Snow Obstruction. If any person shall put or place or cause to be put or placed any snow or ice upon the surface of the traveled portion of any highway for any purpose, except to provide a place necessary for crossing, recrossing and traveling upon said highways by sleds, logging or farm equipment, he shall be fined not more than one hundred dollars. The provisions of this section shall not apply where snow or ice is pushed across the traveled surface of said highways for the purpose of snow removal from land adjoining said highways.

TOWN WARRANT State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Brookfield in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Brookfield on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at one of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the changes to the Zoning and Land Use Ordinance as proposed and advertised by the Brookfield Planning Board.
3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of 1978 taxes.
4. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid on Class V Highways and appropriate the sum of \$309.60 as the Town's share.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4782.32 for the Sanbornville Fire Precinct and \$1,000.00 for forest fires.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2340.80 for use of the Sanbornville Dump.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Gafney Library.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for Huggins Hospital.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450.00 for Public Health Visiting Nurse Service.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$173.50 for the Carroll County Mental Health Service.
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to update the Tax Map for 1978.
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the Lakes Region Association.
13. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$3,000.00 to the Capital Reserve Fund for Town Road Equipment.
14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to rehabilitate the cemeteries in the Town of Brookfield.
15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, contract, and accept any and all monies made available from Federal or State Funds or other sources, and take all necessary action hereunder, as may be required in their discretion.
16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$783.20, as the Town's share for maintaining the Wakefield Ambulance.

17. To see if the Town of Brookfield will vote to accept a dog leash law which restricts dogs to their owners property or otherwise on a leash. A breach of the law requires a graduated fine for the first and successive offenses, the amount to be determined by the Selectmen and paid to the Town. By Petition:

18. To see if the Town will vote to withdraw the sum of \$762.80 from the Revenue Sharing Fund to pay the Beaver Corporation for the remainder of the bill for the Fire Vault Room.

19. To see if the Town will vote to withdraw the sum of \$1,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Fund for gravel for Tibbetts Hill Road.

20. To see if the Town will vote to withdraw the sum of \$6,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Fund to upgrade Lyford Road.

21. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate by withdrawal from the Capital Reserve Fund a sum not to exceed \$26,000.00 for the purchase of a new Truck and Sander. The Selectmen to negotiate the purchase of the truck and sander by bids for the best interest of the Town.

22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell in the best interest to the Town, the present Town Truck and Sander, provided Article 21 is passed.

23. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of RSA 72:43-b and 43-c (Old age exemption): "Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72:43-c for expanded exemptions on real estate which provide for a resident 65 years of age up to 75, a \$5,000. exemption; a resident 75 years of age up to 80, a \$10,000. exemption; a resident 80 years of age or older, a \$20,000. exemption, provided that the resident owns the real estate individually or jointly with another or his spouse with whom he has been living for at least 5 years as man and wife; said resident had a net income of less than \$7,000 or combined income with spouse of less than \$9,000; and owns assets of any kind, tangible or intangible, less bona fide encumbrances, not in excess of the value specified in RSA 72-c, III; provided that the exemptions shall be based upon the assessed value of the real estate.

24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to have the Town reappraised for the sum of \$10,000.

25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell the coal stove and water pump.

26. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$10,000 to purchase 4.4 acres of land adjacent to the Town Hall and presently owned by J. Steuchin.

27. "To see if the Town will vote to elect five members of the Planning Board in accordance with RSA 36 section (b) of said statute for a term of three years etc. as authorized by said statute and being fully covered by the amended RSA 532 in its entity". By Petition:

28. To see if the Town will vote to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ADMINISTRATION (Local Public Works Project)

In 1976 the Lakes Region Planning Commission provided information, technical assistance, and set up pertinent meetings for the Town of Brookfield regarding the Local Public Works Application and Funding which was awarded to the Town.

Upon notice of the award in 1977 the Selectmen engaged Rist-Frost Associates to assist in the detail work of having necessary repairs and restoration work in order to preserve and protect the Historic Buildings.

Specific areas of work recommended was a new roof and insulation for the Town Hall and attached School House, structural repair of perimeter sill, ventilation system of toilet facilities, fireproof existing furnace room, new artesian well, new Town garage, renovation of kitchen in Town Hall, exterior painting and storm windows, construction of parking area, entrance together with landscaping.

At this writing work is in progress.

The Lakes Region Planning Commission takes this opportunity to thank you, the Board of Selectmen, and the Planning Board for your continued support and interest in the Commission's Program. As you are aware, our primary objective is to support local community planning efforts and to be of service to the local community officials.

This past year, the Planning Commission completed an extensive environmental inventory and prepared a land capability analysis for the Town of Brookfield. The Commission has utilized that work in completing and adopting a broad Regional Land Use Plan. This Plan analyzes such policies as growth patterns, economic development, transportation, public facilities, open space and recreation, and defines objectives which the policies are designed to achieve.

Other regional programs, which the Commission has initiated, include: recommendations for action to protect water quality resulting from continued work on the 208 Water Quality Management Plan, including special testing procedures to identify water pollution resulting from failing septic systems; development of an economic base analysis and Overall Economic Plan which will lead to continued EDA funding for municipalities in the Region; finalizing a Rural Transit Plan for the Region; conducting meetings with the N. H. Department of Public Works and Highways to provide information to the towns regarding highway projects under construction or consideration; and an extended program of citizen participation and education, such as the Law Lecture Series which were well attended and highly praised by those attending.

The Planning Commission provided information, technical assistance, and set up pertinent meetings for the Town of Brookfield regarding the Local Public Works Application and Funding which was awarded to the Town.
