STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN OF ROXBURY

Warrant

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Roxbury in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Roxbury Meeting House in said Roxbury on Tuesday, the 14th of March, next at 7:00 of the clock in the evening to act upon the followig subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Appropriation: \$13,000.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,400.00 for salaries and expenses of the Police Department.
- **4.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for Town Welfare and Old Age Assistance.
- **5.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the expenses and maintenance of the Fire Department.
- **6.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the upkeep of the cemeteries.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, and will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000 for interest expense.
- **8.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for a contingency fund.
- **9.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7000.00 for summer and winter road maintenance.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$183.35 to support the Mental Health Service Program of Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$21,602.49 for highway construction and reconstruction. Selectmen's Comment: These funds for expenditure are designated to the Town through the Highway Block Grant Fund. The appropriation does not affect your tax rate, but to be properly expended, a vote is required.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$235.00 as the Town's planning expenses and it's share of expenses for the operation of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. These funds to be used for financing the staff, operation expenses, planning, studies, technical assistance, and other programs of the Commission. These funds may be used in connection with other State, and Federal Funds available, for planning purposes.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,340.00 to be paid for dump privileges in the Town of Marlborough and pay Roxbury's share of solid waste management district expense.
- **14.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for emergency assistance to the Town Poor.

- **15.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$946.65 as it's fair share of stand-by costs for the use of the City of Keene's ambulance service.
- **16.** To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$3000.00 to be put in the Capital Reserve Fund for the future revaluation of the Town.

17. Indemnification of Officers and Board Members.

Should the Town of Roxbury indemnify each official and Board Member whether or not then in office (and his or her executor, administrator and heirs) against all reasonable expenses actually and necessarily incurred including, but not limited to, judgements, costs and counsel fees in connection with the defense of any litigation to which he or she may have been a party because he or she is or was an officer or Board Member of the Town of Roxbury.

18. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Town's representatives to the General Court to respond to our solid waste crisis by taking all necessary measures to insure that New Hampshire adopt legislation that will permit consumers to return for refund of deposit within New Hampshire all soda, beer, wine cooler and liquor containers and that all unclaimed deposit monies shall be collected by the State and no less than 80% shall be returned annually to local municipalities for the sole purpose of implementing, expanding and reimbursing community recycling projects.

19. To transact any other business which may come before the said meeting.

TOWN OF ROXBURY ANNUAL TOWN MEETING OF ROXBURY, NH March 8, 1988

The meeting was called to order by Moderator David Brown at 7 p.m. Selectmen Richard Whipple, Thomas Benson and Michael Neylan were present. Of 129 registered voters, 52 cast votes.

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Selectman for Three Years: 51 votes cast. Michael Neylan received 51 votes. Michael Neylan elected.

Town Treasurer: 52 votes cast. Theresa Demond received 52 votes. Theresa Demond elected.

Tax Collector: 52 votes cast. Marika Stuhlsatz received 52 votes. Marika Stuhlsatz elected.

Auditor: 52 votes cast. David Gregory received 52 votes. David Gregory elected.

Trustee of Trust Funds: 52 votes cast. Peter Heed received 52 votes. Peter Heed elected.

Sexton: 29 votes cast. Barbara Neylan received 1 vote. Reese Every, 2. Kenneth Buffum, 6. Fred White, 3. Ed Cormier, 12. Dick Donohue, 2. Marika Stuhlsatz, 3. After all the votes were announced, everyone declined the position except Fred White who agreed to serve. (Note: nobody filed for this office, so all votes were write-in).

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Appropriation: \$12,700. Motion carried.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,200.00 for salaries and expenses of the Police Department. Motion carried.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for Town Welfare and Old Age Assistance. Motion carried.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for the lease of a radio for the Fire Department. Motion carried. (This is the third year of leasing, then we own it.)

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$375.00 for the upkeep of the cemeteries. Motion carried.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, and will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$945.00 for interest expense. Motion carried.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for a contingency fund. Motion carried.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$9,000.00 for summer and winter road maintenance. Motion carried. Selectmen praised Road Agent Kenneth Buffum for again doing a fine job and keeping costs down.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$173.70 to support the Mental Health Service Program of Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service. Motion carried

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$19,770.25 for highway construction and reconstruction. **Selectmen's Comment:** These funds for expenditure are designated to the Town through the Highway Block Grant Fund. The appropriation does not affect your tax rate, but to be properly expended, a vote is required. Motion carried.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 as the Town's planning expenses and it's share of expenses for the operation of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. These funds to be used for financing the staff, operation expenses, planning, studies, technical assistance, and other programs of the Commission. These funds may be used in connection with other State and Federal Funds available, for planning purposes. Motion carried.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,045.00 to be paid for dump privileges in the Town of Marlborough and to pay Roxbury's share of solid waste management district expense. Motion carried. Thomas Benson, the Town's representative to the Solid Waste Management District, noted that recycling of trash, as well as a regional landfill, is being considered.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for emergency assistance to the Town Poor. Motion carried.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 as it's fair share of stand-by costs for the use of the City of Keene's ambulance service. Motion carried.

Article 16. To see if the Town will authorize the establishment of a capital reserve fund (pursuant to chapter 35) for the future revaluation of the Town and raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,773.16 toward this purpose. Motion carried.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budget appropriations in the amounts indicated: and further to authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced or take any other action thereon:

AppropriationRevaluation - See Article 16

Estimated Amount \$1.773.16

Article 18. "Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 80:58-86 for real estate tax lien procedure? These statutes provide that tax sales to private individuals for nonpayment of property taxes on real estate are replaced with a real estate tax lien procedure under which only a municipality or county where the property is located or the state may acquire a tax lien against land and buildings for unpaid taxes." Motion carried by Ballot vote: 46 YES 1 NO.

Article 19. To transact any other business which may come before the said meeting. Motion carried.

Selectman Richard Whipple praised resigning Police Chief Earl Nelson for doing a commendable job and said the Selectmen have appointed Ron Smith, of the Keene Police Dep't. as New Chief of Roxbury. Neil Collier will continue as Deputy.

Selectman Michael Neylan noted what a great job the Town did in cooperating on safety preparations during the threatened flooding in April of 1987. Fortunately no flooding occurred but the Town was alerted and prepared.

A resident's suggestion for a pot luck supper before next year's Town Meeting was received with enthusiasm.

Meeting adjourned 8:30 p.m.
