- 9.To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the Freedom Emergency Response Team for equipment, insurance and Mutual Aid Dues. (By Petition)
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 for dues to the Lake Region Planning Commission.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 for heavy steel shelving for the Town Clerk's Office, or take any other action thereon. This equipment is necessary in order to preserve and maintain valuable Town records located in the Town Clerk's Office.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000.00 to pave the section of West Bay Road from the intersection of the Ossipee Lake Road to Chick Drive (Soul Air Development) (By Petition)
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900.00 to purchase nine loads of ¾ inch crushed gravel from the Coleman Co. in Albany and to have same spread on the surface of the Old West Ossipee Rd. The Distance is Approximately 1000 ft. and connects with Stagecoach Rd. and Winona Drive which are entrances to Square Brook Estates. (By petition)
- 14. To see if the Town will Vote to Raise and Appropriate the sum of \$26,000.00 for a new one ton highway truck equipped with plow wing and a three yard sander and authorize the withdrawal this amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund.

- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$6,200.00 for a new seven yard sander and authorize this amount to take from the Block Grant Funds.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 to shingle the roof of Town Administration Building.

This land abutts Square Brook Estate Lots, No. 3,4,5 and 6A. on the northerly boundry, which runs a distance of 325 ft., and then turns southerly from the easterly stake of Lot 6A., a distance of 162.5 ft., thence turning northwesterly a distance of some 365 ft. to the westerly stake of Lot 3A., which is the point of beginning. The land is not suitable or approved for any building and is of no value to the town for anything but income to be derived by taxes.

- 19. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the election of Planning Board Members and provide for appointment, to the terms designated in the RSA, by the Town Selectmen. This as provided under RSA 673:211(c).
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit by the division of Municipal Accounting Department and appropriate money for the same.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept in the name of the Town: Grants, land or gifts of any other nature.

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Between July 1985 and June 1986, we experienced fewer fires than normal. The two leading causes of forest fires were again children and fires kindled without written permission of a Forest Fire Warden. Both causes are preventable, but only with your help.

Please help our town and state forest fire officials with forest fire prevention. Contact your Forest Fire Warden for more information.

Enforcement of a state timber harvest regulation is the responsibility of State Forestry officials. Our state has excellent timber harvest regulations; however, your assistance is needed.

If you know of a logging operation and suspect a state timber harvest law may be violated, call your Forest Fire Warden.

If you own forest land, you became responsible for the timber tax payment starting April 1, 1986. This is a change in the Timber Tax Law that will impact all forest landowners. Contact your Board of Selectmen for timber tax forms.

Dear Selectmen,

Enclosed is our newly revised report on the Sacopee Valley Health Center for inclusion in your town report. I've also enclosed, for your information, some background about our "Space Program". Phase 1, our new medical wing, is almost complete; Phase 2, renovations will go on until Spring. This year's request to the towns is not for our Space Program, however, but for operations.

The towns' contributions to our budget, even though small, are important to us. Evidence of local support is critical if we are to attract federal grant support for our "fee discount" program for low income folks, and for other needed services (like health education in the schools and community). I've attached some correspondence from our federal grant programs which emphasizes this.

The town's contribution to our budget also provides us with much needed discretionary funds, which we can use for purposes (like equipment, building maintenance or special programs) not included in our annual operating budget. Given the numbers of your town's citizens we serve with health care and/or fee discounts, we think our request is very reasonable.

The impact of the dollars you vote to us is much greater than their cost to you. We hope that your town will continue to support us.

# 1. MANY LOCAL PEOPLE DEPEND UPON SVHC FOR HEALTH CARE

In 1986, some 6,000 people made more than 19,800 visits to the Health Center. At last count, SVHC was serving approximately:

## 3. SLIDING FEE PATIENTS

MANY LOW INCOME PEOPLE RECEIVE HEALTH CARE AT SVHC WHO WOULD OTHERWISE BE APPLICANTS FOR GENERAL ASSISTANCE FROM THE TOWNS OR BE WITHOUT HEALTH CARE.

Twenty-four percent of our total fees are written off as fee discounts.

In FY 1986, 1,321 SVHC patients were approved for fee discounts, including:

21 residents of FREEDOM

169 residents of Porter

111 residents of Hiram

195 residents of Limerick

163 residents of Cornish

139 residents of Parsonsfield

113 residents of Baldwin

# 4. THE SVHC, WHICH IS A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION GOVERNED BY A LOCAL COMMUNITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS, IS RESPONSIVE TO THE UNIQUE NEEDS OF LOCAL COMMUNITY RESIDENTS

The SVHC was founded in 1976 by a group of local area residents and continues to be governed by a volunteer board of directors composed of respresentatives of the local towns. Local control insures the continuing responsiveness of SVHC to area needs.

# 5. SVHC NEEDS LOCAL SUPPORT TO ACHIEVE GREATER SELF-SUFFICIENCY

The SVHC presently generates about two-thirds of the funds it needs to cover its operating costs. Federal grant funds do not quite cover the balance, which includes the costs of our fee discount program and of non-reimbursable services like community health education and social services.

Our planned expansion will permit greater cost efficiency, and so increase our economic stability. Still, a broad range of souces of support is important. Funds voted by the towns we serve provide both needed dollars and the evidence of community support that we need to attract other grant funds.

# 6. LOCAL SUPPORT FOR SVHC IS AN INVESTMENT IN THE FUTURE

SVHC's continued presence will insure that needed health care is always available to residents of the Sacopee Valley area. Our "Space Program" expansion/renovation will be completed in the Spring of 1987. Expansion will allow us to meet the increasing demand for our services, to add needed new services, and to control costs through more efficient use of space and staff.
