

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Nelson in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sums of money the town will raise and appropriate for repairing highways and bridges or take any action in relation thereto.
- 4. To see if the town will raise and appropriate money to calcium chloride parts of Class V roads or pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 5. To see if the town will raise (\$555.00) to make the Tolman pond road a secondary state highway system or take any action in relation thereto.
- 6. To see if the town will raise and appropriate (\$298.30) for town road aid or take any action relating thereto.
- 7. To set what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- 8. To see if the town will raise and appropriate (\$100.00) to gravel the Wilson road in Munsonville or take any action thereto.

- 9. To see if the town will raise and appropriate (\$300.00) for street lights from the shop in Munsonville to the Stoddard line on the east side of the lake.
- 10. To see if the town will raise and appropriate (\$250.00) for forest fire equipment.
- 11. To see if the town will raise and appropriate money to paint town buildings.
- 12. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate for Old Home Day.
- 13. To see if the town will yote to give the selectmen the right to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (\$40.00) to the Monadnock Region.
- 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of library.
- 16. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Nelson:

I herein submit my eighteenth annual report as superintendent of schools.

Education today faces a crisis in history and civilization. If we are to maintain the ideals of democracy, we must not forget the boys and girls in our public schools who are soon to be the men and women that have to carry on in a changed world. They will have to cope against far reaching questions and pay enormous debts.

Therefore, it is fitting that we scrutinize carefully our objectives and elarify our methods of procedure. Indeed, in our final analysis, we must regard our boys and girls in the public schools as our first and last line of defense.

All isms and philosophies that are poisonous to democracy and the American way of life must be banished from public schools and colleges.

We believe our methods of procedure must follow along three lines of thought, viz. (1) An invigorated drill and practice in fundamentals, the efficiency of the "Three R's" can not be overlooked, the purity of the English language must be maintained, the intellectual activity and vision of life extended. (2) The pupils must be imbued with a deeper feeling for, sense of appreciation of, and a higher respect for the home, the school and the community. (3) Every child must be brought into contact with some situation of life that may give him control of himself, give him the power of decision between right and wrong.

The boys and girls of today are looking not only onward but also upward. Let our training be such that they will see more above them than airplanes but will grasp the fundamental ideas of a Divinity that rules the Universe.

With the coordination and correlation of the above mentioned lines of thought, we may be able to reach our objective, viz. the true Christian American citizen, to whom we may delegate with safety the welfare of the American Way of life, the Constitution and the highest ideals of democracy.
