TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hebron, in the county of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Hebron Community Hall in said Hebron on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at five o'clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

4. To see if the town will vote to give two percent cash discount on property taxes, if paid thirty days from date of their tax bill.

5. To see if the Town will accept and maintain approximately a one-half mile portion of the Hobart Hill Road extending from the so-called Glines Place.

6. To see if the Town will adopt the Enabling Act RSA 36-A 1 through 6, and 168:2 as set forth in the copy of the act and in the hands of the moderator.

If said act is accepted, then the town will appoint or cause to be appointed a committee of not more than three to be known as a conservation commission.

7. To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to be divided equally between the Mary Hitchcock Hospital at Hanover and the Sceva Speare Hospital at Plymouth.

8. To see if the Town will appropriate money to erect a new fence and complete work started at the cemetery and make recommendation for same at the next annual meeting.

9. To see if the Town will appoint or cause to be appointed a committee consisting of three members to investigate the regulations of the cemetery and make recommendations for same at the next annual meeting.

10. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to employ a clerk at a salary not to exceed \$500.00 annually.

11. To see if the Town will vote to have all properties reappraised. This appraisal is to be performed by competent appraisers at a cost of \$2300.00.

12. To see what action the Town wishes to take relative to snow removal.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

Dear Sirs:

I have examined in detail the records of the Trustees of Trust Funds, the Librarian, and the Treasurer and Selectmen of the Town of Hebron for the year 1965.

My Audit Covered:

(a) **Trustee of Trust Funds** - record books, check-book, bank statements, savings banks' books, and record book were checked in detail. Cash transactions and opening and closing balances in the Savings Accounts and Checking Account were found to be correct.

(b) **Librarian - Opening and Closing Cash Balances** were correct. Purchase Vouchers and Checks issued were in order.

(c) **Treasurer and Selectmen's Records** - All record books, vouchers, receipts, note transactions and other capital transactions were completely audited. Opening and Closing balances of Cash in Bank and in Savings Bank were in order. A difference of \$.10 between actual cash and closing cash balance in "Cash Book" was discovered. We have been advised that this error has been rectified. In our examination of the Statement to the State of New Hampshire, we found differences between the Cash Payout book allocations of expense items and the entries on the New Hampshire State Form. These were reported to the Treasurer and Selectmen - Cash was in no way affected by these items as further details presented to us proved that the differences were due to postings to Cash Payout Book and transfers to the State Form were made

under different headings. Assets, Liabilities, Cash Receipts and Expenditures totals, for the year Balances were not out of order. We are, therefore, certifying that All Cash Transactions and Cash closing balances and Statements of Assets and Liabilities are in order at the end of the year 1965.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Most of us who live in New Hampshire and the thousands of vacationists that visit us every year love the State for the variegated woodlands that encircle our clean lakes and clothe the hills and mountains. Most of us appreciate these values, but still there were enough careless people among us to cause over 880 grass and woodland fires to start in 1965. True this was a much dryer than normal year but this should have meant the use of extra care. Fortunately the fire fighting forces have held the line against such careless acts. It is up to each one of us to be ever mindful that a spark or flame is a potential fire.

WE MUST ALL BE CAREFUL:

1. To teach our children the danger in lighting matches.
2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn rubbish or brush:
 - a. Always get a permit to burn from the warden.
 - b. Start your fire late in the day after 5:00 P. M.
 - c. If burning a field or brush have equipment and adequate help on hand. The heat from your fire creates its own draft to spread fire.

Our carelessness with fire is costing our State and Towns thousands of wasted dollars in suppression and hundreds of acres of destroyed woodlands. Yours never to enjoy.
