Town Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Exeter, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs: [L. s.]

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said Exeter, on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1st. To choose by ballot and plurality vote a town clerk.

2nd. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one selectman for three years.

3rd. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one trustee of the Robinson Female Seminary for the term of seven years.

4th. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one trustee of the trust funds held by the town of Exeter, to hold office for three years.

5th. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one trustee of the Swasey Parkway for three years.

6th. To choose all other necessary town officers, auditors, or committees for the ensuing year

7th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, for repairing highways, for repairing and building bridges, for repairing and building sidewalks, for building drains and sewers, for oiling streets, for payment of the town debt, for lighting streets, for defraying expenses of decorating the graves of soldiers, for preventing the spread of insect pests within the town, for the payment of firemen for the ensuing year, and for other charges arising within the town.

8th. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the use of Robinson Female Seminary during the coming year.

9th. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, and other officers and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote arising therefrom. 10th. To see if the town will vote to authorize the town treasurer, with the approval of the selectmen, to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

11th. To see if the town will vote to petition the state tax commission to have an audit made by the division of municipal accounting and to make an appropriation of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) to cover the expense of such audit.

12th. To see whether the town will vote to accept the bequests of the late Gardiner Gilman to the Exeter Public Library and Robinson Seminary.

13th. To see whether the town will authorize the expenditure of that part of the Gilman estate that falls to the Public Library, or so much of it as may be needed for the purpose, to build and equip an addition to the present Library building; and, if such authorization is granted, will appoint the Library Committee as a building committee.

14th. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with other towns coordinated in the Seacoast Regional Development Association, the sum of six hundred and forty-five dollars (\$645.00).

15th. On petition of Edward J. Campbell and twenty-five others, to see if the town will vote to repipe the Town Hall heating system, to install an oil burner for one boiler that will service the entire building, and to appropriate the sum of \$1,100.00 for the same.

16th. On petition of Ralph E. Meras and eighteen others, to see if the town will vote to take its own risk of loss by fire on its public buildings instead of paying insurance companies to do so.

17th. On petition of George E. Dearborn and thirteen others, to see if the town will vote to raise the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) to be expended for the purpose of (1) construction of a building to enlarge the present Central Fire Station on Court Street, (2) to replace the Station Alarm System with modern apparatus, and (3) to install the same

in the Court Street Fire Station, thereby centralizing the facilities of the Fire Department; and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to issue bonds in the name of the town for this purpose, such bonds as to form and terms to be in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Bonds Statute (*Public Laws Chap. 59*, and amendments thereto).

The time and place of payment and the rate of interest of the bonds so issued shall be fixed and determined by the Board of Selectmen except that said bonds shall be made subject to call and payment before the date fixed therefor at the election of the town under the provisions of said Municipal Bonds Statute.

18th. On petition of George E. Dearborn and thirteen others, to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) for a ladder truck for the use of the Fire Department.

19th. On petition of George F. Adams and twenty-one others, to see if the town will appropriate the sum of seven thousand seven hundred and fifty-seven dollars (\$7,757.00) to purchase a Seagrave hook and ladder truck with 240 feet of ladders and Booster pump and tank.

20th. On petition of William A. McReel and sixteen others, to see if the town will vote to rebuild and resurface Water Street from the end of the cement section opposite No. 231 of said street to the beginning of the section that was, a few years ago, resurfaced opposite the Standard Oil Company's filling station on said street, to widen said street from the said No. 231 east to the Town Hall, reset and replace curbing as needed, construct proper approaches, etc., and appropriate a sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars for this purpose. This contract to be let to the lowest reputable New Hampshire or nearby bidder.

21st. On petition of Arthur G. Watson and ten others, to see if the town will vote to purchase a dump truck for the use of the Highway Department and to appropriate the sum of \$1,281.00 therefor.

22nd. On petition of Arthur G. Watson and ten others, to

see if the town will vote to build a sand shed for use by the Town Highway Department and to appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the same.

23rd. On petition of H. W. Waning and ten others, to see if the town will vote to buy a snow plow for use by the Town Highway Department, and to appropriate the sum of \$550.00 for the same.

24th. On petition of Joseph T. Comings and twelve others, to see if the town will vote to centralize and equip, under the direction of the interested officers, offices for the selectmen, treasurer, collector and clerk in the space now occupied by the selectmen and treasurer, and to appropriate the sum of seven hundred dollars therefor.

25th. On petition of R. H. Wentworth and sixteen others, to see if the town will vote to appropriate \$600.00 for eight Band Concerts to be played by the Exeter Brass Band in the Swasey Pavilion during the summer season of 1941.

26th. On petition of George E. Dearborn and twelve others, to see if the town will appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to pay off debt of skating rink in the rear of the Wise Shoe Company.

27th. On petition of Elmer W. Keniston and ten others, to see if the town will vote to accept the following streets: Lantern Lane, Hickory Lane and Robin Lane, being three streets on Colonial Heights.

28th. On petition of Elmer W. Keniston and ten others, to see if the town will vote to install a hydrant on Wheelwright Avenue and to appropriate money for the same.

29th. On petition of Sadie Raymond and twenty-one others, to see if the town will vote to install one street light on Washington Street near the residence of Edward Eagan and appropriate money for the same.

30th. On petition of Frederick M. Gallant and fourteen others, to see if the town will vote to install a street light on Whitley Road, said road being laid out on the westerly side of Winter Street in the Winter Heights Development, and appropriate money for the same.

31st. On petition of Harry B. Sawyer and sixteen others, to see if the town will vote to install a street light in front of the residence of Forrest Ellison on Brentwood Road and appropriate money for the same.

32nd. On petition of Elmer W. Keniston and ten others, to see if the town will vote to install and maintain two street lights on Wheelwright Avenue, and to appropriate money for the same.

Report of the State Tax Commission

Board of Selectmen, Exeter, New Hampshire Gentlemen:

I submit herewith the report of an audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Exeter, which has been made by the Division of Municipal Accounting of the State Tax Commission in accordance with the vote taken at your annual meeting in March, 1940. This audit covers the fiscal year ended January 31, 1941. Schedules as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

Scope of Audit

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Library Treasurer and Trustees of Trust Funds.

Balance Sheets: Balance sheets, which, in our opinion, present a correct statement of the assets and liabilities of the town as of January 31, 1940, and January 31, 1941, are included as part of this report. The balance sheet which appeared in the town report made as of January 31, 1940, has been revised. This was necessary because of overstatement of accounts due the town for sidewalk assessments. It was also found that uncollected poll taxes had been omitted from the statement of assets. In the revised balance sheet these adjustments have reduced the Net Debt from \$69,413.78 to \$66,888.11.

The balance sheet of January 31, 1941, indicates a Net Debt of \$50,964.10, a decrease over the previous year of \$15,924.01. This decrease is accounted for by payment of outstanding bonds amounting to \$6,500.00, as provided for by appropriation, by the net unexpended balance of appropriations and the excess of actual over estimated revenues.

Included in the liabilities are the balances due the school district on account of the annual appropriation and dog license fees. Also included is the balance of the fire department ap-

propriation to cover the reconditioning of the pumper which should be charged to the 1940 appropriation.

Selectmen and Treasurer: Vouchers issued by the selectmen and the police commissioners during the fiscal year were examined as were also the supporting invoices. The treasurer's checks, issued upon the orders of the selectmen, were compared with the entries in the receipts and payments book and found to be in agreement. Receipts of the treasurer were checked by source insofar as it was possible to do so. Totals of receipts and payments were verified. The treasurer's cash book balance as of the date of audit was \$27,280.04, which was verified by statements received from the depository banks and by actual count of undeposited funds.

Bonds and coupons paid during the fiscal year were examined and found to be properly cancelled.

Tax Collector: The tax warrants and tax sale accounts for the levies of 1940, 1939, 1938 and 1937 were audited and balanced as of January 31, 1941. Verification of outstanding accounts by the town auditors had been completed at the time of our audit which made it unnecessary to repeat this procedure. Tax collections in Exeter are very satisfactory, the collection of the 1940 tax levy at the close of the fiscal year in comparison to the total warrant being 89.45%, which is considerable higher than the average for all towns and cities in the state.

Town Clerk: The town clerk's motor vehicle permit and dog license accounts for the fiscal year of 1940 were examined. All monies received for the issuance of such permits and licenses during this period were remitted to the treasurer at regular intervals as required by law.

Library Treasurer: The record of receipts and expenditures of the treasurer of the library was examined and cancelled checks produced which corresponded with the cash book entries. The balance on January 31, 1941, of \$527.27, as indicated by the cash book, corresponded to the total amount on deposit and in the treasurer's hands as of this date.

Trust Funds: The trust fund investments were examined and found to be in agreement with the total of the principal of the

trust funds and unexpended income as shown by the trust fund ledger. The verification of the amounts deposited in savings banks was made by reference to the pass books on which interest for the year ended December 31, 1940, had been entered in each instance. Securities were examined and found to be in order.

All payments by the trustees during the year were accounted for by receipts from the proper recipients or by invoices supporting expenditures.

Spraying, Sewer and Sidewalk Assessments: The collection of sewer, spraying and sidewalk assessments for the fiscal year, together with the balances outstanding as of February 1, 1940, were audited and all such recorded receipts were found to have been remitted to the treasurer. Verification of outstanding accounts as of January 31, 1941, is to be made by this division.

Town Officers' Bonds: The surety bonds of town officers were examined and found to be satisfactory in form and amount with the exception of the trustees of trust funds. No bond was found covering the trustees of trust funds, although the auditors were informed by the agent of the surety company that such a bond was in effect.

It is recommended that the standard form of bond approved by the Tax Commission be obtained by the trustees of trust funds and that a new bond be secured each year.

Recommendations: During the course of the audit several recommendations in regard to accounting procedure were made directly to the officers affected. There are, however, some changes which should be made that are noted herewith:

- 1. Because of their contact with the public and the considerable amount of money in their custody, it is recommended that a better office arrangement be provided for the tax collector and town clerk for the conduct of their business.
- 2. It is recommended that all payments of sewer, sidewalk and spraying assessments be made directly to the tax collector. Other officials to whom payment is tendered should refer the payer to the collector.

- 3. It has been the practice for the town to pay current taxes on property which it has previously bought at tax sales where no redemption has been made, rather than to have the collector sell again for subsequent years. Although this procedure is legally correct it is the opinion of the tax commission that all property upon which taxes are delinquent should be advertised and sold each year.
- 4. Separate accounts should be opened in the banks where the bonds and coupons are payable, to be known as the "Town of Exeter, Bond and Coupon Account." Prior to maturity dates of bonds and coupons a check for the required amount should be issued by the treasurer and credited to the account by the bank. All bonds and coupons presented for payment should be charged to these accounts. This will insure that sufficient funds are on deposit at all times to meet maturing bonds and interest coupons.
- 5. A determined effort should be made to pay all bills contracted by the departments during the current year. It has been the practice to carry over some bills to the next year as a result of which the actual expense of operating the department is not reflected in the financial report.
- 6. It is recommended that when appropriations are made town maintenance be divided into summer maintenance, winter maintenance and general expenses of the highway department.

Statistical Information: The following statistical statements have been prepared:

- a. Statement of Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes Assessed.
- b. Statement of Taxable Valuation and Taxes Assessed.
- c. Comparative Statement of Appropriations and Expenditures.
- d. Comparative Statement of Estimated and Actual Revenues.
- e. Statement of Bonded Debt.

 These were prepared from information taken from

the town records and also from reports submitted to the Tax Commission.

The town officials are to be commended upon the completeness and accuracy of their accounts and records.

Use of the library resources continues to increase in spite of cramped quarters and facilities wholly inadequate to the demands upon them. Eight hundred and seventy-four people in town registered as borrowers, and thirty-one out-of-town paid registration fees during the past year, making a total of 2,253 active borrowers during the three-year period. Twenty-five thousand more books were circulated last year than three years ago. The average circulation was 11 books per capita as compared to four per capita throughout the nation last year. Taken out were 1622 pictures and 189 pamphlets, which justifies the extra work devoted to their maintenance. A new filing case permits easier and quicker access to the material than storing them in large envelopes as previously. To supply requests for specialized subjects 143 books were borrowed from other libraries in the state, from Boston Public Library, and Library of Congress; and we loaned 113 books to other libraries. Work on Cutter author numbers for adult fiction has been completed. A new shelf list is now in progress. As usual, High School classes devoted a morning period for a visit at the library for instruction in its possibilities as an aid in their work.

Hazel Summerfield attended summer library school in July and was appointed first assistant after the resignation of Doris Armstrong Bickford. Emma Rowe left to join the library staff of the University of New Hampshire, and Jean Summerfield took over her duties. In September the librarian and assistant, Hazel Summerfield, accompanied Miss Vroom from Davis Library to the State Library meeting in Keene.

During the summer months various members of the Garden Club kept the library supplied with fresh flowers. Book Week was observed with displays of dolls of foreign countries, loaned by Miss Fannie Wojcicki, and poems in pantomime by the Girl Scouts who have also participated several times in the regular Saturday morning story hour. At Christmas the puppet show portraying how "Silent Night" was written proved so popular as to require a second showing.

Changes in Personnel

Mrs. Marguerite Johnson returned to her position as Supervisor of Music after a year of special study at the New England Conservatory of Music. Miss Izobel Burgstaller, who served during her absence, is now Supervisor of Music at Newburyport, Mass.

Mrs. Marion Berquist Knox consented to return as teacher of Latin and Sociology, because it was difficult to find a suitable teacher to succeed Miss Dorothy Rist, who resigned in June to be married.

Miss Elizabeth French, graduate of Simmons College, was appointed to fill the vacancy caused by the release of Miss Justa Archambault, teacher of Textiles and Clothing, who is now teaching in Pawtucket, R. I.

Choices of Graduates of 1940

Every school should be interested in the activities of its graduates. An effort is made to counsel and advise them in regard to preparation needed for certain fields, but too frequently other factors enter in, and their present activities reveal results which the students did not anticipate. For instance, a glance at the list given below will reveal that out of a group of 16, who were graduated from the Commercial Course, only 2, or $12\frac{1}{2}\%$, are actually engaged in their chosen work.

One attitude which is to be commended is the willingness in most cases to do any respectable work when the desired employment cannot be found. This necessity for changing one's plans leads to a consideration of a study made last spring, resulting in the adoption of new standards for the Commercial curriculum.

Standards for Commercial Curriculum

It will be recalled that, in the last annual report, the writer called attention to the large percentage of the graduates who had taken the Commercial subjects during the past five years, and how the percentage had increased during that period. This evidence seemed to justify a study of the record to reveal, if possible, any relation between the program of the first two years prior to specialization, and the degree of success of the last two years.

This study considered: 1. The intelligence quotient of each student; 2, her program for the freshman and sophomore years; 3, her relative standing in the special group (Commercial); and, 4, her standing in the whole class. The conclusions were the basis for the following plan.

To be eligible to take the specialized commercial curriculum in the junior year, a student must:—

- (a) offer two years' work (8 units) in either the academic or the general curriculum.
- (b) have a satisfactory standing in English (merely a mark of 70 will not be sufficient).

In adopting this plan, the Board of Trustees not only contributed to improvement of standards for the Commercial Department, but also made it possible for those who wish to change their plans for the junior year to do so without confusion. The subjects taken in the Academic and General curricula, namely, English, history, mathematics, and foreign language, and possible electives, will meet the requirements for college or business schools, nursing, or any number of post-secondary training schools.

This plan went into effect in September, 1940. It does not apply to the present Sophomore class, which will be the last to take the Commercial work under the old plan of merely passing 8 units of work, 2 of which were English.

Requirements of Schools of Nursing

Any young ladies who are planning to train for nursing (a profession which seems very popular at present), must meet requirements which are becoming more rigid. The number of prescribed units make it advisable for one to take the Academic course from the start. This will provide for certain related courses, such as mathematics and science, to be taken in a logical order.

Special standard tests administered by the hospital training schools call for vocabularies, both general and special, that can be developed only by thoughtful study and sincere interest in the subjects represented in the Academic curriculum.

Student Activity Fund

During the course of the school year, there are several demands on the pupils for support of worthy causes. Just as the Community Chest program provides for one contribution for the benefit of a number of agencies, a student activity fund would provide for the support of special assemblies, athletics, senior play, Red Cross, or any proper activity which might be included.

The writer proposes a plan which would call for an annual fee from each student for which she would receive a ticket admitting her to school plays and games, and a certain percentage of each membership fee would be taken for each activity and also as a contribution to the Red Cross fund. If a student could not pay the full fee of \$1.00 for instance, she would receive proportionate privileges and be able to feel that she was helping some in the school program.

General support of this nature unually results in a better school spirit. Before such a plan is started at the Seminary, the writer would welcome opinions of parents and students.

Class Gift

The gift of a studio couch and a woolen blanket by the Class of 1940 is gratefully acknowledged. The class had in mind

the comfort of any student who might become ill and need rest at school.

Excerpt from Report of School Physician, Dr. D. W. Leonard

As usual, the new students at the school were asked to have a medical questionnaire filled out and signed by their parents. At the time of the medical inspection, the students having had previous examinations were only asked for imformation about medical events since the last examination; this brief form being added to their first as a supplement. At the time of the inspection, all notations were made on the same papers to be available for tabulation. All forms, excuses and cards relative to the health history of the individual student were placed in a heavy envelope and filed by name. This collection of data will be found to be more complete than that usually to be found on the card prepared by the Board of Education for the same purpose. The latter card is included in the contents of the envelopes on file.

This year, the medical inspections have served as a checkup without disclosing dramatically any hidden and unsuspected disease. The general good health may be taken as strong evidence that, in a community of this type, there is no lack of health supervision and that good health may be acquired and retained without regard to the size of the family income. Here, at least, we find contradiction of the favorite argument of the supporters of "socialized medicine."

School's Relation to National Defense

The greatest contribution a school can make to National Defense is to uphold the traditions and standards which have been the basis for our present society. Students may serve by developing the attitude of wishing to do well the task at hand, and by so doing prepare themselves to serve well later. It is to this program that the faculty is pledged.
