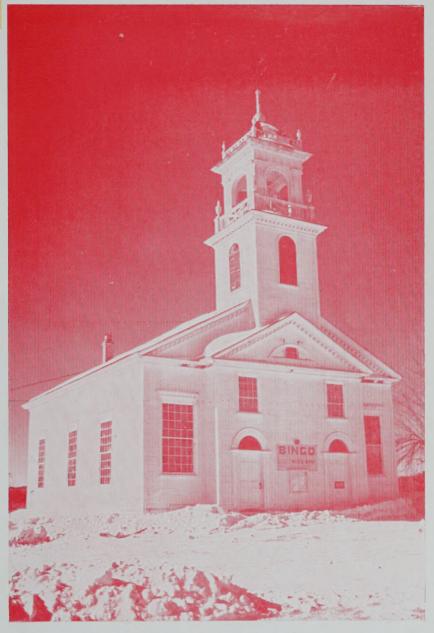

### Town Warrant

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Unity in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Unity on the second Tuesday of March next—March 12, 1963, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

To choose all necessary Officers, Agents and Trustees, for the ensuing year under the Australian Ballot System.

- 1. To choose a Selectman for the ensuing three years.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing one year.
- 3. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing one year.
- 4. To choose an Overseer of Public Welfare for the ensuing one year.
- 5. To choose a Tax Collector for the ensuing one year.
- 6. To choose two Auditors for the ensuing one year.
- 7. To choose a Highway Agent for the ensuing one year.
- 8. To choose a Library Trustee for the ensuing three years.
- 9. To choose a Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years.
- 10. To vote on the following question: "Shall the provisions of Chapter 287 of the Revised Statutes Annotated relative to playing games of Beano be adopted in this town?"

### BUSINESS MEETING CALLED TO ORDER AT 2 O'CLOCK

- To hear the report of the Selectmen and other Town officials and pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 2. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for other Town Charges.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay Librarian's Salary and Library Tax.

- To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance and Town Poor Charges.
- To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay Just Debts of the Town.
- 7. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of Highways and Bridges, Snow Removal, and determine price to be paid for labor and trucks.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$150.00 for the control of Blister Rust.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$744.48 for Town Road Aid. If this sum is raised the State will contribute \$4.963.19.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 for the benefit of the Unity Volunteer Fire Dept. Inc., the Fire Dept. to have authority to spend any part of this money for Civilian Defense Equipment for the Fire Dept.
- To see if the Town will vote by ballot to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of property acquired by Tax Collectors' Deeds.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- To see if the Town will vote to raise one-hundredth of one percent of valuation for the benefit of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Association.
- 14. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the Town's share of Social Security.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a committee to work with them in planning events and placing markers, and designating roads in commemoration of the 200th Anniversary of the Town of Unity.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money not to exceed the sum of \$200.00 to aid in carrying out the above program.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money to redecorate and furnish in an appropriate manner so that it can be used, the Selectmen's Room in the Town Hall; and to dedicate it to Charles Newton and Orrin Bailey in grateful recognition of their long service to the Town of Unity.

- 18. To see if the Town will vote to elect one overseer of Cemeteries whose duty it will be to direct the expenditure of the Town Cemetery Funds and to maintain the Unity Cemeteries in a decent manner.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$125.00 for the East Unity Cemetery; \$125.00 for the Unity Center Cemetery; and \$50.00 for the West Unity Cemetery, said sums to be expended under the direction of the Overseer of Cemeteries.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to allocate from the Town Charges a sum not to exceed \$200.00 for repairing and painting the Hearse Shed and fence at the Unity Center Cemetery. Said sum to be expended under the supervision and direction of the Overseer of Cemeteries.
- 21. To see what action the town will take in regard to the purchase of a grader and plow, and raise a sum of money not to exceed \$6,000.00; said sum to be paid over a period of five years with interest.
- To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To see if the district will authorize the School Board to appropriate receipts from federal lunch reimbursements, tuition, gifts and any other receipts from miscellaneous sources, in addition to the original appropriation for 1963-1964, for the lunch program, general expenses, equipment and improvements.
- 10. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to make application for and to receive, in the name of the district, such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the U.S. Government and/or state agencies.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

### Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and Citizens of the Unity School District, I respectfully submit my annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

#### TEACHING STAFF

Our school year began on September 5th. Three of our regular teachers returned, leaving only one change in our staff for the fall term. Mrs. Lois Cragin resigned to accept a more lucrative position in the Newport Schools. We are very appreciative of the fine work that Mrs. Cragin has done over the years, in the interest of the children in the Unity School.

Miss Nancy Buswell was appointed to succeed Mrs. Cragin in the Primary Room. She graduated from Keene Teachers College last June. Her home is in Claremont.

#### EXPECTED SCHOOL ENROLLMENT 1963 - 1964

It is expected that we will have a first grade entering class of fifteen pupils in September, 1963. This would give us an estimated total school enrollment of one hundred and one pupils. The room assignments would be as follows:

#### **MAINTENANCE**

Mrs. Marjorie Smith continued this year as custodian of the building, and we are very appreciative of her efforts in making our school facilities comfortable and most livable.

During the summer an extensive improvement program was scheduled and completed. The Assembly Room, Reception Hall, and Kitchen were re-decorated. Also, all desks were cleaned, sanded and varnished.

#### STATE AID AND INCOME

We received this year from the State of New Hampshire \$20,908.67 in Foundation Aid. Also the sum of \$847.35 in Building Aid. These amounts together with about \$200 in Trust Funds gave us a total income of approximately \$21,960.00. This amount can help immeasureably in reducing the monies necessary to be raised by local assessment.

#### **CAFETERIA**

Mrs. Dorothy Lemere was appointed cook in our school cafeteria beginning September, 1962. We have been more than pleased with her supervision of the school lunch program. All children who have wished to do so, have had an opportunity to take advantage of this auxiliary school service. Monthly shipment of government surplus foods have helped finance this program, and enabled us to serve meals at a minimum cost to the children.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. That the windows on the East Side of the building be weather-stripped to make our rooms more comfortable on windy days during the winter months.
- 2. That improvements be made in the driveway and culvert in the front of the building, where repairs are definitely needed.
- 3. That some arrangement be made for providing a windbreak for the outside doors on the north side of the building, doors which serve as exits for the lower grade rooms.
- 4. That the kitchen be provided with screens and the tables in the cafeteria be recovered with plastic tops.
- 5. That some thought be given in the near future to the construction of a small addition in the available storage facilities for miscellaneous equipment and janitorial supplies.

#### **SUMMARY**

In my opinion this has been a very satisfactory year at the Unity School. Elsewhere in this Annual Report you will find the reports of the School Principal and the Nurse. They have given a detailed outline of the activities of the children during the school year. I hope you will read those reports with interest and satisfaction.

I wish to thank the School Board, the Teachers, and the Citizens of Unity for their support and loyalty. I am very appreciative of this cooperation. Working together we can continue to maintain a high standard of education, and give the people of Unity a school of which they may be proud.

#### UNITY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

One of the special activities of the past year has been a continuation of the Physical Fitness Program under the direction of Mr. Douglass Reed, Y.M.C.A. Secretary for the Western District.

The television courses have continued. For grades 1 through 4, "Book Parades", grades 3 and 4, "New Hampshire History", and "Science", grades 5 and 6, "Science" and "Art", and grades 7 and 8, "Art" and "Careers".

Open House, combined with the annual Book Fair, was well attended. The books again were furnished by Mrs. Waite's "Book Stall". Miss Caroline Stoughton gave book reviews to the upper grades and Mrs. Tenney held a story hour for the lower grades. A book poster contest was an added feature of this year's fair.

At Christmas time a pageant was presented, and a Christmas tree and gifts were supplied by the Unity P.T.A.

We report with special pride that seven Unity children were winners in the George E. Lewis Fire Poster Contest.

The most notable changes at school are our new first and second grade teacher, Miss Nancy Buswell and our new cook, Mrs. Dorothy LeMere.

Mrs. Shute, the Town Librarian, is present every Thursday with books from the library.

\$100 of the proceeds from the magazine drive has been used to buy books as a nucleus for a school library. From the same fund a set of required 7th and 8th grade literature books have been purchased.

 $\ensuremath{\mathrm{H.M.S.}}$  Pinafore is in rehearsal and will be presented by the school in April.

The class trip to Lost River was enjoyed so much by the graduating class of last year that the present 8th grade is hoping to make the same trip this Spring.

### Report of School Nurse

In submitting my tenth annual report to the citizens of Unity, I would like to summarize a portion of the work carried out in the school health program during the 1961-62 school year.

One hundred eighteen vision tests were done. From this number eight defects were found, reported and corrected.

Ninety-three hearing tests and five audiograms were done. One defect was reported and the child was examined by a physician.

One hundred fifteen children were weighed, measured and examined for noticeable defects.

Dental Health continues to be a major problem in all areas. The Unity P.T.A. has been very interested in this problem and has sponsored a Dental Clinic for the past nine years. Partial financial assistance is received from the Matching Fund Program under the N. H. State Department of Health but the major cost of this dental program is borne by the P.T.A. volunteer drivers from the P.T.A. who transport the children to the clinic. Dr. Karl Rund of Claremont has carried this program for us during the past five years. The children, for the most part, look forward to "going to the dentist"—many of them for the first time. We appreciate the work Dr. Rund has done as well as his real interest in the dental health of the school children. During this past year twenty-eight children attended the clinic and were treated.

A Tuberculin Patch Testing program is carried out yearly in grades one, three, five, seven and eight. Fifty-one children were Patch tested. Four of these children had chest x-rays through the State sponsored Tuberculosis program. All reports were negative.

Immunization Clinics were held during the year. One hundred five school children were given booster inoculations of Salk Vaccine—seventeen pre-school children and nine adults. Diphtheria-Tetanus Toxoid was given seventeen school children in grades one and two. Triple Toxoid was given nine pre-school children and five pre-school children were vaccinated against Small-Pox.

During the summer of 1962 Sabin (oral) Vaccine was made available to pre-school children in three nearby communities—this program included Unity. In September, 1962 the Sabin Vaccine

was made available to school children, pre-school children as well as adults through the Sullivan County Medical Association. Donations of twenty-five cents per treatment were requested—if a person was able to pay—otherwise no one was denied the Vaccine. Seventy-three children completed the series of Vaccine.

I would like to express my thanks to you all for your interest and fine support in helping to carry out our School Health Program.
