TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Grafton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grafton on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. Polls to close at 6 p.m.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for Old Home Day.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for the care of the Common at Grafton Center.

7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey by deed any real estate acquired by the Tax Collector's Deed.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for cutting Bushes and Rail-

ing Embankments.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$9,000.00 for the purpose of maintaining Highways and Bridges.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$953.97 and thereby receive \$6,359.83 from the State for Town Road Aid.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$650.00 for strenghtening and/or reconstruction of abutments at the Valia Bridge and the bridge below the Kilton Pond dam.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 as an emergency highway appropriation under the control of the Selectmen.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450.00 for patching and oiling roads.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the purchase of culverts.

16. (A) To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of a new truck and grader in accordance with the recommendation of the Highway Equipment Committee submitted at the public budget hearing on January 26, 1963.

(B) Authorize the Selectmen to sell or trade in the International Truck, Grader and Allis Chalmers Tractor and apply, together with the \$2,000.00 appropriated in 1962, towards the purchase of said new equipment.

(C) To see what portion of the above appropriation be raised by taxation this year with authorization to raise the balance through issuance of long term serial notes.

17. To see what action the Town may wish to take regarding the land and buildings acquired by the Town from the Grafton School District by quitclaim deed of January 29, 1963.

18. To see if the Town will vote to change the purpose of the capital reserve fund established for putting a basement dining room under the Town Hall to the following purpose:

“This Capital Reserve Fund to be used for the reconstruction of the East Grafton School land and building as a Town Office with dining and recreational facilities, and for the purchase of furniture and fixtures incidental thereto.” Voting to be by written ballot and decided by two-thirds majority of all voters present and voting.

19. To see if the Town will vote to accept a trust fund of \$100.00 from Mildred Runyan, the income thereof to be used for perpetual care of the Andrew B. Runyan burial lot in Pine Grove Cemetery.

20. To see what the Town may wish to do in regard to extending the fence at the Pine Grove Cemetery.

21. To see if the provisions of Chapter 171-A RSA relative to playing beano shall be adopted in this Town.

22. To take any vote or transact any further business that may legally come before said meeting.

PREVENTING FOREST FIRES IS OUR RESPONSIBILITY

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545. In the same period, the cost to the cities and towns for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and esthetic values in the 2,200 acres burned. Residences, farms and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set man caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any source of fires in the open. We can help keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules.

1. Dispose of burnable waste at the town dump.
2. If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, obtain a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.
3. Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry windy weather and preferably burning late in the day.
4. Have something to keep the fire under control—pails of water, garden hose, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.
5. Be sure your fire is out before you leave it.
6. If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never too early for parents to instill in the child's mind a respect for fire.

Keep our town safe from fire.
