TENTATIVE WARRANT
STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Madison in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madison on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, at nine of the clock, in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

As follows:

- Election Expense
- Expense of Town Hall
- Advertising

3. To see what action the town will take in regard to discounts on taxes.

4. To see what sums of money the town will authorize the selectmen to hire in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see what sums the town will vote to raise and appropriate to provide for additional fire protection due to the war emergency.

6. To see what sums the town will vote to raise and appropriate to provide watchmen and additional police protection due to the war emergency.

7. To see what sums the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the town health officer and board of health due to the war emergency.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$69.00 to the Lakes Region Association of New Hampshire to assist in Planning and Development of the town and for the issuance and distribution of printed matter and newspaper and magazine advertising, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

9. To see if the town will vote to purchase a

truck for snow removal, and use on summer highways, and hire money to pay for same, and charge the prevailing truck rate to each department, the money so earned credited to cancel the original loan.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 which is the quota for the Town of Madison for Red Cross 1943 War Drive.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 which is the quota for the Town of Madison for the U. S. O. year of 1943.

I herewith submit my second annual report which is the second in the series of such reports.

Organization of Union No. 36

The eight school districts of Brookfield, Effingham, Madison, Middleton, Ossipee, Tamworth, and Wakefield continue to comprise this supervisory union. The Union expense of administration borne by each district is as follows: Brookfield, 1.42% ; Effingham, 8.41% ; Freedom 5.80% ; Madison, 11.25% ; Middleton, 3.80% ; Ossipee, 32.70% ; Tamworth, 19.08% ; Wakefield, 17.54%. The above percentages are based on the pupil registration in the various towns as of January 31, 1942.

We added to our teaching force this year Miss Eva Sanborn, who is teaching at the Corner School and Mrs. Norman Hartfiel, who is doing substitute work in the high school building; Mr. John Shaw, the regular teacher, having been called into the service. I am pleased to report that your schools are going along very smoothly and you have cause to be proud of them.

In my last report it was shown where considerable repairs were made to our elementary schools. Therefore, it was not necessary to make major repairs of any kind this year. The usual minor repairs are being taken care of.

Miss Eva Heney, our capable school nurse, has examined all our children. She has tested their hearing through the use of the audiometer which was loaned us by the State Board of Education. Miss

Heney plans to hold a dental clinic sometime in the not too distant future. This is a very worthwhile clinic and it is hoped that parents will avail themselves of the opportunity to have their children's teeth cared for. May I suggest that you refer to Miss Heney's report for a more detailed account.

In closing may I express my appreciation to the members of the School Board, teachers, parents, and pupils for the splendid cooperation they have given me in helping to make the Madison schools successful.

Report of the Health Work done in the Madison Schools during the past year.

School Visits 55

Pupils examined 89

Physical examinations, including height, weight, and vision tests have been made on all of the school children in Madison.

Result of examinations:

Defective vision: 16. (11 are wearing glasses)

Defective teeth: 58.

Enlarged tonsils: 7.

The State Board of Education loaned us an audiometer. A hearing test was done on 83 pupils. 81 of the children came within the normal range of hearing. One has a slight hearing defect.

Arrangements are being made for a dental clinic to be held early in the spring, in the High School Building with Dr. Deneault of Meredith in attendance. Clinic rates will be one half the regular dental rates. We hope that all of the school children needing dental work will take advantage of the clinic.

The cooperation of the Superintendent, members of the School Board, Teachers, Parents and the Woman's Progress Club has been very much appreciated.
