



TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Wakefield in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Wakefield on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for winter highways.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for oiling roads.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for culverts, bridges and general expenses.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintaining camp roads.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Public Libraries and where it shall be expended.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lighting in the villages of Sanbornville, North Wakefield, East Wakefield, Wakefield, Union and Woodman.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the proper observance of Memorial Day.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire such sums of money as may be necessary to pay Town bills in anticipation of taxes.
- 13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2000.00 as a capital reserve fund for the purpose of purchasing highway equipment, or for the repair and maintenance of highways, or for any other purpose that it can be legally used for.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$131.00 which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other Towns in the Lakes Region.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to be paid to the Sanbornville Fire Department; also a like sum to be paid to the Union Fire Department.

- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Poor.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to be used by the Sanbornville Athletic Association for the development of the skating rink and playground.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2127.00 to be expended on the Gilman Road; the State contributing \$4254.00.
- 19. To transact any business that may legally come before said meeting.

PREVENT FOREST FIRES — IT PAYS

An average of 7,300 acres of woodland are burned over by forest fires in New Hampshire each year destroying many thousand dollars worth of property of all description. It costs many additional thousands of dollars and requires valuable man hours, taken from other essential work, to extinguish them. These losses affect the personal fortunes of the owners and town and state economies. Everyone loses because of them.

Analysis of fire causes reveal the fact that more than 98 percent of all forest fires are, consistently, the result of human carelessness and are preventable!

We have been extremely fortunate during the past few years. Favorable fire weather and war time restrictions on travel which kept people off the highways and out of the woods have aided materially in reducing fire risks, keeping fires fewer and fire losses low.

We now face changed conditions. People can travel freely. Their love for travel and the freedom of the woods will bring them out in ever increasing numbers. This will step up fire risks materially. The accelerated cutting of the war years has resulted in additional thousands of slash acres. These factors, combined with a possible dry season and human carelessness could easily produce a catastrophe. Everyone must, consequently, be on their guard. They should

- 1. Be careful with fire or when smoking in or near woodlands.
- 2. Cooperate with the local forest fire warden and his deputies by
 - a. Abiding cheerfully with whatever restrictions it may be necessary to impose. They are intended only to be helpful.
 - b. Securing permits to burn debris when the

ground is not covered with snow.

- c. Seeing that others comply with requirements.
- d. Promptly coming to the warden's assistance wheen needed.

If these few fundamental practices are followed it will be possible to PREVENT a large proportion of FOREST FIRES from starting — that PAYS!
