TOWN WARRANT

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for snow removal for the ensuing year.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for general expenses of the highway department, for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Home Day.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred ninety-five dollars and sixty-two cents (\$195.62) for T.R.A.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Fire Department for the ensuing year.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of forty-four dollars (\$44.00) to advertise the Town.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for street lights.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to raise the money to cover the expense of such audit.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to request the State Tax Commission to make a complete reappraisal of the land and buildings within the Town to equalize valuations in accordance with the law and to raise money for this purpose.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the upkeep of the Library.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) toward the support of the Elliot Community Hospital in Keene.
- 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to pay on the truck and plow note, and in how many installments the balance of the note will be paid.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the highway known as the old road to Marlow or any part thereof and authorize the Selectmen to take any action including Court action to carry out the discontinuance.
- 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to improve the public parking lot at Carr landing.

- 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for necessary improvements of the Town Dump.
- 22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for repairs on Town Hall.
- 23. To see what action the Town will take in regard to purchasing a motor grader and to raise money for the same.
- 24. To see what action the Town will take in regard to petitioning the Public Utilities Commission in regard to connecting the telephones in Town to the Keene Exchange and to appropriate money for the same.
- 25. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.


