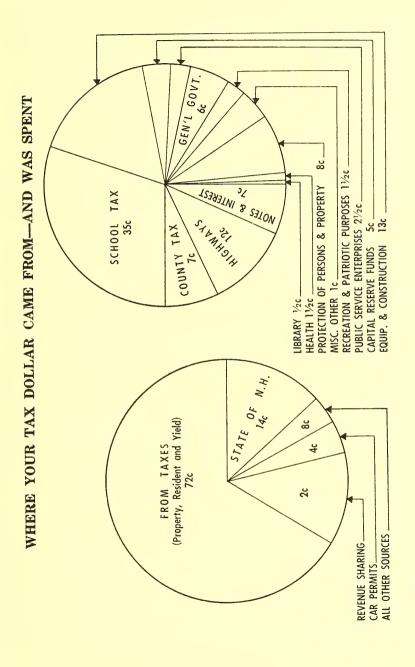

- To see if the town will vote to declare Article as scenic, under the provisions of RSA 253:17-18. Bickford Road so-called, from the Sugar Hill town line to Route 116. (By Petition)
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to declare as scenic, under the provisions of RSA 253:17-18, Lafavette Road so-called, from the Sugar Hill town line to Route 116. (By Petition)
- Article 6. To see if the town will vote to declare as scenic under the provisions of RSA 253:17-18, Town Edge Lane so-called, from Bickford Road to its end. (By Petition)
- Article 7. To see if the town will reapprove the use of the room in the Franconia town hall which is currently being used as a licensed day care center by the Franconia Children's Center, Inc., for the year April 1, 1975 to April 1, 1976 unless another facility becomes available in the meantime. (By Petition)
- Article 8. To see if the town will vote to give up all rights to a portion of the old Profile Golf Links Road across property of Grout and Williams, starting at their northern boundary and continuing southerly eleven hundred sixty five feet to Profile Club property; provided that the property owners grant a right of way to the town for a sixty foot radius turn-around on their property.
- Article 9. To see if the town of Franconia will vote to create an ordinance for the licensing and regulation of dogs to read as follows:

TOWN OF FRANCONIA

Section 1: DEFINITION OF TERMS. As used in this ordinance, unless the context otherwise indicates:

- A. "Dog" shall be intended to mean both male and female.
- B. "Owner" shall be intended to mean any person or persons, firm, association or corporation owning, keeping or harboring a dog.
- C. "At large" shall be intended to mean off the premises of the owner, and not under the control of the owner or member of his immediate family either by leash, cord, chain or otherwise.
- D. "Leash" shall be considered to be not over 6 feet in length. Section 2: No owner or keeper of any dog shall permit such dog to run at large.

Section 3. IMPOUNDING.

It shall be the duty of police officers (or some other designated official) to apprehend any dog running at large and to impound such dog in the town pound or other suitable place. The police officer (or some other designated official) upon receiving any dog shall make a complete registry, entering the breed, color, and sex of such dog and whether licensed. If licensed he shall enter the name and address of the owner and the number of the license tag. Licensed dogs shall be separated.

Section 4. NOTICE TO OWNER AND REDEMPTION

The owner shall be notified not later than two days after the impounding of any dog. The owner of any dog so impounded may reclaim such dog upon payment of the license fee, if unpaid, and of all costs and charges incurred by the Town of Franconia for impounding and maintenance of said dog. The following charges shall be paid to the Town of Franconia: for impounding any dog, \$2.00; for keeping any dog, \$2.00 per day up to ten days.

Section 5. CONFINEMENT OF CERTAIN DOGS.

No dog of fierce, dangerous or vicious propensities and no female in heat, whether licensed or not, shall be allowed to run at large or upon the premises of one other than the owner. If such dog is found running at large in violation of this provision it shall be taken up and impounded and shall not be released except upon approval of the police officer (or person designated by the town) after payment of the fees provided in Section 4, provided however, that if any dangerous, fierce, or vicious dog so found at large cannot be safely taken up and impounded, such dog may be disposed of by any policeman.

Section 6. HABITUAL HOWLING, YELPING OR BARKING — DECLARED NUISANCE.

The keeping or harboring of any dog, licensed or not, which by habitual howling, yelping, barking or other noise disturbs or annoys any person or neighborhood is unlawful; and is hereby declared to be a nuisance and each day shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 7. DAMAGING PROPERTY

It shall be unlawful to suffer or permit any dog to trespass on private or public property so as to soil, damage or destroy any property or thing of value and the same is hereby declared to be a nuisance and any such dog may be impounded by the police officers (or a designated person). Whenever it shall be affirmed in writing by three or more persons having separate residences, or regularly employed in the neighborhood that any dog is a habitual nuisance by reason of trespassing, howling, barking, or other noise, or damage to property, being vicious or by its actions potentially vicious or in any other manner causing undue annoyance, the police officer (or designated person) if he finds such nuisance to exist in fact, shall serve notice upon the owner or custodian that such nuisance must be abated within 48 hours, after which the police officer shall decide whether such nuisance has been abated and if not, any such dog shall be impounded. Refusal to release to the police officer any such dog shall constitute a violation of this chapter. That the owner or custodian of any dog impounded under the provisions of this section, shall pay to the Town of Franconia a fee of \$5.00 in addition to all other charges payable under the provisions of this chapter. Section 8. PENALTIES.

Any owner found violating any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a violation.

Section 9. EFFECTIVE DATE.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the salary of a Dog Officer to be appointed by the Chief of Police.

(By Petition)

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to enter into an agreement with the State of New Hampshire permitting the Town to draw water from Echo Lake for the purpose of fire protection in the Mittersill area. No capital expense to the Town or the State will be involved, but the Town will bear all maintenance expenses. Said water may also be utilized by the Mittersill Corporation and/or related entities for the purpose of snowmaking, and said corporation and entities shall bear the capital cost of such construction.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance

Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and further, to authorize the selectmen to make pro-rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced or to take any other action thereon:

- Article 13. To see if the town agrees to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program by directing the board of selectmen to complete the eligibility application and submit the required information to the Federal Insurance Administration.
- Article 14. To see if the town will vote to grant site plan review authority to the Planning Board in accordance with RSA 36:19a. This will provide the town with an opportunity to review and approve or disapprove plans for non-residential development.
- Article 15. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 16. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or other officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relative thereto.
- Article 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Our office of Fire Prevention is continuing with education in our schools, health care facilities. Also it has started a pre-plan program which will help us in fire suppression.

This year we have firemen enrolled in the state's fire protection program. We feel that the more knowledge we receive the better fire protection we can give the town.

In 1974 we had 25 emergency calls, 5 structural, 7 cars, 4 mutual aid; 3 to Littleton, 1 to Lincoln and one rescue.

REPORT OF THE FRANCONIA CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Last March the Franconia Conservation Commission received from the Ford Foundation a grant of \$750, plus \$125 which was matched by town funds as required, making \$1,000 in all. This was applied to the preparation of a Land Use Inventory, now nearing completion, which will provide basic data for a future master plan for Franconia.

The Commission worked on the Notch road problem, developing a position paper that recommends safety-oriented minimum road changes, with maximum protection of natural features. Ten official bodies, chiefly in Franconia, Sugar Hill and Easton, endorsed the paper. So supported, it was presented to VTN Inc., for inclusion in their Environmental Impact Statement.

In a study of river problems as affected by recent dredging, we asked the Selectmen and Planning Board members to join us in walking the Gale river banks with representatives of the Soil Conservation Service. the Fish and Game Service, and the Army Corps of Engineers. Thereafter, the three organizations offered help with long-range solutions for flooding and pollution problems, if local interest throughout the watershed is strong enough. We hope this will develop in 1975. Meanwhile, a substitute solution for dredging. offered as permanent flood protection by an Army Corps Engineer, was worked out with the owners of the Mahrenburg house on Route 18 by the Gale. It uses large boulders placed along the bank edge to protect against erosion, and a concrete wall to reinforce a terraced bank.

Operation Rescue was an effort made by us to preserve a stand of wild blue lupines before they should be bulldozed away during the work on Route 116 near the new bridge site. Two hundred plants were dug up, and later replanted beside the finished approach to the bridge. We hope they will bloom again next June, as for so long previously.

A quarterly newsletter prepared by members on conservation and other items of interest, appeared for the first time in February. It will be issued regularly hereafter.

Three roads, Lafayette, Bickford, and Town Edge Lane, all in the Ridge Road area, will be offered on the warrant to receive status as scenic roads. This would preserve most of their existing trees and stonewalls during future road improvements.

SUMMARY PROGRAM OF THE WHITE MOUNTAINS REGION ASSOCIATION

1974 (37th Year)

Your Region Association during the year 1974 was active in several cooperative programs. They included the White Mts. Center for Music and the Arts, an experimental mass highway transportation system, and the White Mts. '74 summer advertising program.

With respect to the Center (formerly called the White Mountains Art and Music Festival), your Region Association has contributed substantial in-kind services. As a board member and secretary, your Association's Executive Director handles many of the day to day details for the Center. In addition, the Association provided office space for the Center during May and June and was responsible for much publicity. Furthermore, the Association's secretary was on loan to the Center, half-time, for May and June.

Your Region Association provided assistance in setting up and implementing an experimental bus system. Communities served by the 10-week summer system included Berlin, Gorham, Milan, Groveton, Lancaster, Whitefield, Littleton, Franconia, Bethlehem, Twin Mountain, Jefferson, Randolph, Conway, North Conway and Jackson. During the first half of 1975, it is hoped a federal proposal will be approved which will permit the experiment to continue and to provide service to other communities.

Your Region Association was a major participant in White Mountains '74 cooperative advertising campaign designed to bolster the economy of the recreation industry this past summer. Your Region Association appropriated \$2500 to participate in the program. In addition to investing \$2500, your Association answered all written and telephoned inquiries which were generated by the advertising. As a result your Association responded to those inquiries with some 3500 vacation planning kits. Those participating included the White Mts. Attractions Association, the White Mts. Center for Music and the Arts, the New England Regional Commission, the Governor's office and Waumbek Village.

Other activities and projects of your Region Association include: participation in a newly created N. H. Travel Council, annual solicitation for the two accommodations brochures, distribution of WMRA folders, sponsorship of a conference on proposed wilderness areas in the White Mountain National Forest, solicitation for business memberships, presentation of 4-H awards and certificates, subscriptions to National 4-H magazines for group leaders in the three northern counties, assistance at the N. H. information booth at the Springfield Exposition to promote travel in northern N. H., the writing of several letters to the N. H. Congressional delegation and others protesting the proposed closing of numerous campgrounds

and picnic areas in the White Mt. National Forest, also the writing of letters to many of the same group protesting the low priority tourism and recreation was to receive under a fuel allocation program, financial contributions to the restoration of the Bedell Covered Bridge, to the Mount Washington Observatory (in memory of Joe Dodge), and to the White Mts. Museum of Forest History. The WMRA also has helped out on some publicity for the proposed museum as well as some modest fund raising.

In addition, earlier in the year, the WMRA surveyed some thirty gasoline stations each week. The information on gasoline supplies was then relayed to the Dept. of Resources and Economic Development where it was used to aid out-of-state travelers.

Finally, your executive director wrote numerous news releases, two newsletters, some special articles for publications, and spoke on several radio programs in the region.

Answered 5,942 inquiries and wrote 101 personal letters.

Planned activities for 1975 are: (1) investigate the possibility of helping to provide regularly scheduled air service to Whitefield and Berlin; (2) publish a new quarterly magazine for the region; (3) modernize and revise the White Mountains Map; (4) publish the Where to Stay and the New Hampshire Accommodations and Dining directories; (5) participate in the joint experimental rural highway and transportation project; (6) continue the Association's work with the White Mountains Center for Music and the Arts; (7) explore further the possibility of preparing and publishing a Christmas tree dealers vendor list: (8) participate in the Springfield, Mass. Exposition; (9) continue to answer some 6,000 inquiries generated through advertising; (10) distribute WMRA folders to information booths around the region and to some State Highway Rest areas; (11) continue the Association's efforts on behalf of the White Mountains Museum of Forest History; (12) continue writing news releases about White Mountains Region Association's activities and help promote other regional events; (14) keep abreast of all important legislation that pertains to the region during the next legislative session; (15) continue to participate actively in the newly created New Hampshire Travel Council; (16) continue to publish the Bulletin of Lodging Inquiries and Real Estate Bulletin.
