

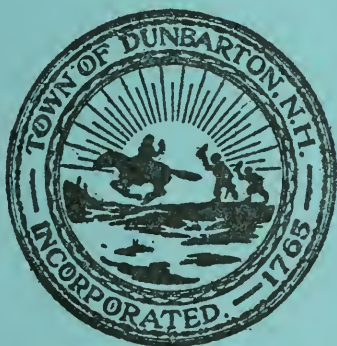

Gentlemen :

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Dunbarton which was made by this Division, acting under authority of Chapter 71, Section 27, of the Revised Statutes Annotated, which provides in part as follows:

“Audit on Motion of Commission. The commission may cause an audit to be made of the accounts of any city, town, school district, village district or precinct, as often as once in two years, or whenever conditions appear to it to warrant such audit.”

This audit covered the fiscal year ended December 31, 1956, and the period from January 1st to October 31st, 1957. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report which is made up in three sections as follows:

Section I —Fiscal Year Ended December 31, 1956

Section II —Period January 1st to October 31st, 1957

Section III—Statistical Table—Ten Year Statement of

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax

Collector, Town Clerk, Trustees of Trust Funds and Library.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

*Comparative Balance Sheets—December 31, 1955—
December 31, 1956: (Exhibit A)*

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1955 and December 31, 1956, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$1,667.23, from \$12,800.02 to \$11,132.79, during the year 1956.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit B)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit B, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

*Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures
—Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits C & D)*

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1956, are presented in Exhibits C and D. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit D), a net overdraft of appropriations of \$5,341.03, less a revenue surplus of \$2,897.41, resulted in a net budget deficit of \$2,443.62.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit E)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1956, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit E. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of October 31st, 1957.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes:

Table I presents a ten year statement of Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes. It will be noted that during the per-

iod from December 31, 1946 to December 31, 1956, the Net Debt increased from \$5,775.22 to \$11,132.79.

During the same period the assessed valuation of taxable property increased from \$604,373.00 to \$1,023,934.00, or 43%, while the amount of the annual tax levy increased from \$35,053.43 to \$56,930.73, or 34%. The local tax rate decreased from \$5.80 to \$5.56 per hundred, compared to the average tax rate for the State which increased from \$3.47 to \$4.83 during this period.

Current Deficit:

It is noted that the current deficit (excess of current liabilities over total assets) increased by \$832.77, from \$10,300.02 to \$11,132.79, during 1956 as shown herewith:

It is further noted that in the tax levy of 1957, there was raised the amount of \$8,000.00 in addition to the regular budgetary items. This appropriation was voted at the special town meeting of January 10, 1957. An appropriation in the amount of \$5,000.00, was also made at the annual meeting in March 1957 to pay an outstanding temporary loan of like amount. Thus it will be seen that actually deficiency appropriations totaling \$13,000.00 were made and raised in 1957. This should be sufficient to entirely liquidate the current deficit and enable the Town to end the current year of 1957 in a surplus position.

Tax Accounts:

The Tax Collector should adopt the use of the standard

form of tax sale record book for recording tax sales and redemptions made therefrom.

Tax payments made between the date of advertising and the tax sale should be recorded as "taxes collected" rather than "redemptions" from tax sales.

Partial payments on "redemptions" should be remitted to Treasurer as "redemptions from tax sales" rather than "tax collections."

Unpaid poll and head taxes should be included in the amount for which a taxpayer's real estate is sold.

When the Collector receives a check from the Town in payment of taxes which the Town buys at the tax sale, the proper accounts in the warrant book should be credited and the amount of taxes, interest and costs to date of sale entered therein. The check should be remitted to the Treasurer as "taxes collected", indicating the year of levy and showing separately the amount of taxes, interest and costs.

Yield tax deposits should be made to the Selectmen and turned over to the Treasurer to be held in escrow until such time as the tax is assessed and then given to the Tax Collector.

Town Well:

It is noted that all income (water rents) derived from the Town Well is turned over to the Trustees of Trust Funds to be placed in a Capital Reserve Fund. This is in accordance with a vote of the Town. Provision should therefore be made in the budget for an appropriation to cover the cost of maintenance of the well.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955 require that the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) of this report shall be published in

the next annual report of the Town. The inclusion of Exhibits in the published report is optional with the Board of Selectmen.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Dunbarton for their assistance during the course of the audit.

RECORD OF ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

Dunbarton, N.H. Mar. 12, 1957

Meeting called to order and the warrant read by the Moderator Arthur H. Powell at three o'clock in the afternoon. Check list posted and polls opened for balloting at 3:30.

Action on all articles was delayed until eight o'clock in accordance with the Warrant posted and read.

Article 1. The following named were elected in open meeting and one vote was cast for each by the Clerk at the request of the Moderator :

Health Officer—Wilfred H. Marshall

Constables—Wilfred H. Marshall, Arthur H. Powell

Sextons—Center, Charles Weatherbee—East, Walter E.

Warriner—North, Warren Spofford

Fence Viewers—Eli N. Noyes, Ralph Walker, L. Webster Burnham

Surveyors of Wood and Lumber—Fred C. Blackman, William L. Merrill, C. Allen Fuller, Jr., Carroll Crosby, Ernest Dugrenier

Auditors—Earle H. Stone, Earl Hadley

Overseer of the Poor—Louis D. Holcombe

Hog Reeves—Alan Savage, Fred Paris Jr., Leonard Luk-sza, Jr., Earl Hadley

Article 2. On motion by Arthur H. Newell, it was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7920.00 to defray Town Charges.

Article 3. Motion by Eli N. Noyes to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2200.00 for General Highway Expense was passed.

Article 4. The sum of \$6500.00 for Summer Maintenance was raised and appropriated on motion by Arthur H. Newell.

Article 5. On motion by Eli N. Noyes \$6000.00 was raised and appropriated for Winter Maintenance.

Article 6. On motion by Arthur H. Newell it was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$672.90 to match the sum of \$4485.98 to be contributed by the State for Class V Roads.

Article 7. A motion to pass over this article by John Swindlehurst was defeated, then a motion calling to raise and appropriate a sum of \$300.00 for White Pine Blister Rust Control was tendered by Arthur H. Newell and passed.

Article 8. The sum of \$5000.00 was voted to pay an overdue note at the Concord National Bank after motion was introduced by Eli N. Noyes.

Article 9. The Town voted to authorize the Selectmen to appropriate \$3263.57 (the amount of 1956 Auto Permit Fees) for applying tar to the Class V and/or T.R.A. Roads on motion by Arthur H. Newell.

Article 10. It was moved that the sum of \$3500.00 be raised and appropriated for the care of Town Poor, Dependent Soldiers, and Old Age Assistance in the proportionate sequence of \$2500.00, \$200.00, \$800.00 by Eli N. Noyes. This was carried.

Article 11. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for Memorial Day on motion of Norman Vigue. An amendment that this sum be turned over to the Legion passed.

Article 12. On motion of Carol Clark it was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for support of the Library.

Article 13. A motion introduced by Arthur H. Newell calling for \$450.00 for care of cemeteries was carried with

the stipulation that \$200.00 be allotted to the Center Cemetery, \$75.00 each to the North and East Cemeteries, and \$100.00 for incidental expense.

Article 14. A motion to pass over this article by Carroll Sarty was ruled out of order. Motion was then made by Ralph Walker that the Selectmen pay $\frac{1}{2}$ of 1% on the net amount of taxes collected to the Tax Collector as remuneration. This was carried.

Article 15. It was voted to pass over this article on motion by Arthur Gewehr.

Article 16. Motion by Norman Vigue to pass over this article was carried.

Article 17. It was moved and passed to pass over this article on motion by Clarence Leach.

Article 18. & 19. On motion by John Swindlehurst, it was voted to authorize the Trustees of Trust Funds to transfer to the Town Treasurer two unspecified Capital Reserve Funds of 2/12/46 and 10/30/47 and to appropriate this amount for the Capital Reserve Fund for Town Equipment.

Article 24. On motion by Robert F. Baker it was voted that the Trustees of Trust Funds cash an existing War Bond maturing in Dec. 1957 and this amount be placed in the Capital Reserve Fund For Town Equipment.

Article 20. This article was passed over on motion introduced by John Swindlehurst.

Article 21. A motion by John Swindlehurst to purchase a snow plow for a sum not to exceed \$900.00 — the money to be taken from General Highway Expense — was accepted and passed by the meeting.

Article 22. Motion to pass over this article by John Swindlehurst was defeated.

A motion for passage of the article was then introduced by J. Willcox Brown reading—"to accept up to one mile of

roads at Holiday Haven Acres as completed and maintain same as regular Town Roads". A voice vote affirmed this.

Article 23. It was voted to authorize the Trustees of Trust Funds to pay to the Town of Dunbarton the sum of \$175.00 for part reimbursement for repairs to the old pump and towards purchase of the new pump. This amount to be taken from the Reserve for Water Maintenance.

Article 25. A division of the House 43 to 9 assured passing over this article introduced by John Swindlehurst.

Article 26, 27, 28. These articles were treated simultaneously and passed over by popular vote on motion by Arthur H. Newell.

Article 29. Motion by Wilfred H. Marshall to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any Real Estate acquired through Tax Collector's deeds was passed with this amendment—"to name property and to whom sold" to appear in the receipts of the Town.

Article 30. Motion to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes was presented by Wilfred H. Marshall and accepted.

Article 31. It was voted to pass over this article on motion by Wilfred H. Marshall.

Article 32. It was moved by Ralph Walker and accepted by the meeting to accept the Reports as printed in the Town Report subject to printers' errors.

Article 33. It was moved by Arthur H. Newell and passed that the Town allow a $1\frac{1}{4}\%$ discount on all property taxes paid within two weeks of the mailing of the bills.

Motion by J. Willcox Brown that a Finance Committee of nine (9) persons be appointed by the Moderator at tonight's meeting to work with the Town Officials and the School Board for seasonable review of budget and financing problems of Dunbarton before the 1958 School District and Town Meetings. This was passed and the following were

named to the committee—Armand Audet, Sidney Flanders, J. Willcox Brown, Richard Hammond, Donald Opie, Arthur Gewehr, Charles Williamson, Ernest Maxfield, and Marguerite Boynton.

RECORD OF SPECIAL TOWN MEETING

Dunbarton, N.H. Jan. 10, 1957

Meeting called to order and the Warrant read by the Moderator Richard I. Hammond at twenty-five minutes after eight o'clock in the evening.

Article 1. Motion by Robert Baker to hear the report of the Selectmen as to the Financial Condition of the Town was passed.

Report was read by Eli N. Noyes and accepted by popular voice vote.

Article 2. Motion by Eli N. Noyes that the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifteen thousand dollars and that the Selectmen be authorized to borrow all or any part of the sum so raised and appropriated, through the issuance of a note or notes to be payable from the tenth day of March, within one year and determine the time or times of the payment of said note or notes, the place of their payment and the rate of interest thereon, and do whatever may be necessary for the issuance and sale thereof, was seconded by Lillian Durost. Passage was afforded by a 31 to 2 ballot.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at nine P.M.

RECORD OF SPECIAL TOWN MEETING

Dunbarton, N.H. Nov. 16, 1957

Meeting called to order and the Warrant read by the Moderator Arthur H. Powell at eight o'clock in the afternoon.

Article 1. A report relative to the need of some sort of Zoning or Planning was read by J. Gardiner Mills, Head Selectman.

Article 2. Motion by Eli N. Noyes "To appoint either a Planning Board or a Zoning Commission" was withdrawn due to priority of a Motion

by Robert Hammond "To pass over the article."
This was defeated.

A motion was then introduced by Wayne Kimmerlin "For the creation of a Planning Board". This was withdrawn in favor of a substitute.

Motion "To establish a Planning Board of seven members with duties as set forth in Section 1-15, Chapter 36, N.H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, to make a study of the Town's development and report to the Town Appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the Town's best development. The Board members shall consist of one Selectman and six other citizens appointed by the Selectmen, as provided in Chapter 36, N.H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955". This was passed.

Article 3. Motion to adjourn was presented by Arthur H. Newell and passed by the Body at 9:10 PM.

Gentlemen :

The finance committee wishes to submit the following report for inclusion in the forthcoming town report :

The Dunbarton finance committee established under the last article of the 1957 warrant for town meeting reports that twelve meetings have been held, with an average attendance of six members.

The first two meetings were devoted exclusively to organization.

Three meetings with the selectmen and two with the school board were held principally for general review and discussion of finances and budgets.

One meeting was held at the request of the selectmen to assist them in the preparation of recommendation for the special town meeting held in November, 1957.

In considering both the school and the town budget, the committee recommended a review of fire insurance coverage on town buildings and the center school, and liability coverage on fire trucks. The committee considers the present coverage to be considerably below realistic present day values.

The committee has reviewed in detail both the school budget for 1958-59 and the town budget for 1958 and considers both to be reasonable and in order. The committee recommends through an article in the town warrant for the 1958 town meeting that the town continue an orderly process of laying aside a sum of money (at least \$100.00) to be placed in the Capital Reserve Trust Fund for Town

Equipment, since the town grader is approaching the end of its useful life.

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of DUNBARTON in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Dunbarton on Tuesday the Eleventh day of March next at three of the clock in the afternoon and to cast ballots from that hour until at least eight o'clock in the evening of said day for such Town Officers as may be listed on the ballot.

You are also notified to meet at the same place at eight o'clock in the evening of the same day, to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose all other necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of moneys as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Highway Expenses.

4. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Summer Maintenance.

5. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Winter Maintenance.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$819.73 for Class V Roads to match a sum of \$5464.89 contributed by the State.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for White Pine Blister Rust Control.

8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appropriate the sum of \$3361.53 (the amount of motor vehicle fees for 1957) for applying tar to our Class V and/or T.R.A. roads.

9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of Town Poor, Dependent Soldiers and Old Age Assistance.

10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Library.

12. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of Cemeteries.

13. To see if the town will vote a fixed rate of remuneration to be paid the Tax Collector for the collection of taxes.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding \$114.00 as a subsidy to the Concord Hospital.

15. To see if the town will vote to increase the water rent from \$15.00 to \$25.00.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to remove existing fire hazards to Town Hall Chimneys.

17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for General Expenses of the Planning Board.

18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to straighten out or otherwise eliminate the dangerous conditions existing at Dudley Hill and East Cemetery.

19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to paint the interior of the upper Town Hall.

20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money and place same in the Capital Reserve Fund for Town Equipment.

21. To see if the town will vote to accept the Zoning ordinance recommended by the Planning Board.

22. To see if the town will vote to accept the Building Code recommended by the Planning Board.

23. To see if the town will vote to postpone consideration of the proposed Zoning ordinance and Building regulations, and further to request the Planning Board to hold at least one more public hearing and present its final recommendations at a Special Town Meeting to be held not later than July 1, 1958.

24. To see if the town will vote to recommend that the Tax Collector Maintain hours, in a specified place, at least one day each week as shall be noted on the tax bill for the purpose of conducting tax business other than the time specified in State Statutes. The day and hours shall be posted in two public places.

25. To see if the town will vote to establish a Finance Committee of nine (9) members to be appointed by the Moderator—to serve 3 years staggered terms with 3 members appointed now for 1 year, 3 members for 2 years, and 3 members for 3 years and with 3 positions to be filled by the Moderator each year in the future.

26. To see if the town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the town the benefits of title 11 of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivors Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated, Amended by Chapter 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 to defray the town's share of the cost thereof.

27. To see if the town wishes to exclude from the plan, services in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election.

28. To see if the town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions, the compensation for which is on a fee basis.

29. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to execute on behalf of the town, the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the town will designate the Town Treasurer as the Officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.

30. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.

31. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on all taxes paid on or before the first of July.

32. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

33. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

34. To hear the reports of Agents, auditors, committees and other officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

35. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the School District in the town of Dunbarton qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Dunbarton on the 8th day of March, 1958, at 3 o'clock in the afternoon, and to cast ballots from that hour until at least eight o'clock in the evening of said day for candidates for the following district officers:

1. Moderator (for the ensuing year).
2. Clerk (for the ensuing year).
3. Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. Treasurer (for the ensuing year).

You are also notified to meet at the same place at eight o'clock in the evening of the same day, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officer of the district.
2. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
3. To choose Agents and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
4. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are esti-

mated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

5. To see if the District will authorize the School Board to contract with Concord, Manchester and Goffstown School Districts School Departments for the tuition of Dunbarton pupils in the high schools of said districts at an amount necessary to provide therefor.

6. To see if the District will vote to appropriate any funds received from tuition for so-called state wards toward payment of general expense of the school year 1957-58.

7. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or offers for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the State of New Hampshire and/or United States.

8. To see if the district will vote to accept the services of a helping teacher for Supervisory Union #19, in accordance with RSA Chapter 189, Sections 44 and 47, as amended by Chapter 338, Laws of 1955, and Chapter 320, Laws of 1957, and to share in the salary and travel with the other districts in the Union for that portion of salary and travel in excess of the \$2,500 to be received annually from the State Treasurer.

9. To see if the school district will adopt as its school check-list the Town checklist, as provided in RSA 197:12a, as inserted by Laws of 1957, chapter 57; this provision to be effective for the 1959 and subsequent annual district meetings.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of Dunbarton:

I hereby submit my annual report as Superintendent of Schools in Dunbarton.

Enrollment

The current year opened with a slight increase in the total enrollment in our Center School. We did experience difficulty in our arrangement of grades in the three rooms, but such a problem is bound to exist with three teachers to cover eight grades. Our projected enrollment figures for the years immediately ahead show slight increases each year, but no problem is anticipated other than previously mentioned.

Teaching Staff

Mrs. Alfa Bourey, who for the past two years served as teacher in the intermediate room, retired from teaching in June. We were fortunate to secure the services of Mrs. Olive Draper of Goffstown.

1958-59 Budget

The budget proposed by the School Board for your consideration at the Annual Meeting calls for an amount approximately equal to our current budget. Although tuition rates continue to rise in our neighboring high schools, we anticipate a reduction in the number of pupils in high school next fall, and for that reason the item for tuition is slightly less than a year ago.

The item for teachers' salaries has been increased. Each year the salaries of beginning teachers continue to rise, and it seems only just and right that the salaries of the established teachers be increased accordingly.

Many School Boards in this area have followed a salary schedule in determining teachers' salaries, giving recognition to training, experience, and successful performance. The Dunbarton Board has given considerable thought to a proposed schedule, and the salary budget item reflects its collective thinking.

This year we do not anticipate the need for a "Deficiency Appropriation". Certain items in our current budget will show unexpended balances, which sums should leave us solvent as of June 30th.

The inadequacy of General State Aid continues to be the major problem in school finance. As has been pointed out in previous Town Reports, the amount of state funds allocated to the towns has not kept pace with the increases in population and school costs. Dunbarton this past year lost its share of such funds, and the entire budget had to be met by local taxation. The same situation will be present this coming fiscal year. What changes or increases are made in State Aid in the next session of the General Court rest heavily on the attitude of the residents and legislators of such towns as Dunbarton. Certainly if we are to create and maintain adequate schools for our children, we must have income other than that available at the local level.

Forest Fire Prevention is Everybody's Business

New Hampshire faces a continuing challenge in its forest fire problem—97 percent of all our forest fires being man-caused and preventable—a serious indictment of interest in our own welfare and that of our neighbor. Both the State and the towns are striving diligently to effectively meet the challenge through education of the public to the threat fire presents to our woodlands; by maintaining a well trained corps of wardens and deputy wardens in every community and by providing ample opportunity for all who wish to dispose of unwanted waste materials. Careless and perverseness, however, continue to be the big hurdles.

Thoughtlessly discarded lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches from moving vehicles, by hikers, hunters and fishermen; careless burning of debris during hazardous periods in dangerous locations; illegal burning; improperly extinguished debris, camp and cook fires—all result in serious loss of property, disruption of industry and farm work and unnecessary expenditure of town and state funds.

To meet the challenge successfully, the state, your community and your local forest fire warden need YOUR thoughtful and cooperative effort—The rules are simple.

1. Don't burn at home—use your town dump and avoid all fire problems.
2. If you do burn, be sure to secure a written permit from your local forest fire warden when the ground is not covered with snow. Permits are required for open debris fires, home incinerators, outdoor fire places and camp fires. Your warden is instructed to permit burning if weather conditions, site and type of burning are safe.
3. Be sure that all lighted material—cigars, cigarettes and matches—are completely out before discarding them. Use ash trays in automobiles.
4. Make certain that your debris, camp and cook fires are completely out before leaving them.
5. Insist that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
6. Call the warden promptly when fire is detected and aid him to extinguish it.

REMEMBER — the fire you prevent might be the one which could burn YOUR property.
