IRB Guidance — Research Involving Virtual Reality

Proposal Submission Deadline

As a reminder, proposals should be ready for institutional review *three (3) business days* before the sponsor due date. In addition, please notify Sponsored Programs Administration (SPA) of an intent to submit a proposal as soon as the investigator(s) decides to move forward with a submission.

The Proposal Submission Deadline Procedure was established to increase the level of service that SPA offers researchers while reducing the financial and regulatory risk associated with proposal submissions. The procedure gives principal investigators as much time as possible for the proposal to be finalized while still allowing for a thorough administrative review at the college/institute level as well as by SPA. This procedure will ensure the proposal is successfully submitted and that it is not returned without review from the sponsor.

Environmental Health and Safety Summer Interns

The Office of Environmental Health and Safety (OEHS) seeks student [summer interns](#) (15 – 30 hours per week; \$12.00 per hour). Interns will gain exposure to working in laboratory settings where hazards such as chemical, biological and or radioactive materials are present and will learn industry standard processes for ensuring safe environments for occupational and research safety. NSF Biographical Sketch and Current and Pending Support

NSF has issued an updated version of the table entitled [NSF Pre-award and Post-award Disclosures Relating to the Biographical Sketch and Current and Pending Support](#). The table dated April 20, 2022 updates information on postdoctoral scholars, students, or visiting scholars and differentiates between research activities that are intended for use on the project/proposal being proposed and those that are not. A definition of honorarium also has been added to the table. In addition, the [Frequently Asked Questions Regarding Current and Pending Support](#) have been updated and new questions have been added.

NSF's Research.gov Update

With the rollout of Research.gov in recent years, the National Science Foundation (NSF) has warned the research community of removing FastLane as their primary end-to-end proposal and award management system. In accordance with [Important Notice No. 147](#), many NSF program solicitations now require the use of Research.gov for the preparation and submission of proposals. Please be advised that NSF will now start requiring the use of Research.gov for the preparation and submission of proposals in response to program descriptions.

FastLane is targeted to be removed as a submission option from all funding opportunities when the Proposal and Award Policies and Procedures Guide (PAPPG) goes into effect in January 2023.
