The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said State qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for interest on temporary loans.
- 5. To see if the Town will accept State aid for construction of the class 2 road known as School Street and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$1,057.50:

Or will accept State aid for construction of class 5 roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$459.63.

- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town highways.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,050.00 for street lighting.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the care of cemeteries as provided in Chapter 55, Section 4, Laws of 1925.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.

- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, in excess of that required by law for the Northwood Public Library.
- 11. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to a discount on property taxes.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to have a tax placed on the shoe shop in said Town on an equal basis with other real estate in said Town; with the following exception, that said shoe shop is in operation for production on or before April 1st, 1935. (By petition.)
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the reconstruction of bridge with cement tile on Pender Hill road near Wild Acre.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate such sum as may be necessary for material to construct a vault to keep Town records in. The F. E. R. A. to furnish the labor to build same.
- 16. To transact any other business to come before said meeting.

Selectmen's Report

The year 1934 has been a very busy one for the Selectmen, with all the various relief and federal projects to look after it keeps a board on its toes to see that our town gets its share.

The year started with one of the heaviest snow falls on record and ended the same way so that our snow removal bills were more than they would ordinarily be on the average over a period of years.

The board was enabled to get some C. W. A. money to expend on snow removal which not only helped to reduce the town's expenditure for this purpose but gave work to some of our citizens.

The maintenance of town highways for summer and winter travel by automobiles necessitates a greater expenditure than was formerly the case in the old horse and buggy days. The roads have to be made wider in order to have room to push the snow back from the traveled part of the highway in winter and for spring and fall it is very essential that we reconstruct our class 5 roads so as to get better drainage and a more permanent surface.

The state has, for the past two years, allotted Northwood approximately \$3,000.00 each year for graveling our class 5 roads. This has been a great help to the town, not only in improving the roads but in furnishing employment to our people.

Money spent by the town on class 5 highways seems to be one of the best investments the town can make. It not only increases the value of property located on these roads, and gives the farms a chance to dispose of their produce the year round but it also seems to be the best way of furnishing employment to the unemployed. It is to be hoped the state and federal

government will alocate more funds in the future for this purpose.

Kelsey Mill bridge was constructed; cement tile was used; this is the type of construction which should be used in the future when any of our bridges or culverts are replaced. It is something that will last and should prove the most economical type for our class 5 roads.

Ye Olde Canterbury Roade bridge failed and had to be replaced; cement tile was used and the job was financed out of money saved from the Kelsey Mill bridge so the town got two bridges for the price of one this year.

The town lines were perambulated during the past year, a duty which has to be performed every seven years. Most of the boundary line markers were found to be in good condition, but a few had to be replaced.

The collection of taxes constitutes one of the most important jobs of any; over 92% of the taxes were collected the past year which is very good considering general conditions and compares favorably with other towns in the state.

Under the present system we are settling with our tax collector at the end of the fiscal year, January 31, by buying the uncollected list from the collector; so far this seems to be the best way of keeping tax accounts straight.

Taxpayers will have to be more alert this year than ever to prevent the tax rate from increasing.

Relief costs are mounting with no prospect of any change for the better and legislation pending which may bring them higher, valuation is falling off, income from other sources is declining and these things all go to make a higher tax rate.

The tax rate is largely determined by the amount of money appropriated at the Town Meeting, therefore it is the duty of taxpayers to be careful how they vote on any article calling for appropriation of money. The only way to insure a town's financial stability is to vote for only what is absolutely necessary and thus keep the tax rate within the paying ability of property owners, both large and small.

Northwood is in better financial condition than it has been for several years, provision having been made to reduce its indebtedness each year. It behooves the citizens to interest themselves in town affairs and see that nothing is done to increase this debt.

A pay as you go policy should be adhered to, economy practised in all departments to the end that our town will in a few years be free and clear of all indebtedness and a surplus on the right side of the ledger.



Discussion of Accompanying Charts and Tables by A. K. Leighton

The growth of town debt since 1913 was due principally to expansion in road building and educational facilities. It was most marked from 1925 to 1931 when the amount was a third larger than the "debt limit".

This town debt was largely "floating debt" caused by an accumulation of deficits on tax anticipation notes with no provision made for retirement. There also was an accumulation of unpaid taxes and of other bills due the town.

Failure to collect taxes, permitting a high rate of annual expenditure, found town finances traveling in a vicious circle

and piled up a charge against tax payers.

In 1932, the town policy changed. A large percent of unpaid bills due the town was collected and a payment made on the debt. In 1933, the remainder of the debt was funded in serial notes at a lower rate of interest and with provision for \$1000 yearly reduction of debt. After 1936 this regular method of paying on the debt will represent no additional charge due to lower interest charges.

Capital outlays prior to 1931 have increased annual maintenance expense; increases in cost of Town Poor and in the County and State Tax also contribute to a relatively high annual budget. Proposals for new capital outlays should be carefully investigated. Attention is called to the tables reporting the rapid rise in "Taxes Bought by Town" and Tax Titles".
