WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Tamworth in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Tamworth on Tuesday, the Tenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Recommended amount \$6700.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing highways and ploughing snow for the ensuing year. Recommended amount \$6000.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing and building bridges. Recommended amount \$500.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day observance. Recommended amount \$10.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise in addition to the amount required by law for the support of the Town Library. Recommended amount—a total of \$250.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$800.00 for the support of the Tamworth Community Nurse. Recomended amount \$500.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs of snow removal equipment. Recommended amount \$700.
 - 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize

the Selectmen to distribute the Inventory blanks at the time they examine and appraise taxable property.

- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 for Tarvia. Recommended amount \$800.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collectors' deeds.
- 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Tamworth Fire Precinct.
- 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Wonalancet Fire Precinct.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 to be applied to the town indebtedness. Recommended amount \$1000.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 for the construction of the Deer Hill road provided the state shall oppropriate the sum of \$2000.00 for the same purpose. Recommended amount \$1000.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to set aside from the summer highway appropriation, the sum of \$400.00 for the improvement of the highway leading from the foot of Stevenson Hill to Sandwich line via Jackson Hill, and from the intersection of said road to Ellery Corner.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to accept state aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$776.43 for the same. Recommended amount \$776.43.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint one or more highway agents.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to contract the breaking of snow on

the town highways, or the whole town or any part of the town.

- 21. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of \$300.00 for the Moore pond lot so called.
- 22. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of the roller house lot, located at the intersection of the Whittier road and White Lake road.
- 23. To see if the town will vote to give Herbert A. Palmer his note for \$645.22.
- 24. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen and road agents to forbid the plowing of all private door yards, unless a fee ranging from \$2.50 to \$10.00, to be established by the Selectmen, be paid in advance.
- 25. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF FINANCE COMMITTEE

Unforeseen increases in State and County taxes, and the expenditure of \$2,350.00 on the construction of the Bemis School instead of using this fund for the general purposes of the School District, operated last year to produce a tax rate of \$3.30, in excess of the budget estimate by \$.40. Increases in expenditures necessary for relief, old age assistance, and highway maintenance have produced an operations deficit for the year of about \$1,100.00.

The School Board's budget, presented elsewhere in this report, is approved. The raising of sums indicated on the copy of the Town warrant contained in this report, approved by this Committee, in connection with the School Board's budget, should produce a tax rate of \$3.20, allowing for estimated further increases in State and County taxes, and an overlay of \$1,500.00.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

I herewith submit my thirteenth annual report as superintendent of schools.

Rollo G. Reynolds has pointed out four things which should be the heritage of every American child.

- 1. He has a right to a strong, healthy body.
- 2. He has the right to develop an honest mind and ability to think in face of evidence.
- 3. Trained hands
- 4. The right to a living soul from which comes the good in life.

Schools are trying to provide these things for our boys and girls. From the first grade to the end of our high school there is opportunity to direct child development. And the best way to prepare for the problems of the future is to do honestly and intelligently the tasks of the present. The youth prepares today's lesson and is better prepared for tomorrow's tasks. He cares for his body now and gains strength for the future. He keeps his mind open to the best things. He learns that life is not for self alone.

High School

Our high school graduated its first class last June. The program was such as to draw favorable comment from the state agent who was present. This year we have a class of ten who expect to graduate. The enrolment of the school at present is 39. Activities in music and athletics have been successful. Our orchestra joined with the orchestra from Ossipee High School in giving a public concert which was worthwhile and much appreciated. Prize speaking, debating and dramatics are among the worthwhile club activities. The school is now organized with a full four-year program.

School Property

The property has been kept in good condition, as usual. The special improvement is in the fine new

building at South Tamworth for the Bemis School. As the name indicates, Mr. and Mrs. Bemis gave the lot and the building which had been a two story residence built with best workmanship. This gift was accepted by the district and, under the careful and faithful guidance of Mr. Charles A. Wiggin, Chairman of the school board, this building has been made into a fine two-room school building. It was possible to provide a library reading-room for each school and spacious halls for lunches and coats. With South Tamworth and Bennett's Corner combined, there is an opportunity for excellent school work—as good as have in any school in town—equal to that in the village schools.

Appreciation is hereby expressed to Mr. and Mrs. Bemis for the gift and to Mr. Wiggin for his untiring efforts in remodelling for school use.

Health Work

The health work is in the care of Dr. Edwin C. Remick and the community nurse, Miss Ruth Allen, R. N. Examinations have been made and Miss Allen is very busy checking defects and preventing spread of disease. Mr. Wiggin has kindly opened his house for a dental clinic which will serve the pupils' needs. Miss Allen's report is included.

Attendance

For the year ending June 30, 1935, we had an average attendance of 158.5, an average membership of 164.7 and a percent of attendance of 96.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE Tamworth, N. H.

To the Townspeople, School Board and the Superintendent of Schools:

On October 1, 1935, I took up the work which Mrs. Maloney had so successfully begun during the first half of the school year.

Eight children had visual defects corrected under the Child Recovery Program and for whom glasses were provided. The bill amounted to sixty-nine dollars and was paid out of Federal funds.

There are no Federal funds available now, either for corrective work or for free milk in the schools.

Eight pints of cod liver oil have been used for school and pre-school children.

Six first aid kits have been placed in the schools, so that each school is now equipped for any ordinary emergency.

The audiometer, a scientific device for testing hearing, was loaned to us, from the state, for the hearing tests.

I wish to thank those who have assisted at our clinics, either with their services or with their cars.

The cooperation of the people and parents of the community has been much appreciated.
