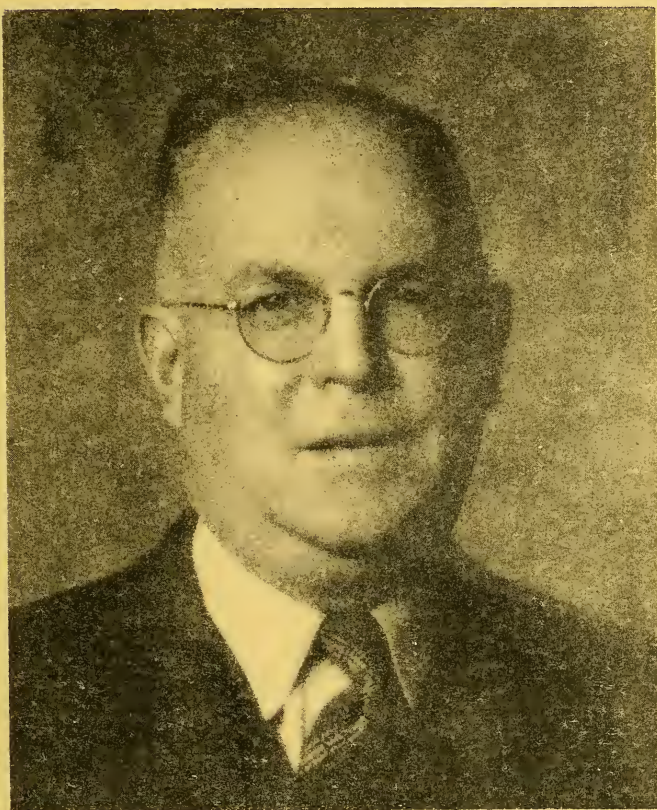

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year. - Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the proposed zoning ordinance, as amended, submitted by the zoning commission, posted and filed with the Town Clerk under date of February 21st, 1964. - Submitted by the Zoning Commission

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for Town Officers' salaries and \$1,000.00 for Town Officers' Expenses. - Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate 350.00 for Election and Registrations. - Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$300.00 for the upkeep and maintenance of the Town Hall and other Town Buildings. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$25.00 for the Library. - Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,600.00 for Insurance. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for interest on loans in anticipation of taxes and \$450.00 for interest on T. R. A. notes. - Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the Town's share of Social Security to Town employees.- Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for payment to Capital Reserve Funds for road equipment. - Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for County Tax. -Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 25. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same. -Submitted by Selectmen

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to auction property taken by Tax Collector's Deed. -Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 for Blister Rust Control. -Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for sealing roads. -Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and direct the Selectmen to execute and deliver to the Deering Community Church, for the sum of \$1.00, a quitclaim deed of the premises on which the Church now stands, bounded on the north by a stone wall and land of Catherine Carew; on the southwest (330 feet more or less) by Route.149; on the south (400 feet more or less) by Church lane; and on the east (91 feet more or less) by the dirt road leading toward Gregg Hill, so called. -Submitted by George Wolf.

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to transfer by quitclaim deed to: Hazel Soukas, Ann Watson, and Thelma Copadis that portion of the North Deering Road no longer used as a right-of-way as a result of relocation of this road by the Town in 1963, and in exchange for the land deeded to the Town of Deering by Hazel Soukas, Ann Watson and Thelma Copadis, a plan of this relocation being shown on a map and survey by Donald Mellen, Surveyor dated September 7, 1963. -Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to repeal the ordinance adopted by the Town at the annual Town Meeting held on March 13, 1962 authorizing the Selectmen to prohibit the erection of any building or trailer within $\frac{1}{2}$ mile of the Town Common, unless such Selectmen shall have approved in advance the plans for the construction and location of such building or trailer in order that the atmosphere of the Town of Deering may be maintained. -Submitted by Ray H. Bigwood.

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Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the purchase of the so-called "hotel lot" comprising two acres, more or less, situated on the North side of Route 149 in the center of the Town of Deering, for the general purposes of the Town including, but not limiting thereby, the use of the land for a Town recreation area or for such other purposes as may be authorized by the Selectmen of the Town; and to authorize the Selectmen to bargain and purchase the said lot on the best possible terms in their absolute discretion. - Submitted by William P. Bittenbender.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the purpose of drilling an artesian well, together with appropriate pumps, lines and fittings for such well, for the use of the Town Hall; and to authorize the Trustees of the Trust Funds to appropriate \$700.00 from the unspent accumulation of interest now available in the Trust Funds of the Town for the same purpose; and to authorize the Selectmen to make arrangements for the drilling and installation of said well. - Submitted by Trustees of Trust Fund.

Article 34. To see what action the Town will take towards replacing or rebuilding the moat bridge in West Deering. - Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to have a 100 amp. service installed directly to the Town Hall as there is no 220 volt entrance to the Town Hall, and to add additional electrical outlets to the upstairs meeting room and kitchen and to authorize the Selectmen not to exceed \$100.00 to have said wiring installed. - Submitted by Deering Improvement Society.

Article 36. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make the following repairs to the Town Hall:

1. To repair front cement steps.
 2. To replace cracked treads on rear stairway.
 3. To install railings on both rear and cellar stairs, and to install adequate lighting for the cellar stairs.
 4. To provide an adequate ventilating system for the toilet rooms.
 5. To install window casings in upper rear room, and to authorize the expenditure of \$500.00 to complete these repairs.

Town of DeeringREPORT OF THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING
DEERING, N.H., March 12, 1963

A legal meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Deering, qualified to vote in Town Affairs was called to order at 7:15 P.M. in the afternoon of March 12, 1963, by the moderator, Howard E. Whitney. The meeting opened with a prayer followed by the salute to the flag.

Article 1. Ballots were cast on the Australian ballot as follows:

Selectman for 3 years. John Snow - 73 votes.

Town Clerk. Clara T. Rich - 92 votes.

Town Treasurer. Clara T. Rich - 97 votes.

Tax Collector. Howard E. Whitney - 98 votes.

Overseer of Welfare. Chairman of the Board of Selectmen -
98 votes.

Highway Agent. Gordon B. Rich - 89 votes.

Auditors. Marjorie Heath & Eunice Willgeroth - 93 votes.

Library Trustee. Alberta Segrell - 53 votes.

Chief of Police. Charles Williams - 94 votes.

Police Officer. Donald Dumais - 62 votes.

Surveyor of Wood & Lumber. Board of Selectmen - 98 votes.

Article 2. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for Town Officers' Salaries and \$1,000.00 for Town Officers' Expenses.

Article 3. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for Election and Registrations.

Article 4. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for upkeep and maintenance of the Town Hall and other buildings.

Article 5. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$20.00 for the Library.

Article 6. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,600.00 for Insurance.

Article 7. The article to have the Selectmen appoint a Planning Commission for the ensuing year was dismissed.

Article 8. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for Civil Defense.

Article 9. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for Vital Statistics.

Article 10. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 for Winter and \$3,000.00 for Summer roads.

Article 11. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for Street Lights.

Article 12. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for general expenses of the Highway Department.

Article 13. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$970.65 to secure Town Road Aid.

Article 14. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for Police and \$600.00 for Fire Departments.

Article 15. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the Town Poor.

Article 16. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 for Old Age Assistance.

Article 17. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$10.00 for Flags for Soldiers' Graves.

Article 18. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for Damages and Legal Expenses.

Article 19. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the Town's share of Social Security for Town Employees.

Article 20. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$450.00 for interest on loans in anticipation of taxes and \$500.00 on interest on T.R.A. notes.

Article 21. It was voted to read, with an Amendment as follows: To provide for the sum of \$2,000.00 for Capital Reserve Fund instead of \$1,000.00 (provided it be legal) and otherwise the sum of \$1,000.00 shall be appropriated for the Capital Reserve Fund for road equipment.

Town of Deering

Article 22. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for County Tax.

Article 23. It was voted that the Town authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 24. It was voted to raise such sums of money necessary to defray Town charges and make appropriations for same.

Article 25. It was amended to read as follows: It was voted that the Town authorize and direct the Selectmen to auction property taken by Tax Collector's Deed, such auction to be held within the ensuing year.

Article 26. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen and Tax Collector to permit tax payers of the Town to pay their anticipated property taxes in advance and to discount such anticipated payments made prior to 1 November of each year, at a rate not greater than the interest rate which would be paid by the Town for borrowings in anticipation of taxes.

Article 27. It was not voted to change to non-partisan ballot instead of continuing the present annual caucuses.

Article 28. The article regarding the plowing of driveways was dismissed.

Article 29. It was voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for repairs and painting of the Town Hall and other Town Buildings.

Article 30. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 for Blister Rust Control.

Article 31. It was not voted to purchase a truck.

Article 32. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$650.00 for the purchase of a reversible road rake.

Article 33. It was voted that the Town authorize and direct the Selectmen to appoint a Zoning Commission under provisions of Revised Statutes Annotated 31:65, and that the said Zoning Commission shall be instructed to recommend, in its report, regulations which will permit the maintenance of the Colonial Character of the Town within $\frac{1}{4}$ mile of the Town Hall.

It is further moved that the said Zoning Commission be requested to hold the hearing required under R.S.A. 31:65 prior to June 1, 1963.

It was voted that it is the sense of the 1963 Annual Town Meeting of Deering, New Hampshire, that the Town Red Cross activities should be combined with those of Hillsboro in the formation

of the Concord Chapter of the American National Red Cross.

It was voted that the 1963 Annual Town Report honor William P. Wood.

It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to have moved the light on Mr. Bittenbender's corner to be placed by the Frog Pond at Mr. Dobbins'.

It was voted to adjourn without date.

REPORT OF SPECIAL TOWN MEETING

Deering, New Hampshire. September 8, 1963 - 7 P.M.

Article 1 - Not Voted

To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$9,000.00 from the Capital Reserve Fund held for "road equipment" to the General Fund and authorize the Selectmen to expend said \$9,000.00 for the purchase of a new Grader by trading in the present Road Grader for an allowance of \$4,700.00 toward the purchase price of \$22,900.00, and to further authorize the Selectmen to borrow the sum of \$9,200.00 to be used as the balance of the purchase price and to issue notes for the repayment of said loan in ten equal annual installments of \$920.00, the first installment to be due one year from the date of the notes, with interest at the rate of 3½ per cent per year on the unpaid balance from the date of the notes.

Article 2 - Voted

To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$3,500.00 from the Capital Reserve Fund for "road equipment" to the General Fund and authorize the Selectmen to expend the said sum for repairs to the Road Grader.

Article 3 - To transact any other business as follows:

Voted that the Selectmen be authorized to dispose of the Bulldozer on the most practicable terms possible in their sale discretion and to transfer the monies realized to the General Fund.

LIBRARY TRUSTEES' REPORT

The Deering Public Library continues to function, in a limited fashion, with the help and encouragement of a small but faithful group of readers. During July and August the little old school house "comes alive", and is open twice a week. Morning hours were tried this past summer with the thought that it might be more convenient for shoppers. The Bookmobile visited us three times and left approximately 250 books. During the winter these books are available at the homes of the trustees and the librarian, and strangely enough, the circulation from these points is larger than from the library itself. Because books are loaned from more than one place, it is difficult to keep exact circulation figures, but approximately 301 books were loaned in 1963, which is an improvement of 1962.

Mrs. Lothrop Herrick resigned as trustee in the spring, and Mrs. John Griffiths was appointed to fill out her term. Mr. Edward Segrell took over as Treasurer, a vacancy created by the death of Mrs. Mary Holden, who had served as treasurer for many years. Many worth-while books were given to the library by our thoughtful friends.

We know the little library will continue to exist because of its historical value to the town, and we hope more of the townspeople will make use of it in the future.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and a relinquishing of personal rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience - a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

1. Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.
2. Carry your rubbish to the public dump - its safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.
3. Never discard lighted cigarette or match. Make this a year round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.
4. Children caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Lets all join with "Smokey the bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green and growing in 1964.

We believe that the proposed ordinance puts no unreasonable burden on anyone, and that it does mainly provide for the application of the Golden Rule in dealing with the property values of all the property owners of Deering, and consequently recommend that the Voters cast their ballots "Yes" to this question.
