## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the Fourteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges and make appropriation for the same.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$309.40 for Town Road Aid, the State contributing \$1,237.59.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the construction of a tool shed for the Highway Department.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of Laconia Hospital.
10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote

to raise and appropriate for the support of Plymouth Memorial Hospital.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of old cemeteries.

12. By request. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and maintenance of the New Hampton Village Cemetery.

13. By request. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$162.00 to the Lakes Region Association of New Hampshire to assist in planning and development of the town and for the issuance and distribution of printed matter and newspaper and magazine advertising calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

14. By request. To see if the Town will vote to repair and straighten the highway from a point near the residence of Edgar W. Eastman to Sunny Ridge Farm and make appropriation for the same.

15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by Tax Collector's deeds.

17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Class V roads.

18. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

19. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Non-Partisan Ballot System as provided in the Revised Laws of New Hampshire.

20. To see what action the Town will take regarding the hospital fund and raise and appropriate money for the same.

21. To see what action the Town will take to discontinue the road leading from the old Knockman Farm, so-called, to the main Ashland road known as Route 3B.

22. To see what action the Town will take to discontinue the section of the main road, so-called, on the easterly side of the Pemigewasset River, extending from the intersection of said highway with the highway from Bristol village over the Pemigewasset River by Fiske School, to a point about 3,500 feet south of Blake Brook, so-called, a total distance of about 1.75 miles, said discontinuance to be effective when a new highway shall have been laid out and constructed in place thereof at the expense of the United States of America and in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Selectmen, and further to authorize and empower the Selectmen for and in behalf of the Town of New Hampton to do any and all things which they may deem expedient or necessary for the construction of said new highway and the discontinuance of said section of the old highway, including the release and conveyance by suitable deed to the United States of America of all the right, title and interest of the Town of New Hampton in and to the discontinued section of said main road.

23. To transact any other business that may properly come before said meeting.

### **Synopsis of Forest Fire Permit Law**

(Chapter 191, Public Laws)

No person shall kindle a fire upon the land of another without permission from the owner, agent or caretaker thereof.

No person shall kindle a fire or burn any material in or near woodlands, pasture, brush, sprout, waste or cut over lands, or where the fire may be communicated to such land, except when the ground is covered with snow, without the written permission of the Forest Fire Warden or the presence of the warden or person designated to superintend such burning.

Any person, firm or corporation causing or kindling a fire without a permit, when a permit is required, and also any person, by whose negligence or the negligence

of his agents any fire shall be caused, is liable to the town for all expenses incurred in attending or extinguishing such fire.

Every person who shall set fire on any land, that shall run upon the land of another, shall pay to the owner all damages done by such fire.

When permission has been obtained from the land owner, camp or cooking fires may be kindled without permission of the Forest Fire Warden (unless such permission is required by city or town), at suitable times and in suitable places where they will not endanger woodlands. Upon failure to totally extinguish such fires the parties responsible are subject to the same liabilities and penalties as are prescribed for other fires.

Penalty for kindling a fire without a permit, \$200, or imprisonment not more than thirty days.

Penalty for kindling a fire willfully, or in a careless or imprudent manner, \$500, or imprisonment not more than one year, or both.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

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The rural teacher situation in the State of New Hampshire, as well as other states, reached a very critical stage this last year. Teachers were in demand in villages and city graded schools to fill vacancies of teachers gone into productive war work.

The Teachers' College graduates did not have to take a rural school, and they knew it. Their services were in demand in larger areas, working with one or two grades, instead of eight, as in the smaller communities. As a result, superintendents were forced to resort to a survey of their respective communities searching for people who had ever taught school and trying to persuade them to return to the school room in this emergency. The second part of the problem, not commonly understood by parents, is, that having found such persons, will they take the school you have to offer? Very frequently no. They are not pleased with its location; the boarding place is too far away; there are no social attractions; etc. So you begin all over again. Four of our five teachers are now commuting daily. One, five miles, another fourteen.

I speak of this teacher shortage situation, because for a time late in August, last, it seemed as though one, possibly two, schools would be closed because no teacher could be secured. We were fortunate in securing teachers.

At the present time, there is no indication that the teacher situation will be improved another year. Every effort will be made to secure teachers and keep all five of our schools open. We hope we will be successful in doing so.

The pupils in all schools have done remarkably well in buying stamps and bonds. In the 4th War Loan they are continuing their interest and effort and before the

close of the drive in February hope to have all stamp books filled and exchanged for a bond.

The "Flu" and "Grippe" have caused attendance records to suffer among both pupils and teachers, especially in this winter term. Last year's attendance record was also seriously affected. From the report you will notice that only four pupils had a perfect attendance record for the year for all four terms and only three a perfect record for the three terms. A perfect record means neither absent nor tardy for the time specified.

The National Education Association says: 200,000 teachers have left teaching since Pearl Harbor; Teachers' College enrollments have dropped 60% below 1941; 50,000 emergency teaching certificates have been issued this year, an increase of 2,000 per cent.

In the school rooms we are attempting to keep every pupil well informed as to what this war means to them, and what part they, as pupils, may play in the present and what part they, as good citizens, may play in peace time requirements.

The teaching of better health habits and better care of the body should be regarded as a move for building stronger and healthier men and women in the community with a more thorough knowledge of the importance of health in general.

This is a kind of work the school nurse is doing and it is a valuable service.

In the purchase of books and supplies, we are trying to supply the pupils of New Hampton with the necessary equipment for their work that pupils anywhere else enjoy. The materials are being well utilized. We feel that we can report good progress in the New Hampton Schools.

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This is a summary of the Health Work done in the New Hampton Schools for the past year.

A very successful dental clinic was held on June 4th and 11th and Nov. 19th, at the town house with Dr. Deneault of Meredith in attendance. A summary of the clinic shows that 58 pupils were treated, with a total of 153 operations. It was sponsored by the local Red Cross Chapter. The children were given reduced rates and were able to finance their own clinic.

The Department of Education loaned the schools an audiometer during the winter. Eighty children were tested. Seventy-four children came within the normal range of hearing. Six had a slight hearing defect.

Cod liver oil was furnished by the Red Cross for the four Rural Schools.

Several children were taken to various clinics during the year. The cooperation of the superintendent, members of the school board, teachers, parents and the local Red Cross Chapter has been very much appreciated
