TOWN MEETING WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lyman, in the County of Grafton and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Lyman Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, 1970, polls to open at ten o'clock in the forenoon and will not be closed before five o'clock in the afternoon in said Town Hall, to act on Article 1., the remaining Articles to be considered at one in the afternoon.

- ARTICLE 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of nine thousand four hundred forty-five dollars (\$9,445.00) as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year. All items marked by an asterisk in the budget are covered by this article.
- ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of eleven thousand three hundred twenty-eight dollars and eighteen cents (\$11,328.18) to maintain highways, equipment and Town share of T.R.A. All items marked by a cross in the budget are covered by this article.
- ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred eighty-one dollars (\$381.00) for the Health Dept. (Health Officer & Overseer of Poor \$60.00, Lisbon District Nursing Association \$107.00, White Mountain Community Services \$214.00)
- ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred fourteen dollars to help defray the cost of the Lisbon Town Dump.
- ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for Town Cemeteries.
- ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will set up a committee to investigate the formation of a Cemetery Association; and prepare necessary by-laws.

ARTICLE 8. To vote on what action the Town will take regarding the land & schoolhouse acquired from the pre-existing School Board.

ARTICLE 9. To vote on raising appropriating or dispersing money as required by action taken in Article 8.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of ninety-nine dollars and 70 cents (\$99.70) for dues to the White Mountain Region Association.

ARTICLE II. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to transfer any 1970 annual net budget surplus funds in the amount of fifty percent (50%) to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund established for the purchase of highway equipment.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the Plan (Social Security Coverage) Service in any class or classes of positions of Election Officials or Election Workers for a calender quarter in which the remuneration paid for such service is less than \$50.00.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to grant a discount of two percent (2%) on all taxes paid on or before such time as the Selectmen may designate.

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote as compensation for the Tax Collector, one percent (1%) of the taxes collected.

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board of seven members with duties as set forth in Sections 1-15, Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, to make a study of the town's development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the protection and maintenance of the Town's best development and to provide \$50.00 for the expense of this board. The Board shall consist of one Selectman and six other citizens appointed by the selectmen, as provided in Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955. (By Petition)

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell & dispose of any real estate acquired by tax deed.

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town approves obtaining the services of the State Auditors for the annual audit of the town accounts.

ARTICLE 19. To hear reports of agents, auditors, committees, and officers heretofore chosen, and pass vote relative thereto.

ARTICLE 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

January 20, 1970

Board of Selectmen Lyman, New Hampshire

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Lyman for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

One of the enclosed audits must be given the Town Clerk as part of the permanent records.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1968 - December 31, 1969: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1968 and December 31, 1969 are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Surplus increased by \$1,108.25.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures - Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary, (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$319.47 less a revenue deficit of \$57.45 resulted in a net budget surplus of \$262.02.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1969, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit F)

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1969, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit F.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

Verification of uncollected and unredeemed taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased by \$1,979.91 from \$8,789.64 to \$6,809.73 in 1969 as shown herewith:

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1969 fire season was a quiet one in this area. Frequent rains kept the danger to a minimum and there were few violations. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follow:

Fire Permit

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m.

Exceptions

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

Penalties

- 1. For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
- 2. For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.
- 3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.
- 4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland maximum fine of \$25.00.

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Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smokes in 1970.

Gentlemen:

The Lisbon District Nursing Association Inc. was organized to provide skilled nursing care, UNDER THE DIRECTION OF THE PHYSICIAN, to the sick in their homes on a visit basis, charging in proportion to their ability to pay, health instructions, educational follow-up and arranging for medical care when necessary. It is supported by the surrounding towns served by the association, the nursing fees and the State of New Hampshire.

The District Nurse is ready to help YOU when you are sick no matter where you live in the district, or whatever your financial situation. She gives nursing care and instructions to people of all ages - elderly or chronic invalids, mothers with new babies, convalescents, returning from the hospital - in fact - to all who require skilled care in the home.

The help of the District Nurse is obtained by asking your physician to notify the nurse, or by telephoning her yourself. The nurse answers each call, but visits are continued only under the guidance of a physician.

The telephone number of the nurse is 838-6616. Fees are set at a rate of three dollars (\$3.00) per call. Fees may be modified or omitted according to circumstances.

We are asking each town served by the District Nurse to share in the support of the Association through their individual town budgets. These towns are Lisbon, Landaff, Lyman, Sugar Hill, Franconia, Easton, and Bath.

Therefore, it is proposed that the town of Lyman set aside fifty cents (50¢) per resident.

In anticipation of the coming budget hearings to be held in the towns of the North Country with the consideration of requests for appropriations in the new year, we are eager that support for White Mountain Community Services again be included in the town budgets within the area we serve.

As we did last year, we are asking for an appropriation of \$1 per person in each community, based on the population count. For the town of Lyman, this will amount to \$201. The response of the towns last year was most helpful: of the 22 towns we serve, all but one voted funds for our agency. Most of the towns voted the full request of \$1 per person.

Demand for the services of our agency continues to grow, and in the past year we have served people in all of the towns in our area. Through our extensive program of consultation with many other professionals--physicians, school personnel, welfare workers, public health nurses, clergymen, etc.-we are bringing useful insights of community mental health to many more people than those we treat directly.

We are enclosing a copy of our current operating budget together with other information which you may find useful for your annual town reports. We will be pleased to send a personal representative to your town budget hearing if you will advise us of the time and place.
