

### E. L. M. COMMUNITY CENTER

#### Report for the Year January 1 - December 31, 1966

1. The usual Day Camp Program was conducted again this year as in the past with a larger attendance than last year. A complete Red Cross Water Safety Swimming Program was carried out.

I wish to thank the 19 High School Students who gave of their time FREE to help with the program.

I wish to thank Mrs. Ruth Coffin and the Senior Citizens of the Center who conducted a FREE course in Ceramics for the children; this was a very successful part of our Day Camp Program.

I also wish to thank the Hinsdale Fire Department who set up and furnished the two large tents for the overnight camp out.

The many merchants and private parties who helped with funds made many extra activities possible for the children. Mr. Stanley Plifka and Mr. Albie Kulick were more than generous.

We averaged twenty-two children from Hinsdale each day. This group paid in over \$800.00 in advance to our Day Camp Program. Each child from Hinsdale paid a total of \$22.00 before they entered the program.

They have made many Ceramic projects for the Center and their own private needs. They have conducted sales to raise money, and have paid for their own kilns and supplies. Many games are enjoyed. 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# REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

January 17, 1967

#### FIRE RECORD

Fire records are made by people — those who cause fires and those who control them. Your forest fire warden, deputy wardens, fire chief and firemen have, in spite of a prolonged drought, made one of the best fire control records in recent years. Despite a very dry spring, we in New Hampshire working together, have substantially reduced our fire incidence (885 in 1965 to 595 in 1966.)

This enviable record is largely due to two factors:

- 1. A closely coordinated and integrated state-town organization jointly carrying out programs of forest fire prevention, training and suppression with dedicated personnel.
- 2. Your appreciation of our forest fire control program and your individual effort in practicing fire prevention.

Statistics show, however, there is room for improvement. Major problems are still with us; (1) the careless disposal of cigarettes; (2) the householder's carelessness in burning rubbish; (3) the failure of woodlot owners and contractors to completely extinguish their brush burning fires; (4) failure to extinguish camp fires; (5) unsupervised children playing with matches.

New Hampshire has 4,339,000 acres of woodland to be protected. In 1966 we experienced 595 forest fires on this area and restricted acreage burned to 395 acres — a fine testimonial to the efficiency and dedication of the men who make up our forest fire control organization.

- 1. If you must burn you will need a permit. Permits are not issued between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. except on rainy days. Permits are not needed when the ground is covered with snow. To minimize risks the best way to dispose of rubbish is at your authorized town or municipal dumping area.
- 2. Be sure all discarded smoking material is out.
- 3. Don't leave a live camp or cooking fire.
- 4. Most important Instruct your children that matches are not play things.

This year, I attended each of the quarterly Advisory Council meetings of the New Hampshire Library Development Program. Three of these meetings were held at the Branch Office in Keene and the other in the Town Hall in Charlestown. After this meeting we visited the library and Fort No. 4. Much progress has been made since the first time I was there. I urge everyone to visit this spot and acquaint themselves with early New Hampshire history.

My assistant and I have attended the Bi-monthly book buying meetings sponsored by the State Library. One of these was held in Jaffrey, one in Newport and the others at the Branch Office. At these meetings a selection of new books, both adult and juvenile is made available for librarians to examine first-hand. Brief reviews of books and talks on current aids, etc. are made by the state personnel.

Mrs. Perry and I served as Co-hostesses at the annual meeting of the New Hampshire Library Association, held at Colby Junior College in New London. It was a gorgeous day in June and a more beautiful spot could not have been chosen.

A major project undertaken this year was to replace the old charging desk with a new 2-level standing height desk. This has been placed parallel with the hallway and leaves much more space in the main foyer. A new round table and four chairs were purchased for the reading room. All of these above items were purchased from a special gift fund.

In January we enlisted the supervision and help of Mr. Arthur Schrader, Music Supervisor of Old Sturbridge Village to move the Henry Pratt organ from the dark hallway upstairs to the large room on the front which has been set aside for the Historical Department of the library. The organ was taken apart and reassembled, the pipes wrapped in newspapers and packed in cartons. We sincerely hope that the restoration of this lovely old masterpiece will be in the not too distant future.

During October and November we exhibited many ceramic pieces made by our local Senior Citizens group. The exhibit attracted the youth as well as the adults.

During one of my frequent visits to second-hand book shops I discovered that there were several volumes of General Leonard Wood's private library available. With the financial aid of the four military organizations we purchased these and now have a new glassfront bookcase to house these books. There are 38 titles, all autographed by General Wood at various stages of his life. These books are to be restricted to use in the library.

I would especially like to thank the following individuals and organizations for their interest and cooperation -- Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Schrader of Old Sturbridge Village, Miss Mary Pritz, Mr. Kenneth Perry and Joel Gilman for the moving of the organ. The American Legion, Minatt Rivers Post No. 44 and American Legion Auxiliary, Unit 44; The Veterans of Foreign Wars, Winchester Post No. 3968 and Ladies' Auxiliary of Post No. 3968 for their generosity in purchasing the General Wood books and special books for the Memory Shelf. And to all others who have contributed books and magazines for our general collection.



# **REPORT ON THE WINCHESTER TOWN BEACH**

# WINCHESTER PARK COMMISSION

The construction work began in the early spring of 1966 at the Town Beach on a cement retaining wall and patio area. It was necessary to excavate prior to erecting forms. Approximately 390 yards of concrete and approximately 40 tons of re-enforcement steel was used on this project. The construction work did not hinder the use of the beach throughout the season.

As the construction work was nearing a completion stage, finances were depleted. This left the Park Commission in quite a predicament. A meeting was called to discuss the above situation. It was decided to borrow \$5,000. All members signed a note after receiving the approval of the treasurer, who negotiated the loan. This note was paid in full before the end of 1966. The finances for this project were raised by the Winchester Park Commission's Weekly Bingo. Plans were discussed for the installation of a chain link fence to enclose the patio area and to extend across the top wall. At this time, a contract has been awarded to a firm from the state of Connecticut to install the fence enclosure as soon as the weather will permit.

The Park Commission wishes to thank the townspeople and all other users for their cooperation while the beach area was under construction.

At this time, we would like to commend Mr. George Bruso and councillors for the excellent job they did on the Summer Day Camp Swimming Program.

The Winchester Park Commission would like to thank everyone for their patronage in the Beach Sticker Program.

Many children and adults participated in the free day event. Thanks are extended to the Thayer High School Band under the direction of Mr. Anthony Santos.

In concluding this report, I, Francis C. Gutoski, chairman of the Winchester Park Commission, extend thanks and appreciation to the following members of the Park Commission: Mr. Norman LeClair, Mr. Stanley Plifka, Mr. Howard Stephens, Mr. Ronald Stephens, and Treasurer, Arnold B. Conway.

# REPORT OF THE WINCHESTER TOWN PLANNING BOARD

The Winchester Town Planning Board was appointed by the Selectmen in the fall of 1966. It has devoted its entire effort during these four months to the preparation of a simple zoning ordinance. The problem was not an easy one for Winchester, unlike some of its neighbors, comprises commerce, agriculture, industry and recreation. Winchester has two of the loveliest lakes and one of the most beautiful valleys in the state and some of the worst manmade eyesores along its highways. The ordinance has been reviewed by Mr. William H. Watson, Jr., town counsel, and by Mr. David Scott, principal planner of DRED, and it has been presented to the voters at two public hearings. It is now presented to the voters for their approval.

Chief Justice Frank R. Kennison in a recent decision of the New Hampshire Supreme Court said:

"In the beginning zoning sought to safeguard the future in the expectation that time will repair the mistakes of the past. Experience has demonstrated that this expectation and prophecy has not been fulfilled and that something more than time and hope is required to eliminate or restrict nonconforming uses."

The time has come to take steps to preserve the heritage that is Winchester's. Therefore, the Board urges the approval of the zoning ordinance.

The Board thanks heartily Mr. Watson and Mr. Scott for their generous professional help and it thanks the townspeople for their suggestions.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 18th day of March, 1967, at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
- 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

8. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers and agents and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district.

9. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for the purpose of paying the salary of the school lunch manager or take any action thereon.

10. To see if the district will vote to create according to the provisions of RSA 195:18 a cooperative school district planning committee consisting of three qualified voters of whom at least one shall be a member of the school board. The members of the committee shall serve without pay for a term ending at the third annual meeting of the district following the creation of the committee.

11. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) for the purpose of paying expenses of school study committees according to the recommendation of the AREA School Planning Committee.

12. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire.

#### SUGGESTIONS

Mention should be made concerning overdrafts totaling \$9,909.05, which is the largest overdraft total ever experienced by your auditors. We do realize that unexpended balances of appropriations and excessive receipts over estimated income resulted in a budget surplus, however, this situation cannot be continually counted on to offset overdrafts.

We do not approve of drawing against the next year's appropriation in that this practice will seriously affect the available funds for the year to come. If necessary such amounts should be shown as accounts payable.

## REPORT OF AREA SCHOOL PLANNING COMMITTEE

To the Winchester School Board,

By vote at the School District Meeting March 12, 1966, this committee was created according to provisions of the state law, for the purpose of investigating formation of an Authorized Regional Enrollment Area (A.R.E.A.), in which Winchester could send high school students to another school on a tuition basis.

This committee firmly believes that the future of any high school with less than 300 students in grades 9-12 is very limited. The meager course of studies offered, the inability to meet the needs of all students adequately, the increasingly high cost of small scale instruction, the difficulty in attracting the best qualified teachers to smaller schools, the current trend toward school consolidation all over our state, and the firmer state policies favoring only larger schools; all these point to the difficult local decision which we must face. The future of our children should be our only concern. Local pride and continuation of the "comfortable establishment" can not be allowed to decide this future. All changes are difficult, but only through difficulties and challenges can growth emerge.

Your committee met with representatives of both the Monadnock Regional and the Hinsdale School Boards and their administrations. We also reviewed the Keene situation, but, believing Keene to be the least desirable of the three possibilities, did not investigate it further. At both Monadnock and Hinsdale we found strong immediate, almost urgent interest that Winchester look to a combination with their school. Although we spent considerable time weighing probable advantages of both these choices, we are not prepared to make any recommendation for one as against the other. More comparative study is needed, and we believe a goal should be set to decide in one direction or the other before the end of 1967, and then pursue a much more detailed study of the choice selected.

At neither Monadnock or Hinsdale did we find any interest at all in the AREA plan of taking pupils on a tuition basis. Both of these School Boards seek instead the investigation of co-operative district formation.

Therefore your AREA Committee, aided and advised by the larger School Planning Committee, makes the following recommendations:

1. This AREA committee, although authorized to function for two more years, should immediately cease further work.

- 2. The School Board should request the District, at annual meeting, to authorize a Co-operative School Planning Committee, to continue the investigation we have started.
- 3. This new committee should have continued advice and support from the larger School Planning Committee, and to achieve this purpose, the School Board should review the personnel of the larger committee, with the aim of seeking a direct commitment from each member and a stronger working group.
- 4. Adequate representation from the high school faculty should be included in the study group on a regular basis.
- 5. The School Board should make budget provisions for outside professional help to work with the new committees, to insure completeness of the study and to especially provide for adequate presentation to the citizens.
- 6. All citizens should take an active interest in the progress of this study and make it their business to be informed at all times on the steps being taken by the Board and Committee. There is no place in this endeavor for anything but respect for those trying to do a difficult job, and for calm, dispassionate, unbiased consideration of whatever proposals may come from the study.

It can be stated definitely that our local High School faces some drastic changes in the near future. The soundness and vision which can shape these changes rest entirely at the discretion of Winchester citizens. Let us resolve to meet this challenge with actions that we and our children may always remember with pride.

This committee wishes to thank the School Board, the Superintendent, and the larger School Planning Committee for all the work they have given and are continuing, that the course of education for Winchester children may be properly directed toward their years ahead — years which will belong not at all to us, but to them alone.

## **REPORT OF THE ELEMENTARY PRINCIPAL**

To the School Board, Superintendent, and Citizens of Winchester:

I herewith submit my first annual report as principal of the Winchester Elementary Schools.

Since September steps have been taken that will improve the core of our curriculum and the activities and experiences to which our pupils are exposed.

This year in the first grades we have introduced a new program, Phonetic Keys to Reading, published by the Economy Company. This system places emphasis on audio and phonetic readiness for the beginning reader and develops a sound foundation in phonics, ability to sound out new words, and use context clues to unlock new words. We believe this method to be an improvement over others that introduce a first grader's reading vocabulary primarily by sight and memorization. It is hoped to be able to extend this phonetic approach into the second grade next year.

Our language program will be greatly improved with the recent selection of the very latest edition of language text books for the elementary schools.

The new Scott Foresman Mathematics Program is now in use in grades five and six. Aside from a few minor adjustment problems the children seem to be progressing well in the new textbooks.

Remedial reading classes have been started at Thayer High. These classes are available to fifth and sixth grade students who have a problem in the area of reading and need more individual attention than is offered in our regular reading sections.

The services of the State Bookmobile, Mrs. Atkins at our town library, and recent additions made to the school supply of library books, provide a rich supply of excellent books for recreational reading and reference work.

Our fifth and sixth graders are now using a new portable science laboratory. The unit can be wheeled from room to room and contains all the necessary materials and equipment for experiments at this level. This equipment along with addition of a forty book science library has greatly enhanced our science program in these grades.

At the P.T.A. meeting held during National Education Week, elementary teachers participated in a panel dealing with the new approach to mathematics in the elementary grades. The panel underscored the fact that modern mathematics does not replace traditional mathematics, but generalizes it, supplements it, unifies it, and most important deepens our understanding of it. This year we were able to provide a program of physical education for the boys and girls of the fifth and sixth grades. I want to extend our thanks and appreciation to Mr. Bruso, Superintendent of Recreation, for instructing this course. In the Spring softball and baseball games are planned with neighboring schools. The experiences to be derived from a healthy competition of this type will be beneficial to our youngsters.

Through the use of plays and programs an attempt has been made to provide our students with worthwhile experiences and opportunities for developing poise, speaking ability, and self confidence. This was done at Christmas time by the Center and Ashuelot Schools, while the fifth and sixth graders at Thayer are planning several more plays.

A school newspaper, "Tiger Tales," has recently been organized. This is a student centered project with the students doing most of the work and decision-making with a minimum of faculty guidance. The school newspaper provides an outlet for practical application of many areas of our curriculum, especially in the language arts and creative writing areas. I feel a publication of this sort is valuable in furnishing occasions for students to make decisions on their own, working together in committees to achieve a common goal, and helps promote school spirit.

I think it is well to note that activities such as a school newspaper, a physical education program, sports competition, and school plays, while certainly not the heart of our curriculum or our main area of emphasis, do serve a worthwhile function in providing opportunities for valuable growth experiences and as outlets for the natural energy, varied student interests, and talents found in the elementary grades.

In conclusion, I would like to extend my appreciation to the School Board, Superintendent Sundstrom, the teachers, and the people of Winchester for their help in making the transition into my new position a productive and pleasurable one.

## **REPORT OF THE HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL**

I hereby submit the annual report for Thayer High School to the Superintendent of Schools.

Enrollment for the school year 1966-67 as of December 31, 1966 is as follows:

The few changes made in the faculty this year were as follows: Mr. Frank Bent, Social Studies and Driver Education; Mrs. Katherine Rhodes, English and Social Studies; Mr. Dale Courtney, Industrial Arts.

Last spring the High School was evaluated by the New England Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges. This climaxed a year long selfevaluation process carried out by the faculty in preparation for this visit. The visiting committee consisted of members from the State Department of Education, teachers and administrators from all around New England. The visit lasted three days and no stone was left unturned. A final report was given by the chairman of the committee commending the school in many ways and also recommending several needs such as more room, physical education facilities, etc. This report was then presented to the New England Committee for approval and on December 2 the Committee met in Boston and approved Thayer High School as an accredited secondary school, for which we can feel very proud. All schools in order to maintain a rating must show some progress within a two-year period.

Many new books have been added to the library this year and we are happy to report that much use is being made of them. Federal money has enabled us to procure many new visual aid items, such as overhead projectors, cameras, copiers, film projectors, etc.

The language department has been greatly improved by the installation of a new twenty unit language laboratory. This is a tremendous improvement over our old one and will enable students to accomplish more.

#### Junior High School Science Curriculum Development Project

Thayer High School was selected to become one of fifty schools in the country to participate in the above government granted project. The National Department of Education felt a need for revision of the curriculum now used in the junior high science area. To fulfill this need, a five-year grant was made to the Florida State University in Tallahassee, Florida.

The project involves grades seven, eight, and nine. Each grade has three years of work in the project. All the equipment and texts are supplied to the school by the project. The materials that are received by the school become a permanent part of the department. This year the entire seventh grade is involved in the project. Next year the eighth grade will be included and the third year will involve all three grades.

Music in the Winchester School District continues to play an important part in the student's entire development as well as providing a musical background for the school year.

Approximately 90 students receive lessons on musical instruments. These lessons are given during and after school, as well as vocal classes at the elementary level, General Music at the Junior High level, and Music Appreciation at the High School level. The Thayer High School Band performed at various outside functions such as parades in Keene, Winchester, Brattleboro, Greenfield, Memorial Day Services, Veterans' Day, Halloween, opening of the Town Beach, and played at the Winchester Creche. This year the band has appeared many times before the entire student body at school assemblies.

The Thayer High School Chorus joined with the Band at the Christmas Concert and at the Pops Concert. This year the Chorus is made up of 65 students from grades 9-12. Maralyn Ryll has been the accompanist for the Chorus during the past year.

#### Guidance

Figures gathered by the Guidance Department for the year 1966 showed that the favorable trend in post-secondary education for Thayer High School is holding up well. Despite the fact that the 1966 graduating class was smaller than the class of 1965 and had fewer post secondaries, the total number of students for 1966 who enrolled and continued in four-year colleges continues to reflect a gain of approximately 100% for the period of 1962-1966 as compared to 1957-1961.

During 1966 there was also a further reduction in the Thayer High School dropout rate. Although figures for 1965 indicated a low of 1.9 per cent, a further drop to 1.5% has been recorded for 1966, marking the third consecutive year with dropout rates under 2 per cent of the student body in grades 9-12.

Work with the Junior High School guidance classes for 1966 centered around study habits, the importance of a high school education, and the values inherent in early investigation of careers and career materials. Noticeable in this effort was increased use of the guidance and school libraries by junior high students, as well as their increasing awareness of the importance of setting up goals early and working to capacity.

The testing program for 1965-1966 was as follows:

The Eighth Grade Testing Program was administered to 53 students in November.

The Sophomore Testing Program was administered to 42 students in March.

The General Aptitude Test Battery was administered to the senior class through the cooperation of the New Hampshire Department of Employment Security.

The following tests were administered on a student-paid basis during the year:

National Merit Tests in March to 5 students.

Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Tests in October to 9 students.

National Educational Development Tests in March to 25 students.

Weschler, Wais Intelligence Tests, and Peabody Picture Intelligence were administered during the year as the need arose.

College Board Tests were arranged for 4 students during 1966.

During 1966 the National Honor Society and the Student Council, through the cooperation of the townspeople, raised funds resulting in a total of \$275.00 in scholarship aid for graduating seniors of Thayer High School.

Other grants and scholarships for 1966 graduates entering college totalled \$2,100.00.

- Mr. Ernest Kay who taught Industrial Arts also resigned;
- Mrs. Jean Kozlowski who taught grade five and six Mathematics resigned in order to teach in Bernardston;
- Mrs. Elinor G. Paine, grade two teacher, who retired after years of dedicated service to her profession; and
- Mr. George A. Payne, Social Studies and Driver Education instructor, resigned to accept a teaching position in Keene.

The staff members who are new to Winchester this year follow:

- Mr. Robert J. Colby, B.S., Holy Cross; M. ED., North Adams State College, received his teaching and administrative experience in Massachusetts school systems. He was elected to the position of elementary principal.
- Mrs. May S. Brooks, B. ED., Keene State College, with several years of experience is teaching grade two.
- Mr. Henry A. L. Parkhurst, B. ED., Keene State College, was elected to teach the special class.
- Mrs. Edna E. Maxwell received her training at Keene State College and has many years of experience. She is teaching grade four.
- Mr. David A. Swierk, B.A., Boston University, was elected to teach in grades five and six.
- Mr. Ellsworth F. Bent, B. ED., Keene State College, is teaching Social Studies and Driver Education.
- Mr. Dale A. Courtney, B. ED., Keene State College, is the Industrial Arts instructor.
- Mrs. Katherine H. Rhodes, B. ED., Fitchburg State College, was elected to teach English in the high school.

In addition to the above, Mrs. Beverly J. Duquette was hired to replace Mr. Richard G. Boutwell in grades five and six. Mr. Boutwell took over duties as a remedial reading teacher beginning after the Christmas holidays. The new program is financed with federal funds under the Elementary Secondary Education Act.

**ENROLLMENT TRENDS:** 

The current enrollment shows a total of 626 pupils enrolled in grades one through twelve in the Winchester schools. This is an increase of 44 over a year ago. The increase is reflected in all of our schools. Ashuelot contains 7 more pupils, the Center School has 18 more, and Thayer High School shows an increase of 19. This is the largest jump in enrollments in recent years and is due largely to in-migration.

A look at future enrollments presents an alarming picture. Although the Ashuelot School appears adequate to house in-coming pupils, the situation has become critical at the Center School and Thayer High School. Although future enrollments are based upon projecting current figures, we must conclude that, since these youngsters are already in our schools, we have reached the point at which additional space is mandatory. It is true that census figures showing future first grade enrollments are not reliable predictions of the actual numbers who enter in the Fall. In fact, the census figures are usually low. For example, the figures last year indicated 35 first graders to enter this Fall. We actually have 60 pupils in grade one. Since there are only seven classrooms at the Center School, one of which is extremely small, it is obvious now that splitting a grade will no longer provide a solution.

**FACILITIES:** Our three buildings are utilized to the maximum. Additional space is a necessity and the adequacy of the Center School is questionable.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM: The quality of our total school program will be affected by the decisions which the citizens make within the next year or two. The aims of the school cannot be separated from the aims of the community any more than the idea of a good education can be differentiated from the idea of a good life. As long as there is confusion about one, there will be confusion about the other. "Education for all" is simple when you are merely giving boys and girls of similar backgrounds certain basic skills for life in a rural community. It becomes much more difficult when you must educate children of varying backgrounds for careers anywhere in the country in any field of activity. We have had to learn, and are still learning, that education for all does not mean the same education. The minds of children develop at different ages, they have different personalities, different capacities and objectives. The curriculum and the teaching have to be sufficiently flexible to meet the needs of the bright, average, and the poor student; to serve those who will enter the professions, those who will be skilled workers, and those who will be unskilled.

The next school year finds Hinsdale, Winchester and Monadnock in the same supervisory union. Is there the possibility that Winchester might cooperate with either or both of these school districts to provide a program which by itself it could not afford? The AREA Committee in another section of the annual report has made specific recommendations for further detailed study of the problem. We cannot afford to ignore these recommendations.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation to the principals and teachers, pupils and parents, the School Board, the AREA Committee and School Planning Committee, and the patrons of our schools for their understanding and cooperation.
