

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

#### TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Nelson in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.82 for the construction of Class V highway, the state to contribute \$1,203.28.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for repairing highways and bridges, or take any action in relation thereto.
- 5. To see if the town will raise and appropriate money to Calcium Chloride Class V highways, or take any action in relation thereto.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the section of the old Roxbury road passing by the South of the Rolfe Floyd place, and accept a new road constructed on the North side of said place, or take any action in relation thereto.
- 7. To see what action the town will take to authorize the sale, by its selectmen, of any real estate secured and now held by the town under tax deeds or any real estate later to be acquired by tax deeds.

- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$37.00 to the Monadnock Region Association of Southern New Hampshire for the issuance and distribution of printed matter, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns in the Monadnock Region.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- 10. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.
- 11. To see if the town will give the selectmen the right to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 12. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of the Library.
- 13. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

# REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Nelson:

I herein submit my nineteenth annual report as superintendent of schools.

From a discussion on education after the war, I wish to quote from a report made by the Conservative Party, viz. "Of all the State's activities, education is the basic activity, because it conditions the future character of the entire community." "In war time, the maintenance of these services at a level of high efficiency should have maximum priority."

To meet the ideals of above quotations, I report a few of the several objectives towards which we are aiming: (1) to maintain the purity of the English language, (2) to give greater emphasis on fundamentals, especially in mathematics. (3) to offer a total interpretation of history, geography and economics, (4) to imbue our pupils with a better understanding of the vital principles of our Constitution and the American Way of life. For the accomplishment of these goals we ask the cooperation of teachers, parents and citizens.

#### CALL FOR TEACHERS

Due to the call of war service, defense work and office work, many teachers have given up the teaching profession. As a result I have had to resort to commercial advertising in order to keep open some of the rural schools.

As conditions may be worse next year, I suggest that former teachers take advantage of the opportunity of attending the Summer School at Keene and thus place themselves in position to qualify with the regulations of the State Board of Education.

I believe this to be a patriotic gesture.
