## RECORD OF ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

---

Dunbarton, N. H.  
March 11, 1958

Meeting called to order and the Warrant read by Moderator Arthur Powell, at three o'clock in the afternoon. Check list posted and polls opened for balloting.

Motion by D. B. Montgomery that "the articles be taken up only in the order in which they appear in the Town Warrant" was passed with no dissenting votes.

Motion by Arthur H. Newell that the polls be closed at 8:30 in the afternoon was acted on in the affirmative.

Action on all articles was delayed until 8:00 o'clock in accordance with the Warrant posted and read.

Order again called at 8:00 o'clock.

Discussion was admitted by the Moderator regarding motion placed by D. B. Montgomery and accepted by the meeting earlier in the day. After much discussion a motion by Alfred Venator to rescind the first motion of the day was entertained and defeated. Votes cast 139; 2/3 or 92 to carry; vote 88 to 51.

Article No. 1. The following named were elected in open meeting:

*Town Forest Committee* — J. Willcox Brown.

*Health Officer* — Wilfred H. Marshall.

*Constables* — Wilfred H. Marshall and Arthur Powell.

*Scouters* — Center, Charles Weatherbee; East, Walter E. Warriner; North, Warren Spofford.

*Fence Viewers* — Elin N. Noyes, Ralph C. Walker, and L. Webster Burnham.

*Surveyors of Wood and Lumber* — Fred C. Blackman, William L. Merrill, C. Allen Fuller, Jr., Ernest Dugrenier and Carroll Crosby.

*Auditors* — Earle H. Stone and Earl Hadley.

*Overseer of Welfare* — Selectmen of Dunbarton.

*Hog Reeves* — Earl Hadley, Henry Blackman. Earl Hadley was sworn in immediately by Moderator Powell.

Article No. 2. It was moved by Eli N. Noyes and voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,520.00 to defray Town Charges.

Amendment by Richard Hammond that the Selectmen be authorized to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to increase Liability Insurance Coverage on town employees to \$100,000.00 and \$300,000.00 and to increase fire insurance on Town Hall, Town Shed and Fire House not to exceed twice the present amount. Also to increase the Fire Department Property Insurance not to exceed \$1,000.00 valuation.

Article No. 3. On motion of Arthur H. Newell \$2,000.00 was raised and appropriated for General Highway Expense.

Article No. 4. The sum of \$6,500.00 was raised and appropriated for Summer Maintenance on motion by J. Gardiner Mills.

Article No. 5. On motion of Eli N. Noyes it was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 for Winter Maintenance.

Article No. 6. \$819.73 was raised and appropriated to match the sum of \$5,464.87 contributed by the State of New

Hampshire for Class V Roads on motion by Arthur H. Newell.

Article No. 7. A motion to pass over this article by John Swindlehurst was defeated. Motion by J. Willcox Brown to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for White Pine Blister Rust control was then passed.

Article No. 8. Appropriation of \$3,361.53 (Auto Permit Money) for tar on the Town Roads was introduced by J. Gardiner Mills and voted by the assembly.

Article No. 9. The sum of \$3,100.00 was raised and appropriated for Town Poor, Dependent Soldiers and Old Age Assistance on motion by Eli N. Noyes and in the sequent amounts of \$1,900.00, \$200.00 and \$1,000.00.

Article No. 10. Motion by J. Gardiner Mills to raise and appropriate \$25.00 for Memorial Day was amended by Eli N. Noyes "to turn this money over to the Legion if Legion still holds a Charter." Both were passed by popular vote.

Article No. 11. A motion calling for raising and appropriating \$250.00 for support of the Library by Katherine Fuller was afforded passage.

Article No. 12. On motion by J. Gardiner Mills \$450.00 was raised and appropriated for care of the cemeteries and distributed as follows: Center, \$200.00; North, \$75.00; East, \$75.00; General incidental, \$100.00.

Article No. 13. It was voted to pay the Tax Collector one half of one per cent on net collections (less discounts and abatements) on motion by Eli N. Noyes.

Article No. 14. A motion to raise and appropriate \$14.00 for the Concord Hospital and to accept and turn over to

same any gifts or donations up to \$114.00 was introduced by J. Willcox Brown.

Amendment by Alfred Venator that any amounts subscribed by individuals be added to this amount.

Amendment by Robert Baker that a like amount be raised and appropriated for each of the following: Elliott, Sacred Heart, Notre Dame and Moore General.

Both amendments were then withdrawn and the original motion was passed.

Article No. 15. Motion by Fred Mills, Jr. to raise the water rent from \$15.00 to \$25.00 met with approval.

Amendment by Katherine Fuller that the Town be responsible for all repairs to pipe lines to water users was defeated.

Article No. 16. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for removing fire hazards relating to the Town Hall chimneys on motion by Alfred Venator.

Amendment by John Swindlehurst that this money be taken from Town Hall maintenance failed to meet with approval.

Article No. 17. \$100.00 was raised and appropriated for General Expenses of the Planning Board on motion by John Ballam.

Amendment by Arthur H. Newell that this include any expense to date was carried.

Article No. 18. On motion of John Ballam it was voted to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 for work on Dudley Hill and East Cemetery roads.

Amendment by John Swindlehurst to take this from Summer money was defeated 40 to 54.

Article No. 19. A vote of 49 to 38 assured passing over of article on motion by Alfred Venator.

Article No. 20. \$1,000.00 was raised and appropriated for deposit in Capital Reserve Fund for Town equipment on motion by John Bunten.

Article No. 21. Motion by J. Willcox Brown to accept Zoning Ordinance as recommended by Planning Board with the exception that the term Residential Agricultural District and all references to such district be stricken from the ordinance met with defeat 58 to 63. Upon insistence of J. Willcox Brown a recount was granted by the Moderator with the net result of another further defeat 65 to 72.

Article No. 22. Motion by J. Willcox Brown that the Town accept the Building Code as recommended by the Planning Board excepting all references to Building Inspector and substituting Board of Selectmen therein was defeated 51 to 83.

Article No. 23. A rising vote of thanks was extended the Planning Board for their splendid and constructive efforts in regards to the proposed and recently deceased Zoning Ordinance and Building Code on request of J. Willcox Brown.

Article No. 24. On motion by John Swindlehurst it was voted to pass over this article.

Article No. 25. By vote of the Town a Finance Committee was established composed of nine members to be chosen by the Moderator by April 1st., 1958. John Bunten introduced this article.

Articles Nos. 26, 27, 28, 29. These were passed over in quick succession by popular vote.

Article No. 30. John Swindlehurst's motion to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds was amended to the effect that property and purchaser be noted in the annual Town Report.

A further amendment by Joseph Iriana was that such property be advertised in public places by the Selectmen.

Both the amendments and the motion passed.

Article No. 31. On motion by Norman Vigue it was voted to allow a 1¼% discount on all property taxes paid within two weeks after the mailing of the bills.

Article No. 32. Authorization was given the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes on motion by Robert Baker.

Article No. 33. It was voted to pass over this article on motion by Arthur H. Newell.

Article No. 34. \$350.00 was raised and appropriated for Fire Hose and Water Holes on motion by John Swindlehurst and in the sequent amounts of \$200.00 and \$150.00.

Article No. 35. It was voted to accept the Cemetery Trust Funds of Whipple, Hadley, Gourley, Dwyer and Barnard.

Motion of Ralph Walker to accept the reports as printed met with approval.

Article No. 36. The following resolution was offered by John Bunten — "to authorize the Selectmen to discontinue the practice of raising the assessed valuation of properties, just because it becomes necessary for an owner to have a well drilled to replace a previous well that is not sufficient for his family's use" — and accepted by the meeting.

## REPORT OF FINANCE COMMITTEE

---

The Dunbarton Finance Committee was established on a continuing basis under Article 25 of the 1958 town meeting warrant, with three positions to be filled by the Moderator each year. The committee has held eight meetings with an average attendance of 7 or 8 members.

Two meetings were held with the Selectmen and one with the School Board, primarily to review finances and budgets. A meeting was held with the Planning Board to discuss plans that might affect the future financial situation of the town.

The committee reviewed the school budget for 1959-60, and recommended certain reductions, totaling approximately \$1,235. The School Board accepted all but one minor recommendation of \$50.

The committee reviewed the town budget for 1959 and recommended to the Selectmen reductions of \$1,010.00 and some changes in listing last year's expenses. Unfortunately, the budget was not presented to the committee until just before the Town Report went to press.

The committee also recommends that :

(a) In future town budgets, new road construction, other than TRA, be shown as a separate item.

(b) The Selectmen explore before the 1960 town meeting the possibility of having a common custodian for the town hall and the school.

(c) Unless the town votes this year for a central heating system in the town hall, it is imperative that the chimney be repaired, to eliminate the fire hazard, as voted at the 1958 town meeting.

On the recommendation of the previous Finance Committee, the town set aside \$1,000 in a Capital Reserve Trust Fund for town equipment in 1958. The 1959 budgets allows for another \$1,000 addition to this fund.

The committee recommends that a similar Capital Reserve Trust Fund for a new fire house be set up at the 1959 town meeting.

The committee extends its thanks to the members of all boards that worked with our committee during the past year.

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of DUNBARTON in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet in the Town Hall in said Dunbarton on Tuesday the 10th day of March next at three of the clock in the afternoon and cast ballots from that hour until at least eight o'clock in the evening of said day for such Town Officers as may be listed on the ballot.

You are also notified to meet at the same place at eight o'clock in the evening of the same day, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all other necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of monies as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Highway Expenses.
4. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Summer Maintenance.

5. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Winter Maintenance.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$815.82 for Class V roads to match a sum of \$5,438.81 contributed by the State.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for White Pine Blister Control.

8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appropriate the sum of \$3,311.85 (the amount of motor vehicle fees for 1958) for applying tar to our Class V and/or T.R.A. roads.

9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of Town Poor, Dependent Soldiers and Old Age Assistance.

10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of the Library.

12. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of Cemeteries.

13. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Fire Hose and Water Holes.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$111 as a subsidy for the Concord Hospital.

15. To see if the town will vote a fixed rate or remuneration to be paid the Tax Collector for the collection of taxes.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money and place same in the Capital Reserve Fund for Town Equipment.

17. To see if the town will approve the proposed agreement between the UNITED STATES and the Town of Dunbarton for the relocation rearrangement and/or alteration of town roads, in connection with the Hopkinton-Everett Dam and Reservoir Project and authorize the Selectmen to enter into and execute an agreement with the United States in reference thereto.

18. To see if the Town will vote to grant authority to the Selectmen of Dunbarton to enter into an agreement with the State of New Hampshire, whereby the State of New Hampshire in connection with the Hopkinton-Everett Flood Control Project, will represent the Town of Dunbarton relation to all Engineering matters, plan rights of way, advertise for bids, and prepare and enter into contracts for and supervise the construction of relocated town roads.

19. To see if the town will vote to act upon and discuss all articles that are in the warrant by petition of the town voters.

20. To see if the town will vote to establish a Municipal Court in Dunbarton.

21. To see if the town will vote to set aside all surplus monies received by action of the Court as a fund to be used towards future expenses of the Court and Police Department.

22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for legal expenses of a Municipal Court.

23. To see if the town will vote the use of the Town Hall free to Elementary and High school children for properly

supervised recreational purposes, subject to the approval of the Selectmen or the School Board.

24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money and place same in a Capital Reserve Fund for a new Fire House.

25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50 to purchase advertising space in the 1960 Guide of the Merrimack Valley Region, or act in relation thereto.

26. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500 for the purchase of the entire Page field, so called, adjoining North Dunbarton Cemetery.

27. To see what action the town will take on starting plans for the celebration of the 200th anniversary of the founding of the town, in 1961.

28. To see what action the town will take in regard to installing a central heating system for the lower half of the Town Hall and consider recommendations and bids for the same.

29. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the installation of a central heating system for the lower half of the Town Hall.

30. To see if the town will vote to make Lots Nos. 158A-155 and 245 (now held by the town) a part of the Town Forest. The Town Forest Committee to pay the sum of \$300 to the town for the same.

31. To see if the town will vote to enlarge the school playground area.

32. To see if the town will vote to appoint a committee to consist of one Selectman, one School Board Member and one Citizen to make such changes in the Town Hall kitchen as necessary to conform to school lunch regulations.

33. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150 for general expenses of the Planning Board.

34. To see if the town will vote to accept all trust funds not heretofore accepted.

35. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.

36. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on all taxes paid on or before the first of July.

37. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

38. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and make an appropriation to cover the cost of such audit.

39. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees and other Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

40. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## **REPORT OF POLICE DEPARTMENT**

**1958**

---

During the past year the Police Department has received essentially the usual number of complaints, among which have been breaking and entering, petty larceny, damage by dogs, suspicious persons, cars abandoned, and missing persons, all these cases having been investigated by the department.

A large per cent of the activities of the Police Department is centered about traffic violations. The greater number of offenders are speeders. The posted speed on Route No. 13 through Page's Corner is 35 mph and Dunbarton village is limited to 25 mph. The traffic is quite heavy in the morning and early evening on week days as many commuters pass through town on their way to work and returning home. Many have no regard for the regulations concerning speed and, despite the school warnings posted in the village, proceed through at a high rate of speed. The department is doing

all it can to slow the violators. When one is observed, the offender is stopped and a warning issued. If a complaint is made and a registration number supplied, the party responsible for the violation is contacted and warned that a second offense will mean a court appearance.

Other sections of the town also have traffic violators. Residents have complained of speeds in East and South Dunbarton where there is now a large area of black top road. When complaints have been made, the roads have been patrolled as much as possible.

Weekends and holidays also bring heavy traffic through the town. In the past year over two hundred warnings have been issued for speed, improper operation, stop sign violation, defective equipment, driving after drinking, passing school bus, and other offenses.

If any person or organization has any ideas or suggestions for the protection of persons or property, the Police Department would welcome the opportunity to discuss them.

In closing, we wish to thank the members of the Dunbarton Volunteer Fire Department and the residents who responded to our request for help in locating a lost child last summer.

**DUNBARTON VOLUNTEER FIRE  
DEPARTMENT, INC.**

The Fire Department has experienced a very busy year. This was due not only to a good demand for its services but a large number of projects started and completed.

There were 23 calls for our assistance during 1958. These calls were for fire protection, overturned vehicles, lost people, pumping water for cattle due to power failure, downed power lines and precautionary burning at town dump. There were only 2 fires which caused any large amount of loss. One of these was partially insured.

A new power oil burner has been installed in the Fire House. This is of a type approved for a garage occupancy and replaces a pot oil burner which is a hazard when left unattended and also not approved.

Alterations to the system for alerting of firemen were made, however, these were minor. A 1/3 H. P. Siren has been mounted above the Firehouse for alerting men near the fire hous. This is tested at 12:30 Sunday noon. We also appreciate the total cooperation of the Dunbarton Telephone Co. and employees.

The Movie Projector Fund has been completed with the financial assistance of several social organizations in town. The projector was purchased and put in service in June. A new fund has been started for a resuscitator for use on drownings, heat attacks, etc. The cost of this item is approximately \$550.00.

Fund raising this year proved very successful. This started with a Chicken Barbecue on June 29th. A Baked Bean Supper

proved successful on December 6th. These two events could not have been a success without the great effort put forth by the fire fighters and the wonderful support of all town people.

Considerable money was spent from our private fund to purchase various items we need. I shall submit a partial list: 1/3 H. P. Siren, 20 lbs. Dry Powder Extinguisher and truck bracket, 1 - 2½" x 1½" reducer, 10 - 1½" spanners, 1 - 1½" Double male coupling and female couplings, 7 Fire Helmets, 4 Fire Coats, 200' manila rope and 2 - 1½" running board brackets. Proceedings have started to purchase 2 Scott Air Pak. This has been handled by the Civil Defense Director, C. Allen Fuller, Jr. These 2 units cost \$275 each.

This private fund I speak of is money raised by pumping wells, burning grass, operating barbecues and suppers, dues of our members and direct donations to the department.

On July 31st, 1958, as chief of this department I was asked to be a member of a committee to draw up a constitution and by-laws of a proposed Federation of Fire Mutual Aid Associations. The reason for this was due to a desire to have a member on this committee who has no written Mutual Aid Agreements. After several meetings a proposal was brought into an open meeting and after slight alterations was accepted. Currently I enjoy a five year term on the executive committee. This organization appears to have strength with more than 50% of N. H. towns and cities represented. They are checking into the Fire Insurance rating bureau for some way to obtain lower rates for communities with some protection but not exactly what the present bureau standards demand.

I wish to thank everyone for cooperating with the fire department this past year. The Police Department's handling of traffic at fires has been greatly appreciated also.

#### YOU CAN HELP PREVENT FOREST FIRES

Twenty-five per cent of all forest fires in New Hampshire are caused from careless debris burning — brush, paper, leaves grass, etc. Most of them are started without the required permit from the local forest fire warden. The cost of extinguishing these fires annually runs into large sums of money.

According to law, responsible parties must pay the cost of putting them out. In addition, violators may be subject to court prosecution with fines running as high as (\$200) two-hundred dollars.

In the interest of fire prevention why not eliminate burning at home? Use your town dump. It has been set up for your personal convenience. It provides a suitable place for the disposal of dangerous inflammable waste material and other useless items which accumulate around the home and local stores; brush, etc., cut on your property. Eliminate the hazard of burning yourself. It will be easier for you — personally and financially.

If, however, you do burn on your premises :

1. Secure a permit from your local forest fire warden — the law requires it.
2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning. Don't leave it.
3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.

*Save yourself much possible difficulty.*

*Use your town dump.*

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

---

*To the School Board and Citizens of Dunbarton:*

It is with pleasure that I submit my first annual report.

Elementary enrollment has remained fairly constant during the past several years. This fall a single additional pupil was enrolled, making a total of 95. In addition, there were 30 tuition students in the high schools of Concord, Goffstown and Manchester.

Statistical tables published in former town reports indicate that many classes have been in excess of the optimum number of 25 students. This continues to be the rule rather than the exception. These classes in turn are divided into 2-4 grades. It may be readily understood that any individual teacher can spend a limited time with any one child under these circumstances. The size of the class is not the problem; it is the fact that even the most competent teachers cannot handle combined grades effectively.

It is a tribute to the zeal and devoted efforts of the teachers in Dunbarton, considering the difficult teaching situation, that the results of some pupils' efficiency has measured favorably with a nationally standardized achievement test over the period of the past few years. This fact is more noteworthy since there has been a change of three teachers in the Center School during the past five years. However, in order not to be lulled into complacency by a few test results, it should be realized that this picture is not universal and that many of our children have not attained the desired grade achievement level under the existing situation. It will be more apparent as the latter group progresses through the grades and as the en-

rollment increases their individual difficulties will also increase.

Dunbarton has a problem of mixed grades, a situation not conducive to good education. I recommend that the situation be studied and that a favorable solution be found.

In order to have good schools, we need good teachers. In order to attract good teachers we need adequate salaries, proper instructional tools and equipment, and a good, sound and practical curriculum. This past half year has seen much progress in the acquisition of learning tools, but there are still many needed items which are represented in the new budget. The curriculum is being studied and evaluated on a Union basis and it is hoped that by the end of next year a printed curriculum guide in all grades and subjects can be placed in every teachers' hands as a guide to more effective teaching.

Many previous superintendent reports have repeatedly noted the inadequacy of local teachers' salaries and have stressed that Dunbarton has been fortunate in having good teachers. With the demand for teachers greater than the supply, and recent college graduates selecting single grade assignments, districts maintaining 2, 3 or 4 grade situations will find it difficult to attract competent teachers. This is neither fair not just for our children, but it is the existing situation.

In order to give our children the type of school which we think is educationally good and also one that we can afford, your superintendent suggests that a careful study be made of our future enrollments and town growth and that consideration be given to factors which could decrease the number of grades which our teachers now have to handle. Also in connection with this study I would suggest that the most serious attention be given to a study of teacher salaries. As undesirable and unacceptable as it may be, the cost of teacher re-

placement is a determining factor in any salary study. A comparison between this year's average salary paid to New Hampshire elementary teachers and Dunbarton's shows that our average salary is \$514 lower than state average.

This discussion is not an attempt to support teacher salary increases. It is an objective presentation of some of the problems that the citizens of Dunbarton should consider if the local school is to best serve the needs of our children.

May I take this opportunity to thank the School Board and citizens of Dunbarton for their cooperation, and I hope that we will merit your continued interest, cooperation and support in the future.
