Town Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.) To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hill in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town Hall in said Hill on Tuesday, the Twelfth day of March, next at 7:30 of the clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To Authorize the Selectmen to borrow for the Town by the issue of notes a sum not to exceed \$15,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1968, said notes to be expressly payable from taxes within one year from the date of their issuance, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for a Capital Reserve Fund to be used for Highway Equipment and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this sum from the accrued income of the Ferrin Fund to defray the cost of same.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the purpose of Mapping and Re-assessing the Town, and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this amount from the accrued income of the Ferrin Fund annually until the necessary amount has been raised, at which time the Town Meeting is to be notified that the required amount has been raised.
6. To see if the Town will vote to print in the Town Report the Statement of Valuations every other year instead of every year, to save the expense of printing. This to start in 1969 and if article 5 is voted affirmatively the Statement of Valuations must be inserted in the Town Report if it should fall on the off year.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the purpose of investigating, per petition, the cost of improving the underground drainage of lots in the northern section of Mountain View Drive and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw

this sum from the accrued income of the Ferrin Fund. A report of such findings is to be made at the next annual Town Meeting.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Bristol Community Center and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this sum from the accrued income of the Ferrin Fund.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be placed in a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of improving the ball park and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this sum from the accrued income of the Ferrin Fund.

10. To see if the Town will vote to combine the Summer, Winter and General Highway funds into one General Highway Fund and to so report in future Town Reports.

11. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

2. Take debris and waste to the town dump.
3. Maintain a clean, safe dump.
4. Keep matches away from young children.
5. Be sure matches and smoking material are dead out when we discard them.
6. Set a good example for others in fire prevention.

10. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such

sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

11. Annual Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the Board of Education and Citizens of the Hill School District:

I herewith submit my annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

In the fall Miss Joan Rivard replaced Miss Patricia Landry as teacher of grades one and two and the Conversational French program which is now in its third year. Mr. Richard Phelps returned this year as Principal and teacher of grades five and six. Mrs. Colby continues as our grades three and four teacher, Mrs. Martha Gilchrist as school nurse and Mr. Vincent Kondrotas in music. With two-thirds of our faculty returning and Miss Rivard now acquainted with the school and community, I feel that the education is progressing very well at Jennie Blake School.

Our educational program of modern mathematics and Conversational French are continuing.

This year we instituted a new reading system in grades one and two. This system integrates phonics into the reading text. Our Title I Developmental Reading Program is being taught again this year by Mrs. Patricia Athanas.

The budget for 1968-69 of \$79,584.98 is up \$10,530.26 over this years budget. An unexpected \$5,553.08 in foundation aid will help to offset this increase. The major portion of the increase \$5,287.00 is for increased costs of tuition. The rest of the increase \$5,243.26 is distributed through all other items in the budget. It is felt the amount requested is needed for the proper operation of our school system.

I would like to express my appreciation to the Board of Education and the Citizens of Hill for their support of our educational efforts.
