The change in the charging system gives each borrower from the library the privilege of taking several books instead of one fiction and one non-fiction book as allowed by the cards. Hence, as will be seen by the circulation, more books than ever have been borrowed. The very general use of the library by the teachers and pupils of the public school has been gratifying. Generous use, also, has been made of the State library books by the D. A. R. members.

The library contains 5,372 volumes, 100 "dead" books having been removed. One hundred and forty-nine have been added, 60 are being rebound, and two have been replaced.

The registration is 72.

Donors to the library are: Mrs. Oliver, 2 books; Mrs. Hoskins, 1 book; Mr. Wack, 1 book; South Manchurian R. R., 1 book; Mrs. Payne, Mrs. Brigham, Mr. Hadley, magazines.
