THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of Canterbury in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs: (L.S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Canterbury on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.

3. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$927.00, the state to contribute \$1,854.00 for State Aid Construction.

4. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the eradication of Pine Blister Rust.

5. To see if the town will, contingent on the enactment of necessary legislation, vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00, the State to contribute \$3,000.00 for special construction on West Road, same amounts to be expended in 1934. Given under our hands and seal, this twenty-fifth day of February, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and thirty-three.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens:

At this time the average citizen's interest in the schools, centers around their cost.

During the current year considerable saving in transportation was made by closing the Emery School and opening the Carter.

The following comparison between some budget items submitted a year ago and the same items submitted today will be of interest:

Budget for elementary schools State Aid	Last Year \$6,141.00 1,661.08	This Year \$5,590.92 1,407.40

Excess above \$5 tax	\$46.70	\$64.55

You will note that expenditures planned for elementary schools are \$550.08 less than last year; that the amount of state aid is less than last year's estimate, and that the amount TO BE RAISED for elementary schools is \$296.40 less than last year.

To secure state aid the \$5.00 tax for elementary schools must be raised. A cut in appropriations for elementary schools would decrease the amount of state aid. A cut of more than \$64.55 would be a failure to qualify for any state aid.

A most careful estimate of amount needed for paying high school tuitions is \$2,300. This is \$200 more than last year's estimate. As both the number of pupils and the cost per pupil is beyond the control of the School Board, this estimate cannot be very exact.

The total amount recommended to be raised for all purposes is \$6,509.94, which is \$751.33 less than last year's recommendation, or \$676.33 less than the amount finally voted.
