TOWN MEETING WARRANT

To: The inhabitants of the Town of Jaffrey, in the County of Cheshire qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Ernest J. Pratt Auditorium of the Jaffrey - Rindge Middle School, located on Stratton Road in said Town of Jaffrey at seven o'clock in the afternoon on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next (polls to be opened from 9:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M.) to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose the following Town Officers:

One Selectman for three years
One Overseer of Public Welfare for one year
One Chief Engineer Fire Department for one year
One member Board of Water Commissioners for three years
Two members Recreation Committee for three years

2. That all reports except that of the Budget Committee be accepted as read.

3. To hear the report of the Budget Committee, and to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be required for the support of the poor, building and repairing of highways and bridges, Fire and Police Departments, Memorial Day, street and building lighting, and other Town charges.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money upon the credit of the Town in anticipation of Taxes.

5. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of $2\frac{1}{2}\%$ for real estate taxes paid with 15 days of the postmarked date of the tax bill, or act in any way relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at Public Auction property acquired or property which may be acquired by tax sale.

7. To see if the Town will vote that the Selectmen may accept any or all legacies, gifts, grants, and subsidies to the Town in Trust or otherwise by any individual or individuals, and to further authorize that the funds may be expended for the purposes stated, or act in any way relating thereto.

8. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to apply, negotiate and do all things necessary to obtain Federal, State and other assistance as may be available to the Town.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the printing of the reports of the Trustees of Trust funds and of the auditor report of those accounts in summary form rather than in full detail in the annual report. Except that in a year in which a Town accepts gifts, legacies and devises for any trust created, the Trustees and the auditor shall print the names of the donors and the value of such gifts, legacies and devises at the time of donation, or act in any

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way relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into an annual contractual agreement with the New Hampshire Parks Department so that the Greenfield State Park could share the use of the present facilities of the Jaffrey Landfill, or act in any way relating thereto.

11. To see if the Town will vote to rescind section B, relating to building permits, of Article 9, passed at Town Meeting in March 1962 and substitute therefor the following:

Building permits shall be issued by or under the authority of the Selectmen at a fee to be determined by the Selectmen, upon determination that the proposed building or structure does not violate any existing ordinance, laws or regulations.

12. To see if the Town will vote to rescind action at the March 1946 Town Meeting Article 27 relative to participation by Town Employees in the New Hampshire State Retirement System and to vote to allow Town Employees, other than the Police Department to elect whether to participate in the New Hampshire Retirement System Plan, or act in any way relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to change the method of compensation of the tax collector from 3/4 of 1% of taxes collected as approved in article 7 of the March 1957 Town Meeting to a fixed annual salary to be determined by the Selectmen, or act in any way relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to expend from the Revenue Sharing Account a sum of money not to exceed \$41,906.00 for the purpose of purchasing the following equipment for use of the Town departments as indicated below:

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$44,637.77 for the purpose of purchasing a new Tanker Truck for the Fire Department, or act in any way relating thereto.

16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Capital Reserve Fund the sum of \$24,671.47 for the purpose of purchasing new equipment for the following Town Departments:

Fire Department - Tanker	\$ 20,362.23
Highway Department - Sander	4,189.44
Police Department - Cruiser	119.80
	<u>\$ 24,671.47</u>

17. To see if the Town will vote to repeal that part of Article 1 of the resolution passed at the Special Town Meeting held September 20, 1977, which reads:

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"and that the New Hampshire Housing Commission is authorized to sponsor a project for elderly persons under Section 8 of the U.S. Housing Act of 1937 as amended for sixty (60) newly constructed building units."

or act in any way relating thereto. (by Petition) (Yes-No Ballot)

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$86,350.00 to improve Gilson Road in the interest of public safety and convenience. Such improvements to include, where indicated: widening; installation of culverts; additional measures to prevent flooding; and proper surfacing of said road to eliminate as much as possible the formation of pot holes at all seasons of the year. It is also recommended that an attempt be made to eliminate certain severe curves and that speed limits be posted on the road, or act in any way relating thereto. (by petition)

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 to widen Hawthorne Road to allow two vehicles to pass safely, or act in any way relating thereto. (by petition)

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,300.00 to improve or pave Baldwin Court Road. A distance of approximately 210 feet, or act in any way relating thereto. (by petition)

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the purpose of decorating the Town of Jaffrey for the Christmas season, or act in any way relating thereto. (by petition)

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,472.00 in support of the Monadnock Family & Mental Health Service, or act in any way relating thereto.

23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,652.00 to support the services of the Monadnock Community Visiting Nurses Association, Inc., or act in any way relating thereto.

24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$865.00 for the support of the Monadnock Region Association, or act in any way relating thereto.

25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 for the support of the Veterans of Foreign Wars ambulance service or act in any way relating thereto.

26. To see if the Town will vote to amend the sewer use charges as adopted under Article 13 of the March 13, 1962 Town Meeting and amended by Article 18, of the March 12, 1968 Town Meeting and further amended by Article 35 of the March 1973 Town Meeting as now reads:

"Sewer entrance Fee \$300.00 per building, sewer rental charges per annum per unit \$30.00; garages, gas stations and restaurants \$55.00; hotels, rooming houses, mercantile or manufacturing buildings \$30.00 per toilet."

To read:

"Sewer entrance fee \$450.00 per building; sewer use charges

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per annum per housing unit \$50.00; garages and gas stations without water meters \$90.00; restaurants, hotels, rooming houses, mercantile and manufacturing buildings without water meters \$50.00 per toilet. All buildings with water meters 50% of annual water usage bill with a minimum charge of \$50.00 per annum.,

or act in any way relating thereto.

27. To see if the Town will vote to become a member of the Regional Planning Commission, now organized and named the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission, or act in any way relating thereto.

28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,941.68 based on 68 cents per capita (population 4,326) as the Town's share for the studies and operation of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. or act in any way relating thereto.

29. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$35,000.00 for the construction of a Bicycle Path to extend from the corner of Stratton Road and Squantum Road to the parking lot at public beach on Lake Contoocook.

Give the Selectmen the authority to apply for, receive, and expend \$17,500.00 of Heritage Conservation and Recreation Service (H.C.R.S.) funds as a reimbursement to this project, or act in any way relating thereto.

30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,850.00 for the placement of a chain link fence to border the Hunt property and humiston Field, or act in any way relating thereto.

31. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the purpose of painting the outside trim of the Town Office Building, or act in any way relating thereto.

32. To see if the Town will vote to accept as a gift a deed of land from the Jaffrey Community Corporation describing two small tracts located on the Northerly side of Stratton Road and the southerly side of Route 124, adjacent to the Boston & Main Railroad tracks, being a portion of the land conveyed by the Monadnock Ledger, Inc. to the Jaffrey Community Corporation by deed dated July 28, 1967 and being recorded in the Cheshire County Registry of Deeds, Volume 768, page 194, said land being the roadway and small common located in front of the Butler House, or act in any way relating thereto.

33. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue as an open highway and make subject to gates and bars in accordance with RSA 238:2 the following Town roads:

Shaker Road - From the residence of Mr. William Jack in a Northerly direction, a distance of approximately eight tenths of a mile to the Marlborough Town line.

Old County Road - From the intersection of the Old Mill Road to Gap Mountain Road, a distance of approximately 4,000 feet.

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Woodbury Hill Road - From the point where Frost Road intersects with Old Dublin Road to the Dublin Town line, or act in any way relating thereto.

34. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,160.00 and to authorize the Selectmen to use these funds to establish crossing guards to supervise street crossings and to help control traffic in the areas of the Jaffrey Grade School and the Jaffrey-Rindge Middle School, or act in any way relating thereto. (by petition)

35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 in order to help obtain federal matching money for the Jaffrey Day Care Chapter of the Monadnock Community Day Care Center in 1979, or act in any way relating thereto. (by petition)

36. To see if the Town will accept as a gift from Mrs. Hattie Letourneau a dam located on the Contoocook River near Old Peterborough Road and Cross Street, or act in any way relating thereto.

37. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provision of RSA 76:62 for a solar energy system tax exemption which shall be in an amount equal to the actual cost of the solar energy system, but not to exceed \$10,000.00. (by petition) (by ballot)

38. To see if the Town will vote to approve of having two sessions for the annual Town Meeting in this Town, the first session for choice of Town officers elected by an official ballot and other action required to be inserted on said official ballot and the second session, on a date set by the Selectmen, for transaction of other Town business. (by petition) (by ballot)

39. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following amendments to the Jaffrey Land Use Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board:

(Proposed changes are underlined)

1. SECTION I-Purpose. Change reference in last sentence to read: all in accord with Chapter 31, sections 60-88, Revised Statutes annotated of New Hampshire, 1977, and any amendments thereto.

2. SECTION II-Non-Conforming uses.

Any lawful use of buildings, structures, premises, land or parts thereof existing at the effective date of this Section or amendments thereto and not in conformance with the provisions of this Section shall be considered to be a non-conforming use. Any non-conforming use may continue and may be maintained, repaired, and improved. Without a variance by the Board of Adjustment; no such Non-conforming use may be (1) expanded, (2) changed to another non-conforming use, or (3) renewed after it has been discontinued for a period of twelve (12) calendar months or more.

3. SECTION II-Non-Conforming Uses

Renumber above provision as paragraph A and add a new paragraph B. as follows: The Planning Board may permit the owner of a non-contiguous substandard lot recorded before the date of this ordinance

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to build thereon without regard to the requirements for lot size or frontage, provided the setback requirements are met and the use conforms to those authorized for the district in which the lot is located.

4. SECTION III - Establishment of Districts

Change paragraph 1 to read: Rural with Town Water and Rural Without Town Water (WTW and WOTW).

5. Delete entire paragraph which begins, "Where the district boundary line divides...."

6. Revise the second sentence of paragraph e. to read, "Where the district boundary line shows a lake, wetland, or other body of water, said boundary shall be the high water mark."

7. SECTION IV - District regulation

Add the following subparagraph to paragraph A, permitted uses in Rural and Residence A Districts: 5. Nursery school or other agency for the day care of children.

8. Paragraph B. To the sentence "The following uses are permitted anywhere in the Town of Jaffrey if authorized by the Board of Adjustment as Special Exceptions in each specific case, add the words, and subject to the guidelines of Section VI H.

9. SECTION IV E General Business and Industrial Districts, revise first sentence to read: Buildings and land may be used for the following: subject to site plan approval by the Jaffrey Planning Board:

10. To paragraph E 3 add the following sentence: Any person or organization who rents, leases, or otherwise permits the use of his property or any portion thereof is responsible for obtaining the requisite permits for such use prior to permitting occupancy.

11. SECTION V. AREA AND WIDTH OF PROPERTY FOR DWELLINGS. Change title to AREA AND WIDTH OF PROPERTY FOR BUILDINGS

12. To Section V paragraph A, add the following; Rural WOTW: minimum lot size 87,120 sq. ft. Min frontage 200'. Front setback 40; side yard 40' Rear yard 40' Offstreet parking: 2 per unit.

13. Same paragraph. Change Industrial side yard setback to 50' and rear yard setback to 50'.

14. SECTION VI. General Provisions

add the following references: E. MOBILE HOME PARKS. Refer to Jaffrey Mobile Home Park Regulation. F. SUBDIVISIONS. Refer to Jaffrey Rules and Regulations to Control Subdivision. G. AIRPORTS. Refer to Jaffrey Airport Regulations.

15. Re-letter GUIDELINES FOR BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT-SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS as paragraph H and add a new subparagraph 1d as follows: Such exceptions, if granted, would not adversely affect any other district or portion thereof.

16. Add a new paragraph I. GUIDELINES FOR THE BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT-VARIANCES. Where the Board of Adjustment finds that unnecessary hardship owing to special conditions may result from strict compliance with these regulations, it may vary the regulations so that substantial justice may be done and the public interest served.

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17. SECTION VII DEFINITIONS. Add a new subparagraph m. Unit. Living quarters for one (1) family.

18 General: re-letter paragraphs and re-number subparagraphs within each section to make the numbering system uniform throughout.

19 SECTION VI B. Delete entire sub-paragraph B.2. which reads: "off-street parking, open or enclosed, shall be considered an accessory use." (by ballot)

40. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Jaffrey Wetlands Conservation District Regulations as proposed by the Planning Board as follows:

JAFFREY WETLANDS CONSERVATION DISTRICT REGULATIONS

I. GENERAL

The Wetlands Conservation District shall be considered as overlaying any other Districts established by this Ordinance. Any use permitted in the portions of the Districts so overlaid shall only be permitted subject to all provisions of this Section.

II. PURPOSES

The purposes of these regulations are:

A. To further the maintenance of safe and healthful conditions of waters within the Town of Jaffrey; to prevent and control water pollution, protect spawning grounds, fish aquatic life, bird and other wildlife habitat; control building sites, placement of structures, and land uses; and conserve shore cover and visual as well as actual points of access to wetlands and natural beauty.

B. To prevent unnecessary or excessive expenses to the Town's endeavors to provide and maintain essential services and utilities which expenses might arise because of inharmonious use of Wetlands.

C. To encourage those uses that can be appropriately and safely located in Wetlands areas.

III. APPLICABILITY

This Section applies to all land areas within 100 feet, horizontal distance, of the normal high water mark of any pond, river, or wetland as defined.

IV. USE REGULATIONS

Permitted uses - any of the following uses that do not result in the erection of any primary structure or dwellings; or alter the surface configuration by the addition of fill, and that are otherwise permitted by the Land Use Ordinance:

A. Forestry- (In compliance with the N.H. State Forestry and Timber Laws, RSA 224:44A)

B. Agriculture, including grazing, farming, truck gardening and harvesting of crops; but not including the stockpiling of manure.

C. Water impoundments and well supplies, public and private.

D. Drainage ways - stream, creeks, or other paths of normal runoff water.

E. Wildlife refuge

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F. Parks and such recreation uses as are consistent with the purpose and intentions of Paragraph B of this Section.

G. Conservation areas and nature trails

H. Open space as permitted by subdivision regulations.

V. NON - CONFORMING USES

A. Any lawful use of building, structures, permits, land or parts thereof existing at the effective date of this Section or amendments thereto and not in conformance with the provisions of this section shall be considered to be a non-conforming use.

B. Any non-conforming use may continue and may be maintained, repaired, and improved. Without a variance from the Board of Adjustment, no such non-forming use may be:

1. expanded
2. changed to another non-conforming use, or
3. renewed after it has been discontinued for a period of twelve (12) months or more.

VI. SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS

The Board of Adjustment, after proper public notice and public hearing, may grant special exceptions for the following uses within the Wetland Conservation District.

A. Streets, roads, and other access ways and utility rights of way easements including power lines and pipe lines if essential to the productive use of land not so zoned and if so located and constructed as to minimize any detrimental impact of such uses upon the wetlands.

B. The undertaking of a use not otherwise permitted in the Wetland Conservation District, which may include the erection of, or addition to, a structure, dredging, filling, draining, or otherwise altering the surface configuration of the land (in compliance with the N.H. State Dredge and Fill Law RSA 149:84), if it can be shown that such proposed use will not conflict with the purposes and intentions of Section II and if such proposed use is otherwise permitted by the Land Use Ordinance.

VII. BUILDINGS -PLACEMENT

No building or structure, shall be located within 100 feet of the normal high water mark. However, in the event that existing timber, shoreline contour, shape of lot or topography shall individually or collectively make a 100 foot set-back clearly undesirable, a reduction of this distance to a minimum of 75 feet may be possible on a receipt of a special exception from the Board of Adjustment. A single, one-story accessory building not exceeding 200 square feet may be located as close as 30 feet to the normal high water mark.

VIII. FOREST CONSERVATION & CLEARING

In order to preserve the natural beauty of the forest, no lot shall be stripped in whole or in part, no swath shall be cut for viewing purposes, and no more trees shall be cut or removed other than shall

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be necessary for conservative forest management and for the erection and maintenance of structures permitted under this ordinance together with appropriate parking and recreational facilities. For purposes of this paragraph, conservative forest management shall be construed to mean that no more than 50% of the basal area of trees shall be cut, in compliance with N.H. State Law RSA 224:44A. The standing timber along the immediate shoreline shall be maintained as closely as possible to its present state, with total cutting permitted for beach/wharf purposes only to a depth of no more than 25 feet back from the normal high water mark. The frontage width of the cut area shall not exceed 30 feet, no part of which shall lie within 50 feet of a side lot line. Where natural vegetation is removed, it shall be replaced with other vegetation that is equally effective in retarding erosion and preserving natural beauty.

IX. MINERAL EXPLORATION

Mineral exploration to determine the nature or extent of mineral resources shall be accomplished by hand sampling, test boring, or other methods which create minimal disturbance. A permit from the Planning Board shall be required for mineral exploration which exceeds the above limitations.

X. RESIDENTIAL LOT STANDARDS

A lot abutting a lake, pond, river, stream or wetland shall have a minimum shore frontage of 200 feet, measured at normal high water level.

XI. SUBSURFACE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SETBACKS

The minimum setback for underground sewage disposal facilities from the normal high water mark of a waterbody shall be no less than 100 horizontal feet. Where daily sewage flow exceeds 2,000 gallons, the minimum setback shall be 200 feet from any shoreline.

XII. WATER QUALITY PROTECTION

No activity shall locate, store, discharge, or permit the discharge of any treated, untreated or inadequately treated liquid, gaseous, or solid materials of such nature, quality, obnoxiousness, toxicity, or temperature that run off, seep, percolate, or wash into surface or ground waters so as to contaminate, pollute, or harm such waters or cause nuisances, such as objectionable shore deposits, floating or submerged debris, oil or scum, color, odor, taste, or unsightliness or be harmful to human, animal, plant, or aquatic life.

XIII. DEFINITIONS

Terms not defined herein shall have the customary dictionary meaning. As used in this Section, the following definitions shall apply:

A. Pond - Any inland body of water which has a surface area in excess of 10 or more acres or where such body of water is made and in addition is completely surrounded by land held by a single owner or those privately owned ponds which are held primarily as waterfowl and fish breeding areas or for hunting and fishing.

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B. River - Any free flowing body of water from that point at which it provides drainage for a watershed of 25 square miles to its mouth.

C. Wetland - Those areas of submerged land enclosed by the normal high water mark, which includes any marsh, swamp, bog or meadow subject to permanent or periodic flooding including the surrounding shore and any abutting soil designated as poorly drained or very poorly drained by the USDA Soil Conservation Service. These areas have been delineated through field mapping surveys completed in August 1976 and are shown on field mapping photographic sheets for the Town of Jaffrey, N.H. The Wetland Conservation District as herein defined is shown on a map entitled "Wet Soils and Wetlands" and is located in the Town Assessor's office. For a detailed explanation of Soil Types, see "Soils and Their Interpretations," Town of Jaffrey, on file with this map.

D. Normal HIGH WATER MARK - That line on the shores and banks of non-tidal waters which is apparent because of the contiguous different character of the soil or the vegetation due to the prolonged action of the water. Relative to vegetation, it is that line where the vegetation changes from predominantly aquatic to predominantly terrestrial (by way of illustration, aquatic vegetation includes but is not limited to the following plants and plant groups - water lily, pond lily, pickerelweed, cattail, wild rice, sedges, rushes, and marsh grasses; and terrestrial vegetation includes but is not limited to the following plants and plant groups - upland grasses, aster, lady slipper, wintergreen, partridge berry, pines, cedars, oaks, spruce, ashes, alders, elms, and maples). In places where the shore or bank is of such character that the high water mark cannot be easily determined (rockslides, ledges, rapidly eroding or slumping banks) the normal high water mark shall be estimated from places where it can be determined by the above method.

E. Accessory Building - A subordinated building located on the same lot with the main building, the use of which is customarily incidental to that of the main building or to the use of the use of the land.

F. Basal Area - Basal area shall mean the cross sectional area of a tree measured at a height of four and one half feet above the ground, usually expressed in square feet per acre for a stand of trees.

G. Incorrect Designation of Soils - In the event an area is incorrectly designated as having poorly drained or very poorly drained soils on the Town of Jaffrey "Wet Soils and Wetlands Map" and evidence to that effect is satisfactorily presented to the Planning Board, the restrictions contained in this regulation shall not apply. Such evidence may be obtained by adequate on-site soils investigation and analysis conducted by a soils scientist qualified in field analysis.

XIV. EMERGENCY OPERATIONS

Emergency operations shall include operations conducted for the public health, safety or general welfare, such as protection of

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resources from immediate destruction or loss, law enforcement, and operations to rescue human beings and livestock from the threat of destruction of injury.

XV. ENFORCEMENT

A. The Board of Selectmen is hereby authorized and empowered to adopt such rules or organization and procedures as are necessary for the efficient administration and enforcement of this ordinance.

B. Upon any well founded information that this ordinance is being violated, the Selectmen shall, on their own initiative, take immediate steps to enforce the provisions of this ordinance by seeking an injunction in the Superior Court or by any other appropriate legal action.

XVI. AMENDMENT

Regulations embodied in the Wetland Conservation District may be amended by a majority vote at any legal Town Meeting, when such amendment is published in the Warrant calling for the meeting, and when such amendment has received two public hearings, which hearings have been advertised and given legal fifteen (15) day notices.

XVII. PENALTIES

Infraction of any provision hereof is a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not more than ten dollars (\$10.00). each day of infraction constitutes a separate offense. (by ballot)

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Report of the Selectmen

Your current Board of Selectmen, charged with the financial affairs of the Town and needing the ability to control expenditures did this year institute a purchase order system requiring prior Selectmen approval for all expenditures from any Town department. This control has provided the tool necessary for proper Selectmen administration of the expenditures necessary in the operation of our community and the result of which is a \$52,000.00 cash surplus of unexpended monies.

Improved procedures in many areas including proper budgeting, financial control of expenditures, tax recording and billing methods has also resulted in the elimination of Jaffrey's long standing position of financial deficit. This deficit condition reported annually in the Financial Report of the Town has for too many years been referred to as our own form of National Debt. This deficit position has been a contributing factor to a higher tax rate for all of us. This years current surplus of \$166,000.00 as reported on the balance sheet of the Financial Report has not only eliminated the remaining deficit of \$64,000.00 reported at the close of last year but has provided us with a surplus position of \$102,000.00 the first in decades in the history of Jaffrey's financial reporting. This dramatic improvement in our financial position will provide us with a greater ability to meet our financial needs and an influencing factor in our future tax rates.

Vital Statistics.

Due to the passage of the Privacy Act of 1977, the practice of printing vital statistics had to be abandoned. Vital statistics will only be available to members of the immediate family. All other inquiries should be made to the Office of Vital Statistics, Concord, New Hampshire.

Sanitary Sewer Report.

During 1978, Whitman & Howard, Inc., the engineers for the Town of Jaffrey on sewerage system improvements, completed the report on "Facilities Plan for Wastewater Treatment Works" which is financed by a 75% grant in aid by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and a 20% grant from the State of New Hampshire.

The report indicates that more than 50% of the flow to the wastewater treatment facility is ground or surface water entering the municipal collection system and that infiltration/inflow (I/I) during the spring may exceed 75% of the entire flow. An I/I analysis has been completed and the areas of excessive infiltration/inflow have been located. It is considered that about 60% of this I/I can be eliminated cost effectively by current rehabilitation methods. The next step is a Sewer System Evaluation Survey to pinpoint the chief sources of I/I and to recommend the method of rehabilitation.

The facilities plan analyzed alternative schemes in accordance with federal and state requirements to expand the capacity and upgrade the treatment of the wastewater treatment facilities in compliance with the National Pollutant discharge Elimination System permit and provided a preliminary design for the most cost effective system. It was recommended that the existing stabilization ponds be increased in capacity and upgraded by raising the dikes and converting them to aerated lagoons by the addition of diffused aeration.

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Extensions to the sewerage collection system were studied. It was recommended that Old Peterborough Road, Erin Lane, Brendan Drive, Kevin Lane, Letourneau Drive, Lacy Road, River Street, Adams Street, and Contoocook Road be served by the municipal system.

In 1978, public hearings were held to obtain public opinion and comments on (1) low pressure sewage collection systems utilizing individual grinder pumps and (2) the facilities plan for improving the existing sewerage system. Both hearings were well attended and the accomplishments very gratifying.

Upon final approval of the Facilities Plan by the State of New Hampshire and EPA, the town should proceed with a Step 2 grant application for the design of the wastewater collection and treatment facilities as well as the sewerage system evaluation study. Preliminary cost estimates indicate that to provide improvements to the treatment facilities, and extension, improvements and rehabilitation to the existing sewerage collection system will cost about \$3.9 million of which the Federal grant will be \$2.2 million, State of New Hampshire grant \$0.6 million, and the Town share \$1.1 million. The Town share may be reduced by other grants.

ANNUAL REPORT

Report of the Jaffrey Public Library Trustees for the year ending December 31, 1978

Jaffrey Public Library continues to be a busy place with an increase in circulation amounting to 7% over & above last year's 13% increase. The biggest gain was in both fiction and non-fiction circulation in the juvenile area.

We had hoped to have full use of the second floor in 1978, but, in spite of the fact that work was held up, we were able to make limited use of it. The office has been completed and furnished, the whole area has been painted & carpeted, the paneling cleaned and re-stained, shelving has been built, and the new furniture is due early in the year. An inter-communication system has been installed between the three floors, and the last pictures in the Library collection were cleaned & restored.

Programs for children continue to be well supported. Once again, over a hundred children joined in the 'Wizard of Oz' summer reading program, and over 80 certificates were awarded at the annual party. The ever-popular 'Little Red Wagon' visited us in August in a Library-sponsored program, and Mrs. Schofield again delighted her young audiences with her programs. We ran 4 storytimes per week throughout the school year, and we hope to include another for pre-school children next year. Children's Book Week was celebrated by a display of posters representing the theme 'Hell Book' made by several classes from the Grade & St. Patrick Schools. The bi-weekly film programs were shown to some 250 children in the Library Film room.

We wish to thank Mrs. Girling & Mrs. Zacharias for their part-time help during the year, & Mrs. Mary Hill & the Rev. Francis X. Cheney for representing Jaffrey at the New Hampshire State Conference on Libraries & Information Services at Concord. Members of the Library staff also attended meetings & discussions on Dr. Lowell Martin's report on the future of New Hampshire libraries, workshops on budgeting, young adult & children's books, and took part in monthly meetings of the Nubanusit Library Co-operative. This is a group of some 20 libraries in the area, co-operating in the bulk buying of books & supplies to help cut costs.

We wish to thank the many people who have helped in the library during the year, either by personal service or by gifts of books, recordings and donations. We thank the friends of Russell H. Barker, in whose memory many 20th. century American literature books were contributed. We also thank the Jaffrey Woman's Club for their continued support during the year.

Thanks to the generosity of Lawrence H. & Josephine B. Wetherell, the Trustees are being able to renovate the interior of the Library over a period of years. We hope that, in 1979, Revenue sharing funds will be available to re-point & silicone the exterior, which is necessary for the preservation of the building.

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PARKS & COMMONS REPORT

Town Cemeteries:

All cemeteries were repaired and kept through-out the year. All cemeteries were fertilized and limed. Conant Cemetery received a new water service through-out replacing the old worn system. This was the reason for the increase in cost of operations incurred this year. Also picket fence has been built and primed to replace old and worn sections of fencing at Conant Cemetery this coming year.

Commons:

All grounds were repaired from winters damage and kept up. Bushes and flowers were planted where needed and replacement was necessary.

Town Beach:

Dock was rebuilt and painted. Beach house was painted outside. Parking area was enclosed and landscaped, with a grass area added, and shrubs and trees planted. The remainder of the work to building, and finishing of landscaping will be completed this spring.

Humiston Field & Ice Rink:

The hard ball field was reworked. A stone wall bordering the Hunt property was removed, and new drainage and landscaping was done in that area, also the slope leading from the rink area was completed. The chain link fence was repaired and painted. A retainer wall was erected and fencing added from the dug out to the rink road area. A stone wall was built between the Martin property and the rink road. The rink road was hot topped as was the apron from there to the arch along Howard Hill Rd., and lines painted for parking. This year we hope to replace the snow fence with a chain link fence between the field and the Hunt property.

Jaffrey Schools:

All grounds were cleaned, prepared and kept for the season. All game areas were readied and serviced throughout the year. These areas are used 8 months of the year now and shared by all.

Town Buildings:

Starting this year the Parks & Commons Dept. has taken over the Janitorial work at the Town Office Building. This is where the overage was incurred in our budget. Renovation work was needed in the Police Dept. and Public rest rooms. Fixtures were added and replaced in some offices.

Proposed work for 1979:

Work at Conant Cemetery, fencing and landscaping. Completion of work at Contocook Beach.

JAFFREY WATER WORKS JAFFREY, NEW HAMPSHIRE 1978 ANNUAL REPORT

During this past year the Jaffrey Water Works has continued its efforts to increase water supply and fulfill water quality objectives as mandated by the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission.

The construction plans and specifications have been completed by our consulting engineers for the Contoocook Lake well pumping station site located off Contoocook Road. These plans and specifications have been approved by the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission, and the facility is ready for construction. Construction has been delayed this year because of difficulties in the land acquisition process. Some of the requisite lands have been taken by eminent domain and are now the property of the Jaffrey Water Works. We fully expect construction of this well pumping station to begin this spring and be completed before the end of the year. The Jaffrey Water Works has constructed some of the water mains required to connect this supply to the existing water main system. These pipelines were constructed with Jaffrey Water Works personnel and equipment.

As required by the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission, we have authorized our consulting engineers to investigate our existing water supply system and determine its adequacy to meet the future demands and the ability of water quality to meet state and federal quality requirements. The purpose of the state-mandated report is to determine if use of all open reservoirs such as the Jaffrey Water Works Poole Reservoir and Bullett Pond should be terminated or if extensive water treatment should be provided. The state has recommended that, if possible, we develop groundwater supplies to replace the Town's existing sources and to fulfill the Town's future needs. The study will include an investigation of our water main system to insure that future supplies developed can be delivered to the customers without effecting delivery rate pressures. These studies will determine where pressure problems exist and make recommendations for improvements to correct these deficiencies.

The Jaffrey Water Works has continued its groundwater survey which was begun in 1977. Our investigation included the installation of about 125 test wells which has uncovered a second proposed municipal sized water supply source. This potential ground water supply exists along the Sharon town line adjacent to the Coll Farm Property. Preliminary tests indicate that the water supply potential exceeds 500,000 gallons per day. Additional extended duration pumping tests are required to verify this potential and determine what, if any, water quality problems exist.

At present, we do not feel it urgent to comply with all the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission requirements. The New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission has established a schedule for compliance with its recommendation for community water systems to treat or abandon surface water supplies. We suggest that Jaffrey's ranking within the first priority for construction of water treatment facilities for the reservoirs or the development of groundwater systems within five years is not justified. We will, however, comply with the state requirements as soon as it is felt ground water supplies can be developed and the Town can support the required expenditures to make these improvements.

ANNUAL REPORT

Jaffrey's water use over the present year averaged 800,000 gallons per day and its maximum water use exceeded 1,000,000 gallons per day. At present, the Town's existing supply provides approximately 400,000 gallons per day and our Bullett Pond and Poole Reservoirs provide approximately 400,000 gallons per day for a total of 800,000 gallons per day supply. The proposed construction of the Contoocook Lake well pumping station will increase the Town's water supply by approximately 500,000 gallons per day to 1,300,000 gallons per day. We anticipate that these supplies will be able to fulfill the Town's needs until 1980 if population growth continues at its present rate.

We will continue our efforts to locate and develop water supplies to meet the Town's future water demands.

REPORT OF THE JAFFREY BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

Once again it is my privilege to report to you, the voters and taxpayers of Jaffrey. This has been a busy year for your Board of Adjustment, one in which we have heard more than 40 appeals to one or more of the Town's ordinances. As a result we have begun to hold hearings twice a month, on the first and third Tuesday evenings when necessary, and have enlisted the services of an Administrative Clerk, James Balentine, who is also an alternate member of the Board, to assist us in the myriad of paperwork and ever increasing details that are a part of the appeal process. He is paid on a per case basis for his assistance but is not compensated for his role as an alternate member of the Board, (nor are any of the Board members or alternates).

We have tried at all times to do our best in assuring appellants of a fair procedure in the appeal process, the hearing itself, and our decision making and rendering process. To this end we have added to our duties the inspection of the site of the proposed Variance or Special Exception and have frequently met on weekends and late into the evening in an effort to reach expedient decisions.

Again my thanks to everyone in the Town Office Building for their help, to the Town Counsel David Tower for his time and valuable advice, to the many Townspeople who have conveyed their support and understanding of the difficulties of the job, and to Keith Burke, Principal of Conant High School, and his staff for allowing us to use their facilities. Special thanks to retiring Board member Richard Stone who is currently clerk and has been past chairman during his 5 years on the Board. And my personal thanks to the Board members and alternate members who have given so freely of their time and effort during the past year.

Report of the Jaffrey Planning Board

During 1978 the Planning Board conducted over thirty preliminary or final hearings on proposed subdivisions. The major effort, however, related to the development of the Master Plan. In August, following a public hearing, the Board declared a moratorium on all subdivisions containing more than four lots until such time as the plan is completed. In November, the Board contracted for services of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission and, with the Commission's guidance, began to gather the basic information needed for a master plan. Preliminary population studies, base maps, and data on present use of land and land classification will be completed by Town Meeting.

The Board also distributed questionnaires to the people of Jaffrey, asking for their views on a variety of questions related to the nature of Jaffrey's future. 1,818 surveys were mailed to residents and 247 mailed to non-resident property owners. The Surveys were picked up by members of the Jaffrey Senior Citizens, by Board members and other volunteers and were tallied by members of the Jaffrey Woman's Club. 729 surveys were returned, 642 from residents and 87 from non-residents.

In December, the Board began a series of public hearings aimed at preparing changes in the Land Use Plan and in the Wetlands Conservation District Ordinance for the consideration of the voters at Town Meeting.

The views and active participation by the citizens of Jaffrey in the development of the Master Plan are solicited by the Planning Board. In October, residents of the town were asked to volunteer to serve on a Sounding Board, giving their views and suggestions as each part of the plan is developed. The following are serving as Jaffrey's Sounding Board: Kay Cipolla, Clayton Crane, Ron Despres, Ted Ernst, Bruce Feltus, Homer Forcier, Herbert Grant, Charles Hamilton, Gale Kenyon, Francis LaBrie, Thomas Page, Weltha Smith, Don Stewart, and Marc Tieger. Additional members are welcome. If any resident of Jaffrey is interested in participating, he or she should contact any member of the Planning Board. Interested citizens may also communicate their views either informally or by attending public hearings or working sessions.

During 1978, Henry Gallup replaced Philip Cournoyer on the Planning Board. Other members are: Archie Coll Jr., Joseph Crocker, Richard Grodin, B. Leonard Krause, H. Charles Royce, and Howard Williams, Selectman Representative. The members of the Board are appointed by the Selectmen for a term of six years or to fill unexpired terms. The Board meets regularly at the Town Offices the second Tuesday of each month at 7:30 P.M. and at other times each month whenever the need for public hearings or working sessions requires.

SURVEY OF THE VIEWS OF THE RESIDENTS OF JAFFREY, CONDUCTED NOVEMBER 1978

I. PURPOSE: To provide guidance to the development of Jaffrey's Master Plan by finding out what the people of Jaffrey consider important about their town and what their opinions are about the future of the town.

II. SUMMARY OF RESULTS: Most of the 729 people responding to the survey expressed themselves as pleased with and proud of their community, citing the people, the environment, the size of the town, and the beauty of the area as most important to them. They want growth to be limited and controlled, insuring that Jaffrey remain the kind of town it is and especially that its natural and historic beauty, its rural character and environment, be preserved and maintained. They want planning to be comprehensive and at the same time fair to all. They want quality and economy in government and town services, desiring no expansion which would lead to higher costs. At the same time citizens of Jaffrey want the appearance of downtown improved, traffic congestion relieved, and shopping enhanced. The four most important concerns expressed are: (1) keeping taxes down (2) quality and efficiency of town government (3) quality and efficiency of schools, and (4) preserving open space. The citizens of Jaffrey chose as the three aspects of the town they most wanted to have increased emphasis: (1) medical and health facilities (2) shopping and (3) environmental concerns.

III. HIGHLIGHTS OF THE SURVEY: A complete copy of the survey is available at the Town Offices. What follows is information abstracted from the survey.

A. The survey revealed general satisfaction with the community, pride in its nature, its people, its environment, and a strong desire that the community retain its present nature. 495, or 80%, said they liked living in Jaffrey very much. In expressing their opinion about growth, 53% said they wanted limited and controlled growth, 25% said they wanted growth not limited, but generally controlled, while 12% said they wanted no growth.

B. The response "Preserve the open space, regardless of growth" was the most numerous of all responses about desirable types of growth.

C. To the question "What do you like best about Jaffrey," over 89% of all responses were: The people (235), the location and Mt. Monadnock (143), the size of the town (141) the environment and open space (136), and the type of community (121).

D. This was echoed in responses to the question "What would you most want to stay the same?" The highest response was the general environment, including Mt. Monadnock and Jaffrey Center (168). Next highest was the size of the town (145). 67 mentioned the friendliness of the people. These responses correlated with those 175 who have come to Jaffrey within the past ten years. The factor stated most frequently (82 times) as the reason they come to Jaffrey was the type of community.

E. The residents of Jaffrey do not, however, feel that everything is perfect. Although the most frequent response to questions about improvement was no reply or nothing, 82 persons cited the undesirability of the poor appearance of downtown. Often mentioned in connection with this were recommendations (62 times) for eliminations of traffic congestion at the intersection of Routes 202 and 124, and a number strongly suggested a re-routing of Route

202 away from the downtown area.

F. The second most frequently mentioned disliked factor is increasingly high taxes and cost of living. 68% of those responding cited Keep Taxes Down as of high concern.

G. 76 people said that shopping in Jaffrey is limited in quality and quantity. A number asked for clothing and shoe stores, more variety, better quality.

H. Over 60 people said that growth leads to problems, expressing concern over more services, higher taxes, and the threat to the environment.

I. 45 people mentioned the police department, expressing a desire for more zealous efforts to eliminate theft and vandalism, and a desire for better leadership, professionalism, and a more friendly attitude. At the same time, many cited young people loitering on Main Street in the center of town as the major policing problem. A number suggested that more facilities and a recreational program aimed at the loiterers might be a constructive solution.

J. 30 people mentioned schools as the item they would most want changed, citing a need for better discipline, better quality, and fewer "extras."

K. To put adverse criticisms in prospective, however, by far the largest number of responses to the question "What would you most want changed about Jaffrey?" were; No Response (103) and Nothing (81). Typical comments are: "Ideal community in my estimation, except lacking certain busines at the retail level," and "To sum it up, Jaffrey is one very good place to live. I really have no complaints."

IV. THE NATURE OF THE INHABITANTS OF JAFFREY AND THEIR NEEDS

A. The population of Jaffrey is somewhat older than the population of New Hampshire, generally. 227 of those responding are 65 years or older. 127 are retired. Older people expressed a need for more and better shopping locally, more medical services available within the town, and tax relief for those who have trouble living on a fixed income in the face of rising costs.

B. Two thirds of the working population work in Jaffrey. Of the 148 who work elsewhere, 57 work in Peterborough, 40 in other towns in Southern New Hampshire, 28 in Massachusetts, 10 in New England, generally, 10 in Rindge, and 19 in Keene. No one complained of commuting time or of road conditions to and from work. Seven listed employment opportunities as a plus, while only one wrote of lack of job opportunities.

C. The population is quite stabel: Only 4% have been in Jaffrey less than one year, 8% (or 51) have been in Jaffrey more than one year but less than three, 21% (or 124) have been in Jaffrey more than three years but less than ten. Over two-thirds of those responding have lived in Jaffrey more than ten years.

D. Many took the trouble to express pride and satisfaction in town services, notably fire protection, road maintenance, efficiency of town government, and the friendliness of local merchants.

V. OUR COMMENTS:

Some of what this survey shows reflects national trends: On the positive side, concern with the environment; and on the negative side, concern with the product of our schools, concern about higher taxes, frustation with the cost of living that seems to leave the worker and the elderly further behind, concern with the problems of growth and an expanding population. All these are felt today

throughout the nation. Some of these problems won't be solved at the local level. No Master Plan, no Planning Board, no matter how hard it tries, is going to roll back the price of oil in Jaffrey, New Hampshire. What we can do and what we will do, however, is to plan carefully with these factors in mind and listen carefully to the voice of the people before we make decisions. This we pledge to do. This survey is a first step.

JAFFREY RECREATION DEPARTMENT - ANNUAL REPORT

The Recreation Department completed its second full year of operation in 1978. Total program participation for the year was 6,550 participants, not including Contocook Beach and the Skating Rink, where we do not keep attendance. This figure compares to 4,265 participants in 1977. The Recreation Committee is continuing to offer a program which meets the needs of more people; while at the same-time, sincerely trying to bring in more revenues that offset budget expenditures.

TRIPS

1,107 people went on department sponsored trips in 1978 to Boston Red Sox (five times), Hampton Beach (two times), Ice Capades, Ice Follies, Deep sea fishing, Bensons Wild Animal Farm, Boston Science Museum, White Mountains, New England Teamen, Budweiser Brewery, Eastern States Exposition, Dartmouth Football, Montreal, New England Patriots, New England Aquarium, Barnum Bailey and Ringling Brothers Circus, New Hampshire Mall Shopping, and Santa's Land.

THE ARTS

Dancing: - The dancing year began with Delia Gynan's ballet, tap and acrobatic classes for the younger generation which culminated in a May recital. In the fall, the reputable Tollman's taught disco and ballroom dancing to adults.

Drama: - We are continually striving for a permanent dramatics program with a childrens and/or adult theatre in Jaffrey. The first steps toward this goal were taken in 1978 with two successful dramatics programs. Andy's Summer Playhouse put on a week long clinic during the summer, and Linda Hagerman assisted the department with a fall program which ended in a Johnny's Halloween production.

Tae Kwon Do Karate: - First Degree Black Belts, Dennis Bartlett and David Griffin began and are continuing a very successful Karate and Self-Defense program for all ages from which many people have already graduated to higher ranking belts.

Humiston Field Skating Rink & Figure Skating Lessons: - Good skating conditions helped us to keep the rink open and available to hundreds of enthusiasts in 1978. Figure skating instructor, Lila Scharpff needs to be thanked for volunteering her time to teach Figure Skating Lessons. The Jaffrey Lions again deserve thanks for their fund raising efforts to continue rink improvements.

Cooking: - Seven volunteer chefs from the Jaffray Community League assisted in teaching youngsters the basic techniques of cooking.

Chess: - The Recreation Department helped to sponsor a two day week-end marathon chess tournament which brought many of New England's best to Jaffrey. This combined with our weekly open chess night.

Arts & Crafts Workshop: - Part time persppnel and volunteers helped to make our summer arts and crafts program our most successful to date.

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SPORTS AND GAMES

Aquatics: - Swimming started early as Joan Nagle taught winter/spring classes to all ages at the Monadnock Bible Conference Pool. We also held family open swims and scuba diving lessons at the pool. In the summer at Lake Contoocook, over 100 children took Red Cross Lessons from Sally Rice and Mike Haynes.

Tennis: - It was a big year for tennis fans in Jaffrey. Joan Nagle taught indoor lessons in the spring and then the newly formed J-R Tennis Association became very active with Steve Krause as President. The Association taught adult lessons as a fund raiser and then many of their members volunteered to teach our summer youth tennis lessons. We would like to thank the J-R Tennis Association for not only helping the Recreation Department, but also for building a bulletin board and practice board at the courts.

Golf: - Reis Hagerman and Steve Altschuler were the instructors in the first year of this continuing program. Thank you to Woodbound Inn for the free use of their golf course, and also to our green stamp friends who helped us to purchase the equipment.

Soccer: - Our annual youth soccer program was again a success largely do to volunteer leadership. We also paid the entry fee for St.Patrick's and the J-R Middle School to enter the Knights of Columbus soccer tournament in Peterborough.

Youth Baseball and Softball Leagues: - Since 1976, much has happened on the baseball front in Jaffrey. The total number of young people playing organized ball has gone from under 100 to over 200 participants. These increases are due largely to the construction of the new Little League Field. Last summer, we added a Jenny League to the Jaffrey Baseball Association. The Jenny's are a girls softball league which had three teams it's first year. For the first time, a Jaffrey Team won the Invitational Little League Tournament. The VFW Babe Ruth team made it a clean sweep by winning the Monadnock Babe Ruth League Championship. A special thank you goes out to the 50 volunteer coaches and umpires that devoted a large part of their summer toward improving the lives of these young people.

Track & Field: - Sally Rice and Mike Haynes coached our first Track and Field team which traveled to the state meet in Concord, sponsored by Hershey. In 1979, we hope to attend at least three regional meets.

Summer Survival: - A weekend camping and canoe trip down the Connecticut River was the high point of this very rewarding class. Thanks to the Boy Scouts for their assistance.

Field Hockey Clinic: - Two very experienced field hockey coaches came to Jaffrey and ran a week long clinic to our Jr. High and High School age girls.

Volleyball: - The first organized program of the Recreation Department in 1976 is still going strong as Roy Stone and troops meet two nights a week in adult coed volleyball. They even played on Christmas day!

Slimnastics: - Alice Buros is the instructor in this continuing program of organized exercise and conditioning improvement.

Walk For Your Health: - Program Director, Bruce Ellis began a walking program in the fall which met with success. This will be a continuing program.

Adult Softball League: - For the first time, we organized a slo-pitch softball league with seven teams both from Jaffrey and Rindge. Games were played in both towns, and we are looking forward to more teams in 1979.

Adult Basketball: - In 1978, we ran a free officials clinic to help supply our increasing demand for officials. We now have six teams in and over 25 years old league: and a combined Jaffrey-Peterborough A-League which also has six teams. To bring back an old rivalry we ran a Jaffrey-Peterborough B-League tournament at the end of the season.

SPECIAL EVENTS

Volunteer's Banquet: - Over 60 volunteer's were honored at our first banquet in March. They were treated to a roast beef dinner and awards. This was just small thank you to the people that spend many hours contributing to improve the quality of life in Jaffrey.

Granite State Basketball Tournament: - This adult men's tournament has become one of the income producing events sponsored by the Recreation Committee. In 1978, 24 teams were invited, and people were treated to some great basketball talent.

Jaffrey Day: - The Second Annual Jaffrey Day was again a success with many businesses, organizations and families taking part in the events. Thanks go to the VFW for serving a ham dinner to hundreds of people. The purpose of Jaffrey Day is to get the people of Jaffrey together in fun and competition one day a year. Hopefully, each year will bring more people to this family day.

Jaffrey Halloween: - Thank you to the American Legion who co-sponsored the Adult Masquerade Ball and the Children's Halloween Party with us in 1978.

Jaffrey Christmas: - Following is a list of people and organizations that helped to make the 1978 Christmas program worth while for everyone: Junior Classe's ski-skate sale, Community League's Childrens Shopping Center, The Community Band, The Conant Madrigal Choir, The Monadnock Christian Nursing Home, The Jaffrey Library, The Jaffrey Lions Club, The Cub Scouts, The Conant Horticulture Class, The Conant Art Class, The Woman's Club, The Triple "D", The St. Ann's Society, The Grange, The VFW, and of course Santa Claus. Thanks to all.

REPORT OF THE JAFFREY HOUSING COMMISSION

Since the 1976 Town Meeting when the Section 8 Rent Subsidy Program was voted in by the citizens, Jaffrey has had 15 units (apartments) available for people who were paying more than one fourth of their income for housing needs and whose income was fixed or very minimal. These 15 units have been constantly filled and in fact, there has been a waiting list since the very beginning of those who need this rent subsidy in order to survive adequately.

The job of the Jaffrey Housing Commission, once their needs study was done and the program voted in at the Town Meeting, has been to provide forms for applicants (both tenants and landlords) and to inspect prospective apartments for decent and sanitary conditions. All decisions as to which applicants are to be accepted have been made by the State Housing Commission in Concord. Therefore, with very little work to do on a regular basis, the Selectmen have agreed with the original members of the Commission to reduce their numbers to two: Mrs. Claire Moore and the Rev. Emily Preston. Very many thanks go to Mr. Gilbert Emery and Mr. Homer Forcier who, along with Father Thomas Bresnahan, comprised the original Commission.
