TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the
County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified
to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to make any additions to the electric lighting system, and raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.
4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the replacement of obsolete poles in its electric lighting system and raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.
5. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for the Construction of Class II road, known as the Forest road, and raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of \$1,195.50, the state to contribute \$3,586.50, or take any action relating thereto.
6. To see what action the Town will take to provide supervision at the bathing beach during the summer months, and raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate an adequate sum of money for Workmen's Compensation and Public Liability insurance or take any action relating thereto.

8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day and Old Home Week or take any action relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$80 for the Monadnock Region Association or take any action relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) for control of White Pine blister rust in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department, or take any action relating thereto.

11. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 1% on all taxes except poll taxes paid on or before July 15, 1942, or take any action relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes or take any action relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to accept gifts or legacies left in trust for use of the Town or take any action relating thereto.

14. To hear reports of agents, auditors, and committees heretofore chosen and take any action relating thereto.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF ELECTRIC LIGHT COMMITTEE

The line was extended to the residences of Mrs. Ella Robinson and I. W. Mailman according to the vote taken at the last annual meeting.

New customers added to the line during the year include Mrs. Ella Robinson, I. W. Mailman, Florence Duckering and Jenny Gurney.

The total income for the year was \$5,669.80 which was somewhat less than the previous year.

The relocation of the poles on the Stoddard Road made necessary by road construction was completed and several poles on the Bonds Corner Road were moved for the same reason.

The trimming program started several years ago was completed and it should not be necessary to spend any more money for this purpose for some time.

A representative of the New England Telephone and Telegraph Co., made an inspection of all jointly owned poles and as a result, it will be necessary to replace a total of 240 poles this coming year. The Replacement Fund was originally established for this purpose but it was depleted by the expense of repairs and replacements after the hurricane of 1938. Consequently, the Town will have to make an appropriation for their share of this work.

We have examined the accounts of the Selectmen, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Collector of Water Rents, Road Agent, Electric Light Commission, Treasurer of the Town Common Fund, Trustees of Trust Funds, Trustees of the Public Library, Overseer of the Poor, Health Officer, Memorial Day Committee, Old Home Day Committee and Town History Committee, and have found them correctly cast and properly vouched.

We have examined the Report rendered the Selectmen by the Water Commissioners and have found the expenditures listed thereon to be correct and properly vouched. The books of the Commission were not available for an audit.

We find in the hands of the Town Treasurer a balance of \$7,749.04; in the hands of the Treasurer of the Common Fund a balance of \$22.62; in the hands of the Treasurer of the Trustees of the Library a balance in the First National Bank of Peterborough of \$1,031.11; the L. B. Thacher Fund, Peterborough Savings Bank, \$1,107.18; Heber J. Davis Fund, 10 shares Public Service Co. of N. H. stock, par \$1,000.00; Peterborough Savings Bank, \$1,059.00; Ella L. Goodhue Fund, Peterborough Savings Bank, \$527.65. We find in the hands of the Treasurer of the Old Home Day Committee a balance in the First National Bank of Peterborough of \$142.82; in the hands of the Treasurer of the Town History Committee a balance of \$32.40; in the hands of the Trustees of Trust Funds (Electric Line Replacement Fund) a balance in the Peterborough Savings Bank of \$1,143.69; Katie Hayward High School Fund, Five (5) shares of Connecticut River Power Company stock, par \$500.00. We find in the hands of the Town Clerk the amount of \$2.10 overcharge on dog tax book. We find that the town is indebted to the Water Commission to the sum of \$15.65.

I submit my eighth annual report, the statistical summary of the Hancock Schools for 1940-1941, and the report of the school nurse, Miss Margaret E. Harris.

The enrollment for the fall term of the present school year was 118. For the same period last year it was 121.

This enrollment has been reduced by some families moving from town between the opening of school in September and the Christmas vacation.

After eight years of valuable service Mr. Craig resigned his position to accept the principalship of a school in Acton, Mass., and Mrs. Colby, who had taught three years in the intermediate grades, and was far from well during the winter and spring of the school year 1940-1941 did not return, and she has since passed away.

Mr. Horace S. Schnare of Andover, N. H., was chosen for the principalship and teacher of grades 5 and 6. He is a graduate of Keene Teachers' College, 1938, and had taught in the Andover schools for the past three years.

For grades 3 and 4, Mrs. Gladys Phillips of Antrim was elected. Mrs. Phillips is a graduate of Keene and has had long experience in grade school work. She is particularly adapted for the intermediate grades.

Hancock has been particularly fortunate in retaining the services of Miss Nellie Welsh as teacher of the primary grades. Her work has been of the highest quality.

The high school, under the administration of Miss Bertha Manchester, maintains its superior standing. With the training in service of Cadet teachers, this position is one of great responsibility.

Since Keene is unable longer to furnish music teachers for our grades, we had some difficulty in meeting the situation early in the school year, but have finally made arrangements with Mrs. Mildred H. Whitcomb of Keene who is supervisor of music in Jaffrey, Troy, Fitzwilliam and Dublin.

The present school year has shown encouraging progress and we believe some of the difficulties encountered in past years have been overcome.

I desire to express my appreciation of the support given me by the school board, parents, teachers and pupils who have co-operated in the important work of directing our schools.
