#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges and make appropriation for the same.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$618.18, the State to contribute the sum of \$2,472.70, for the construction of Class V roads.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
- 6. To see how much money the Town will raise for Memorial Day and make appropriation for the same.
- 7. To see how much money the Town will raise for Old Home Day and make appropriation for the same.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the Laconia Hospital to be used for the care of needy residents of the Town.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the care of old cemeteries.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by Tax Collector's deeds.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money to maintain Class V roads and make appropriation for the same.
- 13. By request. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$162.00 for the Lakes Region Association of New Hampshire.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such an audit.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote additional Fire, Police and Health protection and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to buy a truck to be used on the town roads and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 17. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the Caterpillar Tractor and plow.
- 18. By request. To see if the Town will vote to rebuild the road from Plaisted School to the former Victor Huckins farm, now owned by Don Beeler, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Non-Partisan Ballot System as enacted by the 1943 Legislature.


20. To transact any other business that may properly come before said meeting.

#### FOREST FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

As the tempo of America's war effort mounts, demands upon its citizens for service become more numerous and exacting. To some comes the call to arms; others to public service and still others to defense industries and organizations. No one can possibly escape if he would. All must bear a proportionate share of the burden and the sacrifice. Strong first line fronts on land, sea and in the air are needed and can be developed and maintained only if there is unity of purpose and common determination behind the home front.

As men are drawn into service the burden of carrying on rests more heavily upon those who remain at home. Here, team work becomes increasingly important because of constantly diminishing manpower. A general breakdown in essential local activities and law observance can only be prevented by whole hearted cooperation between citizens and leaders.

There is no field of endeavor where cooperation and compliance with law and regulation are more needed than that of forest fire control. The most effective and economical effort in this field of activity is that of prevention. The old adage "an ounce of prevention" being "worth a pound of cure" was never more aptly applied than to forest fire control.

The forest fire warden is, by law, the designated local leader in forest fire matters. He exercises his prerogatives and discharges his duties as such under the direction of the District Chief and the State Forester. There was never a time when the warden needed each citizen's good will and cooperation more than he does now. With manpower waning, fire prevention, through efficient preparation, care with fire and compliance with

all laws and regulations become a vital duty of citizenship.

For years efforts have been made to improve the usual bad spring and fall fire record. It was not until this year, however, that this problem was, to a great extent solved when permit burning was more rigidly restricted. Forest fire wardens were instructed not to issue permits except on rainy days and even then not to issue permits for burning in or near large slash or blow down areas. This plan worked out so well it has been decided to make it the established policy governing legal burning.

Everyone is well acquainted with the several civilian defense groups. Many of our fellow townsmen are serving in one or more of them. It is only recently, however, that the Office of Civilian Defense, recognizing the threat forest fires are to our timber facilities and resources and the possible disruption of war activities in critical areas, established the "Forest Fire Fighters Service." Its purpose is to provide fire fighters, equipped and trained, to strengthen the hand of the local forest fire warden; to acquaint the people in the area with their responsibility in fire prevention and suppression and to provide an opportunity for people in and near forested areas to participate in the war effort.

The State Forester is the State Coordinator; the District Chiefs are District Coordinators and the Warden is the Local Coordinator. The Forest Fire Fighters Service personnel will be registered under the direction of the Office of Civilian Defense; it will be trained by the warden and other assistants, aided by the District Chief. Individual citizens are urged to join this service group by applying to the forest fire warden or to the Civilian Defense Chairman. By becoming a part of this organization locally, individuals can contribute their share toward the protection of our forest resources which are so vital to the war job.

It is recommended that the small amount of \$30.00 be made available for the purchase and keeping in repair small forest fire hand tools. These small tools can be obtained through the State Department at one half the cost to the state.

During this critical period it is more than ever the part of good and prudent citizenship to remember

- 1. That permission to burn in or near woodland or where fire may be communicated to woodland must be secured from the forest fire warden when the ground is not covered with snow.
- 2. To be careful when smoking in or near the woods and not to throw or drop lighted cigars, cigarettes or matches.
- 3. To notify your local warden promptly of any fire you see.
- 4. That fire prevention is the best and cheapest fire insurance.
- 5. To be fire-minded; be careful; be cooperative and thus help your warden prevent forest fires. This is patriotism at work.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

With the shortage of teachers, especially in rural schools, New Hampton has been very fortunate in retaining the same teachers as last year. There is no better evidence of good teaching than pupil interest. I have been impressed with the interest exhibited by pupils in each of the five schools. The pleasure of working out assignments given them is evidence that the spirit of learning is present in these schools.

The patriotic spirit is also evident by the way the children are responding to the call of the government to purchase war stamps. The record of each school in this respect is praiseworthy.

The children are very much interested in following the war news and tracing the movements of armies on war maps. More will be known of Africa and Australia by the present group of school children than by any previous group because of the war news incentive.

It is amazing how well informed the average boy is about the different types of aeroplanes and various implements of war being used in this global conflict. The desire to make models of planes and tanks by some of the boys is very commendable and it is regrettable that in no school are there any facilities to satisfy this desire for creativeness in the mind of these boys.

Latent talent is undoubtedly present in many boys and girls in rural schools awaiting an opportunity for development. The lack of this opportunity is another argument for a central school, which could be equipped for wood working facilities and some teaching of domestic arts—cooking, sewing, food values, home making, etc.,— and all the girls of 7th and 8th grade age benefit by such an opportunity. Rare are the homes now giving this training which they used to give. War

time is no time to plan these things but the war is showing us plainly what the schools have failed to do in the past to meet the emergencies of the present.

It is gratifying that so many of the graduates of our five schools are attending high schools. It proves that the rural schools are giving their pupils a kind of education that awakens within them a desire for a broader knowledge. It also proves that parents realize the necessity of their children having more education today, than was necessary thirty or forty years ago.

The music program of the schools has been interrupted for several weeks because of the illness of Mrs. Adams. We hope she will be able to resume her work soon.

The work of the school nurse, Miss Hevey, has been very satisfactory. She shows a real personal interest in the health of the school children.

I desire to express my appreciation of the faithful work done by the teachers. I wish parents could find it possible to visit the schools more often.

The friendly relations existing between the School Board and Superintendent have been much appreciated.
