A TRIBUTE TO

ESTHER ARVIDSON EMERY

IN RECOGNITION OF FORTY YEARS' SERVICE AS BALLOT CLERK, LIBRARIAN AND LIBRARY TRUSTEE.



During the waning years of the past century Mr. and Mrs. Arvidson came from Sweden to Quincy, Massachusetts. They had a daughter Esther who grew up in that coastal city, attended the local schools from which she entered a business office as a bookkeeper.

While the present century was still young, many people from our southern neighbor came to Auburn to spend their vacations, Esther among them. It was here that she met her husband Carl Lester Emery and after their marriage they established a home in the village. Auburn was the richer for this union and four children were born to Esther and Carl.

It could happen in America when a daughter in the first generation from the land of the midnight sun could meet and marry the great-grandson to the sixth degree of one John Emery who with his brother Anthony, migrated from Ramsey, England to Massachusetts Bay in the good ship James in 1635. John settled in Newbury where he and his wife had four children, and they and their children for ten generations peopled the country from Calais to the Golden Gate.

In April 1957 Carl died at the age of 66 but Esther has continued to contribute much to the town she adopted, to the church where she is a member, and the community where she resides.

First: To bring in your ballots for:

Town Clerk for the ensuing year,
One Selectman for three years,
Tax Collector for the ensuing year,
Town Treasurer for the ensuing year,
Highway Agent for the ensuing year,
One Library Trustee for three years,
One Cemetary Trustee for three years,
One Trust Fund Trustee for three years,
One Auditor for Two years,
One member of the Police Commission for three years,

Polls will open at 10:00 o'clock A.M. and close at 7:00 P.M..

You are also notified to reconvene on Saturday, March 16, next at 2:00 P.M. (if so voted on Tuesday, March 12) at the Auburn Village School All-Purpose Room to consider the following articles:

Second: To see if the Town will vote to incur debt for Temporary Loans in anticipation of taxes.

Third: To see if the Town will vote to accept such Trust Funds as may have come in during the year and Trust Funds as have not been previously accepted.

Fourth: To see if the Town will vote to use the income of the H. B. Burnham Fund for schools or Library.

Fifth:

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars to add to the Capital Reserve Fund to be used for the purchase of a Police Cruiser. (Recommended by the Budget Committee

Sixth:

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the necessary funds from the Police Cruiser Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase of a Police cruiser.

The services of the Visiting Nurse are available for all of the residents of Manchester, Auburn, Candia, Bedford, Goffstown and Hooksett regardless of race, creed, age or ability to pay. The Association is a Home Health Agency certified to care for Medicare patients.

The Visiting Nurse provides bedside care and treatment according to the direction of the patient's physician. She gives the nursing care and teaching that are needed for the rehabilitation of the patient. Physical Therapy is available by Registered Physical Therapists. Instruction in maternal and infant care during pregnancy and to mothers with new babies is another important part of the service. Classes for Expectant Parents are held Spring and Fall.

The Visiting Nurse is also a teacher who gives family health guidance.

In Auburn, Mrs. Ethel Partan, R.N. and now Miss Ann Wagner, R.N., admitted 8 new cases during 1967, 2 of whom were on Medicare.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and citizens of Auburn I hereby submit my 5th annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

Personnel:

In September we welcomed many new teachers, some to replace those who left the system and others that were to fill new, additional positions.

The recruitment of teachers is one of the most important responsibilities of the Superintendent of Schools: important because of the role of the teacher in the success of the school system. The teachers are the backbone of the system, and the degree of success or failure of the boys and girls is greatly dependent on the qualifications, background and maturity of the teacher.

The leading factor in obtaining top candidates from which to make selections is an adequate salary schedule. A salary schedule, at least comparable to neighboring communities, must be maintained; otherwise, you get only the candidates unacceptable to other communities. Fringe benefits, such as paid hospital insurance, pay for professional improvement (college courses) sabbatical leave, accumulative sick days allowance, are also important to prospective teachers considering a teaching position in the community. There are other factors which include; number of pupils in class, type of building, books that are up-to-date and ample supplies for the classroom teaching activities, availability of apartments and homes, the friendliness of parents and citizens in the town.

When one considers the short supply of teachers and the great demand for them by school districts caught in the area of rapid expansion, it is not difficult to understand the need for having competitive salaries and fringe benefits in order to keep the teaching staff turnover to a minimum and also attract new teachers of good potential for the additional positions added each year.

Our plan of recruitment is composed of a many-sided approach which includes:

1. Printing and distributing to a wide area of colleges, brochures that tell of our community and school in words

and pictures.

- 2. Scheduled visits to college and university placement officers for interviews with prospects.
- 3. Sending teachers already in the system to visit their former colleges to try and encourage June graduates to come to our community for positions.
- 4. Sending principals to visit colleges to interview prospective candidates.
- 5. Advertising in newspapers to keep general public informed as to our needs.
- 6. Listing positions that are open in the Department of Employment Security weekly, also in various other placement offices such as the State Teacher Association, State Department of Education, etc..

We will continue to search for good candidates and strive to bring quality to our growing school system.

Curriculum:

I am most happy and proud to acknowledge the significant beginnings that have been made in the area of Social Studies. The committee of teachers and principals, under the direction of Assistant Superintendent of Schools Mr. Bernard J. Ellis, have been most enthusiastic. Their efforts will enable all teachers to have in their possession a course of study for their particular grade.

Arrangements have also been made to have inservice programs to upgrade and better understand our teaching efforts and the curriculum and the children.

Growth:

This word rather amply describes the School District's great problem; that of providing enough books, supplies, classrooms and teachers for the rapidly increasing number of pupils.

The School District must again be prepared to present to the voters a construction plan for completing the needed classrooms at the Village School. The six classroom addition on the second level needs to be accomplished at the District meeting in March of 1968 or we will again face a serious classroom shortage.

This will complete the Village School and land should be acquired in another section of Auburn to care for a future elementary school.

Appreciation

The School Board, citizens of Auburn and the teaching staff are to be thanked for all of the accomplishments made for the youth of the community.

REPORT OF ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT

It is my pleasure to hereby submit my second annual report as Assistant Superintendent of Schools

The curriculum study committee worked throughout the 1966 1967 school year to develop guidelines for a curriculum for fourth grade social studies. This area was chosen due to lack of material available on the teaching of New Hampshire. This guide will be presented to the fourth grade teachers in September of 1967. As a supplement to this guide a package was prepared for each fourth grade teacher which consists of a booklet and visual aids material for the teaching of the units.

The Union office has prepared teacher recruitment booklets, describing all the towns in this Supervisory Union. These booklets have been sent to teachers colleges in the eastern half of the United States. They have been so written as to encourage prospective teachers to investigate the possibility of teaching in our towns in southern New Hampshire. A picture portfolio has also been prepared for use by the Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent showing every school in the Union - this will be shown to all students we interview on college campus'.

The S. R. A. Achievement Testing Program, which was under pilot study during the school year 1966-67, was adopted for the school year 1967-68 in grades three through eight. The results received from these tests are of the type that will enable the classroom teacher and principal to be aware of the strength and weakness of each child by the end of November. With this material at hand the teacher can plan a program of studies to meet the needs of her particular class.

The Auburn School will be faced with the need for additional classroom space by September of 1968. The new addition, built last year, has enabled the school to offer a better program. The library has allowed the students to pursue research projects as well as find books for their pleasure reading; the laboratory has enabled the science program in grades six, seven and eight to be greatly enriched. The people of Auburn can be proud of the school and the program offered to their children. The addition of needed classrooms and locker-room space will enable this past progress to be continued.

I wish to thank the dedicated principal and teachers for their time and efforts spent on curriculum development this past year. I feel that we have successfully begun the work of curriculum development.

REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL

To the School Board, citizens of Auburn, and the Superintendent of Schools, I hereby submit my second annual report as Principal of the Auburn Village School.

The paper-hangers were working in the corridors and the painters were painting as 320 students appeared for the first day of school on September 8, 1966. Needless to say, the new addition to our school was not quite complete.

These 320 students represented an increase of 39 students from the previous September. When our doors closed in June of 1967 there were 335 students registered at the Auburn Village School. This figure represents an increase of 46 students from June 1966 to June of 1967.

One additional teacher was hired for the school year to help handle this increase in enrollment. Then in February of 1967, Mr. Gratton was hired to help alleviate the over-crowded conditions in grades six, seven and eight.

With the completion of the new addition many educational as well as social functions were carried out during the school year. The modern science laboratory enabled the students in grades 6-8 to work in a lab situation thus creating a good learning situation as they were able to discover and observe various scientific principles as they worked. This is an excellent way to learn as merely reading about a subject is not always meaningful.

The new multi-purpose room made it possible to carry out our physical education program on a year-round basis. The children enjoyed this immensely. During the winter months, Mr. Nightingale coached basketball for youngsters in grades 5-8. His basketball team managed to win several games this year.

Programs such as plays, a string quartet, folk singers, pottery making and dancers were produced through the Center for Arts Exposure, Inc.. Various classes produced plays and skits during the year to the enjoyment of the entire student body.

Mrs. Frietas taught remedial reading this year for a total of 22 weeks. This was made possible with monies made available to us through the ESEA Act of 1965.

Miss Matusek carried out our speech program one morning a week during the school year. This program was a continuation of last year's program made possible through funds from the ESEA Act of 1965.

Different grades took a total of 14 class and field trips during the school year.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank the citizens of Auburn, the School Board, Mr. Dolph, Mr. Ellis, the faculty, the cafeteria personnel, the custodians, our music supervisors, our nurse-teacher, the bus drivers and the PTA for their cooperation in making this a successful educational year for Auburn.

REPORT OF THE SPEECH THERAPIST

A speech Therapy Program has been organized and instituted with Title I Federal Government Funds provided for Supervisory Union #10 in elementary schools of Auburn, Derry, Londonderry and Windham.

This program has been in existence since February, 1966, and until June of last year five graduate students of Speech Pathology were employed on a part-time basis for this School Union. During this time approximately 100 children were seen for one-half hour weekly in a small group or individual session. A seven week summer program followed providing more extensive service for the children and allowing considerable parent participation. Approximately 40 children attended, usually twice to three times weekly.

This program has continued for the 1966-67 school year but because funds have not been available, a full day of this program has been eliminated. More extensive services are now needed in these areas as the population is so rapidly expanding.
