

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Ellsworth in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Ellsworth on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next at 6:30 of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. (Salaries Town Officers Expenses Elect. & Reg. Town Hall) \$3,420.00
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,500 for maintenance and repair of highways and bridges (summer \$1,800.00 winter \$4,700.00) \$6,500.00.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.88 as Town share of TRA (State Share \$505.85).
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the use of the Thornton Dump and Rumney Dump.

#### SELECTMEN'S REPORT

In many ways it has been a very busy year for the Selectmen, due mainly to the revaluation of the Town's property by the **State Tax Commission**. There have been quite a number of personal conferences with various members of the Tax Commission, as well as many phone calls to Concord.

It is the personal feeling of each member of the Board of Selectmen that the appraisal, in many respects, was way out of line - mainly on land valuations, where, in our opinion, there are quite a number of discrepancies. We sincerely hope that these inequities can be resolved to the mutual satisfaction of all concerned.

The Town Hall floor has been rebuilt and, we believe, has greatly enhanced the appearance of our historic little "Town House". We would like, in this coming year, to install a new electric light fixture, in order that we may properly see when we have meetings. Naturally we will attempt to install one in keeping with the colonial motive.

We wish to thank you all for your patience and cooperation. We will always attempt to do that which in our estimation is best for the Town - after all we are also taxpayers.

## REPORT OF DISTRICT FIRE CHIEF AND TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Forest fire control in New Hampshire is a joint state and town responsibility (RSA 224).

The Director, Division of Forests and Lands (State Forester) appoints a forest fire warden and several deputy fire wardens in each town upon the recommendation of the selectmen.

The local forest fire warden is responsible for forest fire prevention and fire suppression activities in his town. He regulates the kindling of outside fires when the ground is not covered with snow by the issuance of written permits only when conditions are safe. He is responsible for suppression with the town/city and state sharing the cost. Suppression costs in excess of 1/4 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the town are assumed by the state.

The state provides training for the local fire organization and helps coordinate activities between towns. The state also supports local forces with backup personnel, equipment, and supplies for suppression and prevention.

This combination of state and local cooperation, started in 1893, works well for New Hampshire has enjoyed one of the smallest acreage losses due to forest fires in the United States for the past 25 years.
