STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Milan in the County of Coos, in said State qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at I. O. O. F. Hall at Milan in said town on Tuesday the 10th day of March at 9:00 of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following articles:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town officers' salaries.
3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town officers' expenses.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for tractor and plow expenses for the ensuing year.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise for the construction of Class 2 roads, known as Milan Hill road, and appropriate and set aside for said purpose the sum of \$1,051.50 to meet the sum of \$2,102.00 which the State gives or accept State Aid for Class 5 roads, and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$323.06 and State will contribute \$1,292.22.
7. To see if the town will vote to build the road on Milan Hill in back of the cemetery or continue on or near the old road in front of the cemetery.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town poor.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for soldier aid and old age assistance.
10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for public library.
11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for cemeteries.
12. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$70.00 for the White Mountains Region Association for advertising purposes.

13. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise \$200.00 for land for a parking place in front of the Town Hall.

15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for land to enlarge the Milan Cemetery.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise extra money to be applied on Spruceville road.

17. To choose by ballot one Trustee for the Cemetery Trust Fund for three years.

18. To choose by ballot one Trustee for the Public Library for three years.

19. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

20. To transact any other business that shall legally come before the meeting.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

Milan, N. H.
February 1, 1942

To the School Board of Milan:

I submit herewith the annual report of the Superintendent of Schools; this being the twenty-second in the series of superintendent's reports.

For the last complete school year ending June, 1941, seven different schools were operated with a total enrollment of 136 pupils.

The percent of attendance for the year was 93.4. The best record was at West Milan with a percentage of 95.

Eight pupils were graduated from the eighth grade with appropriate exercises at the Town Hall.

Twenty-four Milan pupils were registered this fall at Berlin High.

The high spot of the present school year has been the opening of the new three-room consolidated school building at Milan Village.

The children from the three outlying one-room schools on the East side of the town are now being transported to this new building which has a good supply of running water and all modern sanitary arrangements. With less grades to a teacher, more time can be spent now with the classes, and better work should be accomplished. Milan can be proud of its accomplishment in erecting this fine modern building and equipping it with the latest type of school furniture. We have now 83 pupils enrolled in this building.

Your superintendent has regularly visited the different schools throughout the year, inspected classes, and given help and suggestions where needed.
