TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Sanbornton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Sanbornton on Tuesday the fourteenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.

3. What action will the town take in regard to raising and appropriate the sum of twenty-five dollars for purchase of tools for the Fire Warden to be matched by State.

4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the decoration of soldiers' graves and the proper observance of Memorial Day.

5. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through the Tax Collector's deeds.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars for the Laconia Hospital. 7. To see what action the town will take in regard to discount of early payment of taxes.

8. To see if the town will vote to accept State aid for Construction of Class II road, known as the Hunkins road and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$818.73 or will accept State aid for construction of Class V roads, and raise and appropriate, or set aside for said purpose, the sum of \$1,204.50.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$400 toward white pine blister rust.

10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire such sums and amounts as necessary to defray town charges in anticipation of taxes.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for expenses of Old Home Day, by request.

12. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road from Leroy Drakes to the residence of Harry Dearborn with the understanding the town will maintain the road from the same Harry Dearborn residence to the road known as Meadow Brook, Sanbornton Square road.

13. To see if the town will vote to adopt State law regarding regulation of public dances.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The attention of every policy holder is called to the following:

By vote at the annual meeting of the Company held January 7, 1901, policy holders wishing to remain away longer than thirty days may keep the insurance on their property good, by applying to the secretary for a permit to leave premises unoccupied for such times as they may specify paying for the same five cents per month for every one hundred dollars for which they are insured.

The cash premium for permits has been reduced from five to three cents per month.

REPORT OF SANBORNTON PUBLIC LIBRARY

The books and magazines furnished to patrons of the Sanbornton Public Library during the fiscal year just ended amounted to approximately 1,529, divided as follows: Adult fiction, 797; adult none-fiction, 130; juvenile, 437; magazines, 165.

Many of the new adult fiction books were loaned by generous friends and the Public Library Commission. In order to meet the demand for juvenile books, we have borrowed from the Public Library Commission three collections of juvenile books (25 each) to be used in the schools.

The donations of books amounted to 150, also many magazines, both greatly appreciated. The library funds purchased 40 more.

Improvement to the grounds including the planting of a lilac hedge, also work on the back terrace, has been carried on this year.

Having examined the accounts of the Selectmen, Town Treasurer, Town Clerk. Trust Fund Trustees, Library Trustees, Overseer of the Poor and the Tax Collector of the Town of Sanbornton, we find them correctly cast and properly vouched and the financial statements true.

SCHOOL DISTRICT OF SANBORNTON REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

General

Three school houses have been in use this year with four teachers employed as was true last year. The only change in teachers was at the Square where Mrs. Anne (Piecuch) Abbott succeeded Mrs. Baker. At the Christmas vacation another change became necessary. Mr. Whittemore, who had served so satisfactorily for two years at the Brook and Gaza, was elected as principal of the Central School in Boscawen.

Parents and pupils regretted Mr. Whittemore's going, but were glad of his promotion to a better position professionally and wish him the best of success.

Mrs. Flora Blake was elected to the vacancy at the Gaza school. Both Mrs. Blake and Mrs. Abbott were former Sanbornton teachers.

From the statistical table you will notice the total enrollment last year was 127. At the present time it is 111. No school has fewer than 23 pupils.

7th and 8th Grades

In our desire that Sanbornton boys and girls of the 7th and 8th grades should have equal advantages of other pupils elsewhere in junior high schools, we have discov-

ered our program is too ambitious for one teacher to successfully carry out. I think all of us desire to have the boys and girls engage in the sports, but it is evident that those sports must be curtailed somewhat to prevent other parts of school work being neglected until such time as another teacher can be secured, and a regular junior high school organization effected.

With the losses sustained by so many citizens of Sanbornton from the hurricane, it does not seem to me an opportune time to request the necessary building equipment for further expansion of the school program.

I do hope, however, that the idea of establishing a junior high school with the 7th, 8th, and 9th grades will be realized at no very distant date and possibly go so far even as to establish a central school.

TRANSPORTATION

The two transportation routes are now equipped with good comfortable busses which is much appreciated by school authorities as well as by parents.

HEATING AND VENTILATION

The heating of Sanbornton schools is of the old-fashioned method—stoves. The effects are old-fashioned too—roasting those pupils in the front seats, and chilling those in the rear seats.

Something should be done to modernize the heating and ventilation arrangements in all the schools, if for no other reason than a health measure. They are unsatisfactory at present.

HOT LUNCHES

This Fall and Winter, hot lunches are being served at noon in three of the four schools. A hot drink and some one hot dish, like soup or chowder is served. The cooperation of the parents has been decidedly pleasing to and appreciated by the teachers and pupils alike. It is a step in the right direction and should be encouraged.

GRADUATION

As a part of the Sesque Centennial observance the graduating exercises consisted of a one act play "The Four Absentees" depicting scenes from the New Hampshire convention called to ratify the constitution. The plays were well received and showed the difficulties in securing ratification. It was really an educational and constructive graduation.

\$5.00 per \$1,000.00 of equalized valuation must be raised to qualify for state aid. The net assessment must contain this amount in addition to funds raised for high school maintenance and other statutory requirements.
