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

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

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Webster in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Grange Hall in said Webster on Tuesday, the 11th. day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for maintenance of highway and bridges.
 - a. Summer Maintenance
 - b. Winter Maintenance
 - c. Tar roads
 - d. General Expense of Highway Department
4. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$643.34 for class V road construction.
5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Public Welfare.
 - a. Town Poor
 - b. Old Age Assistance
6. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Library.
7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Patriotic purposes.
 - a. Old Home Day
 - b. Memorial Day
8. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support and maintenance of the Hy-Mar Fire Department, including forest fires.
9. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$80.00 for use in connection with the state program for the eradication of White Pine Blister Rust.
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$45.00 toward the operating deficit of the Concord Hospital this being based on the number of patients admitted from Webster.
12. To authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow for the Town, by issuance of notes, a sum not exceeding \$50,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1969, said notes payable from said taxes within one year of issuance, and to authorize the Board of

Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the maintenance of the playground.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$25.00 to be expended in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission for the opening and maintaining of the old roads and old trails for forest fire protection. The New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission to provide a matching sum.

15. To see what sum of money the Town wishes to raise and appropriate for the rent of the Grange Hall for year 1969 and Town Meeting 1970.

16. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board of five members, one of whom shall be a Selectman, as authorized under sections one through fifteen of chapter thirty-six of the New Hampshire Statutes, Annotated 1955 and known as The Community Planning Enabling Act; and to instruct the Planning Board, after a study of the problem, to report its recommendations to the Town for action.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Planning Board to draw up regulations governing the subdivision of land as covered in sections nineteen through twenty-nine of the New Hampshire Statutes, Annotated 1955, under the heading "Authorization for Communities to Regulate New Subdivision of Land".

18. To see if the Town will vote to become a member of the Central New Hampshire Planning Commission. This Commission already has the membership of the city of Concord, the town of Bow and the town of Boscawen. The objective of this commission is to plan for and encourage regional planning analysis, provide consensus on major problems or regional concern and to assist in the effectuation of projects which extend beyond the boundaries of a particular town.

This Commission will have no jurisdiction over any matter of local affairs. It will be primarily advisory. Two members of the Commission shall be from the Town of Webster and to be appointed by the Selectmen.

19. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of fifteen cents per capita to finance the studies to be conducted by the Central New Hampshire Planning Commission. These monies will be used for financing planning studies which must be approved by the Commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with other state and federal funds available for planning purposes.

20. To see if the Town will vote to establish the salaries of the Selectmen as an annual amount in the fixed sum of \$600.00 with an

additional amount of \$150.00 for the chairman.

(Articles 16 thru 20 by petition.)

21. To see if the Town will adopt the following by-laws regulating trailers:

Town By-Laws Regulating Trailers

For the purposes of promoting the health, safety and general welfare of the community, for conserving property values and for ordering its prudential affairs:

The Town of Webster, in town meeting assembled, hereby adopts the following by-laws:

Sect. 1. No premises in the Town of Webster shall hereafter be used for a commercial trailer park. As used in this section, "Commercial trailer park" means a tract of land where two or more trailers are permitted to park, upon payment of a fee or other compensation to the owner or lessee of the land.

Sect. 2. No second-hand trailer shall hereafter be erected, installed or located on any premises in the Town of Webster for use as a residence or dwelling unless such trailer is less than three years old (measured from date of first use) at the time of such erection or installation.

Sect. 3. The minimum lot size for any lot on which any trailer shall hereafter be erected, installed or located in the Town of Webster, for use as a residence or dwelling, is one acre; provided however, that in the case of lots fronting on a lake, pond or river such minimum lot size shall be one-fourth acre.

(a) Such a lot shall have not less than 200 feet frontage on the town highway, state highway or private right of way which serves it.

(b) Provided, however, that a waterfront lot, as above described, shall have not less than 100 feet frontage on any such highway or right of way and not less than 100 feet frontage on the water.

(c) No conforming lot now or hereafter used for trailer purposes shall be so reduced in size as to make it non-conforming hereunder.

Sect. 4. Every trailer used for dwelling or residential purposes, hereafter erected, installed or located on any premises in the Town of Webster, shall have a minimum set back of 50 feet from the town highway, state highway, or private way which serves it, measured from nearest right of way sideline.

Sect. 5. Every trailer used for dwelling or residential purposes, hereafter erected, installed or located on any premises in the Town of Webster shall be equipped with suitable underground sanitary sewage disposal facilities conforming to the recommended standards of the N. H. Department of Health and Welfare, which are hereby adopted as the requirements of this by-law.

Sect. 6. Every trailer used for dwelling or residential purposes,

hereafter erected, installed or located on any premises in the Town of Webster, shall have at least 500 square feet of floor space on the ground floor, measured along the outside walls.

Sect. 7. The word "trailer" as used herein shall mean any vehicle or mobile structure used, or so originally constructed as to permit its being used, for conveyance or overland movement and as a dwelling or sleeping place for one or more persons, whether or not it is equipped with inside utilities, and whether or not it is actually immobile because of temporary or permanent utility connections, foundations or other features attached to a fixed site. It shall include so-called mobile homes and campers, and also motor vehicles with attached trailer bodies.

Sect. 8. The board of selectmen shall be responsible for the enforcement of this by-law, either on their own initiative or upon complaint by any interested person. The board may hold informal hearings for the purpose of investigating grievances and issuing interpretations hereunder.

Sect. 9. Any owner of premises which is used in violation of any section hereof, or any owner of or other person responsible for the construction, erection, installation or location of any trailer, who violates any section hereof, shall, upon conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction, be liable to a fine of not exceeding Ten Dollars for each offense. Each day in which a violation continues, shall be a separate offense. In case of a violation of any section hereof, in addition to the foregoing penalty, the board of selectmen, in the name of the Town, may institute an appropriate action or proceedings to prevent such unlawful action, to restrain, correct or abate such violation, to prevent the occupancy of the trailer or land, or any illegal act or use in or about such premises.

Sect. 10. These by-laws shall take effect upon their adoption in town meeting.

22. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN & DISTRICT CHIEF

Donald Frost, Warden Gerald H. Hight, District Chief

People cause fires. Our records show that the number of fires increase in an area as the population increases and our state is growing tremendously. This means that we all must be aware of fire causes and do our best to prevent their occurrence.

When we are very young the lighted matches is an adventure, burnt fingers and a dropped match is another fire. A little older we like to have a woodland cookout, or go out by ourselves for a smoke but fire and forests get together for another statistic. We adults like to clean up in the spring, burn the old debris and the dead grass, result — escaped fires and much personal expense.

With new homes and summer cottages located in woodlands and with abandoned fields and forests crowding the back yard of our villages' streets, it is necessary that everyone be aware all through the fire season, which comes with the disappearance of the snow, of the need to be careful with outdoor fires and fire sources.

The following action will help:

1. To teach our children the danger of lighted matches.
2. To *never* discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn-
 - a. You need a written permit from the town fire warden for *all* debris burning except when the ground is covered with snow. Cooking fires in outdoor fireplaces or in charcoal brasiers in your own back yard is permitted on notification of the warden.
 - b. The warden is forbidden by regulation to allow burning of household rubbish on *grass* by householders between 9:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M.
 - c. Have equipment on hand to control the fire *before* you light the match.
4. Promptly report any fire out of control to your fire warden or fire department.

Help to keep our town out of the fire occurrence column and save your tax dollars for useful purposes.


