

#### WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Boscawen in the county of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Boscawen on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects: (\*)

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
  - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
  - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
  - (c) Election and Registration Expenses.
  - (d) Municipal Court Expenses.
  - (e) Expenses of Town Hall and Other Town Buildings.
  - (f) Police Department.
  - (g) Fire Department.
  - (h) Blister Rust Control.
  - (i) Spraying and Pruning.
  - (j) Health Department, including District Nurse.
  - (k) Vital Statistics.
  - (1) Sewer Maintenance.
  - (m) Rubbish Disposal.
  - (n) Town Highway Maintenance.

- (o) Street Lighting.
- (p) Sidewalk Maintenance.
- (q) Sidewalk Construction.
- (r) Libraries.
- (s) Town Poor and Old Age Assistance.
- (t) Memorial Day and Other Celebrations.
- (u) Cemeteries.
- (v) Interest on Loans.
- (w) Insurance Premiums.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$391.20 for Town Roads Aid, this sum to be matched by a state contribution of \$1,564.79.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for Blister Rust Control.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$168.95 (1/100th of one per cent of the Town's valuation based on the 1947 assessment) to the Merrimack Valley Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town in cooperation with the 37 other communities in Merrimack Valley Region.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to transfer money from one appropriation to another.
- 7. To see if the voters of the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes on short term notes for the year 1948 to an amount not exceeding \$30,000.00.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the unexpended balance of \$2,270.10 in the 1946 Truck appropriation to the deficit of the fiscal year, 1947.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$127.07 to pay off the deficit balance for the fiscal year, 1947.
- 10. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.
- (\*) Business meeting for appropriations *only* will be called at seven o'clock in the evening.

The Water Street school is now served by the Bookmobile and no books have been requested this year from the County Farm.

Vacation reading clubs were conducted at both the main library and the branch, with the former cooperating with the Grange in their reading club by furnishing books or borrowing from the Extension Department of the State Library, books not on the library shelves.

Book Week was observed with a display of books at both libraries. At the branch there were posters made by the children of the Main Street school.

The main library was decorated for the holiday season with wreaths and a lighted tree.

Both Penacook and Boscawen Congergational churches enrolled in the Congregational Christian Reading Contest.

This year 337 books have been added to the library, 275 by purchase and 62 gifts

Miss Pratt of the State Library assisted the librarian, Mrs. Goldsmith, in the discarding of obsolete books to the number of 766.

Circulation from the main building: Adult fiction, 2,262; Adult non-fiction, 389; Juvenile fiction, 933; Juvenile non-fiction, 231; magazines, 412. Branch: Adult fiction, 2,256; Adult non-fiction, 297; Juvenile fiction, 1,029; Juvenile non-fiction, 243. Magazines, 365, making a total of 8,417.

#### FOREST FIRE PROBLEM SERIOUS

The year 1947 was one of the worst periods of drought and forest fire occurrence in eastern United States history. Lack of water ruined crops, lowered water levels and dried up brooks everywhere. Three months of deficient rainfall and abnormally high temperatures resulted in many fires which were mostly well controlled and kept within bounds. Only the high winds beginning on October 23rd caused a few fires to escape beyond immediate control. These few fires resulted in burning some 15,000 acres and the loss of 63 or more buildings in four New Hampshire towns.

All October fires were costly. They burned deeply in the ground and required day and night patrol of large crews of men until the rains came late in October. Towns which escaped from serious fires might easily have been in the midst of the most serious conflagrations we had.

Governor Dale closed the woods effective at midnight of October 15th. With the blow-up of October 23rd, a second proclamation closed all back roads and authorized towns to inaugurate patrol. The effect of this was to cut down subsequent fires for the rest of the dry period.

Local fire warden forces performed an admirable job to hold the more than 200 fires that occurred during this October period. Many men were taxed to the utmost as the emergency continued. To them and all those who did their work, the people of New Hampshire owe a debt of gratitude. The state forest fire control agency based on local town wardens and town crews wherever adequately equipped rose to the occasion and met the test in whatever town their services were needed.

It is now time to take stock everywhere of our fire fighting facilities for the season ahead and to make them adequate where necessary. To this end town fire plans and training programs for wardens, deputies and other key men in each district are being arranged or in progress. If equipment and tools are insufficient properly to equip the available man power in each community with the right tools for the job, they should be provided for at once. The yearly addition of fire tools to the town supply will generally need to be built up. The state sells tools to the towns and shares one-half their cost. Good equipment is important and can help greatly to keep both damage and fire costs at a minimum.

For many years we have requested our wardens not to issue burning permits except on rainy days. This regulation will be in effect again this year as it is one of the best means of assuring such fires from getting out of control. Nine out of every ten fires can be prevented, 98 percent of all fires being due to human carelessness. Be sure to get a permit for any fire in or near woodland when the ground is free from snow. Be sure your fires are always out before you leave them. Help us in getting the travelling public to keep from throwing out lighted matches or cigarettes. Be careful of all fires in or near woodland.

To see if the Precinct will vote to authorize the Commissioners to lay a new six-inch main from the hydrant beyond Stratton Flour Mills to a point between the former Braley Farm and Henry Sewall's. Also to lay a six-inch main from a fork in the road at the north end of Boscawen Plains and connect with the iron main laid by the State of New Hampshire on the land formerly owned by Herbert Silver, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- ART. V. To see if the Precinct will vote to authorize the Commissioners to increase the volume of water at the

Penacook end of the Precinct, necessary to take care of industry and all private residences, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

ART. VI. To see if the Precint will vote to authorize the Commissioners to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, and other revenue, a sum not to exceed \$5,000.00.

ART. VII. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
