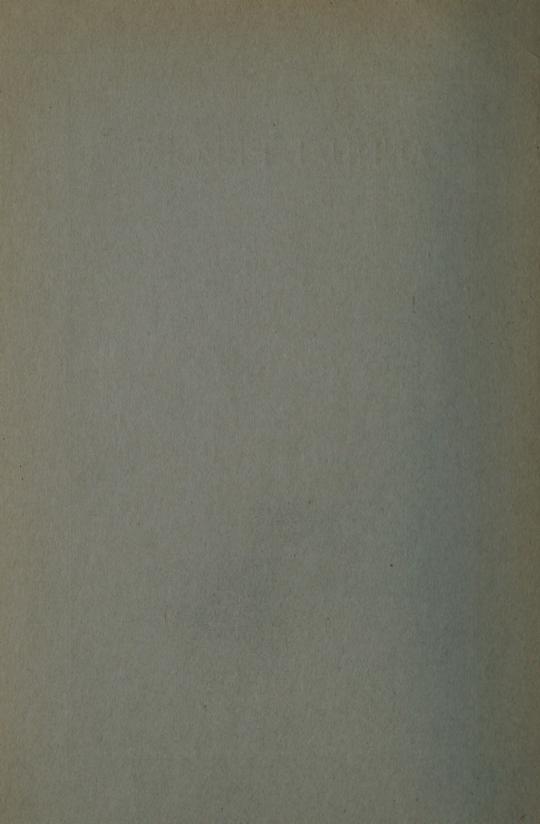

WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

- To the inhabitants of the town of New Durham qualified to vote in town affairs:
- You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall, in said New Durham, on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, 1954, at twelve o'clock noon, to act upon the following subjects:
- Article 1. To choose a selectman for three years, and a town clerk, a town treasurer, a road agent, two town auditors and all other necessary officers and agents for the ensuing year.

AND YOU ARE FURTHER NOTIFIED TO MEET AT SAID TOWN HALL IN SAID NEW DURHAM, AT SEVEN O'CLOCK IN THE AFTERNOON OF SAID TUESDAY, MARCH NINE, 1954, TO ACT UPON THE FOLLOWING SUBJECTS:

- Article 2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses of town government for the ensuing year in accordance with the recommendations of the budget committee or with such variations as are by law permitted.
- Article 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 4. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to make an effort to have Kings Highway placed on class 5 roads. If passed, will void article 5.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$3,000.00 for state aid construction, said amount having been determined by the state highway commissioner as the amount of the town's obligation for state aid construction for the year 1954.

- Article 6. To see if the town will vote to discontinue winter plowing on the following roads:
 - 1. The Dame road from the Van Keuren factory to the residence of Willis Corson.
 - 2. The Valley road from Giles corner to the residence of Roy Berry.
 - 3. The cross road from the residence of Maurice Hayes to the residence of Izah Berry.
- Article 7. (By petition) To see if the town will accept approximately 300 feet between the Jones road and Daddario road.
- Article 8. (By petition) To see if the town will accept the road between Nolan camp and Sprague camp when and if it is built in a manner approved by the selectmen and road agent.
- Article 9. To see if the town will accept offer of Dr. Berlin as follows: Dr. Berlin offers to loan the town \$3,500 to finish Birch Hill road with tar to home of A. I. Willey, the same to be paid off in the following manner: \$500 per year, at no interest; if Dr. Berlin should expire while balance is due, all notes representing said balance will be cancelled. If this offer is accepted, to see if the town will raise and appropriate \$3,500 to be paid at \$500 per year as a standing obligation; the foregoing offer to be accepted pursuant to a written agreement to be signed by Dr. Berlin.
