

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Nelson in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for highways and raise and appropriate \$552.00 the State to contribute \$1,104, to make the Tolman Pond road a secondary state highway system, or raise and appropriate \$300.49 for the construction of Class V highway, the State to contribute \$1,201.94.
- 4. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for repairing highways and bridges or take any action in relation thereto.
- 5. To see of the Town will raise and appropriate money to Calcium Chloride Class V roads, or pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500 for fire protection, police protection and the Board of Health, to be used, if needed for war emergency. The money if not used for this purpose at the close of the fiscal year to be applied in part payment of the Trust Funds used by the town or pass any vote in relation thereto.

- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to give the selectmen the right to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of library.
- 11. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Nelson:

I herein submit my nineteenth annual report as supering tendent of schools.

We are at war today. We must not underestimate the dangers to the heritage due our boys and girls, viz., the enjoyment of free speech, free religion and the ideals of a dynamic democracy.

It is our duty to develop the true type of American citizen. Therefore, we must clarify our vision of objectives in American education and search out the roads that lead to these objectives.

From a psychoanalysis the three main thoroughfares that lead to our goal are (1) the intellectual which resting on the solid foundations of skills in our fundamentals must be enriched and extended; (2) the emotional feelings for the home, the parents, the schools and all American institutions must be strengthened; (3) the younger generation must be taught to choose wisely between success and failure, between right and wrong. Finally, may our boys and girls go forth from our schools imbued with a firm conviction that there is a God and that He will prevail over the warring nations of the world. This is our objective.

Never before in American history have boys and girls offered more challenges than today. They bid us to look forward, to the morrow. They bid us to exercise our greatest care and love for those around and about us. They bid us be strong, active and fearless, and practice moderation and consideration in our dealings with others.

Teachers, parents and citizens, the younger generation is looking to you for guidance through these trying times.

As the heavenly planets move majestically through a sky studded with stars and shedding their reflected light over the

universe so you as leaders move among the boys and girls of this generation. Let the scintillations from your characters and teaching direct and guide them to a higher level of life.

This generation expects your strong moral and financial support. Let us give it.
