- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) to join the New Hampshire Humane Society.

- 16. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to hire on notes of the Town a sum of money necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes of 1981 and pass any vote or votes relative thereto, and appropriate Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) for interest charges.
- 17. To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to make application for and to receive and spend up to Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) of funds that may become available to the Town under "The comprehensive Employment and Training Act of 1973" as amended or from other related agencies for the purpose of providing Federally Subsidized Training and Employment opportunities to benefit both residents of the community and the community—at—large.
- 18. To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to make application for and to receive and spend in the name of the Town, such advances, grants—in—aid, or other funds for Town purposes as may now, or hereafter be forthcoming from Federal, State, local or private agencies that would be of benefit to the Town not exceeding Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00).
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand, Six Hundred Forty-Nine Dollars and Sixty-Eight Cents (\$1,649.68) to continue membership in the Strafford Regional Planning Commission.
- 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$5,400.00) to complete the Public Hearings, Tax Readjustments and Reassessments for 1981 by the Property Appraisal Division of the Department of Revenue Adminstration, State of N.H.

- 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000.00) to purchase the Lockhart Field on the west side of Silver Street opposite the Lockhart Homestead.
- 28. To see if the Town will vote to petition the Representatives and Senators who represent the Town in the General Court to support in the current session of the General Court, the concurrent resolution to amend the State Constitution to limit the annual increase in property taxes to five percent and to limit the annual increase in spending by the state or any city, town or other governmental unit of the state to five percent. (By Petition)
- 29. To see if the Town will permit the Board of Selectmen to sell the unserviceable equipment located on the Town Garage property. The Selectmen will prepare a list of the equipment for posting and advertising in the local newspaper. Sealed bids will be requested at a specified time and date.
- 30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty—Four Thousand, Three Hundred Thirty—Three Dollars and Thirty—Five Cents (\$24,333.35) to pay principal and interest on Fire Truck and Highway Truck for 1981.

REPORT OF DISTRICT FIRE CHIEF AND YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Forest Fire Prevention: Your business, Our business, Good business. Forest fire prevention slogans have been seen in association with Smokey Bear since the late nineteen forties when a national effort to check the spread of forest fires was implemented.

New Hampshire residents recognized that forest fire prevention and suppression was the responsibility of every citizen, a half century before this national campaign, when our legislature established our first forest fire laws in 1903. Since that date, the State has appointed a town/city forest fire warden who is responsible for forest fire law enforcement in his municipality.

All fires kindled out of doors when there is no snow on the ground must be approved in writing by the forest fire warden before being kindled. All forest fires must be suppressed by the warden and his deputies as soon as they are reported. The cost of fire suppression is shared jointly by the town/city and the State of New Hampshire, as are forest fire prevention and forest fire training costs.

This state and local municipality cooperative forest fire program has given New Hampshire one of the best forest fire records in the United States.

RECREATIONAL COMMITTEE REPORT 1980

The recreation department has just completed another success—ful year of providing an area that draws many people, either as spectators or participants, to enjoy baseball, softball and tennis. This year was the first year that the tennis court could be played on with the fencing installed. Many people took advantage of using the tennis courts even though the boundary lines were not painted. The reason the lines were not painted is because the pavement will have to be sealed this coming summer.

Besides the fencing and the nets for the tennis courts some of the other site improvements included were the addition of some bleach—ers for the spectators at the softball and baseball games, a score—board, installation of a power pole with accessories for electrical power and general field and site cleanup and maintenance.

During the summer of 1980 nearly 100 ball games were played on this field including some excellent tournament games in July by the boys and girls in the independent Little League All Star Tournament.

Added to the Recreational program this year was an independent Babe Ruth League representing the town of Milton sponsored by the recreational department. This team played ball against teams as close as New Durham and as far away as Bartlett. Some of the other teams that were involved with this league were North Conway, Conway, Fryburg Maine, Ossipee, Wakefield and Tamworth. The individual that was responsible for the organizing, coaching and providing transportation of this team was Frank Wheldon. He certainly deserves a lot of credit as he had to take time off from work and provide transportation using his own truck and gas.

We would like to thank Jack Lucier and the rest of the beach committee for allowing us the use of the town beach to play ball on for this age group of boys. We especially would like to thank Mr. and Mrs. Brock who spent much time directing traffic at the beach to make this possible.

We again remind you, this park belongs to you, the taxpayer, so come up and enjoy it.

This year the money that we will ask for in our budget will be used primarily for repair services and for the sealing and painting of the lines for the tennis court.

Rural District Health Council, Inc. ANNUAL REPORT 1980

The Rural District Health Council continues as a Certified Home Health Agency covering nine towns—six in Strafford County and three in Rockingham County.

Many long hours of research and organization was done by selectmen and concerned citizens of the towns from 1966 until the first visit was made on May 5, 1969.

The priority service is the care of the sick program which includes visiting nurses, physical therapist, occupational therapist, speech therapist and home health aides, providing visits in the patient's home. The agency also has contracts for home health aide with the Strafford County Home Health Aide program and Portsmouth Area Home Health Aide program.

A Maternal & Child Health program is offered to all children from any of the member towns, and includes physicals, immunizations, teaching and counseling for ages 0-6 years. It also provides home visits to the newborns

on request and any follow-up care as requested by physicians.

A Dental program is also provided by the MCH Program and the Pre-School Dental Services and is held for children 3-6 years, which includes cleaning, and fluoride treatments twice a year with referrals to local dentists for follow-up care when needed. The program also works closely with the Women & Infant Children Nutrition Program and the Strafford County Prenatal & Family Planning Program.

The agency also holds monthly adult health maintenance program which provides blood pressure checks, diabetic and anemia screenings,

nutrition counseling and special diets and weight control.

The first and third Wednesdays screenings are held at the Town Hall in Farmington for the towns of Farmington, Middleton, and New Durham. The second Wednesday they are held at the Town Hall in Northwood, Nottingham, Deerfield, Barrington and Strafford; the fourth Wednesday they are held in Milton at the Milton Health Center. They all start at 1:00 P.M. and continue until all patients are seen—the program is open to anyone in the area. With the next grant year, the agency looks to providing an ongoing program in the Barrington area.

The Rural District Health Council cooperates with other agencies in the area to provide a continuation of good health and social services to its

member towns.

The agency with the cooperation of Frisbie Hospital provides a discharge referral coordinator who assists the social services department at the hospital and the patient's physicians to continue care as needed from the hospital to the patient's home. The hospital funds this program in part with the council.

The strength of the Council lies with the dedicated staff who many times devote themselves above and beyond the call of duty reflecting the nurse who cares for people. Staff nurses providing service within the care of the sick program are Barbara Drew, RN, Myrtle Walsh, RN, Elizabeth Coons, RN, Dorothy Demmons, RN, and Mary Timmons, RN, also acting as part time supervisor. Arlene Thorne, RN, is coordinator of the Maternal Child Health program and Paula Davis, RN, as clinic nurse and Elderly

Screening Coordinator. Jean Germer, RN, is the Discharge Coordinator. Joan Menez, LPN is part-time where needed and Alice Ziegra, RN, part-time. Home Health Aide services are provided by Gail LaRosa and Reneé Wormell. Junellen Chase handles the office duties as Administrative Assistant.

The Board of Directors has voted to decrease the per capita cost by .20¢ with a result of \$3.00 per capita for the fiscal year 1981. Many factors contributed to the decision. This year the agency has experienced in depth evaluation of our financial status, having reviewed both expenditures and income sources. The Ad Hoc Committee was appointed and met frequently throughout the year; "after careful study the Committee recommends that no charge be made to participants of the Child Health Program". However, the Board voted to attempt a pilot study of asking for a \$2.00 donation at clinic sites, a \$1.00 donation will be asked for office visits and a donation for the Elderly Screening Clinics, all effective January 1, 1981.

The Board voted to become a United Way Agency; the grant was increased for the Maternal & Child Health Program through the efforts of the Community Health Care Association. The Agency also has an increase in the State Council on Aging grant and the Referral Coordinator. The total population has increased 751 residents. With this added income the Finance Committee feel the Council can continue to provide the many needed services to its member towns.

Home Health Agencies are delivering relatively inexpensive care to rural residents who might otherwise have no access to such care.

During the past year the Council has made for your town 642 skill—ed nursing visits, 153 home health aide visits, and 336 therapy visits; there have been 47 child health home visits and 98 children have attended the Child Health Program.

- 1. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 2. To choose agents and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 3. To see if the District will authorize the School Board to withdraw after July 1, 1981 in accordance with the provisions of RSA 35, an amount not to exceed five thousand eight hundred and seventeen dollars and nineteen cents (\$5,000 in principal and \$817.19 in interest) from the Nute Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of making paving repairs, electrical and window renovations to the building and facilities known as Nute High School.
- 4. To see if the District will authorize the School Board to withdraw after July 1, 1981 in accordance with the provisions of RSA 35, an amount not to exceed four thousand four hundred and fifty—four dollars and nine cents (\$4,000 in principal and \$454.09 in interest) from the Milton Elementary Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of making paving repairs, electrical and window renovations to the Milton Elementary School and facilities.

In August, 1980, I requested the State Department of Education to conduct an evaluation of all Elementary Schools in School Administrative Unit #44 in order to determine our present state of compliance with the State Department of Education's document entitled, Approved New Hampshire Elementary Schools, k-8. The purpose of this request was to utilize State Department Services to obtain information which we could use as a point of reference at the local level in determining educational goals for the system. The State

Department among other recommendations suggested a thorough examination of present library services with particular attention being given to space and staff. Additional recommendations included the development of a comprehensive school philosophy and the addition of certified art and physical education positions to the staff. The evaluation report placed the Milton Elementary School in category III which means that the school has complied with 80% of the State Minimum Standards for Elementary Schools.

Special Education continues to emerge as a particularly significant challenge to local school districts across the Nation as a result of Federal Law PL 94-142 and Milton is no exception to this trend. During the course of the past several years, the School District has attempted to meet its' obligation in this particular area. A State On-Site Review of Special Education programs in School Administrative Unit #44 underscored the importance of continuing to improve and refine programs for children with special needs. In view of the increasing financial burden which these programs place on the local property tax, Special Education may become one of the most challenging programs for the School District to administer effectively. Cooperative planning with surrounding communities as called for by Chairman Joos is certainly part of the answer to this very Addressing the encroaching power of the Federal difficult issue. and State Governments on decision making at the local level represents another response.

The reader will note that there is an article included in the warrant to see if the District will authorize the school board to take action on behalf of the District so that the District may join as a plaintiff in a suit against the State of New Hampshire which would compel the State to provide funds to School Districts so that a more nearly equitable set of educational opportunities for children can be Presently such a suit is being considered by the New Hampshire School Board Association and the New Hampshire School Administrators Association. The purpose of this suit is to obtain a a judgement from the court to determine if the present method of funding the public schools is constitutional and if not, what remedial measures should be taken to correct the situation. I strongly urge the District to vote this article in the affirmative. If the present State foundation aid formula were fully funded this year, Milton would receive \$249,235 in State funds for the general support of education in the District which would lower the school district assessment and hence, the tax rate accordingly. The Federal and State Governments have for entirely too long a period of time required local school districts to implement costly regulations and have consistently prowided very little in the way of financial resources to the districts with which to implement said regulations. I sincerely believe that the passage of this article will be in the best interest of the children and taxpayers of Milton.

The School Administrative Unit staff continues to assist the principals and teachers in the areas of supervision, curriculum development, implementation of the New Hampshire Accountability plan, obtaining Federal energy funds and refining the new accounting procedures mandated by the new State accounting system referred to as Financial Accounting Classification Handbook II Revised. As requested by the Chairman of the Board, Mr. Joos, I would report that I do not foresee major increases at the School Administrative Unit level in either staff or budgetary items.

In closing, on behalf of the School Administrative Unit #44 Central staff, I wish to express our continued appreciation to the members of the School Board, the principals, teachers, and citizens for the cooperation exhibited and progress achieved this past year. We look forward to a long and productive relationship in which our mutual goals will continue to be the best possible education for our young people.

With the help of matching state funds, we have been able to expand our hot lunch program to include the children of the Milton Mills School. Our kitchen facilities have been remodeled and improved to handle the additional load.

I am disappointed to have to report that the Elementary School received very little of the Federal Energy money awarded this year; which resulted in the shelving of most of our energy conservation projects planned for the Milton and Milton Mills buildings,

On behalf of the children and faculty of the Milton Schools I want to thank the men and women of the Teneriffe Sports Club who through their efforts make it possible for the children of the Elementary School to participate in organized athletics. I also wish to thank the members of the Milton Woman's Club for their continued sponsor—ship of Art and Writing contests, as well as for their generosity in providing monetary awards for excellence in academics on the Elemen—tary level.

As with most years there are always many new faces to introduce and this year is no exception. Retirement, maternity, and professional advancement created the need for six new teachers. They are: Elaine Campbell, first grade; Karen Donahue, second grade; Nancy Zappone, fifth grade; Joanne Ferry, Speech; and Donnalee Hardwick, Special Education. Also joining our staff in 1980 were Cindy Moores, who is working in the lunch program and Andy Lucier, who is our new custodian/maintenance man.

Two new projects are underway for 1981. We are planning the implementation of a new reading program to include grades 1-6, that will provide a consistent and well coordinated reading program for our children. Also ready for implementation is a nationally validated anti-drug education program designed specifically for the elementary aged child.

In closing, congratulations go out to the boys and girls of Milton Elementary School for their respective first place finishes in the 1979—1980 Teneriffe Sports Club Holiday Basketball Tournament.

Continued thanks to the parents, faculty and staff for their dedication and contributions towards making the 1980 school year a successful one.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT NUTE HIGH SCHOOL

This year Nute High School welcomed five new teachers and a new guidance counselor. All are doing well in their respective positions.

A storage shed is being constructed on the west side of the gym by the Somersworth Building Trades class. Nute has three students in this class. This might be one way Nute can economically satisfy its building needs.

The Teneriffe Sports Club continues its Elementary basketball program. This program provides weekend recreation and activity for any students from the third to the sixth grade who wishes to participate. The club continues to sponsor the sports award banquet at the high school.

Federal Energy funds helped pay for the installation of two new doors and a new roof on the shop area. Custodian Henry Fields in—stalled energy saving fluorescent lights throughout new Nute.

Union #44 is in the process of developing tests to ascertain the effectiveness of its new curriculum.

The enrollment is 252, down twenty—one students form last year. This drop is due mainly to the twenty—seven students in the soph—omore class. The average is 45 students in the other five grades,

Sixteen of last year's seniors have gone on to two or four year colleges. One enlisted in the Army and one in Navy.

The boys' basketball team was the 1980 State Champion. Our gym floor still presents a yearly buckling problem. I hope next year that I can report that a solution has been found.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

Milton School Health Report 1979-1980

Pre—school vision and hearing screening was held in Milton in November. This is conducted by the State with the cooperation and assistance of many local volunteers. Any child who fails either screening is retested at school, and if a second failure is noted, then a notice is sent to the parents stating that further testing is indi—cated. Through this early screening program, many problems are detected and corrected before a child enters school.

During the school year, various health screenings are done including vision, hearing, height, weights, scoliosis, B/P, and frequent head checks for pediculosis. Parents were notified if any problems were detected.

Each year the 4th, 7th, and 10th grades, as well as all students participating in school sports have physicals by our school physician, Dr. Lord.

We were again fortunate to be able to have the School Dental Clinic. Twenty students were able to receive follow—up care by a dentist through the State Dental Matching Fund Program.

A clinic was held in the Spring offering all students in grades 7 through 12 Diptheria-tetanus and Polio boosters. These clinics are free and offer the students an excellent opportunity to update their immunizations.

I held health classes in the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd grades four days a week. I feel that it is very important that children receive health education at an early age and hope that we can continue to expand our health education program.

I have been fortunate to have high school students as health aides for the past three years. These students willingly give their time, energy and talents and are a great asset to the school and myself. Thanks girls.

I wish to extend my thanks to everyone for their help and coop—eration during the past year.

The motion to raise and appropriate \$932,542.96 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district was a vote in the affirmative.

Article 4. Victor Joos Jr. made the motion, seconded by Warren Swope, that the district authorize the school Board to receive and expend during the current 1979—80 fiscal year the sum of forty—five hundred dollars (\$4,500.00) in unanticipated United States Department of Energy funds due the district for previously completed energy conservation measures (Supplemental appropriation). It was a vote in the affirmative.

Article 5. Warren Swope made the motion, seconded by Leslie Chase, that the district raise and appropriate the sum of seventy—five thousand dollars (\$75,000.00) for such energy conservation measures as renovating and insulating the roof of the new addition at Nute High School; replacing existing electrical fixtures and doors and adding interior wall and roof insulation in both the Milton Elementary school and Nute High School. It was a vote in the affirm—ative.

Article 7. Norris Provencher made the motion, seconded by Victor Joos, Jr. that the district authorize the School Board to make application for and to receive and expend, in the name of the district, such advances, grants—in—aid, or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Gov—ernment and/or state agencies. It was a vote in the affirmative.
