

the State of New Hampshire in the construction of bridges, and to hire necessary funds to provide the Town's share in any construction authorized and undertaken in the year ensuing.

6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for Town bridge construction or take any action thereto.

7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the tax collector to receive partial payments from any person, firm or corporation owning taxable property on April 1st and before tax bills of the amount of taxes assessed against said property for the year has been received. Such sums will be divisible by ten, but not less than ten dollars, and the tax collector shall receive such payments and give a receipt therefore and credit the amount toward the amount of taxes eventually assessed against said property.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to file in behalf of the Town an application (in form and manner required by the United States and in conformity with P. L. 560. 83rd Congress) and do whatever else may be required by an advance, in the amount of \$12,000., to be made by the United States to the Town of Canaan, New Hampshire, to aid in defraying the cost of preliminary report for sewerage and treatment facilities for the Town of Canaan; and further, to see if the Town will make necessary arrangements to provide such additional funds as may be required to defray the cost of preparation of the report.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$15,000.00 to purchase a new fire truck with a down payment of \$4,000 and the balance to be paid at the rate of \$2,000 per

year plus interest, or take any action thereto. This truck to be purchased by the Selectmen and a representative of the Fire Department.

## LIBRARY REPORT

This past year several changes have come about in our library work.

On April 26, the Canaan Town Library joined the State Wide Development Program. The immediate benefit was \$125 worth of free reference books. Since then, we have had better buying power by depositing our book money with the State Treasurer. We have a far better discount than any other book houses have been able to offer. We were fortunate in persuading Mrs. Eric Moore to serve as our library's representative to the area meetings. She has already met with the group and both she and Mrs. Cady look forward to attending the sessions. These are planned to talk over library problems, discuss ways of improving library services and every so often a book exhibit is set up for the group to have a chance to see and examine new books.

A matter of concern for some time has been our classical and reference section. With the able assistance of Mrs. Martha Pusey, Mrs. Cady has begun to weed out, replace old editions with small hard-to-read type and generally up-grade this particular section of our library.

Still to be taken care of is the \$50 gift given in the Chandler name. Something for the children's room is what the trustees feel Joe and Ruth Chandler would like. No decision on this has been made.

As our financial report shows, we are enjoying more income from the Trust Funds. The Miller Fund of last year and the Hinman Fund, which is new this year, are adding substantially to our income from the Trust Funds.

It was with regret that the Trustees learned of Col. Whitney's decision to make his home in Vermont. Through his efforts, we are the proud owners of the Encyclopedia Britannica

and a table in which to house it. His interest in our town library went beyond mere lip service. For the time he served on our board of trustees, we have many reasons to be grateful, for his interest was sincere and practical.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN  
AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Most of us who live in New Hampshire and the thousands of vacationists that visit us every year love the State for the variegated woodlands that encircle our clean lakes and clothe the hills and mountains. Most of us appreciate these values, but still there were enough careless people among us to cause over 880 grass and woodland fires to start in 1965. True this was a much dryer than normal year but this should have meant the use of extra care. Fortunately the fire fighting forces have held the line against such careless acts. It is up to each one of us to be ever mindful that a spark or flame is a potential fire.

**We Must All Be Careful:**

1. To teach our children the danger in lighting matches.
2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn rubbish or brush;
  - a. Always get a permit to burn from the warden.
  - b. Start your fire late in the day after 5:00 p.m.
  - c. If burning a field or brush have equipment and adequate help on hand. The heat from your fire creates its own draft to spread fire.

Our carelessness with fire is costing our State and Towns thousands of wasted dollars in suppression and hundreds of acres of destroyed woodlands. Yours never to enjoy.
