## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Webster in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Grange Hall in said Webster on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next at one of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects; provided, however, that the polls will be open for balloting on Article 1 from 1:00 p. m. to 7:30 p. m., and action on all the remaining articles will begin at 8:00 p. m.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
  - a. Town Officers' Salaries
  - b. Town Officers' Expenses
  - c. Election & Registration
  - d. Expenses Town Hall & Other Town Buildings
  - e. Damages & Legal Expenses
  - f. Police Department
  - g. Insurance
  - h. Civil Defense
  - i. Town Dump
  - j. Street Lighting
  - k. Interest
3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for maintenance of highway and bridges.
  - a. Summer Maintenance
  - b. Winter Maintenance
  - c. Tar Roads
  - d. General Expense of Highway Department
4. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$850.53 for Class V road construction.
5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Public Welfare.
  - a. Town Poor
  - b. Old Age Assistance

6. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Library.
7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Patriotic purposes.
  - a. Old Home Day
  - b. Memorial Day
8. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support and maintenance of the Hy-Mar Fire Department, including forest fires.
9. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$118.00 toward the operating deficit of the Concord Hospital this being based on the number of patients admitted from Webster.
11. To authorize the empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow for the Town, by issuance of notes, a sum not exceeding \$75,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1971, said notes payable from said taxes within one year of issuance, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof,
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the maintenance of the playground and skating area.
13. To see what sum of money the Town wishes to raise and appropriate for the rent of the Grange Hall for the year 1971 and Town Meeting 1972.
14. "To see if the town will vote to establish a Conservation Commission as set forth in R. S. A. 36-A, said Commission to consist of five (5) members, and that the Selectmen appoint said Commission within thirty (30) days from the date of the annual meeting and that a temporary chairman be appointed to call the first meeting of the Commission." (By petition)
15. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Planning Board the powers of R. S. A. 36:19, relating to subdivision of land.
16. To see if the Town will authorize the construction of a salt shed behind the town offices.



17. To raise a sum of \$1,000.00 for construction of the town salt shed and to authorize the expenditure of \$600.00 from sale of town property to Mr. Robert Roby.
18. To authorize the Selectmen to enter into an agreement with the U. S. Army Reserve for the construction and relocation of the road to the town ball field. And to raise the sum of \$500.00 for materials needed to provide drainage, markings and seeding.
19. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## LIBRARY TRUSTEES' REPORT

We invite all townspeople to visit our newly renovated library. The ceiling has been lowered, insulation and new lighting installed, bookcases added and remodeled, and everything is newly painted. A new gas heater is proving very satisfactory.

We appreciate the use of the Anderson Memorial Church, which the Woman's Union allowed us to use for storage of books and equipment during our period of renovation. We also thank the Early Hour 4-H Club for the gift of a fire extinguisher for the library.

Despite the fact that the library was closed for six weeks due to the above renovations, an average of 31 persons per week used our facilities during the past year. This compares with an average of 25 in 1969.

1350 books were borrowed from the Bookmobile during 1970, and 122 volumes were purchased by the library at an average cost per book of between \$5.00 and \$6.00. The Town appropriation of \$500 is used only for the purchase of books, librarians' salaries, insurance, and supplies. Our balance on hand includes \$100 State Grant-In-Aid, which is given the library for the express purpose of purchasing reference books before the end of the fiscal year; and the gift of \$100 made possible by the Robillard family and the Fire Department, which will be used for a specific purpose at some future date, possibly for library furniture.

In addition to its regular afternoon and evening hours, the library has been open on Wednesday morning from 10:30 until noon for the benefit of school children only.

**TOWN MEETING – MARCH 10, 1970****Grange Hall – Webster**

Meeting called to order at 8:05 by Moderator Robert H. Roby, who read the warrant and the slate of newly elected officers. The latter was as follows: Ruth Stebbins, Town Clerk; William Phelps, Treasurer; Helen Scribner, Tax Collector; (all for one year) and Roger Durgin, Selectman for three years. Robert Hoar was elected Road Agent; Eleanor Richardson and Mabel Anderson, Auditors; all for one year. Carol Creighton was reelected Library Trustee for three years; Trustees of Trust Funds: Barbara Mock, 3 years; Roy E. Roby, 2 years; Madeleine Roberts, 1 year. It was voted to have the selectmen appoint the remaining town officers.

**Article 2. Town Charges.** \$12,800 was raised to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

**Article 3.** \$4,500 was raised for summer maintenance. A vote to raise \$9,000 for winter maintenance was defeated by a tie vote and a vote to raise \$7,000 was also declared a tie vote by the Moderator. A standing vote was taken on a revised motion to raise \$9,000 and it was so voted, with 65 pro and 27 con. A motion to raise \$4,000 for tar roads maintenance was defeated. It was then voted to raise \$3,500 for this purpose. \$1,000 was voted for General Expense of the Highway Department.

**Article 4. Class V. Road Construction.** \$731.93 was raised.

**Article 5. Public Welfare** Voted \$1,500 for Town Poor and \$500 for Old Age Assistance.

**Article 6. Town Library** Voted \$1,500 for Town Library, with \$1,000 of this amount to go towards renovations.

**Article 7. Patriotic Purposes** Voted \$300 for Old Home Day and \$50 for Memorial Day.

**Article 8.** It was voted to raise \$1,800 for the support of the Hy-Mar Fire Dept., including forest fires.

**Article 9. Cemeteries** \$1,500 was raised for the care of cemeteries.

**Article 10. Operating deficit of Concord Hospital.** \$44 was raised.

**Article 11.** It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow for the Town, by the issuance of notes, a sum not exceeding \$50,000 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1970, as specified in this article in the warrant.

**Article 12.** \$300 was voted for maintenance of the Playground.

**Article 13.** \$25 was voted to exped in cooperation with N. H. Forestry, etc.

**Article 14. Rent of Grange Hall** As \$1,000 was included for rent of the hall in the amount raised under Expense of Town Hall and other buildings, it was voted to pass over Article 14.

It was referred back to Article 2 and it was voted to change the figure of \$12,800 to \$14,300, to provide \$1,500 for maintenance of the Police

Department. Selectman Kenneth F. Hoar read the total list of Town Charges included under this article and it was suggested from the floor that the specific items included under TpwN Charges should be itemized and appear in the Town Report under that heading.

**Article 15. Planning Board:** It was explained by Selectman Robert Robillard that the ordinances passed last year at a special Town meeting were of practically no value because the Town has no Planning Board to which to refer question which might arise. Powers of a Planning Board were explained; especially its power as a "stop-gap" measure. The Town cannot legislate hard and fast rules without a Planning Board. A discussion followed. A vote was taken and it was voted to establish a planning board. The ballot vote showed 67 yes and 42 no votes.

**Article 16. Visiting Nurses:** Mr. Joseph Degen, Sec'y of the Kearsarge VNA, explained this article, answering questions from the floor. A motion to adopt this article was defeated by a standing vote (31 for and 49 against).

**Article 17.** Selectman Paul Mock explained, in answer to a question from the floor, the actions and policy of the Selctmen regarding the vote to reappraise the Public Utilities, which was made two years ago. He reported that it was recommended by the Tax Commission that Webster **not** increase the evaluation of P.U. \$50,000. He was informed by Town Counsel that a court case might result from the attempt and the Tax Examiner advised to leave as it is. A discussion of the assessment and valuation of mobile homes followed.

It was voted to have the polls open next year from 1p.m. to 7 p.m. Election expenses were discussed and contrasted with those of former years when a regular daytime Town meeting was held.

The meeting adjourned at 10:40 p.m.
