TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

**To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lempster, in the County of Sullivan,
in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:**

You are hereby notified to meet at Union Hall, said Lempster, on Tuesday, the 9th day of March at ten of the clock, in the forenoon, to open the polls for voting for candidates, and at one o'clock in the afternoon for the discussion of the Articles of the Warrant.

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing, and to vote on the following question, "Shall the provisions of Chapter 171A of the Revised Laws relative to playing Beano be adopted in the Town?"

Article 2. To receive all reports and act thereon.

Article 3. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for the Town in anticipation of taxes.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500.00 for the Highway Capital Reserve Fund.

Article 6. To hear the report of the Interim Lake Site D-1 Committee elected at the March 1970 Town Meeting, and to consider by vote, the approval of the suggested regulations as printed in the Town

Report.

"A Statement of Purpose:"

Your committee submits the following proposed regulations that we believe are specific enough to cover the requirements of the Federal and State authorities.

We feel too, that these proposed regulations will likewise adequately safeguard the development of the proposed lake area.

Section 1: After Federal approval and State and Federal monies are received by the Town of Lempster to commence construction of the Lake Site D-1, a committee of nine members to be named, shall be elected, composed of: three lake property owners, three non-lake residents and the three selectmen. The first election of non-lake residents and lake property owners would be for one, two and three year terms, and thereafter one member would be elected each year for each of these two groups. The Interim Committee recommends the continuance of an Interim Committee of three members until the above stipulations are met. The three members to be elected annually at the regular Town Meeting to continue to work with the county, state, and federal agencies as in the past.

Section 2: The above nine member Committee is to be known as "The Lempster Lake Site D-1 Committee."

Section 3. "The Lempster Lake Site D-1 Committee" shall have legal authority to implement and enforce any or all of the regulations.

Emergency regulations can be made by the Lempster Lake Site D-1 Committee. But, such regulations, in order to be permanent, must be voted upon by the next Annual Town Meeting.

The right of appeal concerning any emergency regulations by any property owner or group of property owners, can be made to the Lempster Lake Site D-1 Committee. If a decision is still unfavorable to the property owner or owners, the right of appeal to the Town Selectmen is afforded, provided a petition is signed by at least five (5) property owners and submitted to the Chairman of the Board of Selectmen. The Selectmen, in such cases of appeal, shall follow any laws pertaining to such matters. The right of appeal concerning any permanent regulation is always afforded at the Town Meeting by an article in the Warrant.

Section 4: Committee's Geographical Jurisdiction: Any land, lot or structure within 700 feet of the 50 yr. high water mark, shall be considered within the jurisdiction, rules, and regulations of the permanent Lempster Lake Site D-1 Committee.

Section 5: Rules and Regulations:

Part A. LOT: All lots shall be at least three-quarters of an acre in size. All lots shall be laid out large enough to provide

adequate sewage disposal and water supply areas to meet the requirements of the State.

A variance of said minimum lot size may be granted by the committee, if it deems proper, provided that no such lot shall be less than the present state minimum of 30,000 square feet.

Fifty (50) feet shall be the minimum lake shore frontage and one hundred (100) feet shall be the minimum road frontage.

All non-lake front properties must have at least one hundred (100) feet frontage. (Road Frontage).

The distance of any structure from the lake's high water mark must conform to existing state laws.

Part B. STRUCTURE: The minimum area per dwelling unit shall be four hundred (400) square feet livable area on the first floor of said unit.

No permanent building shall be covered only with tar paper, sheathing paper or other temporary wall covering. The roof, thereof, shall be covered only with fire resistant materials.

All chimneys shall meet fire and safety legal construction practices.

Part C. SEWAGE: The sewage disposal will be according to existing state laws governing the same and approval must be gotten from the State before work commences.

Part D. ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY: After Federal approval and State and Federal monies are received by the Town of Lempster to commence construction, then each land owner shall make provision for a road right-of-way through his own property if his land abuts another property owner who is fenced in. The shortest most suitable access route to be arrived at by mutual consent. Any further development into individual lots is not included in this provision, but is up to the developer.

In the absence of agreement, The Lempster Lake Site D-1 Committee, shall make recommendations to the said owners. If disagreement still prevails, an appeal may pursue, following the procedures outlined in Section #3.

The Road right-of-way shall be laid out with a width sufficient to meet existing T.R.A. Regulations for the same. This does not bind the fenced-in landowner to necessarily build a road to meet T.R.A. specifications. The above road right-of-way agreements must be properly described, legally signed and recorded in the Sullivan County Registry of Deeds Office.

Right-of-way agreements must be completed and recorded within one year (12 months) from the date that Federal and State funds have been received by the town to commence construction of Lake Site D-1.

Part E. PUBLIC AREA: The Town of Lempster shall provide land to be used for development into a public beach, picnic area, boat launching, ramp, and parking facilities.

Part F. USE OF LAKE: Lake Site D-1 shall be used for recreation purposes; including: fishing, ice-fishing, wild life, swimming, boating, sailing, canoeing, skiing, ice-skating, ice-boating with sails, skimobiles, cross-country skiing, winter dog-sledding.

Part G. RESTRICTION OF LAKE USES: Outboard motor boating is limited to five horsepower (5 HP) including the use of battery operated trolling motors. Also no water skiing is permitted.

Part H. COMMERCIAL ENTERPRISES: After State and Federal monies have been received by the Town for construction of Lake Site D-1, petitions for any new commercial enterprises shall be submitted to the permanent Site D-1 Committee for consideration and approval.

Part I. LUMBERING: Any lumbering, other than clearing for the Lake Site D-1 building lots, roads, sewage systems, shall be carried out under approved selective cutting procedures.

Article 7. To elect a three-member Interim Site D-1 Lake Committee for one year.

Article 8. To see if the Town will accept in trust, the sum of \$100.00 to be known as the Hubert Hartwell Fund.

Article 9. To see if the Town will accept in trust, the sum of \$150.00 to be known as the Charles Pitkin Trust Fund.

Article 10. To see what action the Town will vote to continue the Town Forest Committee and to take any necessary action thereto.

Article 11. To see if the Town will authorize the Town Forest Committee and Selectmen, to sell twelve (12) acres of the Town's land known as the Perkins Place.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$944.92 for T.R.A.; the State will contribute \$6,299.48.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to seal blacktops where most needed.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote \$200.00 to keep the Information Booth open from June 26th to September 12th.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote \$100.00 to continue the Town History Fund established in 1955.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 for the Fire Department's annual expenses.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$250.00 for a Water Hydrant at Lempster Street across the road from the old schoolhouse.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase Insurance for the Town and raise \$1,800.00 to cover expense thereof.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$1,000.00 to reduce the Town deficit.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$700.00 for the Town's share of Social Security for its employees.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to take action in regard to trailers and a building code and appoint a committee to bring in a report and recommendations on same at the 1972 Town Meeting.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the Newport Area Home Health Agency. This sum to be used for Lempster residents.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$32.00 for the D.L.R. Association.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$64.96 for the control of the White Pine Blister Rust.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1,000.00 for Interest on notes.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$200.00 to help maintain and support the Newport Hospital.

Article 27. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to allow 3% discount on taxes, if paid on or before September 1st, based on 80% of last year's taxes, and 2% discount on taxes if paid on or before October 1st using the same base.

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to hold Annual Town Meeting at night starting at 7 P.M. for discussion of the articles in the Warrant.

Article 29. To see if the Town of Lempster will accept that portion of West Shore Road at Sand Pond that lies in the Town of Lempster, approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ mile in length and maintain the same as a Town road.

Article 30. To see if the Town will approve a two-year term for Town Clerk, as proposed by the State.

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$250.00 for a portable radio for the Police Dept. The State will put in \$900.00.

Article 32. To see if the Town will raise \$5,000.00 for a used grader.

Article 33. To see if the Town will raise the salaries of Town Employees.

FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT

The people of Lempster are to be congratulated on their careful use of fire in 1970. The record shows four calls, and of this number only one resulted in any major damage.

During the summer several practice sessions were held at Dodge Pond before meeting time. Six of the business meetings were cancelled because a quorum of seven was not present. This meant that many important decisions had to be made by one man. The average attendance of the six meetings that were held was eight. The highest attendance was 11. This was the April Meeting when the officers were elected.

Some things were accomplished. All the 2½ inch hose was tested, dried, and repacked on the fire truck. Another portable pump was mounted on the tanker so that it no longer takes 30 minutes to refill the tank, also a drain was put on the same truck as the added pump has to be primed manually. A specially made ice chisel was donated. Two hose ends were brazed together making a set of double male and female couplings to be used if the hose inadvertently gets laid the wrong way. Also, a list of the members with their telephone numbers was drawn up and given to the holders of the Red Network phones.

It is vital to the safety of our town that all 41 fire company members keep their knowledge of all the equipment up to date!

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

During this past year, the public has shown a great deal of cooperation in the prevention of fires. We wish to express our thanks for a job well done.

Your forest fire warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires, a synopsis of these laws follows.

FIRE PERMITS

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning (SUCH BURNING IS RESTRICTED BY REGULATION TO BE PRIOR TO 9:00 A.M. and AFTER 5:00 P.M.)

An Air Pollution regulation forbids the burning of household waste in towns where such rubbish is collected by the town.

EXCEPTIONS

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed under normal conditions with permission of the District Fire Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

The agency has sponsored Immunization Clinics about once a month except during the summer months. Last year 464 children attended the clinic. We have sent and received referrals to and from the Medicare intermediary, Blue Cross/Blue Shield, and the various Welfare Depts., both state and local. We refer patients to such services as Crippled Children Clinics in Claremont, Convulsive Disorder Clinics in Manchester, Mental Health Clinics in Claremont, Surplus Food Service, the Clothing Service, the Community Action Program, and the Planned Parenthood Association in Lebanon. We also follow up on the state immunization records for each child advising those who are delinquent to see their doctors or come to the Clinics. All the above are achieved to a large degree by way of consultations — which are not counted as charge visits.

ENROLLMENT

The present number of students totals 115 — broken down by grades as follows:

A projected tuition count of 64 in 1971-72 (an increase of 6) coupled with higher tuition charges in area schools has caused a sizeable jump in the Budget.

MINIMUM STANDARDS

By action of the State Board of Education "September 1, 1972 is the effective date for schools to begin implementation of Minimum Standards and Recommendations for New Hampshire Elementary Schools for School Approval."

In order to comply, Goshen-Lempster would need to add services in:

1. Art
2. Guidance Counseling
3. Librarian
4. Physical Education

It is assumed that schools with small enrollments will join with other schools in sharing these specialized services. Next year we will be asked to provide a plan as to how and when compliance with the Elementary Standards will be met. School personnel have been working with the School Board to arrive at an appropriate course of action.

ACTION

There are two changes in the teaching staff this year. Mrs. Doris Newman, an experienced teacher, replaced Mrs. Sharon Otterson in the primary room. Mrs. Ethel Jarvis replaced Mrs. Hester Morrissey, who retired, in the Grade 4 & 5 position. Both have provided a satisfactory addition to the entire staff which is working together as a unit in a well-coordinated teaching effort.

The Custodian, Lunch Operator, and Bus Operators continue to perform their duties so efficiently that their efforts often go unnoticed. We are grateful to all of them for their part in a smooth-working operation.

In March, the 8th grade made a science field trip to the Hanover Museum where lectures and exhibits focused on fossilization and the geology of the earth.

The P. T. A. arrived at the April meeting to find themselves guests of the 6th and 7th grades in a "World's Fair." Students arranged booths, came dressed, and offered foods from all over the world.

Graduation was held on the 16th of June with the Reverend Robert Lawthers as guest speaker. Beautiful flowers were donated by the Campbells to match the class colors of purple and gold. Class Salutatorian, Brian Wright, and Valedictorian, Richard Baker, gave interesting talks on the theme "Knowledge Is Freedom," which the class picked as their motto. Mrs. Bruno ably directed the musical program.

This Fall saw the addition of three new members to our staff. Mrs. Ethel Jarvis replaces Mrs. Hester Morrissey in grades 4 and 5, who retired after many years of service to Goshen and Lempster. Mrs. Doris Newman replaces Mrs. Sharon Otterson in grade 1, who has moved on to Hillsboro. We were fortunate to reinstate music with the hiring of Mrs. Mary Ann Thomas on a one-day-a-week basis.

Soucy, our School Nurse Mrs. June Buck, and all the parents and friends of the school whose cooperation and interest help make the school an interesting and exciting place in which to teach.
