## SHEA-PORTER LEADS IN CD1, KUSTER IN CD2

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DURHAM, NH – Congressman Frank Guinta currently trails former Congresswoman Carol Shea-Porter in the First District Congressional race. Second District Congresswoman Ann Kuster leads Republican Jim Lawrence who is still unknown to most voters in the district.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,\* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Nine hundred and seven (907) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between October 11 and October 17, 2016. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.3 percent. Included were seven hundred and seventy (770) likely 2016 general election voters (MSE = +/- 3.5%). Four hundred and forty-nine (449) residents (MSE = +/- 4.6%) and three hundred and seventy-six (376) likely voters (MSE = +/- 5.1%) were from the First Congressional District and four hundred and fifty-eight (458) residents (MSE +/- 4.6%) and three hundred and ninety-four (394) likely voters (MSE +/- 4.9%) were from the Second District.

### Shea-Porter vs. Guinta vs. O'Connor – 1<sup>st</sup> District

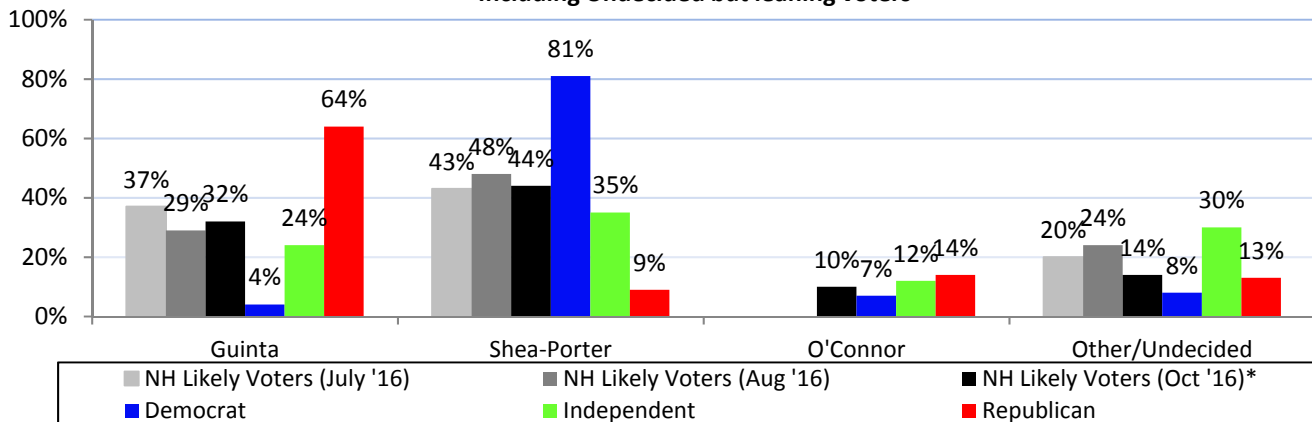
The Congressional election in New Hampshire's first district is the fourth consecutive time that Frank Guinta and Carol Shea-Porter have faced off. Guinta, the incumbent has been hurt by a campaign finance controversy and a tough primary challenge.

If the 2016 election for Congress in New Hampshire's 1<sup>st</sup> District was held today 43% of likely voters say they would vote for Shea-Porter, 29% would vote for Guinta, 10% would vote for Independent Shawn O'Connor, 2% would vote for someone else, and 16% are undecided.

When undecided voters were asked which way they are leaning, the percentages become 44% for Shea-Porter, 32% for Guinta, 10% for O'Connor, 2% for someone else, and 12% are undecided. Shea-Porter is doing significantly better than Guinta among members of their own parties (Shea-Porter leads Democrats 81%-4%, Guinta leads Republicans 64%-9%) and has a 35%-24% advantage among Independents. O'Connor is currently getting the support of 14% of Republicans, 12% of Independents and 7% of Democrats.

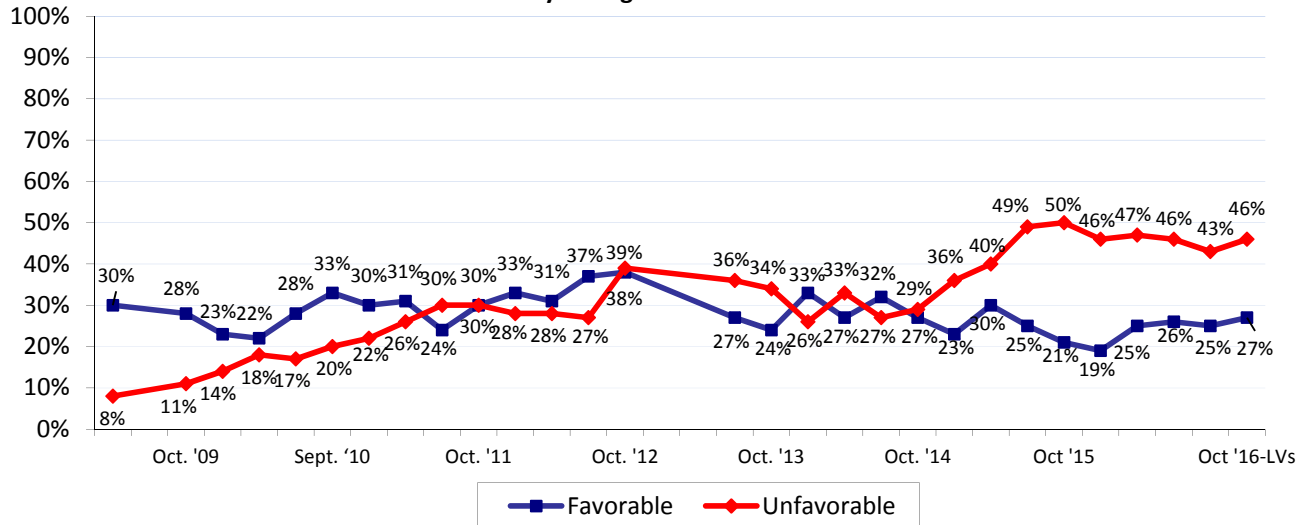

### Favorability Ratings – Frank Guinta

In his district, incumbent Congressman Frank Guinta remains unpopular. Currently, only 27% of 1<sup>st</sup> District likely voters have a favorable opinion of Guinta, 46% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 5% are neutral, and 22% don't know enough about him to say. His net favorability rating is -19%, down slightly from -18% in July. Guinta is only somewhat popular among Republicans (net +17%), unpopular among Independents (-27%), and very unpopular among Democrats (-56%).

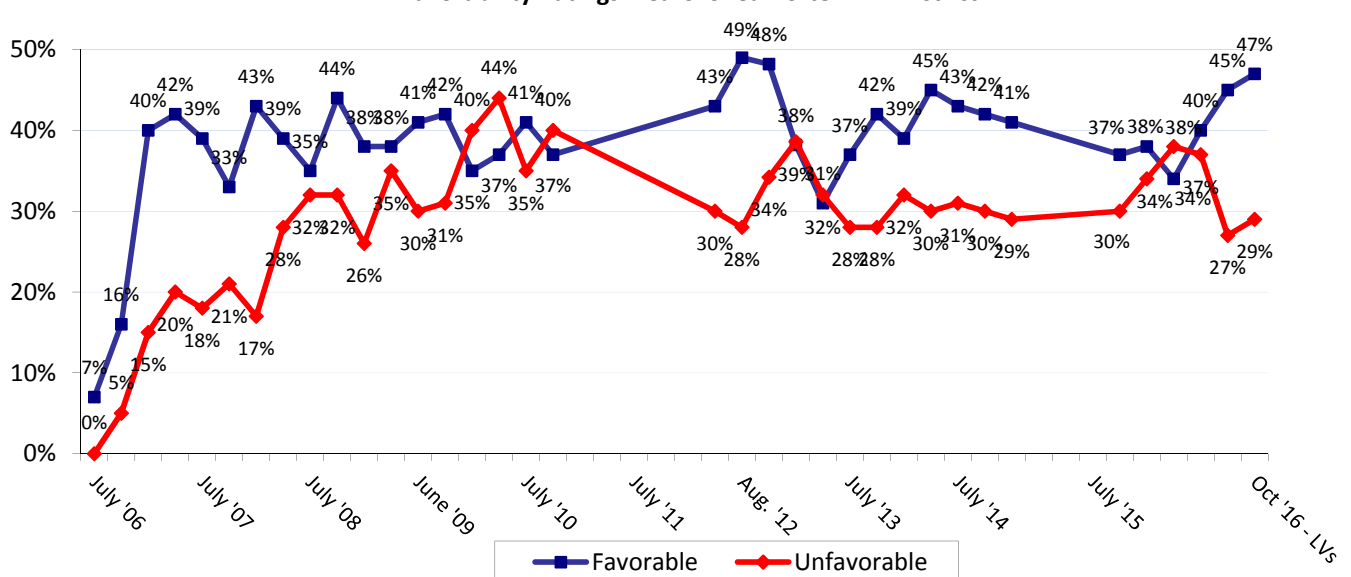
#### Favorability Ratings - Frank Guinta - 1st District



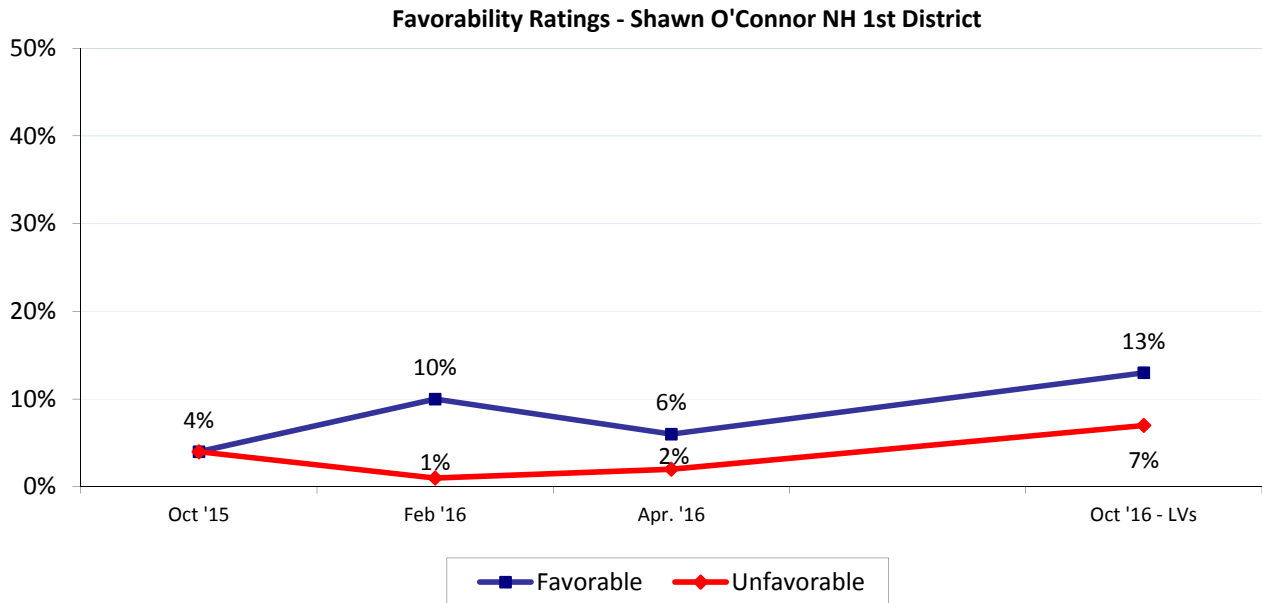
### Favorability Ratings – Carol Shea-Porter

Shea-Porter, who held the First District seat from 2007-2011 and from 2013-2015, is currently popular -- 47% of 1<sup>st</sup> District likely voters have a favorable opinion of Shea-Porter, 29% have an unfavorable opinion, 3% are neutral, and 21% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability is +18%, which is unchanged since August. Shea-Porter is very popular among Democrats (+68%), and popular among Independents (+14%), but very unpopular among Republicans (-33%).

#### Favorability Ratings – Carol Shea-Porter – 1st District

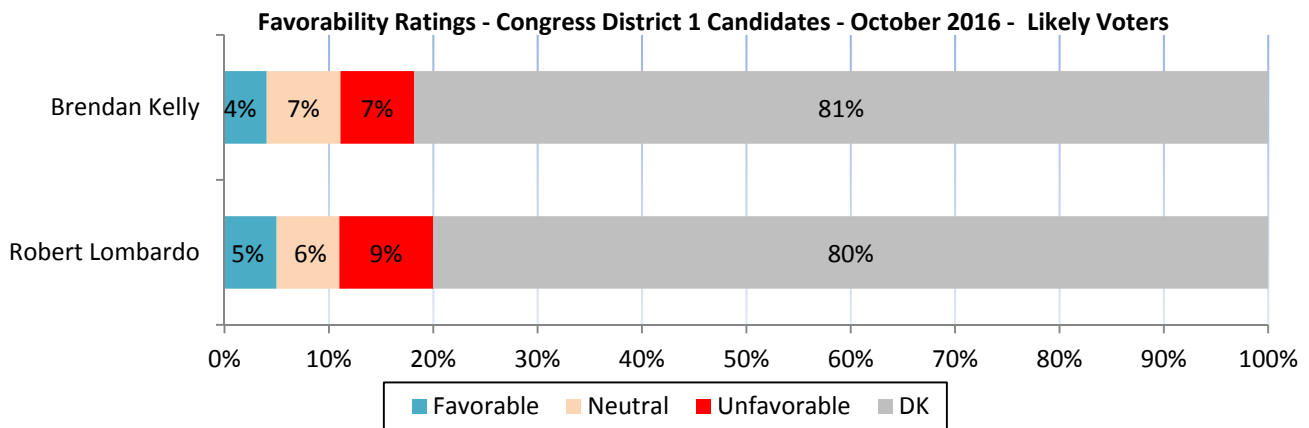


Independent candidate Shawn O'Connor, who earlier this year was vying for the Democratic nomination, is largely unknown among district voters. Currently 13% have a favorable opinion of O'Connor, 7% have an unfavorable opinion, 7% are neutral, and 73% don't know enough about him to say. O'Connor's net favorability is +6%.



The remaining two candidates on the ballot are not well known to voters. Only 4% of 1<sup>st</sup> District likely voters have a favorable opinion of Independent candidate Brendan Kelly, 7% have an unfavorable opinion, 7% are neutral, and 81% don't know enough about him to say. Kelly's net favorability is -3%.

And 5% of 1<sup>st</sup> District likely voters have a favorable opinion of Libertarian candidate Robert Lombardo, 9% have an unfavorable opinion, 6% are neutral, and 80% don't know enough about him to say. Lombardo's net favorability is -4%.



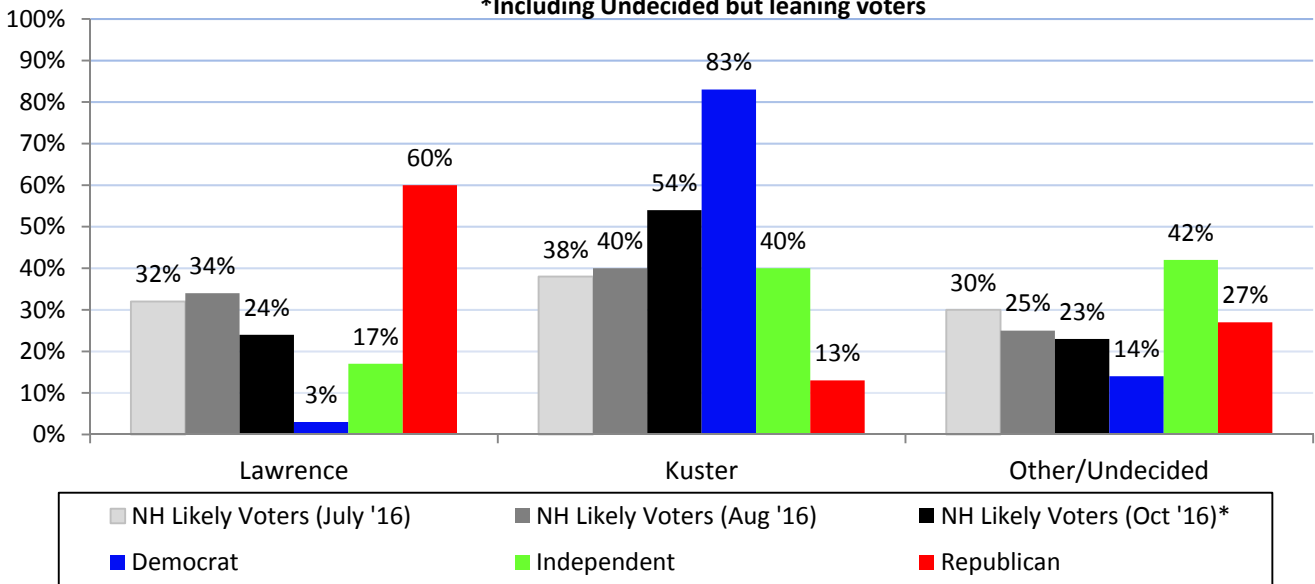
### Kuster vs. Lawrence – 2<sup>nd</sup> District

In New Hampshire’s Second District, incumbent Ann Kuster is being challenged by Republican Jim Lawrence. If the election was held today, 51% of 2<sup>nd</sup> District likely voters say they would vote for Kuster, 23% would vote for Lawrence, 5% would vote for someone else, and 21% are undecided.

When undecided voters are asked which way they are leaning the percentages become 54% for Kuster, 24% for Lawrence, 5% for someone else and 17% are undecided. Kuster does better among Democrats (83%-3%) than Lawrence does among Republicans (60%-13%), and Kuster has the advantage among Independents (40%-17%).

### Kuster vs Lawrence -- 2nd District Likely Voters

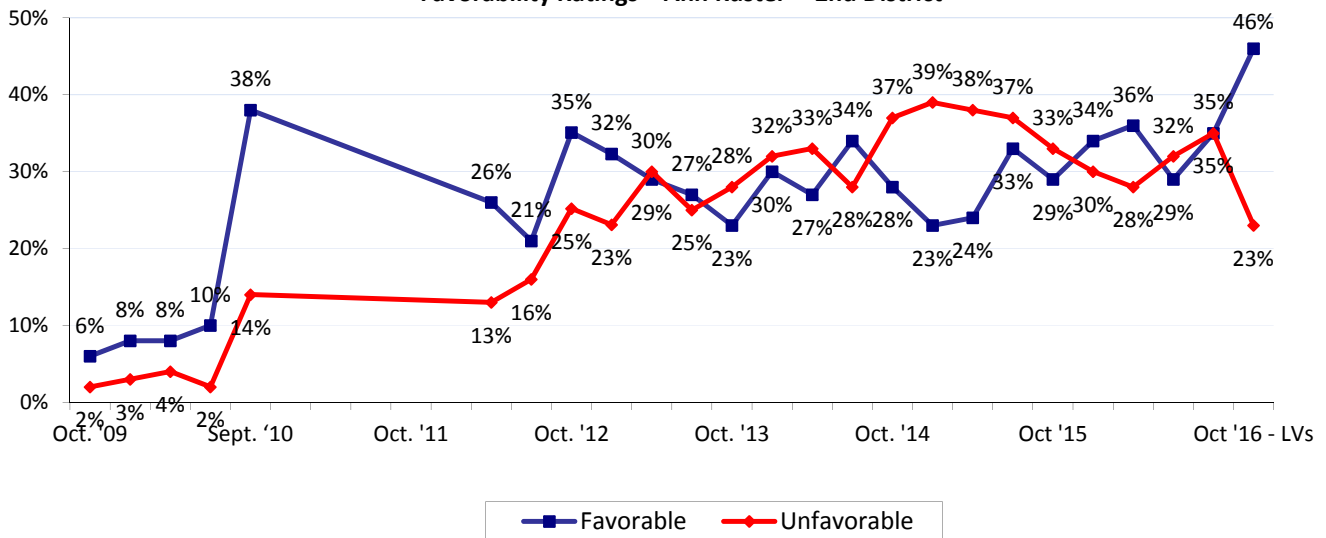

### Favorability Ratings – Ann Kuster

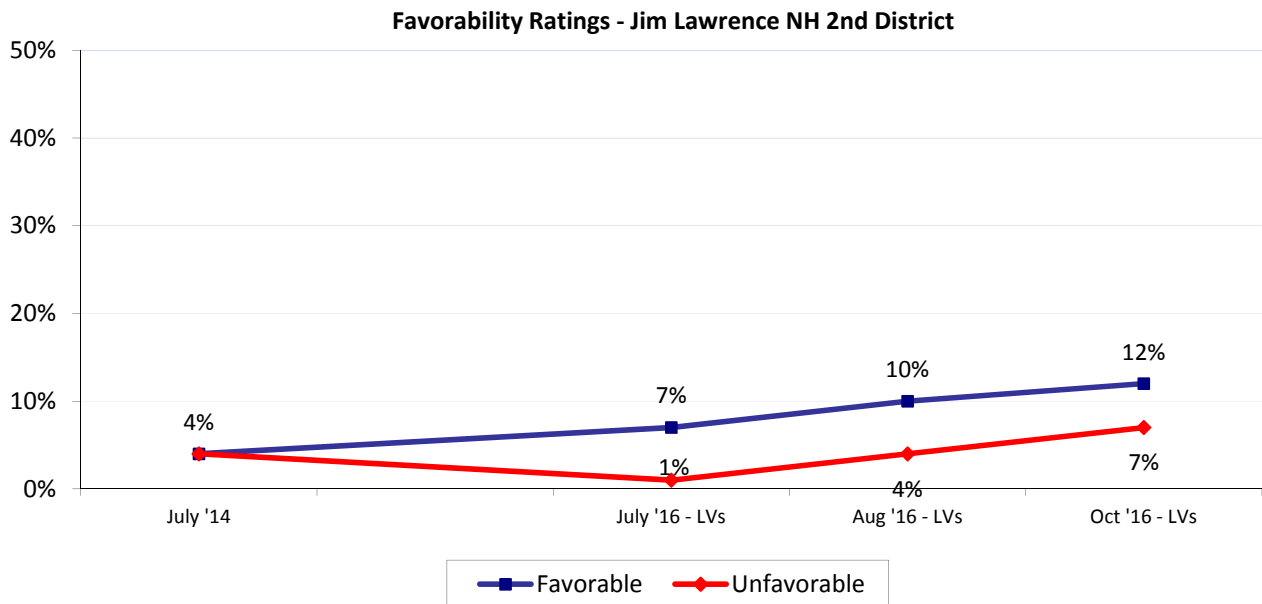
Kuster, who has not been particularly popular during her tenure in Congress, is now viewed favorably by voters in her district. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 46% of 2<sup>nd</sup> District likely voters have a favorable opinion of Kuster, 23% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 3% are neutral, and 28% don’t know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is +23%, up significantly from 0% in August. She is very popular among Democrats (net +64%), popular among Independents (+14%), and unpopular among Republicans (-33%).

### Favorability Ratings – Ann Kuster -- 2nd District

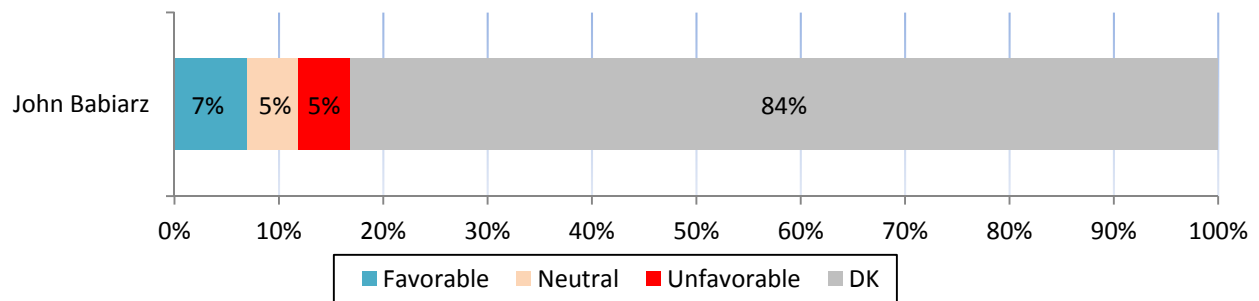


### Favorability Ratings – Jim Lawrence

Despite making his second run for Congress, former State Representative Jim Lawrence is unknown to most district voters -- 12% have a favorable opinion of Lawrence, 7% have an unfavorable opinion, 5% are neutral, and 76% don't know enough about him to say. Lawrence's net favorability is +5%.



The remaining candidate on the ballot, Independent John Babiartz, is also not well known in the district. Only 7% have a favorable opinion of Babiartz, 4% have an unfavorable opinion, 7% are neutral, and 82% don't know enough about him to say. Babiartz's net favorability is +3%.



### Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center and funded by WMUR-TV, Manchester, NH. Nine hundred and seven (907) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between October 11 and October 17, 2016. If a household included more than one adult, the adult who had the most recent birthday was selected to be interviewed.

The margin of sampling error is +/- 3.3 percent for the entire sample. Included were seven hundred seventy (770) likely 2016 general election voters (MSE +/- 3.5%). Four hundred and forty-nine (449) residents (MSE = +/- 4.6%) and three hundred and seventy-six (376) likely voters (MSE = +/- 5.1%) were from the First Congressional District and four hundred and fifty-eight (458) residents (MSE +/- 4.6%) and three hundred and ninety-four (394) likely voters (MSE +/- 4.9%) were from the Second District. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.1%.

The random sample used in the WMUR Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
