WARRANT

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Dalton on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, at 12 o'clock noon to act upon the following subjects. The polls will be open at 12 o'clock and will close at 6 o'clock in the afternoon. The business meeting will be held at the Dalton Elementary School Gymnasium and will open at 7:30 o'clock in the evening.

1. To choose all necessary officers for the year.
2. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to issue temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
3. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget for 1982 as prepared by the Selectmen and appropriate the amount therein or to make any changes.
4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of any real estate acquired by Tax Collector's Deed at private sale, as the Selectmen, in their sole discretion, deem equitable and just (R.S.A. 80:42 (and 111)).
5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend, without further action by the town meeting, money from the State, Federal or other government unit or a private source which becomes available during the fiscal year (R.S.A. 31:95-b).
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate Twenty-five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase and replacement of Fire Equipment.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase and replacement of Highway Equipment.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate by notes and bonds a sum of money not to exceed Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00) for the purchase of a new town dump truck, plow unit, and sander. This (\$60,000.00) to be reduced by (\$25,000.00) of Revenue Sharing Funds established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, by the (\$15,000.00) in the Capital Reserve Fund established for the purchase and replacement of Highway equipment, and whatever money can be acquired by the trade value of the 1975 dump truck and the sale of the 1971 dump truck. If the remaining money needed does not exceed (\$10,000.00), the town shall allow the selectmen to raise said monies by taxation in 1982 rather than by notes and bonds therefore saving 9% interest over 3 years.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for the purchase of a high pressure hot water cleaning machine and culvert thawer.
10. To see if the Town will vote to terminate the elected position of Road Agent. To have termination of said position to become effective upon completion of existing term, or upon resignation of same, and to allow the Board of Selectmen to hire said official.
11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the decision of the Board of Selectmen to adopt an Emergency Management Ordinance so as to make the town eligible for Civil Defense help in case an emergency situation should arise in town.
12. To see if the Town of Dalton, N.H. will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for the Dalton Youth Recreation Program to promote Swimming Lessons. By petition
13. To see if the Town will vote to disapprove of the siting of the proposed +- 450 KV DC transmission line in the Town of Dalton. By petition
14. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF THE DALTON PLANNING BOARD - 1981

The Planning Board has spent a great deal of time this year holding meetings, hearing testimony and evaluating the effects of the proposed High Voltage Power Line. The Board unanimously opposes this line for several reasons. The foremost reason is the Board's contention that the line will erode the town's already fragile tax base. One of the town's biggest assets is its land and to cut through the heart of the town with yet another right-of-way would certainly reduce the attractiveness for potential subdivision and consequent land sales.

Over the past ten years the town of Dalton has demonstrated a slow, controlled and steady growth. The addition of another Power Line with one hundred foot high towers on a two hundred foot right-of-way can not, in the Planning Board's view, enable the town to grow in an orderly and planned fashion. The property owners effected will definitely suffer a loss of subdivision potential due to the unattractiveness of the line, the Board feels. The Planning Board further feels that the use of herbicides to kill vegetation under the line is a serious threat to the drinking water for a great deal of the town's people.

Because of the ill effects caused by this project, the Board has filed to make a general appearance before the Site Evaluation Committee in March in Colebrook. The Site Evaluation Committee is the body which will ultimately decide whether the line will pass through New Hampshire or not.

TOWN REPORT 1981

The Public Health Nursing Service, Inc. is a voluntary non-profit agency which is Medicare/Medicaid certified and also maintains a contract with Blue Cross/Blue Shield for skilled services provided to the residents of Lancaster, Whitefield, Jefferson, Dalton, Groveton and Stark. The agency is governed by a Board of Directors elected from the communities served.

Skilled services provided during the year 1981 included 2901 nursing visits, 470 physical therapy visits, and 189 speech therapy visits to patients requiring these services in their homes. All care is delivered under a treatment plan established by the patient's local physician. In addition to our care of the sick program, we have been pleased to offer several illness prevention programs.

In conjunction with the State of New Hampshire, Bureau of Maternal & Child Health 78 children are taking advantage of our Well Child Clinics which are held monthly. The clinics provide, in addition to the physical examination, hearing, vision, urine screening, developmental testing, nutrition counseling and immunizations to all children in the towns served. Dental clinics are held twice a year, and Pre-School Hearing and Vision testing are available each year.

Monthly Blood Pressure clinics are held in each town served. We have worked closely with local Lions Clubs to provide Adult Health Screening clinics with Lancaster Public Health Nursing Service responsible for any needed follow-up.

Visits to residents of the towns served are based on service needed, regardless of race, color, creed, sex or ability to pay.

As federal programs are decreased and funding sources become more stringent with their criteria, citizens of our service area are going to look to local resources to assist with health maintenance and illness prevention programs more and more — we will be here, growing and changing to meet your needs.

Four ways to help prevent fire in and around your home and protect you and your loved ones:

1. On the inside of your home or building, keep your heating plant in good repair and have it inspected regularly for safety and energy conservation. Don't let combustible materials collect around furnace or other heating devices.
2. On the outside of your home or building, cut down high weeds, rake up trash, clean up and keep combustibles away from doors and windows. A clean yard seldom burns and it is a credit to your Community.
3. Make-shift electrical repairs are fire hazards. Keep all electrical wiring and drop cords in good condition.

4. Know your A. B. C.'s - Fire Extinguishers
 - A. Keep Fire Extinguisher in the clear; don't pile materials around them.
 - B. Know where they are located.
 - C. Learn how to use them and be sure they are serviced and in good operating condition.
5. Know your Fire Department's phone number. Remember in case of fire, call the Fire Department first and then fight the fire. The Fire Department Telephone number: 837-9393.
