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WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Colebrook School Gymnasium in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday, the 5th day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
- To act upon all of the following articles contained in this warrant.
- To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Government Expenses for the ensuing year.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Police for the ensuing year.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Civilian Defense for the ensuing year.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operating expenses of Ambulance District A-1.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will rasie to pay on the construction debt of the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise as a contribution for the services of the Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Service, Inc.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Care, Removal and/or Replacement of Trees.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of Summer and Winter Roads for the ensuing year.

- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Expense of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lighting for the ensuing year.
- To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$1,027.40 for maintenance, construction, or reconstruction of Class V Highways, in the event, the State will contribute \$6,849.32.
- 15. To see if the Town, will vote to remove the snow from the Business area of the village, defining the area to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Plowing and Sanding Sidewalks, for the ensuing year.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.
- 18. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Poor for the ensuing year.
- To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance for the ensuing year.
- To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 for the observance of Memorial Day and care of the Monument Lot.
- 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Hydrant Rental for the ensuing year.
- 22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of \$840.47 to the White Mountain Region Association, being .07c per \$1,000.00 of equalized valuation, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town, in
- c cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500.00 for the construction of sidewalks in accordance with the vote at the 1951 Town Meeting for the ensuing year.

- 25. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for Cleaning Streets in the business area this summer and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the amount voted from the Parking Meter Fund.
- 26. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Tarring Streets.
- 27. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Street Construction, and to direct the Selectmen to place any unexpended balance in a special fund to be used for other streets in later years.
- 28. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of the Town Dump for the ensuing year.
- 29. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operation and construction of the Sewer and Water Departments and direct the Selectmen to place any unexpended balance in a Special Fund to be used for the same purpose in later years.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay on the principal of the bond issue for the Sewerage Facilities.
- 31. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the resurfacing of the Hospital Road and to authorize the withdrawal of such sum for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund to be transferred to the capital reserve fund known as the Special Dump Fund established at the 1969 Town Meeting and augmented by further appropriation under Article 36 of the Warrant for the Annual Town Meeting of 1973.
- 33. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for the use of the Town Planning Board for the ensuing year.
- 34. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000.00 for the purpose of renovation of the Town Hall and purchase of furnishings and equipment for same and to authorize the withdrawal of the amount not exceeding \$5,000.00 for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, the balance, the sum of not exceeding \$10,000.00 to be raised by the issuance of serial Bonds or Notes under and

in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (Chapter 33 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, and any amendments thereto) and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such Bonds or Notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such Bonds or Notes as shall be in the best interest of the Town of Colebrook.

- 35. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) for part payment of the Reappraisal of the Town and authorize the Selectmen to place this money in a capital reserve fund for future expenditures for said purpose and to further authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- 36. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the purchase of new fire hose for the Fire Department and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw such sum from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- 37. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of a new sidewalk snowplow.
- 38. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for reconstruction of Colby Street.
- 39. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of repairing and resurfacing roads outside the precinct and to authorize the withdrawal of such sum for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the Provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- 40. To see whether the Town will, pursuant to revised Statutes Annotated, 245.6 by major vote authorize the Selectmen beginning and effective as of the Town Meeting of 1975, to appoint one or more Highway Agents, instead of electing same by ballot, said vote if passed to continue in effect until changed by major vote at an annual or special Town Meeting. (Inserted By Committee Request) ,
- 41. To see what sum the Town of Colebrook will appropriate for the purchase and installation of metal street signs and poles. (Inserted By Petition.)

- To see what sum the Town of Colebrook will appropriate for the maintenance of the Colebrook Skating rink. (Inserted by Petition)
- 43. To see if the Town of Colebrook will raise the amount of \$2,000.00 as its share in the support of Convalesce. (Inserted by Petition)
- 44. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 as a donation to the support of Alpha House, a group home for boys in Lancaster, serving the needs of boys with family and social problems in Coos and Grafton counties. (Inserted By Petition)
- 45. To elect by ballot a public representative from the Town of Colebrook to the Revised Board of Directors of the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Association for a term of one year. (Inserted by Request)
- 46. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Colebrook National Bicentennial Executive Committee to oversee this Towns participation in the celebration and to designate this same Committee as a steering Committee for a Colebrook Historical Society with instructions to report plans for both at the 1975 Town Meeting.
- 47. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,122.00 as the Towns share for operation of the North Country Council for one year, beginning July 1, 1974. These funds will be used for financing staff, office and general operating expenses, regional planning studies, technical assistance to member communities, coordination with local, State and Federal agencies, and other programs of the Council. These funds may be used in conjunction with State and Federal funds available for planning purposes.
- 48. To see if the Town will vote Pursuant to R. S. A. 31:104, 31:105, 31:106, 31:107 and 31:108 to provide indemnification for Town Officers and employees and officers and employees of special districts within the Town from personal loss or expense including reasonable legal fees and costs, if any, arising out of any claim, demand, suit or judgement by reason of negligence or other act resulting in accidental damage to property providing the indemnified person was at the time of the accident acting within the scope of his employment or office.

- 49. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to non-profit organizations, including heat, lights, and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interest of the Town and at the discretion of the Selectmen, for the ensuing year.
- 50. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticiaption of taxes, for the ensuing year.
- 51. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds, or owned by the Town or any agency thereof, and until such sale is made, to administer the property in the best interest of the Town.
- 52. To see if the Town, will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, and all other Town Officers, as contained in the Annual Report of the said Town for the year ending December 31, 1972.
- To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

This fund was established at the 1952 Town Meeting upon a recommendation of a committee to study the sidewalk situation in Colebrook. Since that year a sum of \$1,500.00 has been appropriated annually except for 1963, 1964, 1971, 1972 and 1973. The Selectmen were directed to construct new or reconstruct existing sidewalks within the limits of this fund.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The New Hampshire Forest Fire Service is represented in every town, city or unorganized place in our state by the forest fire warden. Anyone wishing to kindle an outside fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the fire warden. Except for cooking fires, no fire can be kindled between 9:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M. unless it is a commercial or industrial burn or it is raining. The fire warden is assisted in his work by the District Forest Fire Chief who works for the Department of Resources and Economic Development Forest Fire Service.

Fire prevention was, again this year, the most important part of the Forest Fire Warden's job. Fire statistics show the need with 72% of the fires caused by smoking, debris burning and children. Smokey the Bear is an important prevention tool but he still needs much help from the public. Parents should warn their children of the hazards of playing with matches. Children tend to forget that a lighted match held in their hand is a potential forest fire.

REPORT OF SERVICE RENDERED IN THE TOWN OF COLEBROOK

Over the past three years, Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Service, Inc. has provided a wide range of services to the people of our valley towns. Overall community response to the agency has increased and we have an average of 16 new admissions each month. Counseling, school consultations, and treatment programs are being maintained, and have been of benefit to 44 individuals and their families in Colebrook during 1973.

Mental health staff members work with school personnel in developing flexible programs for assisting students with problems. Working jointly with parents, teachers, and other helping people, such as the school nurse, students are offered counseling, as well as psychological evaluations in appropriate cases. We have also begun recently to be involved in discussion groups with high school students.

Again this year, admissions of area residents to New Hampshire Hospital have been minimal, and those returning to the community have been able to remain at home through the availability of local care.

Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Service is near the people it is meant to serve. Our office is open 9 to 5, with evening appointments available if that is the only time a client can be seen. Staff is available through the hospital switchboard for psychiatric emergencies. Since the agency is locally based, people can get help quickly, with the result that very few residents need leave the area for assistance.

Colebrook's contribution to Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Service is important to our continued service. Contributions help obtaining matching funds from State and other sources, and it helps us provide staff for help when it is needed. Costs are kept low as possible without impairing the quality of care. Per capita costs for our area are far below those of other rural mental health programs.

Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Service meets all State and professional standards for such programs, and is a full member of the New Hampshire Association of Community Mental Health Agencies.

Our staff is prepared to respond to your requests.'
