WARRANT FOR ROLLINSFORD TOWN MEETING State of New Hampshire

Tuesday, March 10, 1964

POLLS TO BE OPEN FROM 10:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M.

It is hoped that the Meeting will, at its outset, vote to adjourn matters of appropriations and other Articles of Town business until Wednesday evening, March 11, at 7:30 P.M.

TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF ROLLINSFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF STRAFFORD, IN SAID STATE, QUALIFIED TO VOTE IN TOWN AFFAIRS:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Town, the tenth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE I. To bring in your ballots for:

- (a) Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, one Selectman and Overseer of Public Welfare for a term of three years; one Selectman and Overseer of Public Welfare for a term of two years; Chief of the Fire Department; three members of the Budget Committee for a term of three years.
- (b) Delegates for the State Constitutional Convention.
- (c) Your vote on the question: Shall Sweepstakes tickets be sold in this Town.
- ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget as prepared and submitted by the Budget Committee.
- ARTICLE 3. To choose all other necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- ARTICLE 4. To see if the voters of the Town of Rollinsford will authorize the Selectmen to

borrow money in anticipation of the collection of taxes.

- ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any Real Estate that has been or may be acquired through Tax Collector's Deeds.
- ARTICLE 6. To see if the voters of the Town of Rollinsford will vote to accept the following ordinance relative to Sunday opening of retail establishments, which ordinance has been granted by the Board of Selectmen on February 3, 1964:
 - Section 1. That retail business establishments may be open in the Town of Rollinsford on the Lord's Day for the purpose of selling or exposing for sale, any merchandise, food, product or services; provided that grocery stores, restaurants, garages, gas stations and drug stores may be open for said purposes all day on the Lord's Day and all other retail establishments including department stores and specialty shops may be open from 1:00 PM on the Lord's Day.
 - Section 2. Each establishment which opens on the Lord's Day under the provisions of Section 1 must supply, at its own expense, any necessary police for its own protection or for control of traffic.
 - Section 3. Each establishment which opens on the Lord's Day under the provisions of Section 1 except those open for the purpose of selling or exposing for sale, milk, bread, drugs, medicine and other necessaries of life or the entertainment of boarders as set forth in RSA Chapter 578, Sec. 4 must obtain a permit from the Board of Selectmen, to be prominently displayed on the premises, and shall pay a \$10.00 fee therefor.

ARTICLE 7.	To bring in your ballot on the following: Shall the Town of Rollinsford continue to maintain its existing Municipal Court so long as its present judge remains in office
ARTICLE 8.	To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Municipal Court.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1962 - December 31, 1963: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1962 and December 31, 1963, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the financial condition of the Town changed from a Net Debt of \$8,834.13, to a Surplus of \$7,373.22, in 1963.

Comparative state ments of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1963, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$5,688.06, plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$3,642.51, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$9,330.57.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1963, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1963, is shown in Exhibit B-2.

Statement of Indebtedness: (Exhibit F)

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1963, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit F.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source in so far as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The Current Surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$9,573.35, from \$8,401.87 to \$17,975.22, in 1963, as shown herewith:

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Rollinsford:

Education this past year in Rollinsford has been, on the average, good in all respects. Teacher turnover, amazingly enough, continues to be nil with the staff exactly the same as it was a year ago. This fact in and of itself results in stability and a continued level of performance that we can be proud of in these days of rapid change. Once again, I wish to compliment Mr. Lewis Hatfield for his devotion and competence as Principal of the Rollinsford Grade School.
His leadership in no small measure contributes to the success of our program.

This year we have introduced into the school modern arithmetic -- or what is commonly known as "modern math." The teachers have taken the introductory program for teachers as presented over Channel 11 Educational Television. This program will be implemented to a greater degree next year, and is one reason why the budget has increased in the area of textbooks for next year.

The other areas in the curriculum are continually being evaluated. Supplementary materials such as textbooks and special research and enrichment materials are being added and surveyed towards the continued strengthening of the overall program of instruction.

In the area of plant facilities, the kitchen has been moved into the former Third-Grade classroom, and this classroom now occupies the former kitchen-lunch room. This change is a good one for without a larger classroom, I am sure that some of the pupils in Grade Three or the teacher would not have been able to get into the room.

This year we are faced with the problem of inadequate toilet facilities on the lower floor. The actual toilets available are in a ratio of one to forty and one to fifty for the girls and boys assigned to this level. The school was built when only four to six classrooms were needed, and toilet facilities were provided for much smaller numbers than we now

have. The toilet rooms themselves are adequate in size, and we can and do plan to add at least two toilets and sinks to each gang toilet area which will solve our problem.

The enrollment in the school is at an all time high figure of 239. Generally, the classes are not of an unreasonable size except in the Second Grade where we presently have forty-three pupils in one grade. The State Department of Education frowns upon any number over forty in one classroom and suggests that this practice be discontinued. The School Board has authorized the employment of a teacher aide for the Second Grade to relieve that teacher of all duties except actual teaching. I can report that this aide does relieve the teacher, and allows each child a greater proportion of the teacher's time.

The budget is higher this year due to higher costs of books and supplies. Teacher salaries are going up all around Rollinsford and we must increase our salaries if we are to hold good teachers— this item has gone up. The addition of a teacher aide has also increased the cost of educating the children next year. Tuition costs are also higher for the new school year due to higher rates.

The Supervisory Union of which Rollinsford is a part voted to add an Assistant Superintendent to the staff next year to help the Superintendent. It is our intent to study curriculum and give closer supervision and more help to the teachers through the addition of this person. This additional service has resulted in higher costs to the district. The tax for state-wide supervision is no longer required from the school district, and this saving approximately covers the additional cost of the Supervisory Union to the town of Rollinsford next year.

The success that we have enjoyed is based upon the work of the teachers, the Principal, the custodian, the nurse, Mrs. Wilson, and the bus transporter. The members of the School Board also share in this success as interested policy-making individuals who set the direction for whatever education we will have. I thank

you, the citizens of Rollinsford, for your support without which we could do very little.

It is with pleasure that I submit to you this my annual report covering in part some of the activities of the Rollinsford Grade School during the year 1963-64.

Our country today has entered upon the most perilous period in its history. At stake are the fundamental freedoms of our people, and peace. Easily undervalued in assessing the elements of our strength are the potentialities of our human resources. Yet of our wealth, our youth offer our greatest hope. The outcome will be determined finally by how well we bring to fruition our every resource of mind, spirit, and of will.

If we are to meet in full strength whatever the future may bring, the schools of the nation must not only attack their problems with vigor and deep insight but they must be understood by the public that supports them. Their needs, the program, the scope of their activities, and how well they discharge their responsibilities are not now well understood. To achieve their maximum effectiveness the schools require not only the best in leadership, in facilities, and in personnel, but also the best community understanding and intelligent community support.

The school welcomes constructive criticism. Any citizen who seeks through genuine interest and honest inquiry to understand the purposes and program of his school, their problems and their needs, and then seeks to influence constructively an improved performance of these functions, renders his school and his community a most valued service. But whoever fails to inform himself, and through false charges seeks to destroy the confidence of the American people in their schools, does his country a great disservice. He should be recognized for what he is - a destructive influence in American Life. American education is fundamentally sound.

The instructional program is ever improving as the science and art of education develop, and as communities co-operate more helpfully with their schools.

If we take the long view, we must recognize that the growing generation is the most precious of our resources and that its talents and abilities must be nurtured and developed to the utmost, and its attitudes and loyalties made one of our chief concerns. Education is the most important responsibility of every American community.

FACULTY

The members of the faculty of the school have remained the same as during the previous year. This is a status that is highly desirable in that it provides a continuity of teaching that is undisturbed.

Reference to the Faculty data Sheet will give all of the vital statistics concerning the various members of the faculty.

ENROLLMENT

While the faculty and the staff has remained unchanged, the student enrollment has not. We are now at an all time high peak since the opening of the Rollinsford Grade School in 1936. Thus far during the current year, we have registered a total of 249 pupils in the school. During this same period of time we have had ten pupils transfer out leaving a current total of 239 pupils. By referring to the following tables dealing with enrollments in school, many interesting facts may be discovered.

The distribution of the pupils may be ascertained by reference to the Pupil-Teacher Ratio Table.

HOT LUNCH PROGRAM

The hot lunch program of the Rollinsford Grade School is under the direction of Mrs. Barbara Wilson, who with her assistant produces an excellent program.

A typical lunch for each day of the school year is as follows:

- (1) A hot dish
- (2) A sandwich
- (3) A dessert
- (4) A bottle of Pasteurized milk

During the past ten years it has been possible to see a steady increase in the numbers of students who have their noon meal in the school. At that time we were feeding an average of 65-70 pupils per day. Today the lunch program has expanded to the point where we are averaging 152 per day.

There is also a special milk program available to those children who wish one or more bottles of milk to be consumed on the premises. This program averages about 65 bottles of milk per day.

The following is a summary of the school lunch program for the past year.

REPORT OF ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

March 12, 1963

The Moderator, Mr. Edgar N. Gray, called the meeting to order at 8:05 P.M. The Meeting was officially opened at 10 A.M. and from that time on the polls were open for voting on Article 1. Mr. Gray announced the results of the balloting as follows:

329 ballots were cast.

Town Clerk - Eugene J. Berube. 302 votes declared elected

Selectman for 3 years:

Lester Eldridge 98 Robert Forge 93 Frederick Roux 130

Frederick Roux declared elected

Town Treasurer - Charles Jackson. 288 votes - elected

Chief Engineer - Roland Sullivan. 294 votes - elected

Budget Committee for 2 yrs - Omer Roberge - 274 votes - elected

Budget Committee for 3 years:
Eugene Berube 248 votes
Leo Gagnon 193 "
Ubald Thivierge 195 "
Ovide R. Viel 176 "

Eugene Berube, Leo Gagnon and Ubald Thivierge were elected.

The moderator had the elected persons come forward and they were sworn in.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget as prepared and submitted by the Budget Committee.

Mr. Yarnall moved that the \$32,000.00 for Roberts Road be stricken from the Budget. The Moderator explained that this was out of order as a motion on the entire Budget had to be made first. Mr. Lawlor move d that Article 2 be adopted as it appears in the Town Report. Mr. Leuchs seconded.

Mr. Leuchs questioned the amount of \$4500.00 for paving Prospect Street. The Selectmen stated that both Prospect and Fourth Streets could be done within that amount.

Mr. Roland Sullivan stated the need of a private fire phone in the town, and the cost would be \$2.00 per day to the person taking care of this phone. He moved that \$730.00 be added to the Fire Department appropriation to take care of this expense. N. Dionne seconded. Motion carried.

Mr. L. Emerson brought up the question of repairs to the bridge on his road. Mr. Hudon, Chairman of the Selectmen, said that this will be taken care of.

Motion on Article 2 was put to vote, and motion was in favor.

Mr. C. Jackson talked about the Roberts Road project and gave figures as to the amount to be raised and also the width of the road. He made a motion that \$32,000.00 be appropriated to construct Roberts Road in accordance with specifications from the State Highway Dept. Ovide Viel seconded.

Mrs. H. Roberts and Mr. Yarnall spoke against this motion, and Mrs. D. Rollins moved that an amendment be made to have a committee appointed to look into the reconstruction of

the road. Mr. Jackson said he would accept the amendment, and Mr. H. Ouellette seconded. After much discussion pro and con, the original motion by Mr. Jackson was put to vote, and was defeated.

Mr. Ouellette requested a vote on Mrs. Rollins' amendment. The Moderator asked if the passage of the amendment would have changed any vote on the original motion, and upon noting that there would not have been a single change, ruled that the vote on the original motion was in order.

ARTICLE 3. To choose all other necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Surveyors of Wood and Lumber

Mr. Hudon moved, seconded by J. Lampesis, that the same committee serve. Motion carried, and the Surveyors of Wood and Lumber are as follows:

Mr. Jackson moved that nominations cease, seconded by A. Morin. Mr. Ovide Viel was elected, and the following comprise this committee:

H. Ouellette nominated Bliss Garvin, seconded by E. Hudon. Bliss Garvin was elected.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the voters of the Town of Rollinsford will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the collection of taxes.

Mr. D. Rollins moved that we accept Article 4 as read. Seconded by Mr. Jackson. Motion carried.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any Real Estate that has been or may be acquired through Tax Collector's Deeds.

H. Ouellette moved for acceptance of this Article, and D. Rollins seconded. Motion carried.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the voters of the Town of Rollinsford will approve the following By-Law unanimously adopted by the Selectmen on February 4, 1963, relative to the operation of bowling alleys in the Town, as follows:

"any person, firm or corporation duly licensed under the provisions of R.S.A. Chap. 286 may operate a bowling alley within the Town of Rollinsford; provided, however, no bowling alley shall be operated on Sunday at any hour earlier than one o'clock in the afternoon."

Mr. F. Seavey moved to accept Article 6 as read. This was seconded by J. Lampesis. Motion carried.

To see if the Town will vote to ARTICLE 7. authorize the Selectmen to file in behalf of the Town, an application (in form and manner required by the United States and in conformity with P.L. 560, 83rd Congress) and do whatever else may be required for an advance in the amount of \$10,000. to be made by the United States to the Town of Rollinsford. to aid in defraying the cost of preliminary report and plan preparation for sewerage and sewage treatment facilities for the Town of Rollinsford, and, further, to see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to defray the cost of preparation of the report and plans.

Mr. Ovide Viel moved that the Article be accepted with the exception that we delete the \$200.00 for the cost of preparation as this amount is already in the Budget. Mr. Yarnall seconded. Motion carried.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the voters of the Town of Rollinsford will authorize the Selectmen, through the Civil Defense Unit, to negotiate with the State Civil Defense Agency for the purchase and installation of an approved Civil Defense Warning System according to the National Civil Defense Act.

Mr. Leuchs moved that we accept Article 8 as read. Seconded by J. Lampesis.



Mr. Hudon brought up the question of the Planning Board being reactivated, and Mr. Fleming said that no action need be taken.
