WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING
TOWN OF MADBURY
March 10, 1953

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Madbury, County of
Strafford and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote
in Town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madbury on Tuesday, the 10th day of March A.D. at 11 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following articles.

ARTICLE 1. To choose the following Town Officers:

- A town clerk for the ensuing year.
- A selectman for the ensuing three years.
- A treasurer for the ensuing year.
- A collector of taxes for the ensuing year.
- Two auditors for the ensuing year.
- A trustee of trust funds for the ensuing three years.

ARTICLE 2. To choose all other town officers.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$7500. in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be paid in the current municipal year from taxes collected during the current municipal year.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of the White Pine Blister Rust, in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$288.20 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$1,921.31 to be contributed by the State.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$62.00 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to allow the collector of taxes additional compensation for his services in collecting the state head tax and to fix the amount thereof.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$285.00 for the purchase of a portable pump for the Madbury Volunteer Fire Department.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to close the road located about 100 yds. west of Jennison barn running from the Hayes road in a southwesterly direction about $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile to the Lee town line.

ARTICLE 10. To see what action the Town will take on the proposed budget for the current year.

ARTICLE 11. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

ARTICLE 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

RECORD OF TOWN MEETING

March 11, 1952.

ARTICLE 1. Balloting for town officers:

For Town Clerk: Edna P. Twombly received 21 votes and was declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Selectman: Charles Jennison received 51 votes and was declared elected for the ensuing three years.

For Treasurer: Loretta J. Morrow received 23 votes and was declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Collector of Taxes: Paul M. Raynes had 24 votes and was declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Auditors: Lillian Rinta had 18 votes and Edward Moore received 18 votes and the two were declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Trustee of Trust Funds: Irving A. Hayes had 12 votes and was declared elected for the ensuing three years.

ARTICLE 2. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to appoint all other necessary town officers.

ARTICLE 3. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow not exceeding \$7500 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year.

ARTICLE 4. Voted to raise and appropriate \$800 for the control of the White Pine Blister Rust.

ARTICLE 5. Voted to raise \$289.63 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$1930.85 to be contributed by State.

ARTICLE 6. Voted to table indefinitely the article to appropriate the sum of \$62 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.

ARTICLE 7. Voted to raise \$100 for Civil Defense.

ARTICLE 8. Voted to appropriate \$350 for repairs and alterations to the Town Hall plus any balance left over from the amount budgeted for normal Town Hall expenses.

ARTICLE 9. Voted to table indefinitely the article authorizing the Selectmen to appoint an inspector of Buildings.

ARTICLE 10. Voted to table indefinitely the article to adopt a building code.

ARTICLE 11. Voted to table indefinitely the article establishing a Planning Board.

ARTICLE 12. Voted to accept the proposed budget with the above voted additions, and a reduction of \$2062. from the amount to be raised by taxation, leaving a total of \$31,957.47 for the Town Budget.

Voted to include painting the metal roof of the shed in the repair expenses of the Town Hall.

ARTICLE 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Voted that the Moderator call for a secret ballot as to whether the voters wish to have the proposed air base at Newington. Results: *Yes*—19 votes, *No*—40 votes.

Voted to approve the work of the selectmen in the past year by a rising vote.

Personally appeared the elected officers and took the oath of office before Moderator Kenneth S. Morrow.

REPORT OF FIRE DEPARTMENT

To the Citizens of Madbury:

On December 3rd the Fire Department marked its fifth year of incorporation. In these five years we have strived for better fire protection and sincerely hope we have gained the confidence of the people.

In the past year we have had an average number of fires. Although a greater part of the spring and summer were potentially dangerous, we had only two grass fires, one accidental, and one from careless burning without a permit.

The only damage to buildings occurred November 10 at the Fernald home. The quick response of the department enabled us to confine the fire to the ell of the house. We greatly appreciate the help of the Dover and Durham Fire Departments.

In our financial statement you will note an expenditure over and above our annual appropriation. The items listed as tires and new brakes are capital investments and the cost should be spread over a number of years. Due to these unexpected expenses we were unable to purchase any new equipment.

The Department has undertaken a project of naming and erecting signs on all Madbury roads. We believe this project will be a great help to the Fire Department and a benefit to the town.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank the townspeople for their cooperation and to urge all Madbury men to join our Department even though they cannot be active fire fighters. Your membership will help carry on this community service.
