You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Deering on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at seven of the clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of the Town Officers for the previous year. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriations of the same. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,400.00 for Town Officers' salaries and \$1,500.00 for Town Officers' expenses. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for election and registration expenses. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the upkeep of the Town Hall and other buildings. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for Social Security payments for Town Employees. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for Police and \$1,000.00 for the Fire Department. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the annual payment of the principal of the loan for the West Deering Moat Bridge. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to be paid to the Capital Reserve Fund for Road Equipment. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for the Town's share of County Taxes. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the care of cemeteries. - Submitted by the Board of Cemetery Trustees.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to auction property taken by Tax Collector's Deed. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to issue notes for the same. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell by Quit-Claim Deed the so called "Hinckley Barn Lot", located in the Town Center and bounded on three sides by the property of Mrs. Catherine Carew and on the fourth side by the property of the Deering Community Church; - said "Hinckley Barn Lot" to be sold to Catherine Carew for the sum of one dollar.

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to have published a history of the Town of Deering and to expend such sums of money as may be required in so doing. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to accept a gift of land from Edna S. Yeaple to the Town of Deering. Said land, one-half acre more or less, is an extension eastward from the rear of the East Deering Cemetery. For consideration paid the Town of Deering agrees to maintain the Yeaple Lot, so called, in the East Deering cemetery under perpetual care. - Submitted by the Trustees of the Trust Funds.

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to transfer to Class VI Highway such roadways of the Town as are not presently in common usage, providing, however, that the Selectmen and the Highway agent shall present a list of said roadways to be presented to a public hearing to be held in the Town Hall of Deering, notice of which shall be given to the voters in the usual manner. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Report of the Selectmen

During the calendar year of 1965 a significant change in Town affairs has been the reassessment of all property at 100% of market value by the Board of Selectmen. Although required by law for several years, there has been a marked reluctance to comply with this requirement in the past because of an apprehension that to do so would increase the Town's share of the County Tax and the School District assessment. We have been reassured by the New Hampshire Tax Commission that this will not be the case, however.

At intervals of two years, the Tax Commission makes a survey of assessments within the Town to determine at what percentage of full market value the properties in Deering are being assessed. This "Equalized valuation percentage" is then applied to the total valuation of the Town. It is this 100% valuation which is compared with other Towns to arrive at our share of the County Tax and compared with Hillsboro's equalized valuation to determine our share of the School District cost. For this reason, the actual percentage of market value at which property is assessed within the Town should have no effect on our payments to other governmental divisions. However, being at 100% of market greatly simplifies the work of the selectmen and therefore saves money for the Town.

We have attempted this Year to contract the highway work as voted in the 1965 Town Meeting. Since the Selectmen received only one bid for snow plowing in answer to our advertised request for bids, the decision was made to rent equipment by the hour at rates comparable to those paid by the State for the same types of equipment. At this time we do not have sufficient cost data to determine with any degree of accuracy whether or not the Town is saving money by hiring equipment instead of using its own.

The accelerated paving of roads within the Town with "Town Road Aid" funds is proceeding at a reasonable rate. The pavement was extended in West Deering to Donovan's Corner and the Reservoir Road was paved as far as the County Road. The County Road was improved in preparation for paving and the Lake Road near the center of Town was widened. It is expected that all of this work will be completed during the ensuing year.

The Selectmen wish to express their appreciation to the voters for their cooperation in maintaining an economical town budget, which is reflected in our tax bills.

Report of the Annual Town Meeting
Deering, N. H. March 9, 1965

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A legal meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Deering, qualified to vote in Town Affairs was called to order at 7:15 P.M. March 9th.

The meeting was opened with a Prayer by the Moderator, followed by the salute to the Flag.

Article 1. Ballots were cast on the Australian ballot as follows:

Selectman for 3 years. William Bittenbender - 68 votes.

Town Clerk, Clara T. Rich - 76 votes.

Town Treasurer, Clara T. Rich - 75 votes.

Tax Collector - Howard E. Whitney - 128 votes.

Overseer of Welfare, Chairman of the Board of Selectmen - 116 votes

Highway Agent, Francis X. Mooney - 109 votes.

Auditors, Marjorie Heath & Eunice Willgeroth - 120 & 118 votes.

Library Trustee, Myrtha Ireland - 78 votes.

Trustee of Trust Funds, Edna Yeaple - 119 votes.

Chief of Police, Charles C. Williams - 147 votes.

Police Officer, Donald Dumais - 86 votes.

Surveyor of Wood & Lumber. Board of Selectman 116 votes.

Article 2. It was voted to accept the reports of the Town Officers for the previous year.

Article 3. It was voted to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriations of the same.

Article 4. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,400.00 for Town Officers' salaries and \$1,100.00 for Town Officers' expenses.

Article 5. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for election and registration expenses.

Article 6. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the upkeep of the Town Hall and other buildings.

Article 7. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900.00 for the Town's share of Social Security.

Article 8. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for Police and \$900.00 for the Fire Department.

Article 9. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 for Blister Rust control.

Article 10. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,800.00 for insurance.

Article 11. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for Damages and Legal expenses.

Article 12. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for Civil Defense purposes.

Article 13. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ 25.00 for vital statistics.

Article 14. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for sealing of roadways.

Article 15. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for Summer and \$4,000.00 for Winter roads.

Article 16. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for street lighting.

Article 17. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 for general expenses of the Highway Department.

Article 18. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$962.01 to secure Town Road aid.

Article 19. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ 25.00 for the Town Librar/.

Article 20. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the Town Poor and \$1,200.00 for Old Age Assistance.

Article 21. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ 10.00 for flags for soldiers' graves on Memorial Day.

Article 22. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ 500.00 for interest on loans in anticipation of taxes and the sum of \$400.00 for interest on long term notes.

Article 23. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ 1,000.00 for the annual payment of the principal of the loan for the West-Deering Moat Bridge.

Article 24. It was not voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to be paid to the Capital Reserve Fund for Road Equipment.

Article 25. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ 5,000.00 for the Town's Share of County Taxes.

Article 26. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to issue note for such loans.

Article 27. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to auction property taken by Tax Collector's Deed.

Article 28. It was voted to be amended to delete the words "providing also that said Board shall be composed of three persons holding appointments indefinitely unless removed by the Selectmen for cause, or until a vacancy shall exist by reason of resignation or incapacity.", and that the following be substituted for the words deleted: "provided that the said Board to be appointed by the Selectmen shall consist of the three regular members of the Trustees of Trust Funds".

Article 29. It was voted to dismiss Article 29 approving the use of the Hotel lot as a cemetery.

Article 30. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ 200.00 for the care of cemeteries, as required by RSA 289:5.

Article 31. It was voted that the Town raise and appropriate up to the sum of \$19,600.00 for the purchase of a four wheel drive truck, and that in payment therefor the Selectmen be authorized to draw the total sum in the Capitol Reserve Fund of the Town, and to sell the Oshkosh as a trade-in thereon, and to issue notes up to but not exceeding \$6,000.00 under the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act provided however that prior to making or permitting such funds or purchase that the Selectmen shall consult with a Ways and Means Committee of three voters of the Town to determine whether any other solution should be adopted with respect to Town road equipment.

Article 32. It was voted to dispose of the "FWD" truck and "John Deere" Loader.

Article 33. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money, and issue Town notes for the same, in anticipation of Town Road Aid reimbursement by the State of New Hampshire, such loans not to exceed the sum of \$21,000.00 for a period of three years and providing also that the proceeds from said loans shall be used

for the following road improvements within the Town of Deering; extension of pavement of the County Road, so called, as far as the North Farm; extension of pavement of West Deering Road, so called, as far as Donovan's corner; extension of the pavement of the Reservoir Road, so called, as far as the County Road; paving of the Fisher Road, so called, as far as the Lake Road; and other improvements at the discretion of the Selectmen and the Highway Agent, as approved by the representative of the State of N. H.

Article 34. It was voted to have a list of property owners published in the next Town Report, to be listed as of April 1, 1965.

Article 35. It was voted that the Town Ordinance relating to the prepayment of taxes by the tax payers of the Town be amended to provide "that in no instance shall any interest be paid on taxes after mailing of tax bills by the Tax Collector of the Town.

It was voted to Honor Clark Poling on next year's Town Report.

It was voted to endorse the idea of the Monadnock Region but not to appropriate any money.

It was voted to consider moving the Library to the Town lot.

It was voted to raise the pay of the Highway Department 25¢ per hour.

It was voted to adjourn to April 9, 1965 at 7 P.M. for voting of the motion previously passed under Article 31. At least 30 voters present or vote will be invalid.

The adjourned meeting was opened at 7:15 P. M., April 9, 1965.

Article 1. It was voted to reconsider and amend that vote under Article 31 which authorized the purchase of a new truck.

Article 2. It was voted (1 no vote) to authorize the Selectmen and the Road Agent collectively to negotiate and conclude such contract or contracts as they in their sole discretion may consider suitable and necessary for the requirements and needs of the roads of the Town, including but not limiting thereby a contract or contracts for snowplowing, salting and sanding, maintenance and reconstruction of the Town's roads, and that the Selectmen and the Road Agent be authorized and empowered to enter into such contract or contracts for a period up to but not greater than three years from July 1st, 1965 with the proviso that the said contract or contracts will be dependent on the actual raising and appropriation of the necessary monies after the first year of such contracts.

Article 3. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ 2,000.00 to be paid into the Capitol Reserve Fund for road equipment.

It was voted to adjourn without date.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Most of us who live in New Hampshire and the thousands of vacationists that visit us every year love the State for the variegated woodlands that encircle our clean lakes and clothe the hills and mountains. Most of us appreciate these values, but still there were enough careless people among us to cause over 880 grass and woodland fires to start in 1965. True this was a much dryer than normal year but this should have meant the use of extra care. Fortunately the fire fighting forces have held the line against such careless acts. It is up to each one of us to be ever mindful that a spark or flame is a potential fire.

WE MUST ALL BE CAREFUL:

1. To teach our children the danger in lighting matches.
2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn rubbish or brush;
 - a. Always get a permit to burn from the warden.
 - b. Start your fire late in the day after 5:00 PM.
 - c. If burning a field or brush have equipment and adequate help on hand. The heat from your fire creates its own draft to spread fire.

Our carelessness with fire is costing our State and Towns thousands of wasted dollars in suppression and hundreds of acres of destroyed woodlands. Yours never to enjoy.
