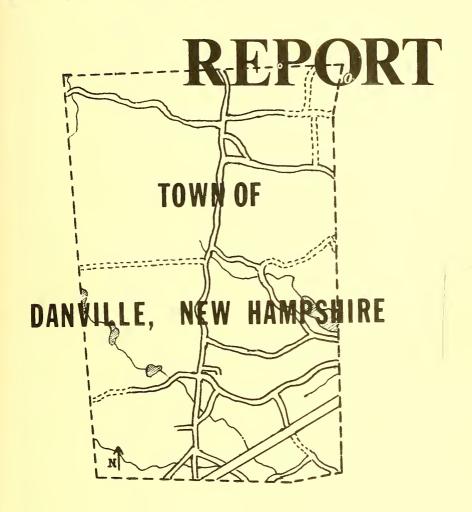

TOWN MEETING' MARCH 9, 1971

The meeting was called to order by Moderator Merle D. Kimball at 10:00 A.M. in the Town Hall. He read the Warrant and a motion was carried to postpone consideration of Articles 2-8 until the Business Meeting on March 12, 8:00 P.M. at the Danville Elementary School. The polls were then declared open for voting on Articles 1 and 9.

Article 1. Voted to choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. Voted to accept the budget in its entirety with the following additions: an additional \$500.00 for the Police Department to cover loss-time pay, and an additional \$300.00 for Insurance to cover the cost of insuring the Old Meeting House and the Little Red School House.

Article 3. Voted to spend the interest of the Parsonage Fund for the ensuing year.

Article 4. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for use of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

Article 5. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to sell Tax Title property.

Article 6. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for support of the Greater Salem Mental Health Clinic.

Article 7. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,540.00 for the purchase of a snow plow blade, complete.

Article 8. No additional business was introduced.

Article 9. Voted to amend the Zoning Ordinances by adding Section L, Article XIV, Definitions, and Article XVI, Multiple-Unit Dwellings.

The polls closed at 7:17 P.M., March 9, with the results announced by the Moderator at 8:00 P.M. On March 12, the Business Meeting was called to order at 8:12 P.M. and adjourned at 8:36 P.M.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Danville in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Danville Town Hall in said Danville on Tuesday, the Seventh (7th) day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much of the Parsonage Fund the Town will vote to spend for preaching for the ensuing year.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for the use of the Town in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell Tax Title Property.
- 6. To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the amendment of the Constitution proposed by the 1971 Session of the General Court shall be approved.
- 7. To appoint a Committee to study salary structure for all Town Officers, elected and appointed; the recommendations of said Committee to be brought back to the next annual meeting.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Conservation Commission under the provisions of RSA 36:A, and that the Selectmen shall appoint said commission, to consist of three (3) members, within thirty (30) days of said annual meeting and that said Selectmen shall also designate for the purpose of calling the first commission meeting, a temporary chairman.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$19,000.00 for the purchase of one new fire truck, class A pumper; such equipment to meet the requirements of the American Insurance Association and the Insurance Services Office of New Hampshire, for approval of a reduction in fire insurance rates, to the North Danville district (so called); and authorize the Selectmen to borrow such monies by Serial Notes.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the establishment of a capital reserve for the fire department, the money thereby appropriated to be used to purchase a new fire truck equipped and approved by the American Insurance Association and the Insurance Services Office of New Hampshire, and the sum of \$6,300.00 to be appropriated therefor; also, any interest earned to be reinvested and/or returned to the Capital Reserve Fund.
- 11. To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 as their share of the cost to begin Phase 1 of "The Town of Danville Out-Door Recreation Program" as approved and funded by the New Hampshire Department of Resources and Economic Development, under the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of 1965 as administered by the Federal Bureau of Out-Door Recreation. (By Petition.).
- 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF THE TRUST FUNDS

During 1971, a capital gain of \$936.40 was realized on the sale of 100 shares of Smith Kline and French Laboratories common stock. This sum was distributed among all the funds proportional to their principal resulting in a 3.1% increase.

The approximate yield on investments for the year was 6.2% based on the Dec. 1, 1970 book value plus accumulated dividend of \$31,435.45 and applicable income of \$1,951.75. This compares with an approximate yield of 5.8% for 1970, 5.1% for 1969, and 4.9% for 1968.

The balance of all trust funds, including accumulated dividends, on Dec. 1, 1971 was \$35,514.95.

REPORT OF POLICE DEPARTMENT

This past year has been as challenging as ever. However, this department has worked to aid and protect the people and keep the peace, and commends the citizens of this town for their readiness to cooperate.

We have added to the Department three special police - Arthur Pierce, Jr., Carl West, and Frank Waters. These men have assisted our regular officers in patrol and traffic duty.

Officer Arthur Pierce, Sr. and Special Officer Arthur Pierce, Jr. are attending the Southern N. H. Police Training School and Special Officer Frank Waters received law enforcement training while a member of the Great Barrington, Mass. Police Department.

It was necessary to purchase some new equipment this year and in October a special money raising project was headed by Officer Clinton Arnold, Jr. Some of the proceeds were used to purchase equipment and some were used for law enforcement study books.

Regular monthly meetings were held to promote complete communication and cooperation among all members. The Chairman of the Board of Selectmen attended each meeting.

Of the over 1,200 hours devoted to police work this past year, the budget only allowed payment of 750 hours; so again this year, we note that the members of this Department have given much of their time, as well as using their own vehicles.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN

AND DISTRICT CHIEF

LEST WE FORGET - IT CAN HAPPEN HERE

Disastrous forest and brush fires that destroy hundreds of homes are more prevalent on the West Coast, with their dry seasons and strong dry hot winds, but 25 years ago this fall is the anniversary of a disaster that devastated large areas of Northern New England, leaving villages in ashes with rows of cellar-holes and chimneys in a number of summer vacation home locations. Many lives were lost on that destructive day of October 23, 1947; nothing could stop the wind-driven flames.

It is true that such conditions are unusual for New Hampshire, but they happened once and they can happen again. The fuel for fires is all around us. All it takes is a firebrand. Only by cultivating a habit of carefulness with fire at all times can we meet the challenge of protection when dry conditions prevail. Please let these reminders be your guide:

- 1. Never, either when walking, riding or driving, discard a firebrand a lighted match or a glowing cigarette.
- 2. Always obtain a permit for any outside burning. The burning of household rubbish is not permitted if your town has rubbish collection. Burning of grass or garden litter can be dangerous. See your warden first.
- 3. If you camp or picnic, be sure open fires are allowed and if they are, put them dead out when leaving.
- 4. Most Important, instruct your children in the danger of the lighted match. A lighted match and dry grass or forest litter is a dangerous combination, which leads to destructive loss and can lead to tragedy.

The past year, 1971, was a favorable year for the control of fires. There were too many fire starts in some towns. We thank those who remembered, and ask others to heed Smokey's message.
