#### CONWAY TOWN WARRANT

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF CONWAY, County of Carroll, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Kennett High School Auditorium at Conway, New Hampshire, on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, 1985, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects hereinafter set forth. Voting on Articles 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 will be by official ballot and the polls shall open for balloting at nine o'clock in the forenoon or as soon thereafter as the Moderator calls the meeting to order and declares a quorum present. The remaining articles of the Warrant shall be acted upon at seven o'clock in the evening or at the closing of the polls if the meeting shall vote to keep the polls open to a later hour.

ARTICLE 1. To choose all necessary officers.

ARTICLE 2. To see whether or not the Town will vote to approve Zoning Ordinance Amendment No. 1 to the Town's Zoning Ordinance as recommended by the Planning Board to be acted on under official ballot of the Town, topically described as changing the numbering, titling and formatting of the Zoning Ordinance, the entire text of which is as published by General Code Publishers Corp. in "The Code of the Town of Conway" on file with the Town Clerk, effective on passage; this amendment shall repeal, supersede and replace by reference to said Code the prior Zoning Ordinance of Conway.

ARTICLE 3. To see whether or not the Town will vote to approve Zoning Ordinance Amendement No. 2 to the Town's Zoning Ordinance as recommended by the Planning Board to be acted on under official ballot of the Town, topically described as creating a new zoning district to be called the Rural Residential/Agricultural District wherein minimum lot sizes will be increased to two (2) acres in the South Conway area of Conway.

ARTICLE 4. To see whether or not the Town will vote to approve Zoning Ordinance Amendment No. 3 to the Town's Zoning Ordinance as recommended by the Planning Board to be acted on under official ballot of the Town, topically described as creating a new zoning district to be called the Recreational Resort District wherein additional uses and accessory uses thereto may be conducted around Peaked and Cranmore Mountains to the heights of Middle and Black Cap Mountains. ARTICLE 5. To see whether or not the Town will vote to approve Zoning Ordinance Amendment No. 4 to the Town's Zoning Ordinance as recommended by the Planning Board to be acted on under official ballot of the Town, topically described as various definition changes, changes to permitted uses in the Residential/Agricultural District, changes to the uses in the Business District, changes to the permitted uses in the Flood Plain Conservation District and in the floodway, changes of delineation of the Wetland Conservation District, adoption of certain setbacks, frontage and building lot requirements and modifying the changes allowed for vested signs.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000,00) for the purposes of improving the Cranmore Lake Shores main access road under the petition for conditional road layout (and with repayment to be by assessment of those served by said road) and authorize the Selectmen to borrow up to said sum under the Municipal Finance Act with the Selectmen to arrange all terms and conditions of such borrowing and its repayment to be acted on by ballot of the Town. Recommended by the Budget Committee (10-0-0).

ARTICLE 7. To see whether or not the Town will vote to adopt the ordinances and regulations, together with a change of numbering, titling and formatting thereof, the entire texts of which are as published by General Code Publishers Corp. in "The Code of the Town of Conway" on file with the Town Clerk, effective on passage; this vote shall supersede and replace by reference to said Code the ordinances and regulations heretofore adopted by the Town of Conway.

ARTICLE 8. To see whether or not the Town will authorize the Selectmen to investigate and contract in the name of the Town for the disposal of solid waste generated in the Town, with private contractor or contractors lasting for a term of years at such price and other terms as the Selectmen deem prudent and reasonable acting in their sole discretion and capacity, with this vote to remain valid until modified or changed by subsequent vote of the Town provided that no action taken by said Selectmen hereunder shall be affected by any subsequent recision or modification of their authority.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) to be used as an offset against the budgeted appropriation for HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT CAPITAL EQUIPMENT, and authorize the withdrawal of that amount from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund. Recommended by the Budget Committee (11-0-0).

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) to be used to replace the TASKER HILL BRIDGE with a steel arch culvert, and to authorize the withdrawal of that amount from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund. Recommended by the Budget Committee (11-0-0).

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) to be used for reconstruction of a portion of SOUTH CONWAY ROAD, and to authorize the withdrawal of that amount from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund. Recommended by the Budget Committee (10-1-0).

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) for hot bituminous overlay paving on WEST SIDE ROAD, and to authorize the withdrawal of that amount from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund. Recommended by the Budget Committee (11-0-0).

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) to plow, sand and remove snow from the sidewalk on the east side of Route 16, between the intersection of Route 16 and 302 and Artist Falls Road. Recommended by the Budget Committee (10-1-0).

ARTICLE 14. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes:

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for compensation for the members of the Planning Board to be divided among the members as follows: \$250.00 for the Chairman, \$200.00 for the Vice Chairman, \$150.00 for the Secretary, \$100.00 for the other regular Board members. Not recommended by the Budget Committee (9-0-1).

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will vote to accept and maintain in an orderly fashion the road system in BIRCH HILL WEST, a development with approximately 1.3 miles of road, consisting of Forbes Drive, Attitash Lane, Red Ridge Lane, Nina Lane, Moat Lane, and a portion of Ledgeview Drive. Agreeable to a petition signed by Kevin P. McInerney and others.

ARTICLE 17. To see whether or not the Town will vote to adopt the following by-law pursuant to N.H. RSA 31:39I (1), and include the same in "The Code of the Town of Conway":

> It shall be unlawful to stand on the travelled portion of a way as defined in N.H. RSA 259:125 (I) for the

purpose of soliciting business or contributions in regard to a commodity or service or for the purpose of distributing any literature advertising some commodity or service. Any person violating this by-law shall be fined up to \$100.00 for each offense to inure to the Town for its general purposes.

Recommended by the Conway Police Commission.

ARTICLE 18. To see whether or not the Town will vote to adopt the following by-law pursuant to N.H. RSA 31:39I(1), and include the same in "The Code of the Town of Conway":

> It shall be unlawful to urinate on any public property situated within the borders of the said Town of Conway, New Hampshire. Public property shall be defined herein as any way defined in N.H. RSA 259:125(II), any property owned by the Town of Conway and any property owned by the State of New Hampshire. Any person violating this by-law shall be fined up to \$100.00 for each offense to inure to the Town for its general purposes.

Recommended by the Conway Police Commission.

ARTICLE 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Nine Thousand Dollars (\$9,000.00) for the support of the CHILDREN & YOUTH PROJECT OF MT. WASHINGTON VALLEY (C&Y). Agreeable to a petition signed by Evelyn B. Dole and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (10-0-0).

ARTICLE 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) to the NORTH CON-WAY DAY CARE CENTER. Agreeable to a petition signed by Linda Owens Forbes and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee. (9-1-0).

ARTICLE 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for the support of the EASTERN SLOPE AIRPORT AUTHORITY. Agreeable to a petition signed by Jesse E. Lyman, III, and others. Not recommended by the Budget Committee (7-2-1).

ARTICLE 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) as a contribution to the capital improvement fund of the EASTERN SLOPE AIRPORT AUTHORITY to finance the 5% local share of a planned \$650,000 project to extend the runway and install an instrument landing system. Agreeable to a petition signed by William J. Hounsell and others. Not recommended by the Budget Committee (6-4-0). ARTICLE 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Sixty Dollars (\$2,060.00) for support of the COMMUNITY ACTION OUTREACH PROGRAM. Agreeable to a petition signed by Julie Lessard and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (10-0-0).

ARTICLE 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Forty Six Thousand Dollars (\$46,000.00) to assist the CONWAY VILLAGE RECREATION COMMISSION and the NORTH CONWAY COMMUNITY CENTER: \$23,000.00 to the Conway Village Recreation Commission, and \$23,000 to the Board the Directors, North Conway Community Center. Agreeable to a petition signed by Sharon M. Fisher and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (7-3-0).

ARTICLE 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) to assist the NORTHERN CARROLL COUNTY FAMILY PLANNING PRO-GRAM. Agreeable to a petition signed by Constance Mead and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (8-3-0).

ARTICLE 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seven Thousand Nine Hundred Thirty Dollars (\$7,930.00) to assist the CARROLL COUNTY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE. Agreeable to a petition signed by Brenda McNall and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (9-1-1).

ARTICLE 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) in support of the CAR-ROLL COUNTRY PROGRAM ON DOMESTIC VIOLENCE. Agreeable to a petition signed by Anne Maura and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (11-0-0).

ARTICLE 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Thousand One Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$4,120.00) to be divided equally between the CHAMBER OF COMMERCE OF CONWAY and the MT. WASHINGTON VALLEY CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, with \$2,060.00 allocated to the Conway Chamber of Commerce and \$2,060.00 allocated to the Mt. Washington Valley Chamber of Commerce. Agreeable to a petition signed by Carl E. Lindblade and others. Not recommended by the Budget Committee (9-2-0).

ARTICLE 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eleven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$11,500.00) for the CENTER OF HOPE, INC. Agreeable to a petition signed by Mark H. Tripp and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (11-0-0).

ARTICLE 30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$1,400.00) for the support of the GIBSON NUTRITION PROGRAM. Agreeable to a petition signed by Glenna Mori and others. Recommended by the Budget Commit<sup>\*</sup>ee (11-0-0).

ARTICLE 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Nine Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$9,400,00) for administrative expenses for the GIBSON CENTER FOR SENIOR SER-VICES, INC. Agreeable to a petition signed by Glenna Mori and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (11-0-0).

ARTICLE 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) for the 1985 Capital Budget of THE MEMORIAL HOSPITAL, North Conway, N.H. Agreeable to a petition signed by Thomas W. Crompton and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (9-2-0).

ARTICLE 33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Thirteen Thousand Fifty Eight Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$13,058.50) for the VISITING NURSE SERVICES OF NORTHERN CARROLL COUNTY, INC. said sum being equal to \$1.75 per person in the Town of Conway. Agreeable to a petition signed by William J. Fowle and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (11-0-0).

ARTICLE 34. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) to support the services of the MT. WASHINGTON VALLEY CHAPTER OF THE AMERICAN RED CROSS. Agreeable to a petition signed by Kathryn A. Burnell and others. Not recommended by the Budget Committee (8-1-2).

ARTICLE 35. Are you in favor of authorizing the Tax Collector to accept prepayment of Resident Taxes prior to issuance of the Resident Tax Warrant, such payments not to be received before April 1st of any given year, in accordance with New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated 80:1a.

ARTICLE 36. Are you in favor of authorizing the Tax Collector to accept prepayment of property taxes prior to issuance of the Tax Warrant, such payments not to be received before April 1st of any given year, in accordance with New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated 80:52a.

ARTICLE 37. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the Town such sums of money as may be needed, such sums not to exceed the combined school, town and county tax budgets, in anticipation for town, county and school purposes.

ARTICLE 38. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen, in behalf of the Town of Conway, N.H. to accept gifts and/or Federal or State aid in the name of the Town of Conway, N.H. applied for, and to receive and expend them in accordance with the purposes thereof.

ARTICLE 39. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw Capital Reserve Funds established by the Town from time to time and disburse the same in accordance with the purposes for which such funds were created respectively.

ARTICLE 40. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell, at their discretion, at public auction, any real estate in the Town to which the Town has title by Collector's Deed; except when it is being sold back to the former owner, or to a party who has succeeded to the title of the former owner, in which case private sale may be utilized; any such real estate to be sold and conveyed on or before the next annual Town Meeting.

ARTICLE 41. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

### SELECTMEN'S REPORT

As the highlights of 1984 Town of Conway business can now be found in the Town Manager's Report elsewhere in this booklet, it permits this page to discuss a more long range thought.

As is more than amply demonstrated each week by the volume of legal and technical material that passes across town office desks, the business of running a town is becoming an increasingly complex one.

It is thus not just desirable, but necessary for a town to have knowledgeable and experienced people involved in its operation. A town must attract good employees - employees who will adapt easily to training and show initiative by keeping themselves current on new ideas in their field - and then keep such employees long enough for them to make positive contributions to the town. Conway's recent record has been excellent. The turnover amongst town employees over the past few years has approached zero. The Highway and Landfill departments have done all that has been asked of them and most of their members have earned substantially higher than "satisfactory" ratings.

Many of the town office personnel attend meetings of the New Hampshire Municipal Association - meetings at which they can discuss mutual problems with employees of other towns and are exposed to new methods for coping with them. Town Assessor, Jim Fennessy, keeps up to date on the Board of Directors of the N.H. Association of Assessing Officials. Town Clerk, John Stevens, is also on the Board and a past president - of the New Hampshire City and Town Clerks Assn., and Assistant Town Manager, John Walsh, is on the Board of Directors of the N.H. Resource Recovery Association.

Town Manager, Curt Lunt, has been attending courses at the University of Maine, Orono, from which he hopes to acquire his Masters Degree in Public Administration later this year. Truly one of Conway's major assets today - and one often overlooked - is the knowledge and stability of those who work for the town.

It has been a personal pleasure of mine to serve with two highly qualified and conscientious Selectmen, Bob Bumstead and Paul Ashnault. Their knowledge and experience have helped the Town avoid many pitfalls in the increasingly hazardous world of municipal operation. Conway is most fortunate to be able to attract people of their caliber, and needs to continue to lure talented residents willing to contribute time and energy to both elected and appointed positions in making Conway a better and better place to live and work.

### **TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT**

#### TO THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN AND CITIZENS OF CONWAY

While disposal of garbage may not be the number one problem or topic of conversation with most people, it has been both for the Town Hall and will probably continue to be for some time to come. Even though we did build a transfer station and now haul our waste to the Sanco, Inc. landfill in Bethlehem, the problems of our landfill are still present. We are now testing four monitoring wells, and have agreed to develop a closeout plan in 1985 which involves estimating costs of covering the site with impermiable materials. We are also continuing to negotiate with a private firm, Remedial Resource Recovery, for incineration of our garbage in their planned refuse-toelectricity plant.

Maintenance of our 77 miles of public highways is also a major continuing commitment. The highway department did a large amount of paving and reconstruction in 1984, including resurfacing two miles of West Side Road and reconstructing 3,500 feet of Stark Road. With the assistance of engineering student, Chris Gordon, and the offices of H. Edmund Bergeron, we inventoried all of our public roads and began use of a portable traffic counter to enable better planning. My appreciation of the fine work performed by Highway Foreman, Lewis (Bud) French, Jr., and his crew is extended.

With the cooperation and assistance of Madison, Eaton, and Albany, the Town perambulated those town lines in 1984, as required every seven years by law.

The ordinances and regulations of the Town were researched and codified in 1984 into one reference book. That codification is on the 1985 Warrant for your approval. The success of both the perambulation and codification projects is due to the dedicated efforts of Assistant Town Manager, John Walsh.

In 1984 we applied for and received two federal community development block grants; one of \$265,000 to assist the Center of Hope in building new facilities, and one, just beginning, of \$294,000, to rehabilitate existing housing in Center Conway.

Although we did experience several legal setbacks in zoning matters in 1984, we remain committed to reasonable enforcement and planning for our future. We are pleased with the overwhelming cooperation we have received in these efforts. Your willingness to participate and serve in both elected and appointed positions is essential to the continuance of truly representative government.

The Board of Selectmen meet regularly on Mondays in open session and Minutes of those meetings are on file at the Conway Public Library.

Thank you for your support and assistance.

### ASSESSOR'S REPORT

The Town seemed to enjoy an upswing in new buildings and building additions in 1984. This seemed to mirror the upturn in the national and regional economy.

We have seen a trend toward mini mall construction which in turn features factory outet stores. These seem to boost the local economy in two ways as they are good for our tax base, and, in bad weather, seem to keep people in Town shopping when they can't benefit from our seasonal activities out-of-doors.

The outlook for 1985 is for continued construction upswing based on building permits issued to this point.

We will close with our yearly reminder the people contemplating an exemption for 1985 must file by April 15th. This includes new applications for Current Use on land, as well as veterans, elderly, etc.

### CIVIL EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS REPORT

1984 was a very active year for Civil Emergency Preparedness (CEP). As Civil Defense Director of Conway, this task was a pleasure as well as some hard work.

As early as March, plans were set into motion to better the Emergency Response of the Valley in the event of a Mass Casualty Incident (MCI).

I attended a 36-hour Emergency Management Course in Brunswick, Maine, sponsored by FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency). A main focus of the course was the need to inventory all the local resources that could be called upon should the need arise. The private sector is one of the strongest resources we have, and many have come forward to offer help.

In June I organized a 2-day seminar in North Conway, concerning preparation and response to a MCI. The seminar was funded by N.H. Public Health Region V EMS and by an attendance fee. It was well attended by fire, police, Emergency Medical personnel, heads of local and State agencies, Civil Air Patrol, and doctors, nurses, and employees of 21 of the 31 New Hampshire hospitals. Invaluable information was taught, exchanged and tested.

During 1984, Preparedness was increased by work on an Emergency Operations plan for the Conway area, establishment of an Emergency Operations Center at the North Conway Fire Station, purchase of medical supplies for Mass Casualty, and folding cots donated by Community Action Program. The Emergency Response trailer project is still in the works and will be set up in the spring of 1985.

Also in 1985, communication will be greatly increased with a 16 channel mobile radio. 50% of the funding will be allocated by the State of New Hampshire Emergency Management Assistance Program.

# REPORT FROM THE CHIEF OF POLICE

On March 18, 1985, the Police Commission bestowed a great honor on me by promoting me to the rank of Chief. The last  $7\frac{1}{2}$  months have been a great learning eperience for me. This has been my first year in law enforcement that I have had to manage a budget, and I am pleased to say that the 1984 budget was under expended by \$10,194.00.

In 1984 your Police Department responded to 5,527 requests for police service. Our department Prosecutor processed 2,162 violations and misdemeanor offenses which resulted in 2,000 guilty findings, and a total of 162 offenses that were either dismissed, not prosecuted, or received a finding of not guilty. The 1984 conviction rate was 93%. Also not indicated in the above figures, were 103 felony arrests which come under the jurisdiction of the Superior Court.

The emphasis this past year has been on drunken drivers in an attempt to make our highways safer. With funds received from the New Hampshire Highway Safety Agency, we were able to implement an Alcohol Countermeasure Program two days a week for four months with the following results: DWI arrests - 36; other motor vehicle arrests - 14; summons - 49; warnings - 373.

In 1983 there were 5,759,427 cars that passed over the traffic recorder by the Yield House and, according to the State Highway Department, the traffic for the first nine months of 1984 was up 6%. This section of road is the fourth busiest secondary road in the State of New Hampshire. With all the heavy traffic we experience, I am glad to say that we did not have any traffic fatalities this past year, and the total number of accidents was down from 633 in 1983 to 498 in 1984, for a 21% decline. I do not anticipate any major change for 1985, but with your support we will again provide you with the service that you are accustomed to and extend our effort to keep our highways safe.

I would like to thank Police Commissioners Paul W. Hutchins, Jr., Wesley S. Gleason, Roy H. Larson, Jr., and the officers and members of the Conway Police Department, for the support and assistance they have given me in my first year as your Chief.

### PLANNING BOARD

#### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The past year may well be remembered as the first year of "business as usual" for the Conway Planning Board. With all major plans and regulations in place, and with no unexpected turnover in membership, the Board could concentrate on efficient consideration of Site Plan and Subdivision applications, and on revising the Town's land use regulations to meet the requirements of new State laws and the needs of a growing community.

At its semi-monthly planning meetings the Board completed a major overhaul of the Subdivision regulation and the regular yearly "tune-up" of the Site Plan regulation, the Master Plan, and the Planning Board by-laws, and drafted four amendments to the Zoning Ordinance to be proposed for voter approval at the 1985 Town Meeting.

Perhaps the most important change of 1984 was the emplacement of "certificate of compliance" provisions in all regulations, to provide a mechanism to insure that development is carried out as planned and to reduce the risk of costly legal proceedings to correct violations.

At its regular administrative meetings, the Board processed the following applications (2-1-84 through 1-31-85):

For the first time in recent memory, the Board was able to complete its work within the regular 50-week meeting schedule. While the good attendance record of Board members at nearly 200 hours of meetings was an important factor, the work accomplished during 1984 would have been literally impossible without the efforts of Paul King, the Board's technical consultant, and Kathy Szympruch, our recording secretary.

Also worthy of special mention were the contributions of Jan Weinraub, who brought new meaning to the office of Board Secretary, and of Vice Chairman Marilyn Miller, who chaired several difficult meetings and served as the Board's Ambassador-at-large to other Town and Village organizations.

Two problems come to mind that the Board did not have time to solve, and that must be passed on to future Boards. First, it is absolutely essential that the Subdivision, Site Plan and Zoning Regulations be translated into English. These documents had simple beginnings in troubled times, and have since been amended, reorganized, revised and patched by a variety of authors, to the extent that the real intent and meaning are often obscured by tortured syntax and legalese bafflegab.

The second problem is general civic apathy toward Board membership. The seven-member Board is authorized to appoint three additional alternate members to three-year terms, but in 1984 was able to find only one qualified new alternate. These positions provide valuable input to the Board's deliberations and serve as a training ground for regular membership, and some way must be found to keep them filled.

In New Hampshire, where home rule and individual rights are held in high regard, it follows that if a man's home is his castle, a man's town is his kingdom. Those of us who most staunchly defend the right to do what we want with our own property may be the first to take offense when our neighbor does what he wants with his. Your Planning Board is chartered under State law to balance these conflicting interests and to guide and moderate growth and change for the general welfare of the community and its residents. By contributing your ideas, your criticism, your support and your service you can help it to do its job. Conway is a great place to live . . . only you can make it better.

### **REPORT OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES**

#### 1984

During 1984 14,755 people visited the Conway Public Library to read, do research, ask for information and check out books. There are 21,360 volumes in the library. Many paperbacks, which are not cataloged, have been given to the library.

In June, Charles Davis, a newly elected trustee, resigned because of leaving the area, and the selectmen appointed Robert L. Johnson to fill the vacancy for the rest of the year. Karen MacDonald resigned from the staff after several years' service to accept a position with the elementary school libraries. Two new members were added to the staff, Carol Kennett and Pat Tiberii, to provide for three people to be on duty at all times instead of two, and to provide increased open hours on Saturdays. Dudley Carleton has been employed as janitor. The staff is highly professional, friendly and helpful to the public. Volunteers continue to play an important role in library activities.

Civic organizations, such as the Tin Mountain Conservation Center, the Audubon Society and the Conway Historical Society, continued to meet in the library. Summer reading programs and story time programs were increasingly popular in 1984. Three lectures on George Orwell's book, "1984", were sponsored by the New Hampshire Council for the Humanities.

Our Project READ (Renew, Expand And Develop) campaign to raise \$250,000, started in 1982, was complete in 1984, as a result of continued fund raising activities, and \$70,000 voted at town meeting from Revenue Sharing funds. Construction started in June, with completion anticipated early in January 1985. The basement will be both beautiful and functional. A new entrance from the parking lot plus the installation of an elevator will provide long needed easy ingress as well as accessibility to the handicapped. The meeting room will accommodate large groups for programs of a civic, cultural and educational character. The children's room will be moved to the new area, with enlarged space, and the former children's room will be used for reference material. Modern rest rooms are being added.

The vision of a library large enough to expand its activities, without sacrificing the beauty of the building, is finally coming to fruition, due to the support of many, many organizations and people. The trustees and staff look forward to the library becoming a center for civic and cultural activities, and they express their heartfelt appreciation for all the efforts that have gone into this project.

### REPORT OF THE CONWAY CONSERVATION COMMISSION

One of the major accomplishments of the Commission in 1984 was the Natural Resource inventory of the Pudding Pond Property (230 acres) completed by B. H. Keith Associates of Conway. Part of the inventory compared the 1950 pH (6.0) and dissolved oxygen levels (7.2 ppm) with current conditions. It was found that the pH (acidity) level of the Pond has been at a constant of 6.0 while dissolved oxygen levels have improved to approximately 11 ppm. Due to the beaver dams the water depth has increased by 3 to 4 feet from that in 1950. Water samples were taken in July and October 1984 and another will be taken in May 1985.


The inventory also mentioned that the recreational, aesthetic and educational opportunities of the present trail system was good due to the potential visual appeal and ecological richness. This report is available to be reviewed at the Town Hall and Conway Public Library.

Included with this year's report is a description map of the most recently completed mapping of the Town of Conway Common Land located in East Conway. We are now in the process of redefining the boundaries of a second parcel of Common Land located in East Conway to the area north of the intersection of the East Conway Road and Fryeburg Road.

Cutting of brush to keep the views and trails open continues to be an annual program with town owned property. With the increasing use of Whitaker Woods by cross country skiers, the scenic vista trail was brushed out in December of 1984. Additional clearing of brush will be done in Shedd Woods along Route 16 in North Conway in 1985.

The Commission welcomes Susan Nichols-Lucy as a new member replacing Karen McDonald who resigned during the year due to other commitments.

### NORTH COUNTRY COUNCIL ANNUAL REPORT

Calendar year 1984 saw the North Country Council, Inc. observe its twelfth year of successful operation for towns in the North Country. The Council, as a regional, non-profit, public planning agency chartered under NH RSA 36:45, is responsible for providing assistance in local community planning, economic development, solid waste, transportation, and municipal services.

In Conway, the Council prepared a CDBG application for a \$265, 000 revolving loan fund which will initially benefit the Center of Hope and subsequently other economic development activities in Town. We assisted the Town Community Development Director in putting together a successful housing rehab program for Center Conway and worked with the Assistant Town Manager in obtaining funds for the Smith Eastman Landing project.

The Council is preparing text and illustrations for the Valley Pride Coordinating Committee's sign design guideline project. Information was provided to the Planning Board on certificate of occupancies. As part of the Mr. Washington Valley Solid Waste District Plan, the septage disposal situation in the Valley was reviewed and a report prepared.

In economic development, the Council hosted in the spring two region-wide economic development conferences with over 200 business, industry and government leaders attending. From the conferences, regional strategies were developed to address such issues as highway improvements, air service, regional promotion, mechanisms for regional communication, development funding, and regional job expansion. As an outgrowth of these conferences, the Council is presently coordinating the preparation of a North Country Videotape project, which, when complete, will examine the potential for industry to locate in the North Country. The Videotape will be available to Chambers of Commerce, local development corporations, and municipalities in order to promote their communities to businesses looking to expand or relocate in the North Country.

The Council has provided information and guidance to several towns on federal and state grant and loan programs. This past year saw well over \$2.0 million in Community Development Block Grant funds come to the region for such activities as housing rehabilitation, water and sewer system improvements, a downtown revitalization study, an industrial park feasibility study, and business revolving loan funds. Community planning assistance has emphasized master planning and improvement in local land use controls. New state mandates and commercial and residential growth in several towns have created busy work loads for planning boards. The Council's assistance takes many forms: regional workshops, newsletters, regulation review and update, and assistance on a regular or onetime basis for subdivision and site plan applications. Subdivision review workshops were held in Littleton, Campton, and Dalton and we co-sponsored the Municipal Law Lecture Series in Twin Mountain.

Overall, the Council's major objective is to work with North Country towns in solving local and regional problems. We rely on and appreciate the involvement of town officials and residents and look forward to assisting your town this coming year.

# REPORT OF THE TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

Our first forest fire prevention law was enacted by our State Legislature 90 years ago. This early law set in place a cooperative forest fire prevention and suppression effort between city and town governments and State government. It simply stated that no open fire could be kindled, when the ground is free of snow, without the written permission of the town/city Forest Fire Warden. This law also stated that anyone kindling a fire without written permission shall be liable for the damage caused and subject to a \$1000 fine.

During the past 90 years, this law has worked so well that it has remained unchanged. All open fires when the ground is not covered with snow must be authorized by the local Forest Fire Warden. Persons kindling a fire without a permit when one is required are liable for damages caused, fire suppression costs and subject to a \$1000 fine.

This cooperative fire prevention law has contributed significantly to our nationally recognized annual forest fire loss record.
