TOWN MEETING - MARCH 11, 1969

The Meeting was called to order at 1:30 P. M. by the Moderator, who read the Warrant and declared the polls open for voting.

Article 1. Voted to choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. (Which was the appropriating of necessary funds for Town expenses) was deferred until consideration of Article 10. Then voted in the affirmative, with deletion of funds appropriated for Articles 8 and 10, namely; the appropriation of funds for tax re-appraisal by the State Commissioner, and disposal of refuse.

Article 3. Voted to spend the interest of the Parsonage Fund for preaching for the ensuing year.

Article 4. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for the use of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

Article 5. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to sell Tax Title property.

Article 6. Voted to remove all restrictions pertaining to the use of the land purchased by the Fire Association.

Article 7. Voted against having the State Tax Commissioner appraise the Town at 100% of true value.

Article 8. Passed over due to vote on Article 7.

Article 9. Voted on annual salary of \$500.00 for Tax Collector.

Article 10. Voted against appropriating money for disposal of refuse.

Article 11. Voted to authorize the Fire Chief to send Fire apparatus out of town and receive fire apparatus from other towns on a donated basis.

Article 12. (Other business brought before the Meeting).

- 1. Voted to participate in Kingston's 275th Anniversary Celebration in August 1969.
- 2. Voted to hold future Town Meeting and elections in the school to enable those unable to climb stairs to vote.

Voted to adjourn the Meeting at 9:45 with polls remaining open for an additional 15 minutes for those who had not as yet voted.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Danville in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Danville Elementary School in said Danville on Tuesday, the Tenth (10th) day of March, next at one-thirty (1:30) of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much of the Parsonage Fund the Town will vote to spend for preaching for the ensuing year.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for the use of the Town in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell Tax Title Property.
- 6. On petition of 10 or more people: "To see if the town will vote to have the State Tax Commission appraise the Town at 100% of true value."
- 7. On petition of 10 people or more: "To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00, as a partial cost of reappraisal by the State Commission, and that the remainder of the cost to be appropriated in 1971."
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for support of the Greater Salem Mental Health Clinic.
- 9. To see what action the Town will take on having Regular Police Officers appointed by the Selectmen, on Approval of the Chief of Police, instead of being elected at annual Election.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of accumulating enough money so that when added to the Lester Colby Trust Fund, a Town Library may be constructed as intended by the terms of the Lester Colby will; and to deposit in such Capital Reserve Fund, 80% of the proceeds from the completed sale of timber from land owned by the town.

11. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

It is the intention of the Trustees of the Trust Funds to hold quarterly public meetings to review these investments.

State law requires that records must be maintained for each individual fund and all income and capital gain (or loss) of a common fund be prorated to the individual funds. The services of a computer have been donated which will simplify this additional and complicated bookkeeping.

REPORT OF POLICE DEPARTMENT

This year the Danville Police Department is again pleased to report another graduate of the Rockingham County Police Training Academy, Officer Arthur Pierce, Sr.

The listings below are some indication that Danville problems in the law enforcement area are increasing in proportion with the rest of the nation. A neighborly community such as Danville does have advantages in that its citizens can be of great assistance by reporting any information regardless of how unimportant it may seem to them. All assistance of this type, during this year, has been greatly appreciated.

Through the T.V., radio, newspapers, etc. the public is becoming more concerned and more aware of the drug abuse problems which are increasing daily in our area and anyone having information on this, however slight, should report to their local, county or state law enforcement departments. Anyone desiring information on drug abuse may obtain this through the library, PTA, and law enforcement agencies.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Less fortunate than our northern towns, we had too many fires. Carelessness in burning trash and discarding smoking material and children playing with fire caused most of the fires. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follow:

Fire Permit

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m.

Exceptions

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Household waste burning, with a permit, is allowed on rainy days between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

Escaped Fires

If a fire escapes from your control, whether or not you have a permit, you are liable for the costs for control and extinguishment. If you start a fire illegally there is the additional chance of a fine. The landowner may also recover his loss or damages from the fire.

It is unlawful to drop or throw burning material in wooded areas.

Anyone seeing an uncontrolled and unattended forest fire is bound by statute to report it.

Penalties

- 1. For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
- 2. For kindling a fire by any means willfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.
- 3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.
- 4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland, maximum fine is \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smokes in 1970.
