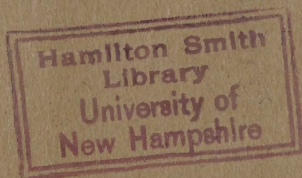

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Nelson in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for highways and raise and appropriate \$552.00 the State to contribute \$1,104, to make the Tolman Pond road a secondary state highway system, or raise and appropriate \$300.49 for the construction of Class V highway, the State to contribute \$1,201.94.

4. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for repairing highways and bridges or take any action in relation thereto.

5. To see of the Town will raise and appropriate money to Calcium Chloride Class V roads, or pass any vote in relation thereto.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500 for fire protection, police protection and the Board of Health, to be used, if needed for war emergency. The money if not used for this purpose at the close of the fiscal year to be applied in part payment of the Trust Funds used by the town or pass any vote in relation thereto.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.

9. To see if the Town will vote to give the selectmen the right to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of library.

11. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.
